

Framework for building community and responding to challenging behavior

What is Restorative Justice Practices?

Restorative practices is a process by which an individual acknowledges wrongdoing, takes steps to repair harm and is welcomed back into the school community. This fosters a culture that lifts communication and values relationships.

Wildcat Circles

Students participate in restorative justice practices, community building, and problem solving **Wildcat Circles** to develop healthy relationships, safety, empathy, a voice, ownership, and learning. Which supports well-being and student achievement from our Cerritos students.

Wildcat Expectations



- Stay home if your child is sick or has tested positive for COVID.
- Call the office to report your student's absence and contact their teacher for work.
- You must wear a mask for 10 days if a member of your family or someone in their class has tested positive for COVID.

Supporting your student's Mental Health at Home



- ◆ Model healthy coping skills (Engage in activities such as deep breathing, using stress balls, coloring, or going for walks)
- **Watch for behavior changes** (withdrawn or isolation from friends, family or routine)
- **Keep communication open and honest** (receive and listen with love & support)
- Create a routine and set clear boundaries at home (create a daily schedule for meals, chores, or movie night. Clear expectation at home will help minimize feelings of frustration)
- Let them know they are loved and supported (provide a positive home environment that increases their feelings of security and safety)
- Provide positive feedback and encouragement (positive praise increases feelings of pride and confidence)
- Encourage joyful movement (practice physical activity regularly to support healthy physical and mental health)
- ◆ Talk about feelings and emotions regularly (discuss different emotions felt throughout the day with your child)
- Involve them in decision making (your child will feel heard and valued when included)
- Seek counseling services if needed (recognize when your child needs support. Do not be afraid to find and ask for help)



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


