Glendale Unified School District Administrative Regulation

By-Laws of the Board

Student Board Member

Student Advisory Council Membership

Each school may have up to six members on the Student Advisory Council. Students should be selected to reflect the diversity of the student population at their school and amongst the District.

Recruitment and Selection

The school principals or designees will distribute applications to all high school students that includes information about the Student Advisory Council and guidelines for applying. It is expected that the application process be advertised using multiple methods so that all students are aware of the opportunity. All high school students are encouraged to apply.

The six members from each school will be selected by a committee comprised of the Executive Director of Secondary Instruction, Student Advisory Council Advisor, College and Career Counselor, and a representative from Teaching and Learning. Students will be selected based on the quality of their application and what they intend to contribute to the Student Advisory Council.

Selection of Voting Members

Only three students from each school will be permitted to vote when selecting the student board member.

The three voting members will be chosen using a random selection process to ensure equitable and fair representation. All students need to be present at the Student Advisory Council meeting in order to be eligible for the random selection process.

Student Advisory Council Meetings

The meetings are held at the Glendale Unified School District Administration Center Board Room from 5:00-6:30 p.m.

Members create goals at the first meeting of each school year with the interest of all GUSD students in mind. Members collaborate on the Student Voice Panels held two times a year during a Special Board Meeting and the Youth Leadership Conference for middle school student leadership teams. Student Advisory Council members will also participate in the planning process for the District's Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP).

The term to serve on the Student Advisory Council is one school year. Students may serve for multiple years if selected each year. Regular attendance at Student Advisory Council meetings is

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an expectation. If the Board Student Advisory Council Advisor determines that a member's duties are not being fulfilled, the school may appoint another student to serve as an alternate.
