

California **Environmental Quality Act** (CEQA)





Purpose of CEQA

- All discretionary projects in California are required to undergo environmental review to determine the environmental impacts.
- CEQA informs the public and decision makers about the project and about the potential environmental impacts.
- CEQA identifies feasible ways to avoid or reduce potential impacts.
- CEQA discloses any significant and unavoidable impacts.
- CEQA provides an opportunity for the public and local/state agencies to comment on the environmental issues.



Field Use and Project Construction

- Field Use and Scheduling
 - Track and Field existing uses for campus events/practices and outside sporting events
 - Larger events occur at other District campuses (Glendale HS)
 - Highest attended event is Varsity Football games (1,600 attendance)
 - Would be relocated back to their home school
 - Use schedule dependent on season (Table 3-2 of Draft EIR)
- Construction anticipated to begin in Summer 2022
 - 18 24 months duration





Project Objectives

- 1. Provide lighting to allow night use of the track and field to accommodate school-related events and activities.
- Provide bleachers with adequate capacity to accommodate various spectator events currently held on and off campus.
- Utilize existing space to enhance opportunities for after-school athletic and extracurricular activities.
- 4. Enhance sense of community by allowing home football games to occur on campus.
- 5. Upgrade the athletic fields to boost school pride.


No Mitigation Measures were required.





Draft EIR Findings: Less than Significant with Mitigation

- Temporary construction noise could exceed noise thresholds
 - Sound barrier installation
 - Construction equipment controls







Draft EIR Findings: Significant and Unavoidable Impacts with Mitigation

The Project was determined to have a "Significant and Unavoidable Impact even with Mitigation Incorporated" on:

- Noise: Operational-Generated Noise
- Aesthetics: Operational Light Trespass
- Transportation: Parking






Noise: Operational

- Noise levels during special events and games would exceed the existing ambient noise levels by more than 10 dBA.
- Mitigation Measure N-2 :
 - Development of a Noise Control Plan
 - Track and field Sound System Design Plan
 - Retain a qualified acoustical consultant

Even after mitigation, periodic noise increases could exceed thresholds resulting in a temporary significant and unavoidable impact







Aesthetics: Light Trespass

- Light levels along I-210 and Mayfield Avenue would exceed the County's 0.5 foot-candle threshold.
- Mitigation Measure AES-1:
 - Shield and directed lighting system
 - Automatic shutoff at 10:00 p.m.

Even after mitigation, light increase could exceed thresholds resulting in a temporary significant and unavoidable impact









Transportation: Parking

- Estimated event parking demand:1,053 spaces
- A deficiency of 205 parking spaces was identifed
- Mitigation Measure T-1:
 Development of Event Traffic
 Control Plan

Even after mitigation, temporary deficiency of parking during events would result in a significant and unavoidable impact








Alternatives

- No Project Alterative
 - Lessen environmental impacts in all areas
 - Considered environmentally superior to the proposed project
 - Does not meet any of the project objectives







Alternatives

- Bleacher and Field Improvements with No Lighting Alternative
 - Reduce environmental impacts in some areas
 - Considered environmentally superior to the proposed project
 - Does not meet the project objectives 1, 3, and 4
