### Program Goals

- Improve collaboration among students, families, Glendale Unified administrators, and the Glendale Police Department.
- Learn new skills and strategies for academic success.

### Program Schedule

- Week 1: Introductions and Welcome Exercise
- Week 2: Health and Fitness
- Week 3: Career Clusters, Glendale Youth Alliance, and Glendale Unified Parent Portal
- Week 4: Social Media, Gangs, Drugs, and Alcohol
- Week 5: Field trip to Barnes & Nobel
- Week 6: Mental Health & Homelessness
- Week 7: Group Project with Ascencia
- Week 8: Career Cluster Panel, VIDA, Graduation

The classes will have 25 students per session. Students will complete a community service project, receive a certificate of completion, and community service hours upon completing the TAPP program.
