SUBJECT: Budget Updates

These updates will include a current status of the COVID-19 one-time funds, as well as the ongoing annual budget.

#### 1. COVID-19 One-Time Funds

A total of \$114.8 million COVID-19 one-time funding has been, or soon will be, received from several State and Federal sources. There are a variety of spending restrictions, spending timelines, specific resource budget codes, and will span over several fiscal years. To date, the district has spent or encumbered \$59.2 million. Information will be shared on the possible uses of the remaining \$55.6 million. Spending plans will have an equity focus on students in the following areas: low income, English learners, foster youth, homeless students, students with disabilities, students at risk, disengaged students, students below grade level, students who did not enroll in kindergarten in 2020-21, credit-deficient students, and students at risk of not graduating.

The District will be spending from the funding sources based on the most restrictive first, as well as based on the sources with the shortest spending deadlines.

The one-time funding has greatly assisted the District in successfully getting through this past year and reopening our schools for in-person instruction. However, these funds will create a lot of complexity in budgeting for at least the next two fiscal years. It will be important to keep clear the issues of one-time funding and the ongoing budget stories of LCFF and declining enrollment, as well as manage the cliff effect caused when the one-time revenue is gone.

#### 2. Ongoing Annual Budget

Information will be reviewed from the Governor's May Revise, adjustments to the 2021-22 Fiscal Stabilization Plan, and a review of current enrollment projections.

This report will provide the Board of Education with information on the process followed for developing the Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant Plan. The Plan addresses the instructional strategies the District will implement to address student needs. The final plan will be submitted for Board approval at the June 1 meeting.

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant (ELO) was authorized by Assembly Bill 86 in conjunction with In-Person Instruction funding to expand in-person instructional time and provide academic interventions and pupil supports to address barriers to learning and accelerate progress to close learning gaps. These one-time funds are available to Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) through August 31, 2022. Grant funds are apportioned based on the LEA's local control funding formula plus \$1,000 per homeless student enrolled in the 2020-21 school year. On or before June 1, 2021, the governing board of an LEA receiving funds must adopt, at a public meeting, a plan describing the LEA's process for assessing the needs of pupils, the LEA's plan for informing parents of opportunities for supplemental supports, its plan for providing supplemental instruction and support, and how the LEA has involved parents and school staff in the development of the plan. Glendale Unified has been allocated \$17,626,747 in funding from this grant.

#### Grant funds may be used for:

- Extending instructional time by increasing the number of instructional days or minutes, providing summer school or intersessional instructional programs, or other actions that increase instructional time or services
- Accelerating progress to close achievement gaps
- Integrated supports to address barriers to learning
- Community learning hubs
- Supports for credit deficient pupils
- Additional academic services for pupils

• Training school staff on strategies including trauma-informed practices to engage pupils and families

At least 85 percent of the funds must be spent for providing in-person services for the allowable expenditures above. At least 10 percent must be spent to hire paraprofessionals with a priority on full-time paraprofessionals to provide supplemental instruction through the duration of the program, prioritizing English learners and individuals with exceptional needs. Up to 15 percent of the funds may be used to increase or improve services for pupils participating in distance learning or to prepare the LEA for in-person instruction.

As part of planning the new Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), the District has engaged stakeholders in a variety of ways throughout the school year. Multiple meetings were held and surveys administered to solicit input on addressing student needs. The meetings included, but were not limited to, Districtwide LCAP Stakeholder Meetings; Superintendent's Parent Advisory Committee (SPAC); District PTA; District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC); parent/guardian forums at schools; student voice panels; school and District administrator meetings; meetings with the bargaining units; SELPA; Board Meetings and Town Halls. The feedback from these forums continue to support the development of the Expanded Learning Opportunity (ELO) Grant.

To address the areas of identified needs, the District ELO Grant will provide a combination of District and school services. The District services will include expanded instructional time opportunities during summer, and to support acceleration and early literacy, the District will utilize paraprofessionals (Education Assistants) who will provide targeted support to identified students, including English learners and individuals with exceptional needs. Furthermore, community liaisons will support schools in building partnership with the families to support the whole child. Funds will be allocated to schools to address school specific needs, focusing on addressing academic achievement and mental health services.

The final plan will be submitted for approval at the Board of Education meeting on June 1, 2021.

This report provides the Board of Education with information on the need to revise existing Board Policies (BP) 6112 (School Day) and BP 6146.1 (High School Graduation Requirements) as recommended by the California School Boards Association (CSBA) and to comply with Education Code and federal and state laws.

#### BP 6112 - School Day

CSBA Update:

Last GUSD Update:

Staff recommends the Board of Education update the Board Policy (BP) 6112 to include the grade level instructional minutes approved by the Board on March 6, 2018, for Grades 1-12 and August 14, 2018, for Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten. The proposed revisions were developed in collaboration between District leadership and representatives from the Glendale Teachers Association.

The revision makes a slight change to the middle and high school minutes to account for a new seven-period day, block schedule, which will serve as the District's new default schedule. The new schedule also adheres to the late-start requirements for high schools, Education Code 46148, in which districts were to move start times to 8:30 a.m. as of the 2021-2022 school year.

When calculating the total number of instructional minutes, the time it takes students to travel between class periods is included in the total. In a seven-period blocked schedule, there are only three passing periods as opposed to five passing periods in a traditional six-period day. Over the course of a 180-day school year, the schedule redirects instructional minutes from passing periods and increases students' face time with teachers. Approximately two minutes a day (370 minutes total) is redirected for high schools and less than one minute a day (108 minutes total) for middle schools.

#### **BP 6146.1 - High School Graduation Requirements**

Staff recommends the Board update Board Policy (BP) 6146.1 to eliminate the five-credit career preparation requirement, beginning with the class of 2022. This requirement is outdated since students are encouraged to identify, select and complete Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway programs, Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) pathway programs and/or World Languages.

The revision to BP 6146.1 will also include language for VAPA to include CTE courses that are approved by the University of California Management Portal as VAPA-Interdisciplinary Art to be counted for the one-year VAPA graduation requirement.

The proposed revisions to BP 6112 and BP 6146.1 are presented to the Board for first reading. Should the consensus be to move forward, the policies will be on the June 1, 2021 meeting agenda for approval. Upon approval of the BPs, revisions will be made to the accompanying Administrative Regulations as needed following the normal District process.

Copies of the proposed revised BPs are attached to this memo.

#### School Day

The Board of Education shall fix the length of the school day subject to the provisions of law. (Education Code 46100)

The length of the school day shall apply equally to students with disabilities unless otherwise specified in the student's individualized education program or Section 504 plan.

•	Kindergarten	42,300

•	Grades 4-6	54,900

The schedule for elementary schools shall include at least one daily period of recess of at least 20 minutes in length in order to provide students with unstructured but supervised opportunities for physical activity.

#### **Secondary Schools:**

The District requirement for annual instructional minutes are:

- Middle Schools (Grades 6-8) 61,448
- High Schools (Grades 9-12) 65,970

In establishing the daily instructional schedule for each secondary school, the Superintendent or designee shall give consideration to course requirements and curricular demands, availability of school facilities, and applicable legal requirements.

The When schools maintain the total number of school days students attend, the Board of Education encourages flexibility in scheduling so as to provide longer time blocks or class periods when appropriate and desirable to support student learning, provide more intensive study of core academic subjects or extended exploration of complex topics, and reduce transition time between classes.

Prior to implementing a block schedule program in which secondary students attend class for fewer school days, the Board shall consult with the certificated and classified employees of the school in a good faith effort to reach agreement and shall also consult with parents/guardians of the students who would be affected by the change and the community at large. Such consultation shall include

at least one public hearing for which the Board has given adequate notice to the employees and to the parents/guardians of affected students. (Education Code 46162)

#### Instruction

#### High School Graduation Requirements

The Board of Education desires to prepare all students to successfully complete the high school course of study and obtain a diploma that represents their educational achievement and increases their opportunities for postsecondary education and employment.

- A. Minimum academic standards for a diploma of graduation from high schools in the Glendale Unified School District are as follows:
  - 1. Satisfactory completion of a minimum of two hundred and twenty (220) semester periods of credit earned in grades 9, 10, 11, and 12.
  - 2. Course Requirements

The following courses are required as part of the 220 semester credits taken in grades 9 through 12:

- a. English 4 years (40 credits), including Freshman and Sophomore English (Education Code 51225.3)
- b. Mathematics 20 credits Grades 9-12 including courses of study that include Integrated Math I and II Standards (Education Code 51225.3)

Integrated Math I and II courses successfully completed in grades 7 and or 8 can be used to meet this requirement. However, students are required to complete a minimum of 20 units of mathematics in grades 9-12 regardless of mathematics courses completed in grades 7 and 8. All students are encouraged to complete Integrated Math III and beyond to complete A-G requirements and be college and career ready.

c. Science – Requirements for the class of 2023 and prior years: 2 years (20 credits), including 1 year of Biological Science and 1 year of Physical Science (Education Code 51225.3)

Requirements beginning with the class of 2024: 3 years (30 credits), including 1 year of Living Earth, 1 year of Chemistry in the Earth System and 1 year of Physics of the Universe

d. Social Science - 3 years (30 credits), including 1 year World History, Culture and Geography, 1 year U.S. History, Culture and Geography, 1

semester American Government and Civics, and 1 semester Economics (Education Code 51225.3)

- e. World Languages/Languages other than English (LOTE)\* 1 year (10 credits)\* OR Fine Arts Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) 1 year (10 credits)\*\*. -a A student who chooses to take one year of world language World Languages/LOTE to fulfill this requirement must also take at least one semester (5 credits) of fine arts VAPA (f). in addition.
  - \* University of California A-G admission requirements include a minimum of 2 years of LOTE proficiency and 1 full year of VAPA credits.
- f. Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA)\*\* 1 semester year (5 10 credits) required unless fulfilled by "e" above VAPA course required unless fulfilled by "e" above or 1 year (10 credits) Career & Technical Education Course that qualifies as VAPA interdisciplinary art.
  - \*\* A CTE course must be approved as a University of California A-G "f" interdisciplinary art in order to fulfill the GUSD graduation and A-G requirement. To be counted towards meeting GUSD graduation requirements, a CTE course shall be aligned to the CTE model curriculum standards and framework adopted by the State Board of Education. (Education Code 51225.3)
  - \* A student who chooses to take one year of world language to fulfill this requirement must also take a VAPA course to fulfill one year (10 credits) for the A-G requirements.
  - \*\*A CTE VAPA course must be an approved course for A-G requirements to fulfill the A-G requirements. To be counted towards meeting graduation requirements, a CTE course shall be aligned to the CTE model curriculum standards and framework adopted by the State Board of Education. (Education Code 51225.3)
- g. Career Preparation 1 semester (5 credits)

Beginning with the class of 2022, career preparation (5 credits) is no longer a GUSD graduation requirement.

#### High School Graduation Requirements

- h. Health 1 semester (5 credits)
- i. Physical Education, unless the student has been otherwise exempted pursuant to other sections of the Education Code, 2 years (20 credits) (maximum of 40 semester credits applied toward graduation) (Education Code 51225.3)
- B. Because the prescribed course of study may not accommodate the needs of some students, the Board shall provide alternative means for the completion of prescribed courses in accordance with law.
- C. Students in grade 12 shall be enrolled in at least five courses each semester. This requirement shall not apply to students enrolled in career and technical education programs, community college courses, independent study, continuation education classes, work experience education programs, and special education programs as designated by the individualized education program.
- D. Exemptions from District-Adopted Graduation Requirements

District students are required to complete graduation course requirements specified above, including the requirements imposed by Education Code 51225.3 and those adopted by the Board.

However, a foster youth, homeless student, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, or migrant student who transfers into the District or between District schools any time after completing the second year of high school, or a newly arrived immigrant student who is in the third or fourth year of high school and is participating in a newcomer program, shall be exempted from any graduation requirements adopted by the Board that are in addition to statewide course requirements.

This exemption shall not apply if the Superintendent or designee makes a finding that the student is reasonably able to complete the requirements in time to graduate by the end of the fourth year of high school. Within 30 days of the transfer or of the commencement of participation in a newcomer program, as applicable, the Superintendent or designee shall notify any eligible student of the availability of the exemption and whether the student qualifies for it. (Education Code 51225.1)

#### E. Retroactive Diplomas

#### High School Graduation Requirements

Any student who completed grade 12 in the 2003-04 through 2014-15 school year and met all applicable graduation requirements other than the passage of the high school exit examination shall be granted a high school diploma. (Education Code 51413)

In addition, the District may retroactively grant high school diplomas to former students who: (Education Code 48204.4, 51430, 51440)

1. Departed California against their will while in grade 12 and did not receive a diploma because the departure interrupted their education, provided that they were in good academic standing at the time of the departure.

Persons may be considered to have departed California against their will if they were in custody of a government agency and were transferred to another state, were subject to a lawful order from a court or government agency that authorized their removal from California, were subject to a lawful order and were permitted to depart California before being removed from California pursuant to the lawful order, were removed or were permitted to depart voluntarily pursuant to the federal Immigration and Nationality Act, or departed due to other circumstances determined by the District that are consistent with the purposes of Education Code 48204.4.

In determining whether to award a diploma under these circumstances, the Superintendent or designee shall consider any coursework that may have been completed outside of the United States or through online or virtual courses.

2. Were interned by order of the federal government during World War II or who are honorably discharged veterans of World War II, the Korean War, or the Vietnam War, provided that they were enrolled in a District school immediately preceding the internment or military service and did not receive a diploma because their education was interrupted due to the internment or military service in those wars.

Deceased former students who satisfy these conditions may be granted a retroactive diploma to be received by their next of kin.

3. Are veterans who entered the military service of the United States while in grade 12 and who had satisfactorily completed the first half of the work required for grade 12 in a District school.

#### High School Graduation Requirements

4. Were in their senior year of high school during the 2019-20 school year, were in good academic standing and on track to graduate at the end of the 2019-20 school year as of March 1, 2020, and were unable to complete the statewide graduation requirements as a result of the COVID-19 crisis.

#### F. Honorary Diplomas

The Board may grant an honorary high school diploma to: (Education Code 51225.5)

- 1. An international exchange student who has not completed the course of study ordinarily required for graduation and who is returning to the home country following the completion of one academic school year in the District.
- 2. A student who is terminally ill.

The honorary diploma shall be clearly distinguishable from the regular diploma of graduation awarded by the District. (Education Code 51225.5)

#### Approval of Budget Adjustment for the Verdugo Woodlands Elementary School Bridge Project

On February 5, 2019, the Board approved a budget allocation of \$2,000,000 for the completion of the Verdugo Woodlands Bridge Project, funded by Measure S funds. On March 22, 2021, the District received and opened bids for this project. Following the receipt of bids, staff determined that the current approved budget was not sufficient to cover the total project costs, which include the base bid, allowance, and soft costs. Staff has determined that the project will require \$1,250,000 in additional funding to move forward with the project. A total project budget of \$3,250,000 would cover the following project costs:

• Hard Construction Costs	\$1,350,000

Completion of this project is imperative due to accessibility requirements set forth by DSA, and in order to obtain final DSA closeout on the Verdugo Woodlands ORG Project. An allowance of \$400,000 was given on this project for rock removal and unforeseen underground conditions, for a total project cost of \$1,750,000. This allowance will only be used if needed and upon approval by District staff. This project is anticipated to be completed by March 30, 2022. Bid details are available for review in the Procurement & Contract Services Department. This project will be funded by Measure S – Verdugo Woodlands Bridge Project funds.

An allowance of \$100,000 was given on this project for unforeseen underground utilities, rock removal, and excavation for a total project cost of \$592,900. This allowance will only be used if needed and upon approval by District staff. This project is anticipated to be completed by August 9, 2021. Bid details are available for review in the Procurement & Contract Services Department. This project will be funded by Measure S – Glenoaks Elementary School New Building Project funds.

This project is anticipated to be completed by August 9, 2021. Bid details are available for review in the Procurement & Contract Services Department. This project will be funded by Measure S – Monte Vista Elementary School New Building Project funds.

# • Approval of Change Order No. 5 to Lease-Leaseback Contract with Balfour Beatty Construction for the Glendale High School Aquatic Center Project, and Notice of Completion

On July 16, 2019, the Board approved the award of Lease-Leaseback contract to Balfour Beatty Construction for the Glendale High School Aquatic Center in the amount of \$13,348,345. This project budget allocation included the approval of a \$400,000 owner contingency for unforeseen conditions, and was not a part of the Contractor Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP).

Various modifications have been made to this project and contract, and have been approved by the Board as follows:

- On August 11, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$207,883.00
- On September 1, 2020, the Board approved an additional budget allocation of \$1,014,649 for the project to cover additional the project costs.
- On September 15, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$179,102.
- On October 6, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 3 in the amount of \$273,227.
- On November 17, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 4 in the amount of \$72,438.00

Planning and Development staff has continued to negotiate final costs of additional portions of the approved items on the project. The final negotiations for Change Order No. 5 included installation of a new irrigation system at the softball field, painting of existing privacy screens and ladders on Building A, installation of trench drains to meet Health Department requirements, installation of new railing to match existing railing, and a credit for the substitution of valves in the pool equipment room. These changes will also include a time extension of 104-calendar days on the project.

The total cost for these items was negotiated and resulted in Change Order No. 5 in the amount of \$89,108.14. This Change Order results in a 6.16% cumulative increase to the original contract and is within approved project budget, as well as the 10% project Change Order limit. This increases the total construction contract to \$14,170,103.14.

This project was completed in a satisfactory manner as of April 14, 2021 for a total cost of \$14,170,103.14. The project is funded by Measure S, Capital Outlay, Routine Restricted Maintenance, and Previous State funds.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 23 - A Commitment to Returning Students to In-Person Learning for the 2021-22 School Year, beginning the first day of school, August 18, 2021.

Glendale Unified School District is committed to meeting every child's academic and social emotional needs while protecting the health and safety of our students, employees, families, and community. At the May 4, 2021 Board of Education meeting, GUSD staff proposed the return all students for in-person learning, full-time, 5 days a week, beginning with the first day of school on August 18, 2021. The Board of Education was unanimously in support of this proposal and asked staff to prepare a resolution in support of in-person learning for their consideration and approval at the May 18 Board meeting.

As a next step, district staff will be scheduling meetings with our various stakeholder groups over the coming week, including the Return to School Committee, GTA, CSEA, GSMA, PTA, Superintendent's Parent Advisory, Student Advisory Council, etc. The District will continue to follow all health and safety guidelines and will be prepared to pivot to hybrid or distance learning instruction should the need arise.

The Board of Education is being asked to adopt the attached resolution affirming the Board's firm intention to ensure all students are able to attend full-time, five days a week, for in-person learning on the first day of school, August 18, 2021.

WHEREAS, Glendale Unified School District is committed to meeting every child's academic and social emotional needs while protecting the health and safety of our students, employees, families, and community; and

WHEREAS, due to the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic, public schools have been closed to full in-person instruction since March 16, 2020; and

WHEREAS, students have shown incredible resilience in the face of historic circumstances, educators and staff have put in tireless work to teach in unprecedented ways, and families have juggled simultaneously working in a pandemic and supporting distance learning; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 98 signed into law by Governor Newsom on June 29, 2020 mandates that the compulsory education requirements of Education Code section 48200 requiring pupils between the ages of 6 and 18 to attend school continues to apply in the 2020-21 school year, and accordingly further mandates that all school districts "shall offer in-person instruction to the greatest extend possible" during the 2020-2021 school year (Ed Code §435049 a & b); and

WHEREAS, Glendale Unified School District has reopened for limited in-person learning on March 29 for elementary students and April 12 for secondary students; and

WHEREAS, in-person learning historically has proven to be the most effective form of learning for the majority of students because it allows them to develop socially and emotionally while exploring ideas and dynamic social situations among their teachers and peers; and

WHEREAS, a recent study by Policy Analysis for California Education found that "there has been significant learning loss in both English Language Arts (ELA) and Math, with students in earlier grades most affected," and that "certain student groups, especially low-income students and English language learners (ELLs), are falling behind more compared to others;" and

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2021, Los Angeles County entered the yellow tier of the state's reopening blueprint, allowing for the broadest reopening of the economy since the pandemic began more than a year ago; and

WHEREAS, Governor Gavin Newsom has announced that on June 15, 2021, the state of California will "fully reopen," and the color-coded tier system and other COVID-19 restrictions will be phased out as vaccinations increase and community spread decreases; and

WHEREAS, the Glendale Unified School District has successfully facilitated COVID-19 vaccinations to all staff members and students 16 years and older who wanted the vaccine.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Glendale Unified School District Board of Education as follows:

- Section 1: The Board of Education reaffirms the authority delegated to the Superintendent in Emergency Resolution No. 10, dated March 13, 2020.
- Section 2: The Board values and commits to working with staff, parents, students, and labor partners as needed, to ensure that all District students would be able to return to full-time, in-person instruction on the first day of the 2021-22 academic calendar.
- Section 3. The Board instructs staff to expand in-person learning time/opportunities before the end of the 2020-21 school year, where and when it is possible.
- Section 4. That upon return to the 2021-22 school year, August 18, 2021, students should have access to as many career and extracurricular programs as health and safety guidelines allow.
- Section 5. Through summer programs, expanded learning opportunities along with regular learning, the District will be supporting the social-emotional and mental health needs of our system while ensuring a rigorous academic program.

Section 6. Mitigating the learning loss deepened by distance learning will remain a priority throughout the 2021-22 school year.

On July 16, 2019, the Board approved the award of Lease-Leaseback contract to Balfour Beatty Construction for the Glendale High School Aquatic Center in the amount of \$13,348,345. Various modifications have been made to this project and contract, and have been approved by the Board as follows:

- On September 15, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 2 in the amount of \$179,102.
- On October 6, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 3 in the amount of \$273,227.
- On November 17, 2020, the Board approved Change Order No. 4 in the amount of \$72,438.00

Planning and Development staff has continued to negotiate final costs of additional portions of the approved items on the project. The final negotiations for Change Order No. 5 included installation of a new irrigation system at the softball field, painting of existing privacy screens and ladders on Building A, installation of trench drains to meet Health Department requirements, installation of

new railing to match existing railing, and a credit for the substitution of valves in the pool equipment room. These changes will also include a time extension of 104-calendar days on the project.

The total cost for these items was negotiated and resulted in Change Order No. 5 in the amount of \$89,108.14. This Change Order results in a 6.16% cumulative increase to the original contract and is within approved project budget, as well as the 10% project Change Order limit. This increases the total construction contract to \$14,170,103.14.

This project was completed in a satisfactory manner as of April 14, 2021 for a total cost of \$14,170,103.14. The project is funded by Measure S, Capital Outlay, Routine Restricted Maintenance, and Previous State funds.

SUBJECT: Approval of AP World History Instructional Material Adoption

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve the adoption of AMSCO World History Modern: 1200 to Present instructional materials for Advanced Placement World History starting in the Fall of 2021.

These changes typically require updated instructional materials to match the updated course content. Recently, the College Board updated the course content for AP World History with a significant change in the time period covered by the course from beginning in 1450 CE to 1200 CE, starting in the 2019-2020 school year. This change is significant and positive because it will ensure teachers and students can begin the course with a study of the civilizations in Africa, the Americas, and Asia that are foundational to the modern era. The course is also better aligned to California World History Standards. Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) AP World History teachers concluded that their current instructional materials are not adequate to address the changes to the AP World History course content and examination.

Currently, two of the four high schools offering AP History courses are using the AP World History course for 10<sup>th</sup> grade: Clark Magnet High School and Hoover High School. The other two high schools, Crescenta Valley High School and Glendale High School, are using AP European History for 10<sup>th</sup> grade. In the past, the AP European History course was better aligned to the California World History Standards and the previous versions of the World History course were generally regarded as covering far too much content than could be adequately covered in a one-year course. With this recent revision and the prior revision, the AP World History Course now better aligns to the California standards and covers a more reasonable amount of content. When the current adoption cycle for AP European history concludes, the History-Social Science Curriculum Study Committee (CSC) will consider which course best meets the needs of GUSD students. There is general

agreement that the AP World History course offers a more culturally relevant and responsive curriculum than the AP European History course.

In February of 2021, the AP World History teachers at Clark Magnet High School and Hoover High School initiated a process to identify and assess instructional materials for adoption recommendation. This process narrowed to two choices:

- World History: Modern [1200-Present] (AP Edition) AMSCO Perfection Learning, 2020
- Ways of the World: A Global History with Sources: For AP World History Modern Course Since 1200 C.E, Bedford, Freeman and Worth, Fourth Edition, Strayer and Nelson, 2020.

The committee also included AP European History teachers from Glendale High School and Crescenta Valley High School as informed observers.

This committee process ended with a final recommendation for GUSD to adopt World History Modern: 1200 to Present from AMSCO. The History-Social Science CSC approved the recommendation for adoption on April 20, 2021. High school principals approved the recommendation on April 23, 2021. The textbook information is available for community input on the GUSD website and copies are available for review in the Educational Services department at the District office.

# Next Steps

Pending Board approval, approximately 205 bundles will be ordered for Clark Magnet and Hoover High Schools. The cost of the Student Edition Bundle including the student textbook and interactive eBook is approximately \$40,000 and will be funded by the Educational Services department.

**Learning Programs** 

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve a services agreement between Glendale Unified School District and Sports for Learning in the amount of \$92,625 to provide a blended social-emotional and sports program at selected District elementary schools during the summer expanded learning programs.

In August 2020, to support elementary teachers, the Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) contracted with Sports for Learning to develop asynchronous lessons to support K–3 physical fitness and social-emotional well-being. Sports for Learning lessons blended programs such as STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) and PBIS (Positive Behavior Support & Interventions) with sports fitness.

The Sports for Learning curriculum provides fun, physically active games and sports as a vehicle to engage students in Social Emotional Learning (SEL). Lessons incorporate the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL) best practices into their curriculum. CASEL is a trusted source for knowledge about high-quality, evidence-based SEL. CASEL supports educators and policy leaders and enhances the experiences and outcomes for all PreK-12 students. Sports for Learning lessons focus on specific SEL skills throughout the course of the program, with a main goal of getting students to practice and gain proficiency in a range of skills. The curriculum is also aligned with the California Physical Education and Health Standards.

With the expansion of summer opportunities for elementary students, social-emotional learning and physical fitness were areas that parents expressed interest in as students had been at home for over a year due to school closures resulting from the COVID-19

pandemic. This caused a lack of interaction between students as well as the opportunity to be physically active.

Sports for Learning has designed the following program for GUSD:

# Camp EXCEL

During the 3-hour, 15-minute morning Camp EXCEL period, principals and parents expressed a desire to have enrichment activities within the program, so the program would have fun and exciting classes intermingled with reading and math instruction.

Sports for Learning will provide weekly lessons to students during the Camp EXCEL experience. The cost for Sports for Learning to provide one coach at each of the 20 elementary schools, if needed, would be a maximum/not to exceed \$92,625. GUSD elementary physical education (PE) teachers will be offered the assignment to teach during Camp EXCEL first. A Sports for Learning coach will fill the position at any school where a PE teacher is not placed. Therefore, staff anticipates the maximum amount of the agreement may not be reached.

Funding for this agreement will be covered by the Expanded Learning Opportunities Grant authorized by Assembly Bill 86.

District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions:

- 5. Independent Contractor. Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, Contractor is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, District being interested only in the results obtained.
- 6. **Materials**. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows:
- 7. Copyright/Trademark/Patent. Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District. Contractor consents to use of Contractor's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

#### 8. Termination.

- 8.1. Without Cause by District. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 8.2. Without Cause by Contractor. Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Contractor shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services to District. Contractor acknowledges that this sixty (60) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- 8.3. With Cause by District. District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - 8.3.1. material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or
  - 8.3.2. any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - 8.3.3. Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the required services from another Contractor. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceed the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to the District upon the receipt of the District's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

9. **Indemnification**. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold free and harmless the District, its Board of Education, agents, representatives, officers, Contractors, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("the indemnified parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, costs, expenses, judgments, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, nature and description, in law or equity ("Claim"), to property or persons including, but not limited to, personal injury, bodily injury, death, property damage, and Contractors' and/or attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, Contractors, or agents, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages; or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by the Contractor in conjunction with this Agreement, unless the claims are caused wholly by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District. The District shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that Contractor proposes to defend the indemnified parties.

- 10.2. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance**. The Contractor shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:

  - 10.2.2. Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to which cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.

An endorsement stating that the District and its Board of Education, agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, Contractors, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District. An endorsement shall also state that there shall be a waiver of any subrogation.
    - 10.2.4. All policies except the Professional Liability, Workers' Compensation Insurance, and Employers' Liability Insurance Policies shall be written on an occurrence form.
- 10.3. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 11. **Assignment**. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

- 12. Compliance with Laws. Debarment and Suspension. Contractor warrants and certifies that neither Contractor, nor any person working for or acting on behalf of Contractor as part of this Agreement, has been or is debarred, penalized by, convicted, sanctioned, suspended, excluded or otherwise ineligible to participate in any state or federal program, or by any federal department or agency, or by Los Angeles County
- 13. Certificates/Permits/Licenses. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. **Employment with Public Agency**. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. **Anti-Discrimination**. District programs, activities, practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics and therefore the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Contractor agrees to require like compliance by all of its subcontractor(s).
- 16. **Fingerprinting of Employees**. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Contractor's performing of any portion of the Services.
- 17. No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 18. District's Evaluation of Contractor and Contractor's Employees and/or Subcontractors. The District may evaluate the Contractor in any way the District is entitled pursuant to applicable law. The District's evaluation may include, without limitation:
  - 18.1. Requesting that District employee(s) evaluate the Contractor and the Contractor's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
  - 18.2. Announced and unannounced observance of Contractor, Contractor's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 19. Limitation of District Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue,

arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.

20. Confidentiality. The Contractor and all Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. Contractor understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

Both parties will maintain in confidence and safeguard all confidential information, as defined in this paragraph, of the other party, it affiliates, and its customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise identified as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure or by law, and includes but is not limited to, trade secrets, know-how, inventions, techniques, data, customers list, personal information, financial information, sales, and marketing plans of the other party, its affiliates, or its customers. Both parties recognize and acknowledge the confidential and proprietary nature of any Confidential Information and acknowledge the irreparable harm that could result if such confidential information is disclosed to a third party or used for unauthorized purposes. Each party agrees to use any Confidential Information only for the purpose of conduction business with each other and their clients in the manner contemplated by this Agreement. Both parties will restrict disclosure of any Confidential Information to only those personnel who have a need to know and will bind such personnel to obligations of confidentiality to the same extent that each party is bound by this Agreement. Upon request of the owner of the confidential information, the other party will promptly return or destroy all materials incorporating any Confidential Information and any copies. The obligation under this paragraph do not apply to information that: 1) is or becomes generally known or in the public domain through no act or omission of the other party; 2) was lawfully in Insight's or Client's possession without restriction as to use or disclosure before its receipt from the other party; 3) is received from, or was made available to, a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; 4) was independently developed; 5) is otherwise permitted to be disclosed under this Agreement; 6) is disclosed with the prior written consent of the disclosing party; or 7) is required to be disclosed in any civil or criminal legal proceeding, regulatory proceeding or any similar process, however, the party required to make the disclosure under the law shall give prompt notice of this to the other party prior to such disclosure so that the other party may seek an appropriate protective order or give its consent to such disclosure.

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. - 22. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 26. **Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted.** Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.

- 36. **Delivery.** Time of delivery of goods or services is of the essence in this Contract. District reserves the right to refuse any goods or services and to cancel all or any part of the goods not conforming to applicable specifications, drawings, samples or descriptions or services that do not conform to the prescribed statement of work. Acceptance of any part of the order of goods shall not District to accept shipments nor deprive it of the right to return goods already accepted at Contractor's expense. Over shipments and under shipments of goods shall be only as agreed to in writing by District. Delivery shall not be deemed to be complete until all goods or services have actually been received and accepted in writing by District.
- 37. Conduct on District Premises. The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve an agreement with Sports for Learning for Summer Camp Program at selected elementary schools in the amount of \$1,286,208 from July 6, 2021 to August 13, 2021, funded by COVID-19 funds.

Sports for Learning will be providing full-day summer programming for the following seven elementary schools sites: Glenoaks, Franklin, Jefferson, Keppel, Monte Vista, Mountain Avenue, and Verdugo Woodlands. Each site will host 120 students and operate from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm. The program and curriculum blends social emotional learning with physical education, is staffed at a 15 to 1 ratio, and will operate following all applicable COVID-19 health and safety protocols.

**TO SUPPORT 2020-2021 BOARD PRIORITY NO. 1:** Maximize Student Achievement - Close the digital and equity gap; offer robust distance, hybrid, and in-person learning programs; and address learning loss and improve attendance.

**TO SUPPORT 2020-2021 BOARD PRIORITY NO. 2:** Foster a Positive Culture of Learning – Ensure equitable teaching and learning opportunities led by excellence; support culturally relevant curriculum that emphasizes inclusion; and increase parent and family engagement opportunities.

**TO SUPPORT 2020-2021 BOARD PRIORITY NO. 3:** Ensure the Health and Safety of GUSD Students and Employees – Strengthen mental health support and programs; develop proactive health and safety procedures; and support physical, social, and emotional wellbeing.

#### SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement for Professional Services ("Agreement") made and entered into by and between the Glendale Unified School District ("District"), a public entity, and Sports for Learning, herein after referred to as ("Contractor").

The parties do hereby contract and agree as follows:

#### 1. <u>Term</u>

Contractor shall commence providing services under this Agreement from July 6, 2021 through August 13, 2021.

### 2. Scope of Services

Contractor will provide a full-day summer program for students enrolled in the District at the following seven (7) elementary campuses: Benjamin Franklin (1610 Lake St, Glendale, CA 91201); Mark Keppel Visual and Performing Arts Magnet (730 Glenwood Rd, Glendale, CA 91202); Glenoaks (2015 E Glenoaks Blvd, Glendale, CA 91206); Monte Vista (2620 Orange Ave, La Crescenta-Montrose, CA 91214); Mountain Avenue (2307 Mountain Ave., La Crescenta-Montrose, CA 91214); Thomas Jefferson (540 Fifth Street, Glendale, CA 91201); and Verdugo Woodlands (1751 North Verdugo Road, Glendale, CA 91208). Contractor will fully staff the program with the necessary personnel to cover every aspect required of a full day summer program including but not limited to the following areas of support: drop-off/pick-up, health screening of students, in classroom and outdoor activities with all necessary supplies and/or equipment, snack and lunchtime supervision, before and after childcare program to ensure hours of operation from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., parent communication, following all COVID-19 health and safety protocols, etc.

Contractor's specific program and services performed is described in "Scope of Work" attached hereto as Addendum A and fully incorporated herein.

#### 3. Compensation

District agrees to pay the Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement a set for in Addendum A "Scope of Work." District shall pay Contractor the amount set forth in Addendum B "Cost Proposal" according to the following terms and conditions: Contractor will invoice the District for four (4) installments. The first installment of \$200,000.00 will be due no later than two weeks prior to the beginning of the program. The remaining three (3) installments shall be invoiced by Contractor to the District as outlined in Addendum B.

Invoices should be submitted to Accounts Payable Department, Glendale Unified School District, 223 N. Jackson Street, Glendale, CA 91206.

#### 4. Expenses

District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing services for District that are not specifically identified in Addendum B "Cost Proposal" and factored into the compensation paid by the District to the Contractor.

#### 5. Materials

Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement.

## 6. Independent Contractor

In the performance of this Agreement, Contractor shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Workers' Compensation. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, Contractor is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, District being interested only in the results obtained.

### 7. Joint Employer

Neither party shall be deemed a joint employer of the other party's employees. Each party shall indemnify the other party from and against claims made by the indemnifying party's employees that they are co-employed by the other party. Neither party's employees will be deemed "leased" employees of the other for any purpose. In connection with this Agreement, each party is an independent contractor and does not have any authority to bind or commit the other.

# 8. Contractor's Employee Processing

- Employee Eligibility Verification: The Contractor warrants that it fully complies with all (i) Federal and State statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and that all its employees performing work under this Contract meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in Federal statutes and regulations. The Contractor shall obtain, from all employees performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by Federal or State statutes and regulations including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 U.S.C. §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. The Contractor shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees for the period prescribed by the law. The Contractor shall indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by District, and hold harmless, the District, its agents, officers, and employees from employer sanctions and any other liability which may be assessed against the Contractor or the District or both in connection with any alleged violation of any Federal or State statutes or regulations pertaining to the eligibility for employment of any persons performing work under this Contract.
- (ii) Fingerprinting and Criminal Background Check: Contractor shall complete the background check requirements of California Education Code section 45125.1 for all of its employees who will be working on the District's school sites with students. The Contractor shall not staff the summer program with any employees who have been convicted of a violent felony listed in California Penal Code section 1192.7(c). The Contractor shall provide the District with fingerprinting/criminal background check for all employees who will be used to staff the summer program.
- (iii) **Tuberculosis Clearance**: Contractor will ensure that all of its employees who will be working on the District's school sites with students are determined to be free of active tuberculosis by a medical professional.

# 9. Conduct on District Premises

Contractor shall, at all times, comply with and abide by all reasonable policies and procedures of the District (or that may be established thereby, from time to time) that pertain to conduct on the District's premises, possession or distribution of contraband, or the access to, and security of, the Party's real property or facilities, to the extent that the Contractor has been provided with a copy of each such policy or procedure. Contractor shall exercise due care and diligence to prevent any injury to persons or damage to property while on the other District premises. Contractor covenants that at all times during the term it, and its employees, agents, and Subcontractors shall comply with, and take no action that results in the District being in violation of, any applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, and rules. Contractor's personnel shall clearly identify themselves as Contractor's personnel and not as employees of the District. When on the District premises, Contractor's personnel shall wear and clearly display identification badges or tags, as approved by the District. Contractor's employees shall not smoke or use profanity or other inappropriate language while on site. Contractor's employees shall not enter the facility while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other intoxicants and shall not have such materials in their possession.

#### 10. Anti-Discrimination

District programs, activities, practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics and therefore the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Contractor agrees to require like compliance by all of its subcontractor(s).

## 11. Indemnification

Contractor agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the District, its Board of Education, officers, agents, volunteers, and employees, individually and collectively, from and against all costs, losses, claims, demands, suits, actions, expenses, liability, damage, injury, payments and judgments, including legal and attorney fees, arising from personal or bodily injuries, property damage or otherwise, regardless of and however caused, brought or recovered against any of the above arising out of or incident to any alleged acts, negligence, omissions or willful misconduct of the Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, agents, consultants and contractors arising out of or in connection with the performance of the Services, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages and attorney fees and other related costs and expenses. Contractor shall defend, at Contractor's own cost, expense and risk, any and all such aforesaid suits, actions or other legal proceedings of every kind that may be brought or instituted against the District, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents or volunteers. Contractor shall pay and satisfy any judgment, award or decree that may be rendered against District or its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents or volunteers, in any such suit, action or other legal proceeding resulting from services rendered by Contractor. Contractor shall reimburse District and its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents and volunteers, for any and all legal expenses and costs incurred by each of them in connection therewith or in enforcing the indemnity herein provided. Contractor's obligation to indemnify shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the District, its directors, officials, officers, employees, agents or volunteers.

# 12. Limitation of District Liability

Other than as provided in this Agreement, the District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall the District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.

## 13. Confidentiality

The Contractor and all Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. Contractor understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

Both parties will maintain in confidence and safeguard all confidential information, as defined in this paragraph, of the other party, it affiliates, and its customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise identified as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure or by law, and includes but is not limited to, trade secrets, know-how, inventions, techniques, data, customers list, personal information, financial information, sales, and marketing plans of the other party, its affiliates, or its customers. Both parties recognize and acknowledge the confidential and proprietary nature of any Confidential Information and acknowledge the irreparable harm that could result if such confidential information is disclosed to a third party or used for unauthorized purposes. Each party agrees to use any Confidential Information only for the purpose of conduction business with each other and their clients in the manner contemplated by this Agreement. Both parties will restrict disclosure of any Confidential Information to only those personnel who have a need to know and will bind such personnel to obligations of confidentiality to the same extent that each party is bound by this Agreement. Upon request of the owner of the confidential information, the other party will promptly return or destroy all materials incorporating any Confidential Information and any copies. The obligation under this paragraph do not apply to information that: 1) is or becomes generally known or in the public domain through no act or omission of the other party; 2) was lawfully in Insight's or Client's possession without restriction as to use or disclosure before its receipt from the other party; 3) is received from, or was made available to, a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; 4) was independently developed; 5) is otherwise permitted to be disclosed under this Agreement; 6) is disclosed with the prior written consent of the disclosing party; or 7) is required to be disclosed in any civil or criminal legal proceeding, regulatory proceeding or any similar process, however, the party required to make the disclosure under the law shall give prompt notice of this to the other party prior to such disclosure so that the other party may seek an appropriate protective order or give its consent to such disclosure.

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## 14. Insurance

The Contractor shall procure and maintain at all times it performs any portion of the Services the following insurance with minimum limits equal to the amount indicated below.

Contractor shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employers' Liability Insurance for all of its employees performing any portion of the Services. In accordance with provisions of section 3700 of the California Labor Code, the Contractor shall be required to secure workers' compensation coverage for its employees. If any class of employee or employees engaged in performing any portion of the Services under this Agreement are not protected under the Workers' Compensation Statute, adequate insurance coverage for the protection of any employee(s) not otherwise protected must be obtained before any of those employee(s) commence performing any portion of the Services.

Contractor shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:

- (i) A clause stating: "SHOULD ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED POLICIES BE CANCELLED BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF, NOTICE WILL BE DELIVERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY PROVISION."
- (ii) Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to which cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.
- (iii) An endorsement stating that the District and its Board of Education, agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, contractors, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District. An endorsement shall also state that there shall be a waiver of any subrogation.
- (iv) All policies except the Professional Liability, Workers' Compensation Insurance, and Employers' Liability Insurance Policies shall be written on an occurrence form.

Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.

# 15. Termination

- (i) Without Cause by District: District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- (ii) Without Cause by Contractor: Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Contractor shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services to District. Contractor acknowledges that this sixty (60) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- (iii) With Cause by District: District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - a) Material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor;
  - b) Any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - c) Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the required services from another Contractor. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceed the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to the District upon the receipt of the District's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

# 16. Certificates/Permits/Licenses

Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.

#### 17. Delivery

Time of delivery of goods or services is of the essence in this Agreement. District reserves the right to refuse any goods or services and to cancel all or any part of the goods not conforming to applicable specifications, drawings, samples or descriptions or services that do not conform to the prescribed statement of work. Acceptance of any part of the order of goods shall not District to accept shipments nor deprive it of the right to return goods already accepted at Contractor's expense. Over shipments and under shipments of goods shall be only as agreed to in writing by District. Delivery shall not be deemed to be complete until all goods or services have actually been received and accepted in writing by District.

# 18. Notice

Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, served, and received if given in writing and either personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, or sent by overnight delivery service, or facsimile transmission, addressed as follows:

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. Any notice given by mail shall be effective three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail.

#### 19. Assignment

The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

# 20. No Rights in Third Parties

This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.

# 21. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties

This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties. In the event an express conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of the any attachments or exhibits, the terms of this Agreement will prevail.

If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.

## 27. Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted

Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.

# 28. Authority to Bind Parties

Neither party in the performance of any and all duties under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, has any authority to bind the other to any agreements or undertakings.

#### 29. Attorneys' Fees and Costs

Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs and attorneys' fees.

#### 30. Headings

Paragraph headings in this Agreement are used solely for convenience, and shall be wholly disregarded in the construction of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted for or against a party because that party or its legal representative drafted such provision, and this Agreement shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the Parties.

# 31. Signature Authority

Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been properly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement.

This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.

# SCOPE OF WORK DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

Sports For Learning will be providing full-day Summer programming for 7 school sites (Glenoaks, Franklin, Jefferson, Keppel, Monte Vista, Mountain Ave, and Verdugo Woodlands) in the Glendale Unified School District. This service will take place from July 6th to August 13th, Monday through Friday, from 7 am to 6 pm. Each site will host 120 students. SFL will be providing 8 full-time staff per school (56 total) in order to maintain a 15 to 1 ratio with all students. On top of the full-time staff, SFL will also be recruiting, hiring, and training additional floater staff to ensure the success of the program. SFL has partnerships/relationships with Colleges/Universities throughout the state where we recruit current and recently graduated students to act as near-peer mentors and role models to the students while running our program.

Our staff receives training on the Sports For Learning program/curriculum which blends Social Emotional Learning with Physical Education. This curriculum is aligned with CASEL's core competencies as well as California Physical Education state standards. Students will throughout the day play fun engaging games that focus on learning SEL topics and vocabulary. We design specific programming for TK-2, 3-5, and 6-8 grade levels.

Along with our SEL and Physical Activity curriculum, our Summer Program staff is also trained in other areas. This includes not only supporting extracurricular areas of interest such as art and music, but we also cover topics in order to focus on the whole child in order to create a well-rounded experience for students such as creativity, exploration, and reflection. The SFL team will follow a daily schedule with activities mapped out for the entire program.

As far as on-site support our staff provides, that ranges from drop-off/pick-up, health screening of students, in classroom and outdoor activities with all necessary supplies and/or equipment, snack and lunchtime supervision, before and after childcare program to ensure hours of operation from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., parent communication, following all COVID-19 health and safety protocols, etc.

efforts of our teachers during a tumultuous year. They appreciate everything they do beyond the classroom for our students, as well.

- 2. Taline Arsenian, President of GTA, said as we acknowledged Teachers Appreciation Week let us remember the extraordinary challenges we faced this year. The Board's acknowledgment today of GTA members is appreciated; however, it is not enough. They need a real seat at the table. Include educators in the decision-making process. This year, they have been the last to know about changes to safety and working conditions. If you want to appreciate teachers, treat them like real stakeholders and education experts. Trust your educators. Morale is at an all-time low. Stop union bashing. The union's special interest is GUSD students. They believe that GUSD children deserve a quality education. They are trained credential high-quality professionals. Teacher appreciation is not a day in May, it is a lifestyle. She thanked the GUSD parents. On behalf of GTA Board, she expressed to the teachers and nurses, that they hear them and will advocate for them always because advocating for them means advocating for students.
- 3. <u>Letetsia Fox</u>, CSEA-Los Angeles Chapter, said since 1986, the third week in May has been designated as Classified Employees Week. The CSEA theme this year is "we are essential workers" getting it done. The work of our classified employees should not go unnoticed and should be celebrated. Many classified workers continued to work during the pandemic to serve our students, families, and employees. Let us celebrate these employees. They are requesting that our administrators participate in Shadow Day.
- 4. Monica Han, CSEA Board of Directors, spoke on behalf of the classified members of Glendale chapter. She asked the Board to take the time and get to know their classified employees first hand.

May 16 starts the week of Classified Employees Week, celebrating the unsung heroes of our district. They would like to propose that our board members and administrators shadow an employee for a few hours to see what they do. She thanked all classified staff members for everything that they do for our district and students.
- 6. <u>Elena Chamorro</u>, parent, urged GUSD to hold outdoor, in-person promotion ceremonies. It cannot be left to the individual schools whether they will hold inperson or zoom ceremonies. As promotion plans are being communicated, her elementary school is planning a drive by and zoom ceremony. Students should be recognized in person, especially since we are in the least restrictive yellow tier. Many concessions were given to teacher union requirements. Now it is time for the Board to uphold their mission in providing a high quality education addressing the unique potential of each student in a safe and engaging environment.

- 7. Sara Morrison, GTA Bargaining Chair, spoke on the proposed GUSD Virtual School. GTA's Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) states that if GUSD wishes to open a virtual school, both GTA and GUSD agree to come back to the table to negotiate. Since this has not happened, why is the Board voting today. The CBA is a mutual agreement. In order for a program like this to be successful, it would need to be a collaborative endeavor. GUSD high school teachers will not be designing the curriculum for these students in any of the core subjects. Instead, the plan is these courses will be delivered by a computerize curriculum called APEX. APEX has been used in our district for credit recovery. APEX courses can be completed in just a few weeks. The APEX assignments can be googled easily. Our students deserve an authentic, general education experience. They need teachers in order to grow up into productive citizens. Before you vote, we need to negotiate.
- 6. Sara Branscon, parent, requested a commitment from the Board starting this fall for five days a week in-person instruction and four days a week for the remainder of this year. As grateful as she is that her son is attending two days a week, she feels sad when she thinks about next year being an extension of what we have today, part-time hybrid learning. If we do not open full time in the fall, we will continue to lose more parents, donations, volunteers, and happy and engaged students. We will continue moving with caution ignoring the studies and science. She is pleading with the Board to make logical choices, do not over complicate this. Show us your leadership and open our schools full time.
- 7. Sera Bovlos, parent, said schools across the country have opened full-time except for California. It is very clear it is a political union issue. It is estimated that 600 to 1000 students are already planning not to return next fall. The primary reason is that the campuses will not be open five days week. Parents need confirmation before the end of the school year in June whether schools will open for in-person instruction this fall. Both parents and teachers need time to plan accordingly. As CDC, the President, and medical boards have stated, schools are safe to reopen.

**Programs to Support English Language Development** 

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve the purchase of Heggerty Phonemic Awareness kits in the amount of \$12,828.98 for use at all elementary school sites in grades K-6 for the Summer Camp EXCEL program, school year intervention and enrichment programs to support English Language Development, phonics, and phonemic awareness instruction and support.

In the summer of 2021-2022, all 20 elementary schools in the Glendale Unified School District will host Camp EXCEL offering students a high impact, high quality summer program. English learners will be provided with targeted instruction to advance their language proficiency through the use of the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness kits.

Supporting students in foundational skills, phonemic awareness and word recognition in a systematic and structured manner are critical components of the California English Language Arts/English Language Development (ELA/ELD) Framework. Using Heggerty Phonemic Awareness materials will support student growth in foundational skills and will directly support development of a strong understanding of the English language.

Heggerty Phonemic Awareness curriculum is aligned with the California Common Core Standards in both English and Spanish. It is a strategic program designed to support language learners to build foundational literacy by teaching them the phonemic awareness and phonics skills. Each leveled kit is grade or grade band specific, but is versatile and can be used in any grade to target needed skill. Heggerty Phonemic Awareness lessons can be used in the summer and/or school year as language play activities built into each student's

day. Phonemic awareness is an oral and auditory activity, which makes these activities a fun way to play with the sounds a student hears in words. It is important for children to understand that the words they hear in language are made up of sounds. This will support them in connecting print or letters to the sounds they hear when they read or spell words.

Camp EXCEL, school year intervention, and enrichment programs will benefit English learners with the addition of Heggerty Phonemic Awareness kits. The lessons provide the flexibility needed to support the curriculum and support small groups of English learner students for these programs. The lessons give classroom teachers and/or intervention teachers tips for assessment in order to target the instruction to meet the needs of all English learners.

The purchase of the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness kits will be funded by the Title III English Learner grant for a total of \$12,828.98.

District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 8.2. Without Cause by Contractor. Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Contractor shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services to District. Contractor acknowledges that this sixty (60) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- 8.3. With Cause by District. District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - 8.3.1. material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or
  - 8.3.2. any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - 8.3.3. Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the required services from another Contractor. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceed the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to the District upon the receipt of the District's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

9. Indemnification. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold free and harmless the District, its Board of Education, agents, representatives, officers, Contractors, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("the indemnified parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, costs, expenses, judgments, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, nature and description, in law or equity ("Claim"), to property or persons including, but not limited to, personal injury, bodily injury, death, property damage, and Contractors' and/or attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, Contractors, or agents, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages; or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by the Contractor in conjunction with this Agreement, unless the claims are caused wholly by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District. The District shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that Contractor proposes to defend the indemnified parties.

# 10. Insurance.

10.1. The Contractor shall procure and maintain at all times it performs any portion of the Services the following insurance with minimum limits equal to the amount indicated below.

Insurance that shall protect the Contractor, the District, and the State from all claims of bodily injury, property damage, personal injury, death, advertising injury, and medical payments arising performing any portion of the Services. (Form CG 0001 and CA 0001, or forms substantially similar, if approved by the District.)

- 10.1.2. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employers' Liability Insurance for all of its employees performing any portion of the Services. In accordance with provisions of section 3700 of the California Labor Code, the Contractor shall be required to secure workers' compensation coverage for its employees. If any class of employee or employees engaged in performing any portion of the Services under this Agreement are not protected under the Workers' Compensation Statute, adequate insurance coverage for the protection of any employee(s) not otherwise protected must be obtained before any of those employee(s) commence performing any portion of the Services.
- 10.1.3. **Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions)**. Professional Liability Insurance as appropriate to the Contractor's profession.
- 10.2. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance.** The Contractor shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:
  - 10.2.1. A clause stating: "SHOULD ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED POLICIES BE CANCELLED BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF, NOTICE WILL BE DELIVERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY PROVISION."
  - 10.2.2. Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to which cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.
  - 10.2.3. An endorsement stating that the District and its Board of Education, agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, Contractors, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District. An endorsement shall also state that there shall be a waiver of any subrogation.
    - 10.2.4. All policies except the Professional Liability, Workers' Compensation Insurance, and Employers' Liability Insurance Policies shall be written on an occurrence form.
- 10.3. **Acceptability of Insurers**. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 11. **Assignment**. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

- 12. Compliance with Laws. Debarment and Suspension. Contractor warrants and certifies that neither Contractor, nor any person working for or acting on behalf of Contractor as part of this Agreement, has been or is debarred, penalized by, convicted, sanctioned, suspended, excluded or otherwise ineligible to participate in any state or federal program, or by any federal department or agency, or by Los Angeles County
- 13. **Certificates/Permits/Licenses**. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. **Employment with Public Agency**. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. **Anti-Discrimination**. District programs, activities, practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics and therefore the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Contractor agrees to require like compliance by all of its subcontractor(s).
- 16. **Fingerprinting of Employees**. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Contractor's performing of any portion of the Services.
- 17. **No Rights in Third Parties.** This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 18. **District's Evaluation of Contractor and Contractor's Employees and/or Subcontractors**. The District may evaluate the Contractor in any way the District is entitled pursuant to applicable law. The District's evaluation may include, without limitation:
  - 18.1. Requesting that District employee(s) evaluate the Contractor and the Contractor's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
  - 18.2. Announced and unannounced observance of Contractor, Contractor's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 19. Limitation of District Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue,

arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.

20. Confidentiality. The Contractor and all Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. Contractor understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

Both parties will maintain in confidence and safeguard all confidential information, as defined in this paragraph, of the other party, it affiliates, and its customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise identified as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure or by law, and includes but is not limited to, trade secrets, know-how, inventions, techniques, data, customers list, personal information, financial information, sales, and marketing plans of the other party, its affiliates, or its customers. Both parties recognize and acknowledge the confidential and proprietary nature of any Confidential Information and acknowledge the irreparable harm that could result if such confidential information is disclosed to a third party or used for unauthorized purposes. Each party agrees to use any Confidential Information only for the purpose of conduction business with each other and their clients in the manner contemplated by this Agreement. Both parties will restrict disclosure of any Confidential Information to only those personnel who have a need to know and will bind such personnel to obligations of confidentiality to the same extent that each party is bound by this Agreement. Upon request of the owner of the confidential information, the other party will promptly return or destroy all materials incorporating any Confidential Information and any copies. The obligation under this paragraph do not apply to information that: 1) is or becomes generally known or in the public domain through no act or omission of the other party: 2) was lawfully in Insight's or Client's possession without restriction as to use or disclosure before its receipt from the other party; 3) is received from, or was made available to, a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; 4) was independently developed; 5) is otherwise permitted to be disclosed under this Agreement; 6) is disclosed with the prior written consent of the disclosing party; or 7) is required to be disclosed in any civil or criminal legal proceeding, regulatory proceeding or any similar process, however, the party required to make the disclosure under the law shall give prompt notice of this to the other party prior to such disclosure so that the other party may seek an appropriate protective order or give its consent to such disclosure.

21. **Notice**. Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, served, and received if given in writing and either personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, or sent by overnight delivery service, or facsimile transmission, addressed as follows:

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. Any notice given by mail shall be effective three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail.

- 22. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties. In the event an express conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of the any attachments or exhibits, the terms of this Agreement will prevail.
- 23. California Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and the rights, duties and obligations of the Parties shall be determined and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California, in the County of Los Angeles. The Parties further agree that any action or proceeding brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be maintained in the county in which the District's administrative offices are located.
- 24. **Waiver**. The waiver by either party of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant, condition, or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition herein contained.
- 25. **Severability**. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 26. **Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted.** Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.
- 27. **Authority to Bind Parties.** Neither party in the performance of any and all duties under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, has any authority to bind the other to any agreements or undertakings.
- 28. **Attorney Fees/Costs.** Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs and attorney's fees.
- 29. Captions and Interpretations. Paragraph headings in this Agreement are used solely for convenience, and shall be wholly disregarded in the construction of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted for or against a party because that party or its legal

- representative drafted such provision, and this Agreement shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the Parties.
- 30. Calculation of Time. For the purposes of this Agreement, "days" refers to calendar days unless otherwise specified.
- 31. **Signature Authority.** Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been properly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- 32. **Counterparts.** This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- 33. **Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits**. The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 34. Force Majeure Clause. The parties to the Contract shall be excused from performance thereunder during the time and to the extent that they are prevented from obtaining, delivering, or performing by act of God, fire, strike, loss, or shortage of transportation facilities, lock-out, commandeering of materials, products, plants or facilities by the government, when satisfactory evidence thereof is presented to the other party(ies), provided that it is satisfactorily established that the non-performance is not due to the fault or neglect of the party not performing.
- 39. **Amendments.** No alteration or variation of the terms of this Contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties; no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the parties; and no exceptions, alternatives, substitutes or revisions are valid or binding on District unless authorized by District in writing.
- 40. **Delivery.** Time of delivery of goods or services is of the essence in this Contract. District reserves the right to refuse any goods or services and to cancel all or any part of the goods not conforming to applicable specifications, drawings, samples or descriptions or services that do not conform to the prescribed statement of work. Acceptance of any part of the order of goods shall not District to accept shipments nor deprive it of the right to return goods already accepted at Contractor's expense. Over shipments and under shipments of goods shall be only as agreed to in writing by District. Delivery shall not be deemed to be complete until all goods or services have actually been received and accepted in writing by District.
- 41. **Conduct on District Premises.** Contractor shall, at all times, comply with and abide by all reasonable policies and procedures of the District (or that may be established thereby, from time to time) that pertain to conduct on the District's premises, possession or distribution of contraband, or the access to, and security of, the Party's real property or facilities, to the extent that the Contractor has been provided with a copy of each such policy or procedure. Contractor shall exercise due care and diligence to prevent any injury to persons or damage to property while on the other Party's premises. The operation of vehicles by either Party's personnel on the other Party's property shall conform to posted and other applicable regulations and safe-driving practices. Vehicular accidents occurring on a Party's personnel. Each Party covenants that at all times during the term it, and its employees, agents, and Subcontractors shall comply with, and take no action that results in the

other Party being in violation of, any applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, and rules. Each Party's personnel shall clearly identify themselves as the appropriate Party's personnel and not as employees of the other Party. When on the other Party's premises, each Party's personnel shall wear and clearly display identification badges or tags, as approved by the other Party. Contractor's employees shall not smoke or use profanity or other inappropriate language while on site. Contractor's employees shall not enter the facility while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other intoxicants and shall not have such materials in their possession. Contractor's employees shall plan their activities to minimize the number of times they must enter and exit a facility. They should transport all tools, equipment and materials needed for the day at the start of the work period and restrict all breaks to the absolute minimum.

42. Employee Eligibility Verification: The Contractor warrants that it fully complies with all Federal and State statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and that all its employees performing work under this Contract meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in Federal statues and regulations. The Contractor shall obtain, from all employees performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by Federal or State statutes and regulations including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 U.S.C. §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. The Contractor shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees for the period prescribed by the law. The Contractor shall indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by District, and hold harmless, the District, its agents, officers, and employees from employer sanctions and any other liability which may be assessed against the Contractor or the District or both in connection with any alleged violation of any Federal or State statutes or regulations pertaining to the eligibility for employment of any persons performing work under this Contract.

Toll Middle School Spanish FLAG teachers, Jordi Solsona-Puig and Maria Capdevila-Gutierrez, were notified by the National Education Association (NEA) that their application for funding for their Tolerance, Biliteracy and Media project was approved.

Consistent with the Teaching Tolerance for Social Justice Standards, the teachers will work with Spanish dual immersion students to implement digital media projects and encourage them to link the content from their History and Spanish Language Arts courses to present Social Justice issues on video formats in Spanish. By the end of each school year, the student video projects depicting Social Justice Standards will be highlighted during the school's Cultural Awareness Week.

Following the initial project implementation, the teachers will share their knowledge gained with student teachers in CSU-Fullerton's bilingual program in two workshops.

The grant award, in the amount of \$4,500, will cover expenses listed in the approved project budget to include: student Wevideo licenses for two years, training for students with media professionals, expenses for the Cultural Awareness Week, and a central editing station (computer).

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve the Affiliation Agreement with The University of Akron College of Health and Human Sciences.

This agreement is between the Glendale Unified School District and The University of Akron to provide fieldwork experiences to university students in the College of Health and Human Sciences. This affiliation agreement will address clinical education programs including the School of Speech Language Pathology and Audiology, School of Social Work, School of Sport Science and Wellness Education, School of Allied Health, School of Counseling, and School of Nutrition and Dietetics. This Agreement shall be effective for a period of one (1) year beginning on the date of the last signature, and shall be extended automatically for successive one (1) year periods thereafter unless terminated by either party by written notice to the other at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the end of any such one (1) year period, in which event, this Agreement shall terminate at the end of such one (1) year period unless a later date is specified in such notice.

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 44225 and 44227 of the California Education Code, the Governing Board of any school district is authorized to enter into agreements with the California State Universities and Colleges, the University of California, or any other university or college approved by the Commission on Teacher Credentialing as a teacher education institution to provide teaching experience through practice teaching to students enrolled in teacher education curriculum of such institutions.

**TO SUPPORT BOARD PRIORITY NO. 2**: Create a Culture of Learning - Support student learning with safe schools and programs that emphasize and increase inclusion, build positive relationships, and continue to enhance opportunities for life-long success.

# AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

# THE UNIVERSITY OF AKRON and GLENDALE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

This agreement is entered into between Glendale Unified School District located at 223 N Jackson Street, Glendale, CA 91206 (referred to hereafter as "Facility") and The University of Akron, a statutory institution created under the laws of Ohio, located at 302 East Buchtel Common, Akron, OH 44325 (referred to hereafter as "University") through its College of Health and Human Sciences.

The purpose of this agreement is to provide an affiliation agreement that addresses all of the clinical education programs in the College of Health and Human Sciences. This includes the School of Speech Language Pathology and Audiology, School of Social Work, School of Sport Science and Wellness Education, School of Allied Health, School of Counseling and School of Nutrition and Dietetics.

WHEREAS, the University currently conducts accredited educational programs in its College of Health and Human Sciences and desires to obtain clinical educational experience for the students enrolled in the educational programs within the College of Health and Human Sciences (hereinafter the "Students"); and

WHEREAS, the Facility recognizes the need for and desires to aid in the educational development of Students and is willing to make available its clinical and educational resources to the University for such purposes; and

WHEREAS, the University and the Facility mutually desire to promote excellence in human services and health education and to contribute to the professional growth and competence of Students.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter set forth, it is understood and agreed upon by the parties hereto as follows:

I The UNIVERSITY and FACILITY agree to affiliate and cooperate for their mutual benefit to provide a high standard of research and educational programs for College of Health and Human Science students. The programs that may be accommodated at the Facility include the following:

Bachelor of Arts in Social Work (BASW)
Child Life Specialist
Masters of Social Work
Nutrition and Dietetics Coordinated Program
Speech Language Pathology
Food and Environmental Nutrition
Allied Health

# II UNIVERSITY RESPONSIBILITIES

- a) The University shall be responsible for the assignment of students to the Facility. The University agrees to provide to the Facility only those students who have completed the required course of study as determined by the University.
- b) The University shall provide a Clinical Program Coordinator for each program who will act as a liaison between the University and the Facility for that program. The Clinical Program Coordinator will be responsible for maintaining active communications and relationships with the Facility including, but not limited to:
  - (1) Sending the names, telephone numbers and addresses of Students to the Facility Program Coordinator at least two weeks before the first day of each student group assignment;
  - (2) Supplying the Facility with student evaluation forms and information regarding the Students' current level of academic preparation prior to the arrival of each student group to the Facility for the clinical program;
  - (3) Maintaining an ongoing communication with the Facility to integrate the academic and clinical experience and making on-site visits when practical; and
  - (4) Developing, in coordination with the Facility Program Coordinator, an agreement as to hours, place, and type of clinical experience.
- c) The University and/or Student shall purchase and maintain for itself, its Faculty and Students, a policy of professional liability insurance with a single limit of no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) annual aggregate.
- d) The University shall advise the Students that failure to comply with the Facility rules and regulations or failure to comply with any Student Responsibilities set forth in this Agreement shall be sufficient cause for immediate dismissal of the Student from the clinical program at the Facility.

# III FACILITY RESPONSIBILITIES

- a) The Facility shall have the exclusive right to determine the number of Students, if any, which the Facility will accept into the program.
- b) The Facility shall assign a member to serve as the Facility clinical coordinator to whom the University's Clinical Program Coordinator shall report. It is understood by the parties that the Facility may have a different clinical coordinator for each of the programs listed in section I. The clinical coordinator may not be a full-time position and the Facility shall determine, in its sole discretion, the amount of time the clinical coordinator shall devote to the responsibilities set forth herein. The clinical coordinator shall be responsible for:

- (1) Planning and coordinating the clinical education arrangements between the Facility and the University;
- (2) Serving as a liaison between the Facility and the University; and
- (3) Developing and administering an orientation program for new Students which will familiarize the Students with the Facility, and all applicable policies and procedures.
- c) A Student shall not be used in lieu of professional or non-professional staff of the Facility, and the Students shall at all times be supervised by a qualified member of the Facility staff or by the Students' clinical instructor as appropriate during their participation in the clinical educational program.
- d) The Facility agrees to retain complete responsibility for the care of its patients.
- e) The Facility shall provide clinical education learning experiences for the Students which are planned, organized, and administered by qualified staff in accordance with mutually agreed upon educational objectives and guidelines.
- f) The Facility reserves the exclusive right, to be exercised solely with the Facility's discretion, to dismiss at any time any Student for any non-discriminatory reason. The Facility Clinical Coordinator shall promptly notify the University's Clinical Program Coordinator of any problem or difficulty arising with a Student, and a discussion shall be held either by telephone or in person regarding the Student. The Facility will, however, have final responsibility and authority to dismiss any Student from the Clinical Program at the Facility.
- g) The Facility shall, upon reasonable request, permit representatives of the University to inspect the clinical facilities and services available for clinical experience, Student records, if any, and other items pertaining to the clinical education program.
- h) The parties acknowledge that many Student educational records are protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and that the permission of Students must be obtained before Student data can be released to anyone.
- i) The facility will coordinate with the appropriate entity's emergency medical care for students of the University in the event of accident or sudden illness which occurs during the course of clinical experience upon the premises of the Facility. The cost of such services shall be borne by the students.

# IV STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- a) The Students shall provide their own transportation to and from the Facility as well as any meals or lodging required during the clinical experience.
- b) The Students agree to abide by the rules, regulations, policies and procedures of the Facility, including, but not limited to, Facility policies, rules and regulations regarding

- the confidentiality of patient information. The Students will receive this information during orientation.
- c) Students are required to submit a current background check to the Facility that meets Facility's requirements before they are permitted on the premises of the Facility. The Facility has the sole discretion in determining if the background check meets the Facility's requirements.

#### V MISCELLANEOUS

- a) The Facility and the University will promote a coordinated effort by evaluating the Program annually, planning for its continuous improvement, making such changes as are deemed advisable, and discussing problems as they arise concerning this affiliation. Both will jointly plan and mutually agree upon the number of students to be assigned, the dates of their assignment, and the specific experience to be provided. Placement of students will depend on the staff and space availability.
- b) The Facility and the University agree that the Students participating in the clinical program are at all times acting as independent contractors, and no Student in the clinical education program will be deemed to be an employee of the Facility. The Facility shall not be liable for the payment of any wage, salary or compensation or any kind for the services provided by the Students. Further, no Student will be covered by the Facility's workers' compensation, social security, unemployment compensation programs, or any other benefits except those expressly provided for in this Agreement.
- c) Students and faculty will exercise confidentiality with regard to all patient/staff information gained during the experience.
- d) Each party prohibits unlawful discrimination based on the student's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.
- e) The terms and conditions of this Agreement may be amended by written instrument executed by both parties.
- f) This Agreement is nonexclusive. The Facility and the University reserve the right to enter into similar agreements with other institutions.
- g) This Agreement shall be effective for a period of one (1) year beginning on the date of the last signature, and shall be extended automatically for successive one (1) year periods thereafter unless terminated by either party by written notice to the other at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the end of any such one (1) year period, in which event, this Agreement shall terminate at the end of such one (1) year period unless a later date is specified in such notice.
- h) This Agreement is not a third-party beneficiary contract and confers no rights on any Student or employee of either party.

- i) This Agreement shall be governed by Ohio law.
- j) This Agreement shall supersede any and all prior agreements between the parties regarding the subject matter hereof.
- k) Any notice required hereunder shall be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, and shall be deemed given upon deposit thereof in the U.S. mail (postage prepaid) bearing the following address:

- The provisions of this Agreement are severable. If any provision of this Agreement is declared void or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions of this Agreement shall remain binding.
- m) During the term of this Agreement, the parties shall take such actions and revise this Agreement as necessary or advisable to comply fully with all laws, rules and regulations applicable to the performance and discharge of such services, including without limitation the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-191: "HIPAA") and the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder, as well as guidance issued by the United States Department of Health and Human Services (the "HIPAA Regulations").
- n) Neither party shall use the name of the other in any promotional or advertising material unless review or approval of the intended use is obtained from the party whose name is to be used.
- o) Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to permit the assignment by either party of any rights or obligations hereunder, and such assignment is prohibited unless evidenced by the written consent of each of the parties. In addition, this Agreement contains all of the terms and conditions between the parties and may be amended only in writing signed by each of the parties.

The individuals executing this Agreement represent that they have the authority to bind their respective party.
