What is *i-Ready*?



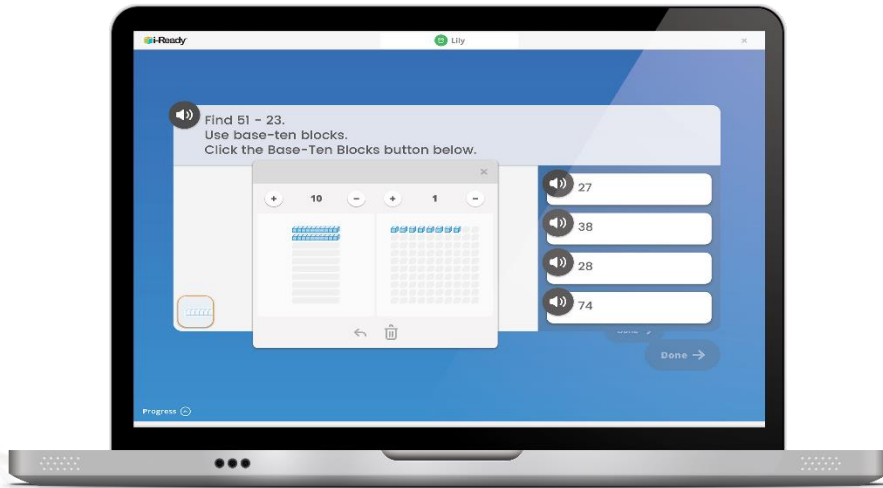

i-Ready Diagnostic



The *i-Ready Diagnostic* is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit your child's needs. Each item a student sees is individualized based on their answer to the previous question.

The purpose of the Diagnostic is not to give your child a score or grade, but instead to determine how best to support your child's learning.

How Does the Diagnostic Work?

i-Ready is an **adaptive test**. This means the questions change based on your answers.

will be **hard**



Some questions
will be **easy**



Others will be
just right for you

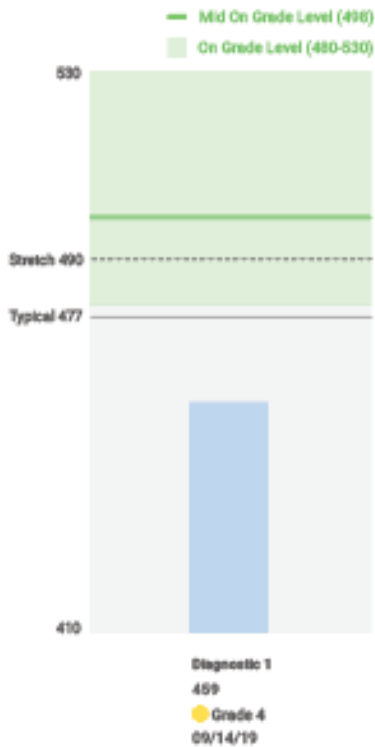

Logging In

How do I log in?

On an iPad®:

- **Download the free *i-Ready Connect for Students* app** from the App Store®. iPad must be compatible with iOS® 11 or above, such as the iPad Air®, iPad Air 2, or iPad Pro®.
- If your student's district/school:
 - **Uses Clever**, download the Clever app, log in using their district/school portal credentials, and click on the *i-Ready* icon.
 - **Uses a portal that is NOT Clever**, students should open the Safari® browser, enter their school portal URL and log in, and click on the *i-Ready* icon.
 - **Does not use a portal**, they should open the *i-Ready for Students* app and log in to *i-Ready* using the credentials provided by their teacher.

From a computer:

- If your student's district/school:
 - **Uses a portal**, your student should log in using their district/school portal credentials and then click on the *i-Ready* icon.
 - **Does NOT use a portal**, your student should visit i-ReadyConnect.com and log in to *i-Ready* directly on a computer using the credentials provided by their teacher.

Prepare for the assessment



Select the right time

The assessment typically takes between 45–60 minutes. Break this time into smaller 15–20 minute sessions.

Select the right place

Students should take the test in a private and quiet location ideally away from any distractions.

Gather supplies

Though the test is online, students will need paper and pencil to take notes.

Answer the Ws

“Why am I taking this test?”

We are taking the Diagnostic so that your teachers know what you can already do and what skills you need!

“Why is it important to do my best?”

We want to make sure you get lessons that keep YOU learning and growing. We want to make sure you get lessons that aren't too hard or boring.

Answer the Ws

“What is the test like?”

The test adapts, or changes, as you take it. That means some questions might be hard and some may be easier. You'll probably get about half of the questions right—that means the test is working perfectly! Remember, you won't be graded or get a score. Once you're finished, your teacher will know how to help you grow!

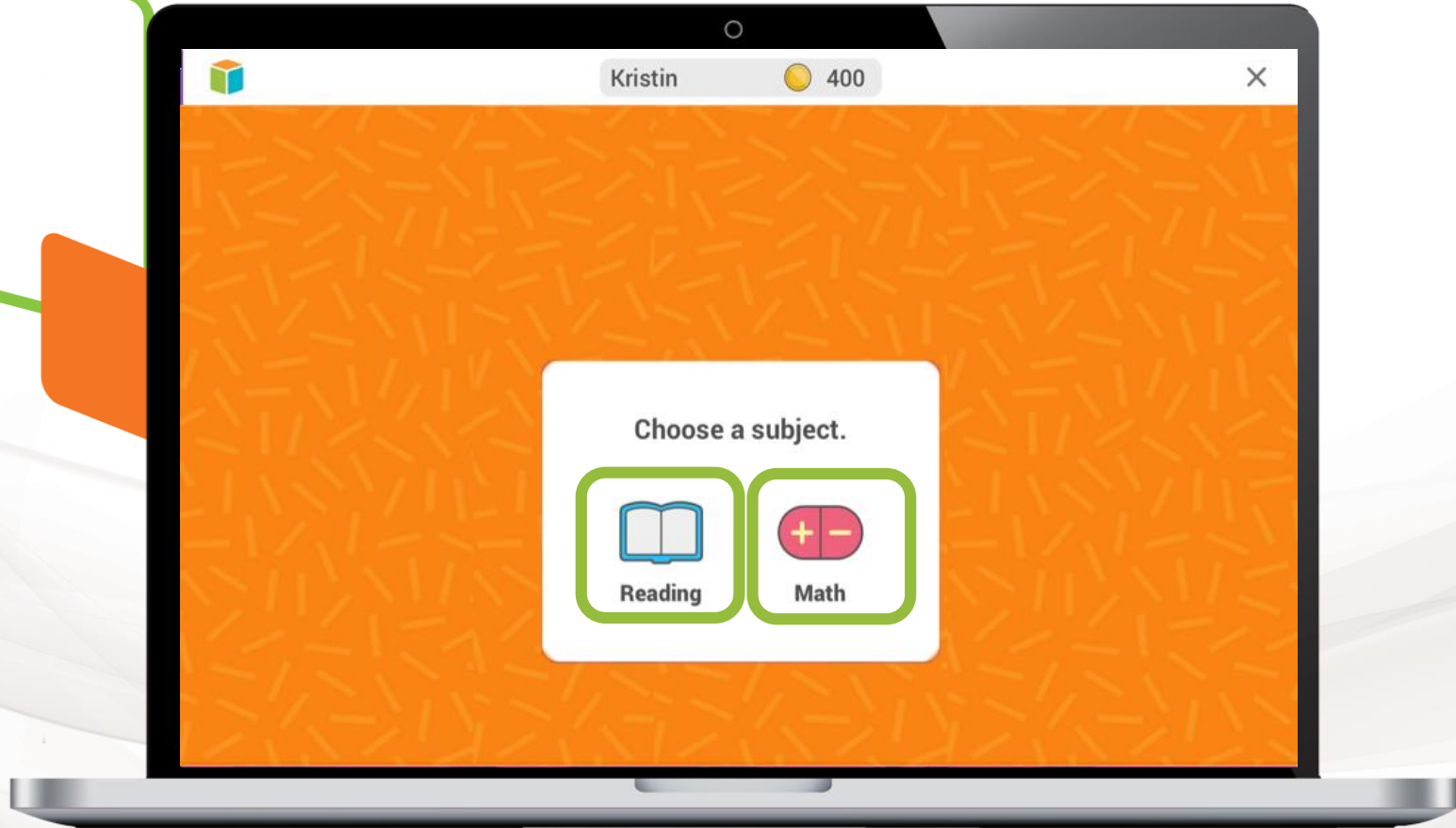
“What if I don’t know the answer?”

Try your best! Remember some questions are going to be hard and it’s okay if you don’t know the answer! Select the answer you think is best and keep on moving!

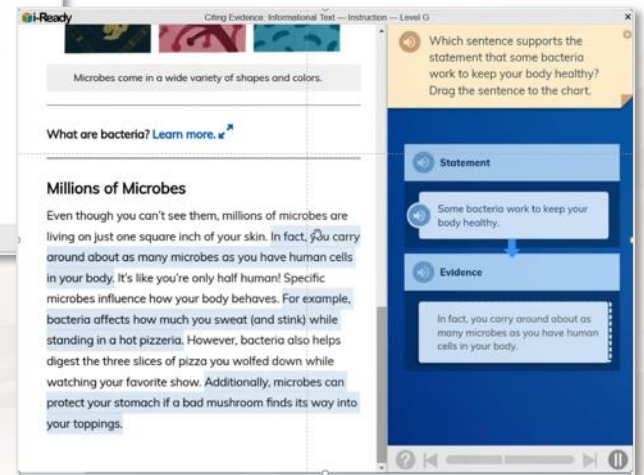

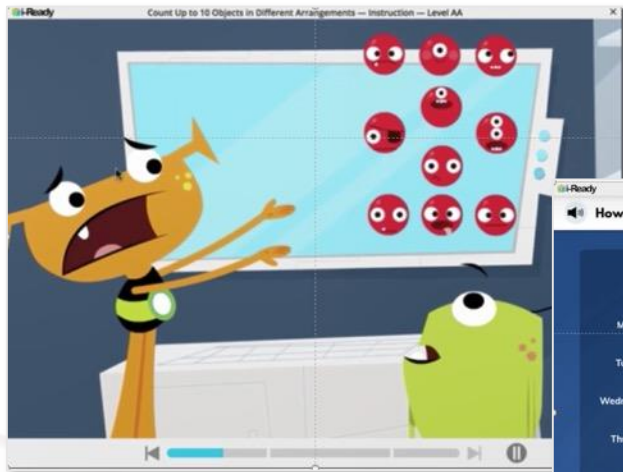

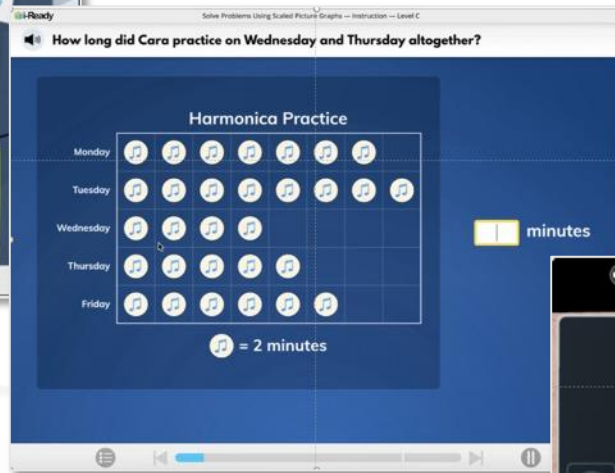

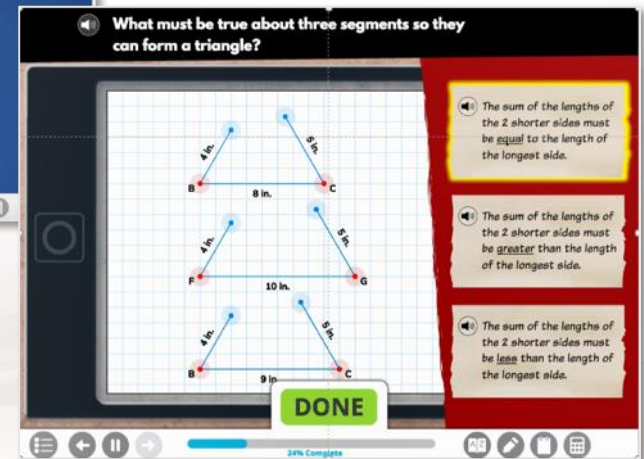

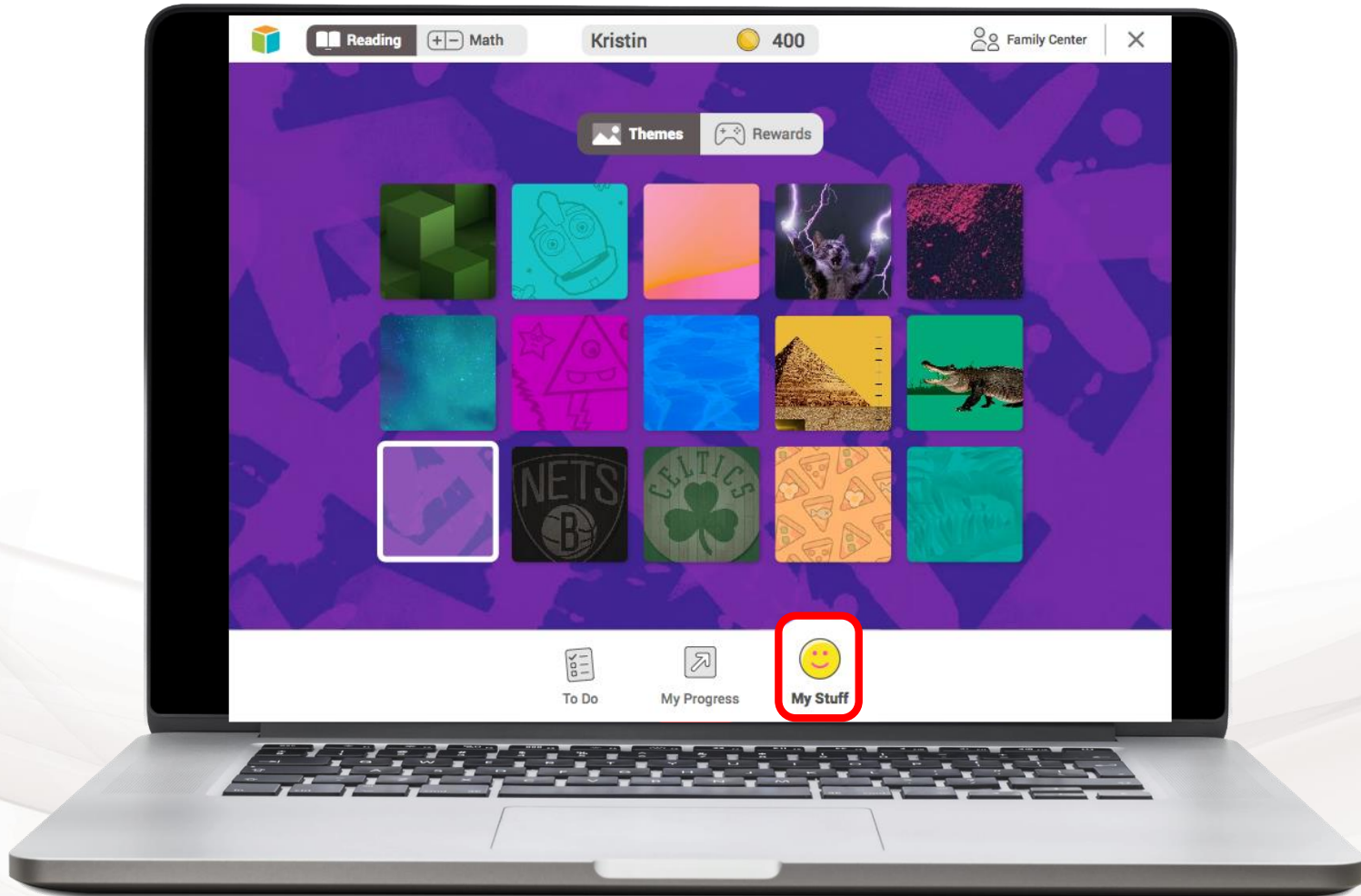
