SUBJECT: Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Update #6

This report will provide an update on the 2017-2018 Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), Glendale Unified School District's (GUSD) "Roadmap to Success," focusing on the Foreign Language Academies of Glendale (FLAG) Programs and Nutrition Services.

# The Foreign Language Academies of Glendale (FLAG) would like to update the Board on the FLAG Programs.

FLAG students across the district in all language programs demonstrated academic proficiency and growth on state assessments from 2017. In most instances, FLAG students showed performance levels that were similar to or higher than both district and statewide averages.

On the California English Language Development Test (CELDT) administered to students designated as English learners, FLAG students in the second grade scored similarly to those in English-only programs, but in third grade and beyond, those in the FLAG program exceeded district and state averages. Students who are learning through two languages in FLAG are classified as Redesignated Fluent English Proficient (RFEP) at a higher rate than those who are learning only in English.

On the Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC) given in Spring 2017, FLAG students scored similar to or higher than non-FLAG students and scored higher than the District and state averages both in English Language Arts and in Mathematics. Across languages, FLAG students are demonstrating high achievement on the SBAC. By sixth grade, FLAG students outpaced all comparison groups in the percentage of students who have met or exceeded standards.

The achievement indicators of FLAG students on both the CELDT and SBAC assessments continue to underscore the effective nature of learning in Dual Language Immersion Programs, where classroom instruction is conducted at least 50% of the time in the target language. The FLAG Program continues to promote and value developing language in both English and the target language, and students are given ample opportunities to acquire literacy skills and conceptual knowledge that transcend specific language learning.

# Nutrition Services would like to update the Board on the Nutrition Program.

The Nutrition Services Department was tasked with the LCAP goal of increasing meal application submissions by 10% per year. In 2016-17, Nutrition Services received 12,999 meal applications (50.2%). In the current school year 2017-18 (as of October 26), 14,934 meal applications were received (55.3%), an increase from last year.

To meet this goal the following changes were made:

- Created an "opt out" option for families whose income would not allow them to qualify for free and reduced meal benefits.
- Created an "other benefits" flyers for families whose children do not want to eat school meals, such as reduced internet rates, discounted standardized testing fees, fee waivers for college applications and more.
- Created a dashboard with ETIS to provide real time updates on the meal application processing progress.

The Nutrition Services Department conducted a Meal Satisfaction Survey in Spring 2017 (January 17-February 3, 2017). Survey responses were collected from grades 4-8 with a total response rate of 65.7%.

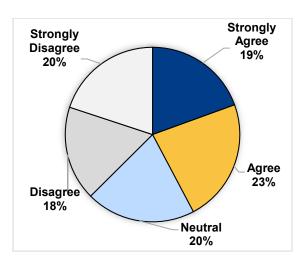

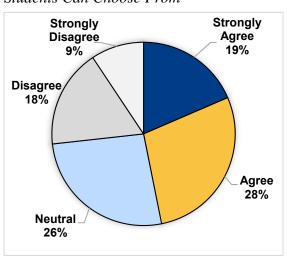

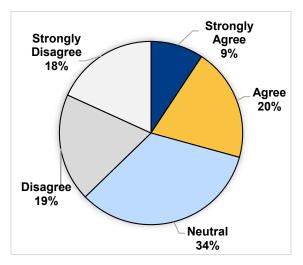

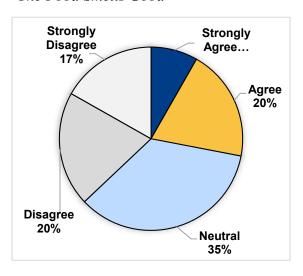

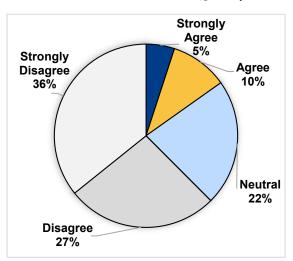

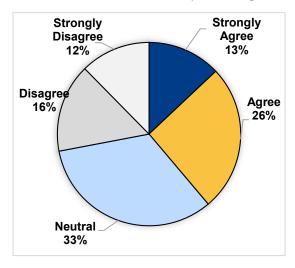

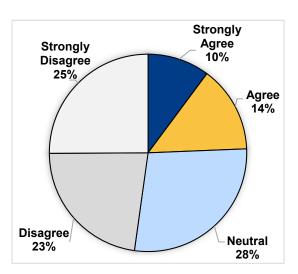

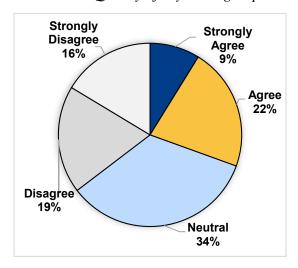

SUBJECT: Vehicle Fleet Sustainability Plan/Budget Allocation

Business Services and Facility & Support Operations (FASO) will present options and recommendations for sustaining the District's vehicle fleet. The presentation includes an overview of the current fleet, safety considerations, cost and a solution to sustain the vehicles over time.

Educational and Institutional Cooperative Services (E&I) has a competitively bid contract for a solution with Enterprise Fleet Management, currently used by Burbank Unified School District and Pasadena Unified School District.

SUBJECT: The California Voter Participation Rights Act – Senate Bill 415

This report provides an opportunity for the Board to discuss adopting a plan as mandated by Senate Bill 415, the California Voter Participation Rights Act, which becomes effective January 1, 2018.

On September 1, 2015, Governor Brown signed into law Senate Bill 415, requiring school districts that hold their elections on odd-numbered years to change to a statewide election date if the voter turnout in past local elections has resulted in a "significant decrease in voter turnout." A "significant decrease in voter turnout" is defined as at least 25 percent less than the average voter turnout for the previous four statewide elections within the political subdivision. The average voter turnout in Glendale based on the previous four November general elections was 53.11%. The average voter turnout in Glendale based on the last four municipal elections was 21.89%.

Clarification was sought from the State Attorney General's Office as to whether this law applies to Charter cities, including when Board of Education elections are governed and contained in the city charter (as in the case for GUSD). On July 11, 2017, Xavier Becerra, Attorney General, opined that the Act does apply to charter cities and to local school districts whose elections are governed by city charters. Currently, the City of Glendale conducts its general municipal election on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in April of each odd-numbered year.

In order to avoid potential liability, GUSD must either consolidate to even-year elections by the date of its first election after January 1, 2018 or adopt a plan to consolidate by that date. If a district adopts a plan to consolidate by 2018, the consolidation must occur by November 8, 2022. When a school board consolidates its election, the term of office of all current board members shall be extended accordingly (Ed Code §10404.5g).

To move governing board elections from odd to even years, the Board must adopt a resolution and submit a request to shift our election to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. The request must be submitted no later than 240 days before the election in question. The County Board of Supervisor will need to approve the request. If approved, the county elections official is required to notify all voters in the district by mail of the change at the district's expense.

Attached is a draft of a resolution approving the rescheduling of Governing Board Member elections from odd to even number elections commencing with the 2022 governing board election. This can be changed if the Board wishes to commence moving to even number years in 2020, as well.

# RESOLUTION NO. \_\_

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE GLENDALE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT APPROVING THE RESCHEDULING OF GOVERNING BOARD MEMBER ELECTIONS FROM ODD YEAR TO EVEN YEAR ELECTIONS COMMENCING WITH THE \_\_\_\_ GOVERNING BOARD ELECTION

WHEREAS, Section 1001 of the California Elections Code ("Elections Code") establishes that elections held in June and November of even-numbered years are statewide general elections; and

**WHEREAS**, the current date for election of Governing Board members of the Glendale Unified School District is every two (2) years on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in April of odd-numbered year; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 14050 of the Elections Code (commonly known as the "California Voter Participation Rights Act") prohibits any political subdivision of the State to hold elections on dates other than a statewide general election date in even numbered years if those previous non-concurrent elections have resulted in a significant decrease in voter turnout; and

**WHEREAS**, the District has undertaken an analysis of the voter turnout rates and has determined that there exists a significant decrease in voter turnout in odd-numbered years as compared to statewide general election dates; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 14050 of the Elections Code requires political subdivisions of the state to adopt a plan not later than January 1, 2018, to consolidate a future election with a statewide general election in even numbered years not later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election date; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 1302(b)(1) of the Elections Code authorizes a school board to voluntarily change the regular election cycle for its members to occur on the same day as the statewide primary election, the statewide general election or the general municipal election by adopting an appropriate resolution, subject to approval by the county board of supervisors ("Board of Supervisors"); and

WHEREAS, changing the election date for school Board elections to even-numbered years and consolidating Board elections with local municipal and statewide general elections will promote increased voter participation in school board elections as voter turnout is ordinarily higher in statewide elections, and changing the election date will also minimize or avoid increased election costs to the District; and

WHEREAS, with the approval of the County Board of Supervisors, the election date for Board members will be moved from April of odd number years to November of even numbered years commencing in 2022 extending the term of office for those elected in 2017 and 2019 (i.e. (a) the expiration date of Trustee Area B's term shall change from 2021 to 2022; (b) the expiration date of Trustee Area C's term shall change from 2021 to 2022; (c) the expiration date of Trustee Area D's term shall change from 2021 to 2022; (d) the expiration date of Trustee Area A's term shall

change from 2023 to 2024; and (e) the expiration date of Trustee Area E's term shall change from 2023 to 2024). Thereafter, a new four-year term for each trustee shall be created to align the election cycle to the statewide general election dates

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Glendale Unified School Dsitrict Governing Board adopts this Resolution to consolidate the election date for members of the Governing Board with the date of the statewide elections in November of even-numbered years pursuant to Section 1302(b) of the Elections Code; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Superintendent is directed to submit this Resolution to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors no later than 240 days before the date of the currently scheduled April 2021 Board election; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that within 60 days from the date the District submits this Resolution to the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, the Board of Supervisors is requested, by this Resolution, to approve the Resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the District requests the Board of Supervisors post the required public notices of the proceeding in which this Resolution is to be considered for adoption by the Board of Supervisors, as provided by Section 25151 of the Government Code, including providing notice of all affected voters; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, if the consolidation of election is approved by the Board of Supervisors, all incumbent Board member terms shall be extended by one year and seven months and the term for each new Board member shall begin a new four-year cycle on the same dates as the statewide general election dates, as described above in this Resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Superintendent is directed to prepare and present to this Board for consideration and adoption all necessary changes to the District Board Policies and/or Administrative Regulations as a result of the adoption of this Resolution; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Superintendent and/or his designee are hereby authorized to take such other action or steps necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution.

Enrollment Information for 2017-18 (as of October 4, 2017)

The District has concluded the CALPADS enrollment report for 2017-18, reflecting enrollment at 26,242. This is an increase of 167 students over the number on last year's report and was 79 more than projected. It is hopeful that the District is finally exiting a "declining enrollment" cycle, and enrollment will continue increasing in future years.

The Historical Enrollment graph attached indicates that elementary grades increased 82 students over the prior year, and secondary grades increased 85 students, resulting in a total increase of 167 students for all grades. The increase in students is a very positive trend and indicates future growth in the District.

The District has been very active in developing/maintaining programs that attract and retain students including FLAG, Magnet Programs, and Career Tech Programs.

Attached is a detailed report of the current enrollment and related history.

# **Enrollment Information for 2017-18**

The first attachment provides information regarding regular and special education enrollment for all elementary and secondary schools. The information includes:

- Actual enrollment for 2016-17 (as of CALPADS)

Enrollment for 2017-18 (as of CALPADS) was 26,242. The District's total enrollment has increased approximately 0.64% (167 students) from 2016-17 CALPADS.

The second attachment provides information used in 2017-18 Budget development, and outlines both the Standard Progression and historical trend projections. Below is a comparison of the two projection methods to the actual enrollment as of CALPADS.

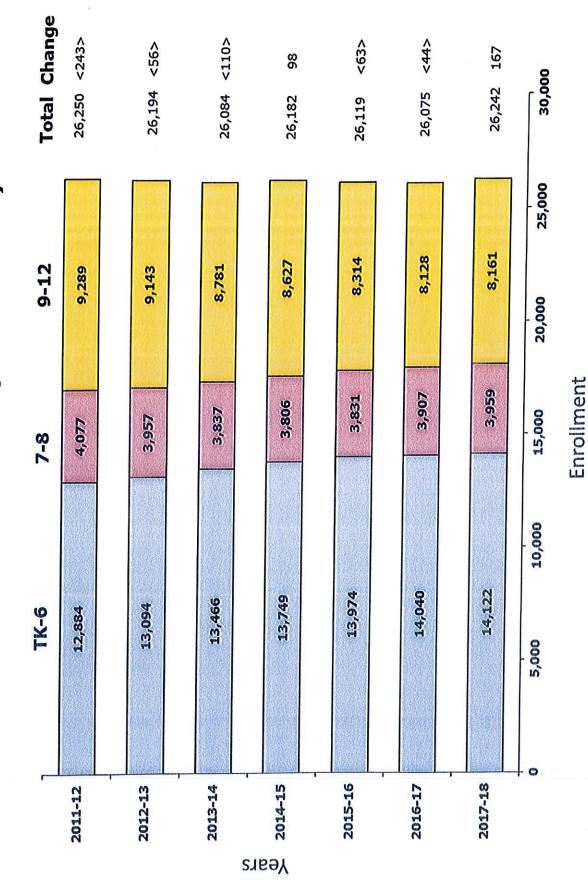

**Become Cerritos Computer Science Magnet** 

As presented on October 17, 2017, staff is recommending that Cerritos Elementary School be transitioned into a magnet school based on the innovative coding program being integrated throughout the school through a partnership with Code To The Future. Pending Board of Education approval, Cerritos would become another parent choice program, Cerritos Computer Science Magnet, along with Thomas Edison Advanced Technology Magnet, Benjamin Franklin International Foreign Language Academies of Glendale Magnet, Mark Keppel Visual and Performing Arts Magnet, and the Foreign Language Academies of Glendale (FLAG).

# Academic Program

This year, Cerritos Elementary partnered with Code To The Future, a leading Computer Science program for magnet and theme-based schools. Students learn the fundamentals of Computer Coding as part of their daily curriculum. Through this 21st century literacy, students are developing critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration skills.

Cerritos will continue to offer the same, outstanding instruction in reading, writing, math, science, social studies, music, and P.E., all of which are foundational content to the campus. In addition, the following coding software programs will be used at Cerritos Computer Science Magnet to allow teachers to seamlessly integrate coding into the curriculum:

 Scratch: With Scratch, students can program their own interactive stories, games, and animations using loops and "if-then" statements, and share their creations with others in the online community. Scratch helps students learn to think creatively, reason systematically, and work collaboratively - essential skills for life in the 21st century.

- Lego Bricks (Analog), Lego WeDo 2.0, and Lego EV3 Mindstorms: Learning to
  code through LEGO® gives students the opportunity to use a physical problemsolving tool in their coding exercises. Their code comes to life in ways they can
  see, hear, touch and even chase across the room.
- Minecraft Education Edition: Spatial thinking and pixel art in Minecraft create an
  excellent opportunity for students to work on mathematics and visual arts
  objectives in an engaging environment.

The 2017-2018 school year coding curriculum is being implemented in three cycles as outlined in the chart below:

Students in grades 2-6 will also be introduced to robotics this school year and over the course of the five-year implementation. Additional coding programs will be introduced building on the students' proficiency levels, which will lead to Java coding being done by 4th grade students.

# Enrollment

Current Cerritos students will be grandfathered in and new students who live in the attendance boundaries will be allowed to enroll directly at the school. All students who live outside the Cerritos attendance boundaries would participate in the student lottery and would need to submit applications by January 31, 2018, to be included in the February 14, 2018, Elementary Magnet Schools and Dual Immersion Programs lottery. As with the other schools, late applications would be placed on a waiting list. The priorities for Cerritos would be as follows:

1. Siblings of current Cerritos students who do not live within the attendance

boundaries

- 2. All other GUSD students
- 3. Out of district students

The number of open spaces for students who live outside the attendance boundaries would be determined for each grade level. For the 2018-2019 school year, Cerritos would anticipate filling one Transitional Kindergarten (TK) class and up to three kindergarten classes to capacity should enough applicants be interested. In grades 1-6, offers would be made to applicants to increase enrollment in those grades staying within reasonable class size.

Promoting sixth grade students from Cerritos Elementary School would continue to matriculate to Roosevelt Middle School. Students that live outside the Roosevelt attendance area would be encouraged to apply for a permit to benefit from the school's Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA), NASA, and Robotics programs, as well as a wide-range of computer science, technology, foreign language and visual and performing arts electives.

# Implementation Timeline and Marketing Plan

If approved, the anticipated timeline of implementation would be as follows:

November 7, 2017 The proposal is presented to the GUSD Board of Education for its consideration as an action item.

Ongoing

Promote Cerritos Magnet to age-eligible students throughout the community through tours; preschool nights; flyers distributed at preschools, TK sites, etc. (sample flyer included below). particular focus will be to make connections within the community to maintain ethnic diversity and gender balances within the student population.

Distribute flyers to local businesses, realtor associations, leasing agencies, and community centers with a particular target area east and south of Glendale in Atwater Village, Eagle Rock, Glassell Park, and Los Feliz.

Specifically ask local businesses to promote to their employees the idea of enrolling their children in excellent GUSD schools located close to where they work.

SUBJECT: Proposed Revisions to Board Policies Relating to Business and

and Bylaws of the Board

This report will provide the Board of Education with information on the need to revise existing Board Policies (BP) 3290 (Gifts, Grants and Bequests); BP1325 (Advertising and Promotion); BP 4140/4240/4340 (Bargaining Units); BP 4315 (Evaluation/Supervision); and BP 9323 (Meeting Conduct) as recommended by the California School Boards Association (CSBA) and to comply with Education Code and federal and state laws. Copies of the proposed policies are included with this report.

# BP 3290 - Financial Responsibility - Gifts, Grants and Bequests

CSBA Update: July 2011

Last GUSD Update: December 2002

Staff has reviewed and compared District's Board Policy 3290 against the CSBA updated policy. The attached BP 3290 has been revised to comply with Education Code and federal and state laws.

# **BP 1325 – Advertising and Promotion**

CSBA Update: April 2013 Last GUSD Update: July 2014

Staff has reviewed and compared the District's Board Policy 1325 against the CSBA policy. The attached BP 1325 has been revised to include language pertaining to advertising on school and District websites, social media, and school facilities; distributing materials that are inconsistent with school objectives; and using school and District logos.

Currently, there is no accompanying Administrative Regulation (AR) to this policy. However, upon approval of the BP, an AR will be created which will include the process for distribution of materials.

# Board Policy 4140/4240/4340 - Bargaining Units

CSBA Update: October 2017 Last GUSD Update: September 2015

Attached for the Board's review are revisions to Board Policy 4140, 4240, 4340, which reflect new laws. The changes prohibit districts from deterring or discouraging employees from becoming or remaining members of an employee organization. The changes also reflect a new law which requires districts to provide employee organizations with specified contact information for new employees in the bargaining unit and to give employee organizations access to new employee orientations (limited in scope to onboarding sessions where newly hired employees are advised of their employment status, rights, benefits, duties, responsibilities, or any other employment-related matters).

# **Board Policy 4315 – Evaluation/Supervision**

CSBA Update: August 2014 Last GUSD Update: February 2004

Mandated policy is reorganized to delete separate sections for certificated and classified administrators/supervisors to provide consistency in evaluation purposes and procedures. Policy also revised to emphasize consistency of evaluation procedures with employee contracts and collective bargaining agreements; link staff evaluations to decisions about contract renewal as specified in AR 4312.1 – Contracts; add optional evaluation criteria specified in law; and reflect the revised California Professional Standards for Educational Leaders as adopted by the CTC in February 2014.

# **Board Policy 9323 – Meeting Conduct**

CSBA Update: December 2016 Last GUSD Update: June 2003

Board Bylaw 9323 is being updated to reflect new law, which requires the Board to provide a member of the public who uses a translator at least twice the allotted time to address the Board during Board meetings. Additionally, a section has been added addressing public speakers using PowerPoints/videos, etc. during public comments,

possibly changing the time from five minutes to three minutes; and adding a section on the length of Board meetings for the Board's consideration.

The proposed revised Board Policies are being presented for first reading. If the consensus of the Board is to move forward, the policies will be presented at the November 28, 2017 Board meeting for approval. Further, upon approval of the policies, updates to the accompanying Administrative Regulations will be made as needed following current District procedures.

# Gifts, Grants and Bequests

- A. The Board of Education may accept gifts, grants or bequests in the name of the District. While greatly appreciating suitable donations, the Board shall reject any gift which may directly or indirectly impair its authority to make decisions in the best interest of district students or its ability or commitment to provide equitable educational opportunities.
- B. Gifts requiring installation, repair, or continuing maintenance must first be approved by the Chief Business & Financial Officer and responsible program administrator before the Board is requested to accept such gifts. Donated item must be compatible with District operations and meet District specifications for operation and safety.
- C. It is the responsibility of a school, from its own resources, to install, maintain and repair gifts and bequests of equipment.
- D. When gifts, grants or bequests are donated to the Glendale Unified School District for utilization in the funding of a certificated or classified position, the following will take place:
  - 1. A written notification of intent to fund a particular position (certificated or classified) must be initiated by the Principal at the school site, or as applicable, the responsible administrator at the District Administration Center. This notification, accompanied by the appropriate certificated/classified personnel requisition forms, must then be sent to the Business Services Division. After approval by Business Services, all documentation will be forwarded to the Human Resources Office.
  - 2. Positions will be funded at the established District salary rate for a minimum of a one-school-year duration and will be established, filled, supervised, reduced or eliminated according to provisions of the Education Code and District policy, practices and procedures.
  - 3. Total funding including salary, benefits and related costs must be received by Business Services prior to position implementation.
  - 4. Notification of intent to continue, reduce, or eliminate funding for an ensuing year must be forwarded to the Business and Personnel Offices at least 120 days prior to the conclusion of the school year.

# Gifts, Grants and Bequests

- E. The District will not assign a monetary value to gifts other than cash presented to the District or any school. The Board of Education will however, respond to each gift with a letter of appreciation to the donor.
- F. Students and their parents are discouraged from presenting gifts to District employees.
- G. Acceptance of any gift or other inducement for potentially inappropriate reciprocal action by a member of the Board of Education or District employee, relating to the operation of the District, is prohibited.
- H. Some vendors of materials and supplies used by the District routinely distribute inexpensive items such as calendars and pens as part of their regular advertising program. Acceptance of these items by employees is not considered a conflict of interest.
- I. The Board shall ensure that acceptance of gift, grants, or bequest does not involve creation of a program which the Board would be unable to sustain when the donation is exhausted.
- J. Any gifts of books and instructional materials shall be accepted only if they meet regular district criteria for selection of instructional materials.

#### Corporate Sponsorship

The Board may enter into an agreement or arrangement with an outside entity for the sponsorship of an educational, athletic, or other program or activity. When appropriate, the agreement may allow the outside entity to advertise or promote its business, product, or service in district publications or on district property or web sites.

Every sponsorship agreement shall be in writing and shall be approved by the Board. The Board shall ensure that the district's relationship and arrangement with the sponsor are consistent with the district's mission, values, and goals. Any advertising or promotional message, image, or other depiction to be used by the sponsor shall meet the standards set for commercial advertising on district property and in district-sponsored publications. No message, image, or other depiction that promotes the use of obscene language, pornography, alcohol, tobacco, or prohibited drugs or that advocates unlawful discrimination, use of violence, or the violation of law or district policy shall be allowed.

Each sponsorship agreement shall contain statements including, but not limited to:

- 1. The purpose of the relationship with the sponsor, details of the benefits to the district, and how the benefits will be distributed.
- 2. The duration of the agreement and the roles, expectations, rights, and responsibilities of the district and the sponsor, including whether and to what extent the sponsor is allowed to advertise or promote its products and/or services.
- 3. The authority of the Board to retain exclusive right over the use of the district's name, logo, and other proprietary information. The sponsor's use of such information shall require prior approval of the Board.
- 4. The authority of the Board to terminate the agreement without any penalty or sanction to the district if the sponsor's message, business, or product becomes inconsistent with district vision, mission, or goals or the sponsor engages in any prohibited activity.
- 5. The prohibition against the collection of students' personal information except as allowed by law.

# **Community Relations**

<u>Public Activities Involving Staff, Students, or School Facilities -- Relations Between Public and Students</u>

#### Advertising and Promotion

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The Governing Board establishes this policy to ensure effective and consistent implementation of its directions related to advertisements and promotions by non-school groups in school-sponsored print and online publications, websites, and social media, and on school facilities. Student speech shall be regulated in accordance with BP/AR 5145.2 - Freedom of Speech/ Expression.

#### Limited Public Forum

Glendale Unified School District desires to promote positive relationships between district schools and the community in order to enhance community support and involvement in the schools. Therefore, the Superintendent or designee may approve:

- 1. Distribution of noncommercial materials that publicize services, special events, public meetings, or other gatherings of interest to students or parents/guardians. Events or programs sponsored by a profit-making organization on behalf of a nonprofit organization may be acceptable for distribution depending upon the material itself.
- 2. Paid advertisements on school property, including, but not limited to, advertisements on billboards and scoreboards.
- 3. Paid advertisements in school-sponsored publications, yearbooks, announcements, and other school communications, including websites and social media.
- 4. Products and materials donated by commercial enterprises for educational use, including those that bear the name and/or logo of the donor, as long as they do not unduly promote the donor or any commercial activity or product.

Prior to the distribution, posting, or publishing of any non-school group's promotional materials or advertisement, the Superintendent or designee shall review the materials or advertisement based on the criteria listed below. He/she may not disapprove materials or advertisement in an arbitrary or capricious manner or in a way that discriminates against a particular viewpoint on a subject that is otherwise allowed by Board policy.

All materials to be distributed shall bear the name and contact information of the sponsoring entity.

As necessary, the Superintendent or designee shall require a disclaimer on any non-school group's promotional materials to be distributed, posted, or published, stating that the distribution, posting,

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or publishing of the materials does not imply district endorsement of the group's activities, products, or services.

#### Criteria for Approval

The Superintendent or designee shall not accept for distribution any materials or advertisements that:

- 1. Are lewd, obscene, libelous, or slanderous.
- 2. Incite students to commit unlawful acts, violate school rules, or disrupt the orderly operation of the schools.
- 3. Are religious, political, or controversial in nature.
- 4. Discriminate against, attack, or denigrate any group on account of any unlawful consideration.
- 5. Promote the use or sale of materials or services that are illegal or inconsistent with school objectives, including, but not limited to, materials or advertisements for tobacco, intoxicants, non-nutritious foods and beverages, and movies or products unsuitable for children.
- 6. Solicit funds or services for an organization, with the exception of solicitations authorized in Board policy.
- 7. Distribute unsolicited merchandise for which an ensuing payment is requested.

The Superintendent or designee also may consider the educational value of the materials or advertisements, the age or maturity of the students in the intended audience, and whether the materials or advertisements support the basic educational mission of the district, directly benefit the students, or are of intrinsic value to the students or their parents/guardians.

Schools may establish additional criteria pertaining to the content of advertisements in school publications and yearbooks, as deemed appropriate by the Superintendent or designee in accordance with law and Board policy.

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The use of District or school names, logos, or images is limited to specific written approval by the Superintendent or designee.

#### **Distribution of Materials**

Glendale Unified School District desires to promote positive relationships between the schools and the community. Therefore, Certain materials meeting the criteria below may be approved for distribution by elementary schools to students and their families. Distribution of materials at secondary schools or to staff at any location will follow the same criteria; however, such material will be limited to posting at the school site or made available for pick up in the school office.

- A. Materials for distribution shall not be religious, political in nature, commercial (profit making), or controversial. Events or programs sponsored by a profit making organization on behalf of a nonprofit organization may be acceptable for distribution depending upon the material itself.
- B. Materials prepared by a school parent or teacher group, such as (PTA), school foundations, school site councils, booster clubs, may be distributed to students and/or parents with the approval of the Principal.
  - Legislative material approved by, or originated by, the California Congress of Parents, Teachers may be distributed at Parent Teacher meetings or at meetings jointly sponsored by the Parent Teacher Association within school buildings. "Back to School Nights," school carnivals, and other similar meetings are considered to be events jointly sponsored by the Parent-Teacher Association. Legislative material, when distributed in a school building, will be the responsibility of the Parent-Teacher Association and in no way shall imply endorsement by the School District. Legislative material shall not be distributed to or by school children.
- C. Organizations wishing to distribute information to one school only will contact that school directly for approval from the site administrator. Site administrators are to follow guidelines specified in Section B for appropriateness. Information relative to contests may also be approved at the discretion of the site administrator. School-specific flyers need not be approved by central office, but must be approved by the site administrator.

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D. Requests to distribute materials in the schools from organizations or individuals other than the Parent-Teacher Association and/or school-sponsored groups such as foundations and clubs shall be referred to the Public Information Office.

All such agencies shall adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. Materials must not require follow-up in the classroom in terms of collection of money or maintenance of check-off lists for materials returned.
- 2. There will be no distribution of materials during the first week of the new school year or the last two weeks of school.
- 3. Distribution of information pertaining to the recruitment of students for membership in youth groups will occur at the beginning of the school year. Dates will be established annually.
- 4. Distribution of information pertaining to participation in youth sports programs will occur one time annually, with timing dependent on the sport.
- 5. Distribution of information pertaining to youth programs sponsored by the City of Glendale and Los Angeles County will be allowed for a maximum of 10 times per year.

#### And follow these procedural steps:

- 1. Organizations are required to file an application form in the Public Information Office. A sample of the material to be distributed shall be attached.
- Organizations are requested to translate materials into the major languages as indicated for each school. At a minimum, each flyer should include individual resource people to call for information in the primary languages.
- 3. If approval is granted, material shall be packaged as described on the application and delivered to the schools in person at least three days prior to the distribution date.

# Management Evaluation Evaluation/Supervision

The purpose of evaluation is to promote the continuous improvement of performance. Evaluation of management personnel is an integral part of the total management strategy designed to accomplish the goals and targets/objectives of the District. Issues related to student achievement and safety are considered first when establishing targets/objectives.

The District management evaluation system's characteristics include:

- A. Clearly stated targets/objectives which are aligned with:
  - 1. Board of Education priorities
  - District Strategic Plan
  - 3. Related State Laws/Education Code
  - 4. GUSD Leadership Standards
  - GUSD Code of Ethics
  - 6. Duties and responsibilities as specified on the appropriate management position description
  - 7. Recommendations from prior year's evaluation
- B. A focus on results and the processes used to achieve established targets/objectives.
- C. A collaborative process to establish essential targets/objectives including input from stakeholders and allowing for self-evaluation and reflection.

The District management evaluation procedures include:

- A. Providing feedback through commendations which describe the accomplishments and positive performance of the person being evaluated.
- B. Providing recommendations in areas of needed improvement.

Compensation and other forms of rewards and incentives will be determined in part on the basis of administrative performance and the achievement of goals and targets/objectives established in the annual evaluation.

# Management Evaluation Evaluation/Supervision

The Governing Board believes that regular, comprehensive evaluations designed to hold administrative and supervisory staff accountable for their performance are key to improving their instructional leadership and management skills. Evaluations shall be linked to the district's vision and goals and school improvement plans.

Evaluations shall be used to recognize the exemplary skills and accomplishments of administrative and supervisory employees, serve as a criterion for contract renewals, and identify areas needing improvement. When the evaluation indicates areas needing improvement, the Board expects employees to take the initiative to improve their performance and for their supervisors to assist them in obtaining needed job skills.

Administrative and supervisory employees shall be evaluated in accordance with provisions of employee contracts and/or applicable collective bargaining agreements as appropriate.

The Superintendent or designee shall make written evaluation procedures available to all administrative and supervisory employees.

An employee shall be evaluated annually for the first and second years of employment as an administrator or supervisor in the district, and at least every two years thereafter, unless otherwise provided for in an employee contract or collective bargaining agreement. Evaluations may occur between scheduled periods at the request of the employee, his/her supervisor, or the Superintendent or designee.

The Superintendent or designee shall establish clear, objective criteria for evaluation based on the job responsibilities of each administrative or supervisory position. Evaluation criteria for certificated school site administrators may be based on the California Professional Standards for Educational Leaders (CPSEL) and also may include, but not be limited to, evidence of: (Education Code 44671)

1. Academic growth of students, based on multiple measures which may include student work as well as student and school longitudinal data that demonstrate academic growth over time.

Assessments used for this purpose shall be valid and reliable and used for the intended purposes and for the appropriate student populations. Local and state academic assessments may include, but are not limited to, state standardized assessments and formative, summative, benchmark, end-of-chapter, end-of-course, Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, college entrance, and performance assessments.

2. Effective and comprehensive teacher evaluations, including, but not limited to, curricular and management leadership, ongoing professional development, teacher-principal

teamwork, and professional learning communities.

- 3. Culturally responsive instructional strategies to address and eliminate the achievement gap.
- 4. The ability to analyze quality instructional strategies and provide effective feedback that leads to instructional improvement.
- 5. High expectations for all students and leadership to ensure active student engagement and learning.
- 6. Collaborative professional practices for improving instructional strategies.
- 7. Effective school management, including personnel and resource management, organizational leadership, sound fiscal practices, a safe campus environment, and appropriate student behavior.
- 8. Meaningful self-assessment to improve as a professional educator, which may include, but not be limited to, a self-assessment based on the CPSEL and the identification of areas of strengths and areas for professional growth to engage in activities to foster professional growth.
- 9. Consistent and effective relationships with students, parents/guardians, teachers, staff, and other administrators.

The evaluation shall be dated and signed by the employee and evaluator. The employee may respond in writing to the evaluation within a reasonable time after receiving a copy of the evaluation. The response shall be attached to the evaluation and placed in the employee's personnel file.

# **Bargaining Units**

The Governing Board recognizes the right of district employees to form <u>a</u> bargaining units, select an employee organization as their exclusive representative and be represented by that organization in their employment relationship with the district. The Board is committed to negotiating in good faith with recognized employee organizations and respecting the rights of employees and employee organizations.

The district shall not dominate or interfere with the formation or administration of any employee organization or contribute financial or other support to it.

Neither the district nor the employee organization shall impose or threaten to impose reprisals on employees, discriminate or threaten to discriminate against employees, or otherwise interfere with, restrain, or coerce employees because of their membership or nonmembership in an employee organization.

The district shall not deter or discourage employees from becoming or remaining members of an employee organization, impose or threaten to impose reprisals on employees, discriminate or threaten to discriminate against employees, or otherwise interfere with, restrain, or coerce employees because of their membership or nonmembership in an employee organization. (Government Code 3543.5, 3550)

#### Formation of Bargaining Units

Certificated and classified employees shall not be included in the same bargaining unit.

The district may recognize a bargaining unit of supervisory employees if: (Government Code 3545)

- 1. The bargaining unit includes all supervisory employees.
- 2. The supervisors are not represented by the same organization that represents employees whom the supervisory employees supervise.

For this purpose, supervisory employee means any employee, regardless of job description, having the authority, in the interest of the district, to hire, transfer, suspend, layoff, recall, promote, discharge, assign, reward, discipline, assign work, direct, adjust grievance of other employees, or effectively recommend that action. The exercise of this authority shall not be merely routine or clerical in nature, but shall require the use of independent judgment. (Government Code 3540.1)

#### **Bargaining Units**

Employees serving in management, senior management, or confidential positions shall not be represented by an exclusive representative. Such employees may represent themselves individually or may be represented by an employee organization whose membership is composed entirely of employees designated as holding those positions. When represented by an employee organization, that organization shall not meet and negotiate with the district. For this purpose: (Government Code 3540.1, 3543.4)

- 1. Management employee means any employee who has significant responsibilities for formulating district policies or administering district programs, and whose position is designated as a management position by the Board.
- 2. Confidential employee means any employee who is required to develop or present management positions with respect to employer-employee relations or whose duties normally require access to confidential information that is used to contribute significantly to the development of management positions.

# Access to Employee Orientations and Contact Information

The district shall permit employee organizations access to new employee orientations where newly hired employees are advised, whether in person, online, or through other means or mediums, of their employment status, rights, benefits, duties, responsibilities, or any other employment-related matters. The district shall provide employee organizations at least 10 days' notice in advance of an orientation. However, in any specific instance where an unforeseeable, urgent need critical to the district's operation prevents the required 10 days' notice, a shorter notice may be provided. (Government Code 3555.5, 3556)

The structure, time, and manner of the access to new employee orientations shall be determined by mutual agreement of the district and the exclusive representative, following a request to negotiate by either party. If the district and exclusive representative fail to reach an agreement, matters related to the access to new employee orientation shall be subject to compulsory interest arbitration. The district and employee organization may mutually agree to submit any dispute to compulsory interest arbitration at any time. In addition, if any dispute arises during negotiations and is not resolved within 45 days after the first meeting or within 60 days after the initial request to negotiate, whichever is earlier, either party may make a demand for compulsory interest arbitration. When any such dispute arises during the summer when the district's administrative office is closed, the timeline shall commence on the first day the administrative office reopens. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on the parties. (Government Code 3556, 3557)

#### Personnel

#### **Bargaining Units**

The Superintendent or designee shall provide an exclusive representative with the name, job title, department, work location, telephone numbers (work, home, and personal cell phone), personal email address(es) on file with the district, and home address of any newly hired employee in the bargaining unit, within 30 days of hire or by the first pay period of the month following hire. In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the same information on all employees in the bargaining unit to an exclusive representative at least every 120 days, unless more frequent or detailed lists are required by agreement with the exclusive representative. (Government Code 3558, 6254.3)

However, the Superintendent or designee shall not disclose the home address and any phone numbers on file for employees performing law enforcement-related functions, nor shall he/she disclose the home address, home or personal cell phone number(s), or personal email address(es) of any employee who is a participant in the Safe at Home address confidentiality program pursuant to Government Code 6207 or any employee who provides written request that the information not be disclosed for this purpose. Following receipt of a written request, the district shall remove the employee's home address, home and personal cell phone numbers, and personal email address from any mailing list maintained by the district unless the list is only used by the district to contact the employee. (Government Code 3558, 6207, 6254.3)

#### Payment of Dues or Service Fee

Upon the written request of a recognized employee organization, the Superintendent or designee shall deduct the amount of organization dues or the fair share service fee, determined in accordance with Government Code 3546, from the wages and salary of each employee represented by that employee organization and shall pay that amount to the employee organization.

Any employee who is a member of a religious body whose traditional tenets or teachings include objections to joining or financially supporting employee organizations shall not be required to join, maintain membership in, or financially support any employee organization as a condition of employment. However, such an employee may be required to pay an amount equal to the service fee to a designated charitable fund.

Each employee organization shall, within 60 days after the end of its fiscal year, provide the Board and the employees who are members of the organization with a detailed financial report consisting of a balance sheet and an operating statement. If the employee organization fails to provide the financial report, the Board may issue an order compelling the organization to provide the financial report or any employee within the organization may petition the Board for such an order.

#### Meeting Conduct and Procedures

#### Meeting Procedures

All Governing Board meetings shall begin on time and shall be guided by an agenda prepared in accordance with Board bylaws and posted and distributed in accordance the Ralph M. Brown Act (open meeting requirements) and other applicable laws.

All meetings shall be guided by an agenda prepared and delivered in advance to all Board members and to other persons upon request.

The Board president shall conduct Board meetings in accordance with Board bylaws and procedures that enable the Board to efficiently consider issues and carry out the will of the majority.

The Board believes that late night meetings deter public participation, can affect the Board's decision-making ability, and can be a burden to staff. Regular Board meetings shall be adjourned at 10:30 p.m. unless extended to a specific time determined by a majority of the Board. The meeting shall be extended no more than once and subsequently may be adjourned to a later date.

# Parliamentary Procedure

The Board will ordinarily use <u>Roberts Rules of Order</u> (latest revised edition) to govern the conduct of Board meetings subject to the following:

- Rules and procedures adopted by the Board in conflict with Roberts Rules of Order shall take precedence.
- Any laws or regulations of the State of California in conflict with Roberts Rules of Order shall take precedence.
- The Chair may make such exceptions as appear necessary to facilitate the orderly conduct of business. Any ruling of the Chair is subject to approval of the Board. The Board of Education shall act by majority vote of its membership. Presiding Officer has full privileges of the body.

#### Quorum and Abstentions

Three members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If there is less than a quorum present at a Board of Education meeting, the members may adjourn to a specified date.

Unless otherwise provided by law, affirmative votes by a majority of all membership of the Board are required to approve any action under consideration, regardless of the number of members present.

The Board shall act by majority vote of all of the membership constituting the Board. (Education Code 35164)

The Board believes that when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them. When a member abstains, his/her abstention shall not be counted for purposes of determining whether a majority of the membership of the Board has taken action.

#### Appearance Before the Board of Education

A. Any individual or group may address the Board of Education concerning items shown on the agenda or any subject within the Board's jurisdiction subject to the conditions listed below:

# Public Participation

Members of the public are encouraged to attend Board meetings and to address the Board concerning any item on the agenda or within the Board's jurisdiction. So as not to inhibit public participation, persons attending Board meetings shall not be requested to sign in, complete a questionnaire, or otherwise provide their name or other information as a condition of attending the meeting.

In order to conduct district business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requires that public presentations to the Board comply with the following procedures:

- 1. The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board on any item of interest to the public that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, either before or during the Board's consideration of the item. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3) Questions are to be directed to the Board of Education as a whole and may not be put to individual Board Members or individual staff members
- 2. At a time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board matters that are not listed on the agenda. The Board shall take no action or discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2). It shall be in order for Members of the Board of Education to interrupt a speaker at any time to ask questions or make comments in order to clarify the discussion. Speakers requesting to add media presentations (i.e. videos, photos, PowerPoints, etc.) to their public

comments, must submit the media presentation to the Public Information Office by 4 p.m. the day before a board meeting. The district has the right to deny the request, if deemed inappropriate. Speakers must conclude presentation within the three (or five) minute-time allowance; no extension of time will be granted.

3. Without taking action, Board members or district staff members may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by the public about items not appearing on the agenda. Additionally, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a Board or staff member may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on his/her own activities. (Government Code 54954.2)

Furthermore, the Board or a Board member may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, ask staff to report back to the Board at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter, or take action directing staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. (Government Code 54954.2)

Not more than five minutes may be allotted to each speaker, and no more than twenty minutes to each subject matter, except by unanimous consent of the Board of Education

4. The Board need not allow the public to speak on any item that has already been considered by a committee composed exclusively of Board members at a public meeting where the public had the opportunity to address the committee on that item. However, if the Board determines that the item has been substantially changed since the committee heard the item, the Board shall provide an opportunity for the public to speak. (Government Code 54954.3). Any person may present orally or discuss at a meeting of the Board complaints or charges against individual employees of the District, but only when: a) such complaints or charges first have been presented to District administration, in writing, to be reviewed promptly through appropriate channels up to and including the Superintendent, and b) such administrative review has resulted in a disposition with which the complaining party is unsatisfied. The unsatisfied complainant may then present the complaint or charge against the individual employee to the Board itself, either in writing or in person, and in public session if so requested by the complainant. If the Board itself undertakes review and hearing of a complaint or charges, it shall do so in closed session, unless the involved employee has requested in a timely manner, after notice from the Board, that the matter be heard in public. Such employee public hearing rights are limited to such third-party complaints or charges, and do not apply to the employee evaluation, discipline or termination/non-renewal deliberations process.

5. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the president and shall then proceed to comment as briefly as the subject permits.

Individual speakers shall be allowed three minutes (or five minutes) to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item. Speakers are not allowed to give their time to another speaker. The Board shall limit the total time for public input on each item to 20 minutes. With Board consent, the Board president may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. The president may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add.

In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the Board, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Board, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Board to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)

- 6. The Board president may rule on the appropriateness of a topic, subject to the following conditions:
  - a. <u>If a topic would be suitably addressed at a later time, the Board president may indicate the time and place when it should be presented.</u>
  - b. The Board shall not prohibit criticism of its policies, procedures, programs, services, acts, or omissions.
  - c. The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of district employees. However, whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an individual employee, the Board president shall inform the complainant of the appropriate complaint procedure.
- 7. The Board president shall not permit any disturbance or willful interruption of Board meetings. Persistent disruption by an individual or group or any conduct or statements that threaten the safety of any person(s) at the meeting shall be grounds for the president to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board.

The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared if necessary. In this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individuals not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda. (Government Code 54957.9)

When such disruptive conduct occurs, the Superintendent or designee shall contact local law enforcement as necessary.

Conduct which prevents the Board from conducting its business or is disruptive to operations of the Board shall not be permitted at any meeting of the Board of Education, nor will defamatory or abusive remarks be tolerated. The President of the Board may terminate the right—of any speaker who violates this regulation to continue his/or her address.

Persistent disruption by an individual or group shall be grounds for the chair to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board. The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared if necessary; in this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individual(s) not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda.

8. Smoking shall not be permitted at any meeting of the Board of Education.

#### Recording by the Public

Members of the public may record an open Board meeting using an audio or video recorder, still or motion picture camera, cell phone, or other device, provided that the noise, illumination, or obstruction of view does not persistently disrupt the meeting. The Superintendent or designee may designate locations from which members of the public may make such recordings without causing a distraction.

If the Board finds that noise, illumination, or obstruction of view related to these activities would persistently disrupt the proceedings, these activities shall be discontinued or restricted as determined by the Board. (Government Code 54953.5, 54953.6.

#### Communications to the Board of Education

- 1. Written communications from the public should be addressed to the Board of Education, 223 North Jackson Street, Glendale, California 91206. Each communication to be considered must carry the signature and address of the writer.
- 2. Communications shall be forwarded to Members of the Board of Education with the regular agenda. The agenda is mailed to the Board Members on the Friday immediately preceding the first and third Tuesdays of each month. Each communication brought before the Board will be acknowledged by listing the name of the writer under the

Communications section of the agenda. Following the Board meeting each listed communication will be acknowledged in writing as the Board may direct.

- 3. If in the judgment of the Board the content of a communication is pertinent, it may be paraphrased or read and may be discussed at the Board meeting. At the direction of the Board, a communication may be filed with the official minutes. A written communication, except it shall not be paraphrased, may be read, or discussed in a public meeting. If in the judgment of the Board a communication pertaining to a personnel matter requires discussion or consideration, this will be done in closed session unless the officer or employee who is charged or against whom a complaint is made requests a public hearing.
- 4. All written and oral communications pertaining to the Board of Education, or relating to the operation of the District and its personnel, shall follow established organizational channels.
  - a. The official representative of District-wide employee organizations may address communications directly to the Superintendent.
  - b. Communications to the Board of Education should be initiated by or channeled through the Superintendent's office with the following exception: when the Superintendent is absent from the District it is appropriate for the Superintendent's designee to transmit communications directly to the Board of Education.
- 5. Nothing in the foregoing shall be construed to prevent an employee of the District from participating in the discussion at Board of Education meetings of items which appear in the official agenda.
- 6. Nothing in this statement shall be construed to prevent any employee from obtaining counsel, advice, instruction or information from his/her professional association regarding his/her legal and/or professional responsibilities.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve re-appointment of CBOC committee member Sophal Ear, Michael Myers, and Avetis Mkhitaryan, to a two-year term.

On June 21, 2011, the Board of Education approved the selection of seven (7) members from the local community to serve on Measure S – Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee. Current law states that any member may serve a maximum of three (3) consecutive terms, and that the Committee must have a minimum of seven (7) members.

On March 2, 2015, the Board increased the size of the committee from seven (7) members to nine (9) and in July 2016, five (5) seats were scheduled to become vacant due to members reaching the end of their terms. The District began the recruitment of applicants in July 2016 and received five (5) applications. Due to the limited amount of applications received, District staff has decided to appoint only three (3) of the five (5) vacant seats on the Committee, fulfilling the requirement to have a minimum of seven (7) members.

On September 6, 2016, the Board approved the recommendation of the appointment of Lincoln Bleveans, Daniel Harrison, and Harry Leon, to a two-year term ending June 30, 2018.

On August 15, 2017, the Board approved the recommendation of the appointment of Arineh Arzoumanian to a two-year term ending August 31, 2019.

It is recommended that the Board approve the re-appointment of Citizen's Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) members Sophal Ear, Michael Myers, and Avetis Mkhitaryan, to a two-year term ending July 31, 2019. Attached to this report is the CBOC membership roster.

#### AGREEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT WITH CYNTHIA M. FOLEY, Ed.D.

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on the 8th day of November 2017, between the Classified Personnel Commission of the Glendale Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as "Personnel Commission," the Glendale Unified School District of Los Angeles County, hereinafter referred to as "District," together with the District's Board of Education, hereinafter referred to as "Board," and **Dr. Cynthia M. Foley,** hereinafter referred to as "Director, Classified Personnel" or as "Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources," or as "Employee."

It is recognized that Dr. Cynthia M. Foley is concurrently employed by the District's Personnel Commission as Director, Classified Personnel and by the District as Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources. All costs of her employment are to be shared equally by the budgets of the District and the Personnel Commission.

IT IS HEREBY MUTUALLY AGREED that the conditions of employment for Dr. Cynthia M. Foley, Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources, and Director, Classified Personnel shall be as foll

- 1. The term of this contract agreement shall be for two years and seven months, commencing November 8, 2017, and ending June 30, 2020. After the completion of the 2018-2019 school year, but prior to December 1, 2019 the Board shall consider whether to extend or renew the contract for an additional period.
- 2. The annual base salary shall be \$185,000 for the fiscal year. This amount shall not be subject to decrease during the term of this Agreement. The Board shall increase the salary for the 2018-19 school year to \$193,926 or the current salary paid to other Assistant Superintendents at that time subject to the Employee meeting or exceeding the expectations for performance and goals established in the Employee's annual evaluation from the Superintendent.
- 3. The health and welfare and other fringe benefits shall be those accorded the other full-time senior management employees of the District.
- 4. The work year shall be 12 months of full and regular service per fiscal year (from July 1 through June 30).
- 5. Vacation benefits shall be accrued at the rate of 22 working days during each year of service under this agreement. The Employee is encouraged to take vacation days in the year earned. If circumstances dictate otherwise, the Employee may annually cash out up to ten earned and unused vacation days.

- 6. Sick leave days shall be as provided by law and Board policy to all certificated management employees.
- 7. The duties of the Employee shall be as those described in the then-current Board-approved position description applicable to Employee's position, and as reasonably directed by the Superintendent and/or Board of Education. Employee shall report directly to the Superintendent.
- 8. The duties of Director, Classified Personnel shall be described in the then-current Personnel Commission-approved position description, and as reasonably directed by the Personnel Commission. Employee shall report directly to the Personnel Commission. The Chairperson of the Personnel Commission shall, at least once each year, meet with Employee to review Employee's performance. Results shall be reported to the Superintendent.
- 9. The Superintendent shall, at least once each year, meet with Employee to review Employee's performance. Employee shall perform the duties of her position in a competent, honest and good faith manner, and shall devote full-time efforts to the performance of duties pursuant to this Agreement. The annual evaluation shall be confirmed in written summary form.
- 10. The District encourages Employee to participate in professional organizations for purposes of education and personal development, and therefore shall reimburse as business expense the cost of Employee's membership in the Association of California School Administrators (ACSA).
- 11. The District shall reimburse Employee for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of services for the District within the scope of employment as provided for in Board of Education Policy 4331.3 and/or authorized by the Board of Education.
- 12. Automobile travel, within the scope of the Assistant Superintendent, Educational Services, duties, will be reimbursed at the regular mileage rate according to District policy.
- 13. This Agreement may be terminated prior to its expiration:
  - 13.1 By Employee, in the event of Employee's qualified retirement under STRS based either on age or disability;
  - 13.2 By either Employee or the District, in the event of a physical or mental condition of Employee which has disabled, or is expected to disable Employee from effective performance of the essential duties of her position for an extended period, even with reasonable accommodation, after Employee has exhausted all available sick leave and vacation entitlements. Nothing herein shall preclude the District from

appointing an interim replacement for Employee during the period of Employee's disability.

- 13.3 By the death of Employee;
- 13.4 By the District, due to good cause. Good cause includes a material breach by Employee of the obligations owed to the District, and also includes conduct by Employee which undermines her effectiveness as a trusted senior executive of the District; or
- 13.5 By the District, without good cause as defined above. In that event only, the Employee shall continue to receive the balance of payments set forth herein for the remainder of the stated term of this Agreement, or a period of 12 months, whichever is the lesser.
- 14. If this Agreement is terminated for any of the above-mentioned causes, Employee shall continue to be eligible for all post-retirement medical and dental insurance benefits for the Employee and spouse as per Board Policy 4317.13. Any accrued vacation, retirement calculation, and disability allowance shall be paid at the rate of 1/225 of the annual salary.
- 15. As required by Government Code Section 53243.2, if this Agreement is terminated because the employee is convicted of a crime involving abuse of office or position, the employee must reimburse the District for specified payments (paid leave pending an investigation, legal criminal defense, cash settlement related to termination, etc.) made by the District.
- 16. Any disputes or claims otherwise cognizable in court, arising out of or relating to enforcement of the parties' Agreement of Employment, or termination of employee's employment, including any contractual, statutory or common law claims, and claims against individual managers, agents and Board members of the District in their capacity of such, as well as against the District itself, shall be submitted to binding arbitration pursuant to the Employment Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association. Statutes of limitations and scope of remedies shall be the same as if the case were brought in court, except that claims alleging violation of this Agreement of Employment must be brought, in writing, within one year of the alleged violation. The District shall pay for the cost of the arbitration itself, but the parties shall each bear the cost of their own case, unless otherwise provided by statute.
- 17. This Agreement shall be binding upon the District upon final adoption by the Board of Education.

**Computer Science Magnet School** 

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve for Cerritos Elementary School to become Cerritos Computer Science Magnet School.

As presented on October 17, 2017, staff is recommending that Cerritos Elementary School be transitioned into a magnet school based on the innovative coding program being integrated throughout the school through a partnership with Code To The Future. Pending Board of Education approval, Cerritos would become another parent choice program, Cerritos Computer Science Magnet, along with Thomas Edison Advanced Technology Magnet, Benjamin Franklin International Foreign Language Academies of Glendale Magnet, Mark Keppel Visual and Performing Arts Magnet, and the Foreign Language Academies of Glendale (FLAG).

# Academic Program

This year, Cerritos Elementary partnered with Code To The Future, a leading Computer Science program for magnet and theme-based schools. Students learn the fundamentals of Computer Coding as part of their daily curriculum. Through this 21st century literacy, students are developing critical thinking, creativity, communication, and collaboration skills.

Cerritos will continue to offer the same, outstanding instruction in reading, writing, math, science, social studies, music, and P.E., all of which are foundational content to the campus. In addition, the following coding software programs will be used at Cerritos Computer Science Magnet to allow teachers to seamlessly integrate coding into the curriculum:

 Scratch: With Scratch, students can program their own interactive stories, games, and animations using loops and "if-then" statements, and share their creations

with others in the online community. Scratch helps students learn to think creatively, reason systematically, and work collaboratively - essential skills for life in the 21st century.

- Lego Bricks (Analog), Lego WeDo 2.0, and Lego EV3 Mindstorms: Learning to
  code through LEGO® gives students the opportunity to use a physical problemsolving tool in their coding exercises. Their code comes to life in ways they can
  see, hear, touch and even chase across the room.
- Minecraft Education Edition: Spatial thinking and pixel art in Minecraft create an
  excellent opportunity for students to work on mathematics and visual arts
  objectives in an engaging environment.

The 2017-2018 school year coding curriculum is being implemented in three cycles as outlined in the chart below:

Students in grades 2-6 will also be introduced to robotics this school year and over the course of the five-year implementation. Additional coding programs will be introduced building on the students' proficiency levels, which will lead to Java coding being done by 4th grade students.

## Enrollment

Current Cerritos students will be grandfathered in and new students who live in the attendance boundaries will be allowed to enroll directly at the school. All students who live outside the Cerritos attendance boundaries would participate in the student lottery and would need to submit applications by January 31, 2018, to be included in the February 14, 2018, Elementary Magnet Schools and Dual Immersion Programs lottery.

As with the other schools, late applications would be placed on a waiting list. The priorities for Cerritos would be as follows:

- 1. Siblings of current Cerritos students who do not live within the attendance boundaries
- 2. All other GUSD students
- 3. Out of district students

The number of open spaces for students who live outside the attendance boundaries would be determined for each grade level. For the 2018-2019 school year, Cerritos would anticipate filling one Transitional Kindergarten (TK) class and up to three kindergarten classes to capacity should enough applicants be interested. In grades 1-6, offers would be made to applicants to increase enrollment in those grades staying within reasonable class size.

Promoting sixth grade students from Cerritos Elementary School would continue to matriculate to Roosevelt Middle School. Students that live outside the Roosevelt attendance area would be encouraged to apply for a permit to benefit from the school's Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA), NASA, and Robotics programs, as well as a wide-range of computer science, technology, foreign language and visual and performing arts electives.

1.	Term. Contractor shall commence providing services under this Agreement onJuly 1, 2017 and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by _June 30 _, 2018
2.	Submittal of Documents. The Contractor shall not commence the Services under this Agreement until the Contractor has submitted and the District has approved the certificate(s) and affidavit(s), and the endorsement(s) of insurance required as indicated below:

District agrees to pay the Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this Agreement (as needed, as requested) a total fee not to exceed (NTE)  One hundred thousand dollars (\$ 100,000.00 ) which includes reimbursable cost listed in item 4.1. District shall pay Contractor according to the following terms and conditions:
	Note: Accounts Payable will not process payment until the services have been completed. Invoices should be submitted to Accounts Payable Department, Glendale Unified School District, 223 N. Jackson Street, Glendale, CA 91206.
4.	Expenses. District shall not be liable to Contractor for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by Contractor in performing services for District, except as follows:

- 5. Independent Contractor. Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, Contractor is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, District being interested only in the results obtained.
- 6. Materials. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows:
- 7. Copyright/Trademark/Patent. Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District. Contractor consents to use of Contractor's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

#### 8. Termination.

- 8.1. Without Cause by District. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 8.2. Without Cause by Contractor. Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Contractor shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services to District. Contractor acknowledges that this sixty (60) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- 8.3. With Cause by District. District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - 8.3.1. material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or
  - 8.3.2. any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - 8.3.3. Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

#### Glendale Unified School District

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the required services from another Contractor. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceed the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to the District upon the receipt of the District's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

9. Indemnification. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold free and harmless the District, its Board of Education, agents, representatives, officers, Contractors, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("the indemnified parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, costs, expenses, judgments, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, nature and description, in law or equity ("Claim"), to property or persons including, but not limited to, personal injury, bodily injury, death, property damage, and Contractors' and/or attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, Contractors, or agents, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages; or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by the Contractor in conjunction with this Agreement, unless the claims are caused wholly by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the District. The District shall have the right to accept or reject any legal representation that Contractor proposes to defend the indemnified parties.

#### 10. Insurance.

Commercial General Liability Insurance and Any Auto Automobile Liability

- Insurance that shall protect the Contractor, the District, and the State from all claims of bodily injury, property damage, personal injury, death, advertising injury, and medical payments arising performing any portion of the Services. (Form CG 0001 and CA 0001, or forms substantially similar, if approved by the District.)
- 10.1.2. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employers' Liability Insurance for all of its employees performing any portion of the Services. In accordance with provisions of section 3700 of the California Labor Code, the Contractor shall be required to secure workers' compensation coverage for its employees. If any class of employee or employees engaged in performing any portion of the Services under this Agreement are not protected under the Workers' Compensation Statute, adequate insurance coverage for the protection of any employee(s) not otherwise protected must be obtained before any of those employee(s) commence performing any portion of the Services.
- 10.1.3. **Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions)**. Professional Liability Insurance as appropriate to the Contractor's profession.
- 10.2. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance**. The Contractor shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:
  - 10.2.1. A clause stating: "SHOULD ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED POLICIES BE CANCELLED BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF, NOTICE WILL BE DELIVERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY PROVISION."
  - 10.2.2. Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to which cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.
  - 10.2.3. An endorsement stating that the District and its Board of Education, agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, Contractors, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District. An endorsement shall also state that there shall be a waiver of any subrogation.
    - 10.2.4. All policies except the Professional Liability, Workers' Compensation Insurance, and Employers' Liability Insurance Policies shall be written on an occurrence form.
- 10.3. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 11. **Assignment**. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

- 12. Compliance with Laws. Debarment and Suspension. Contractor warrants and certifies that neither Contractor, nor any person working for or acting on behalf of Contractor as part of this Agreement, has been or is debarred, penalized by, convicted, sanctioned, suspended, excluded or otherwise ineligible to participate in any state or federal program, or by any federal department or agency, or by Los Angeles County
- 13. Certificates/Permits/Licenses. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. Employment with Public Agency. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. Anti-Discrimination. District programs, activities, practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics and therefore the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Contractor agrees to require like compliance by all of its subcontractor(s).
- 16. Fingerprinting of Employees. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Contractor's performing of any portion of the Services.
- 17. **No Rights in Third Parties.** This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 18. District's Evaluation of Contractor and Contractor's Employees and/or Subcontractors. The District may evaluate the Contractor in any way the District is entitled pursuant to applicable law. The District's evaluation may include, without limitation:
  - 18.1. Requesting that District employee(s) evaluate the Contractor and the Contractor's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
  - 18.2. Announced and unannounced observance of Contractor, Contractor's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 19. Limitation of District Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue,

arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.

20. Confidentiality. The Contractor and all Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. Contractor understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

Both parties will maintain in confidence and safeguard all confidential information, as defined in this paragraph, of the other party, it affiliates, and its customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise identified as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure or by law, and includes but is not limited to, trade secrets, know-how, inventions, techniques, data, customers list, personal information, financial information, sales, and marketing plans of the other party, its affiliates, or its customers. Both parties recognize and acknowledge the confidential and proprietary nature of any Confidential Information and acknowledge the irreparable harm that could result if such confidential information is disclosed to a third party or used for unauthorized purposes. Each party agrees to use any Confidential Information only for the purpose of conduction business with each other and their clients in the manner contemplated by this Agreement. Both parties will restrict disclosure of any Confidential Information to only those personnel who have a need to know and will bind such personnel to obligations of confidentiality to the same extent that each party is bound by this Agreement. Upon request of the owner of the confidential information, the other party will promptly return or destroy all materials incorporating any Confidential Information and any copies. The obligation under this paragraph do not apply to information that: 1) is or becomes generally known or in the public domain through no act or omission of the other party; 2) was lawfully in Insight's or Client's possession without restriction as to use or disclosure before its receipt from the other party; 3) is received from, or was made available to, a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; 4) was independently developed; 5) is otherwise permitted to be disclosed under this Agreement; 6) is disclosed with the prior written consent of the disclosing party; or 7) is required to be disclosed in any civil or criminal legal proceeding, regulatory proceeding or any similar process, however, the party required to make the disclosure under the law shall give prompt notice of this to the other party prior to such disclosure so that the other party may seek an appropriate protective order or give its consent to such disclosure.

21. **Notice.** Any notice required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given, served, and received if given in writing and either personally delivered or deposited in the United States mail, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt required, or sent by overnight delivery service, or facsimile transmission, addressed as follows:

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. Any notice given by mail shall be effective three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail.

- 22. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties. In the event an express conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of the any attachments or exhibits, the terms of this Agreement will prevail.
- 23. California Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and the rights, duties and obligations of the Parties shall be determined and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California, in the County of Los Angeles. The Parties further agree that any action or proceeding brought to enforce the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be maintained in the county in which the District's administrative offices are located.
- 24. Waiver. The waiver by either party of any breach of any term, covenant, or condition herein contained shall not be deemed to be a waiver of such term, covenant, condition, or any subsequent breach of the same or any other term, covenant, or condition herein contained.
- 25. Severability. If any term, condition or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force and effect, and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated in any way.
- 26. Provisions Required By Law Deemed Inserted. Each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Contract shall be deemed to be inserted herein and this Contract shall be read and enforced as though it were included therein.
- 27. Authority to Bind Parties. Neither party in the performance of any and all duties under this Agreement, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, has any authority to bind the other to any agreements or undertakings.
- 28. Attorney Fees/Costs. Should litigation be necessary to enforce any terms or provisions of this Agreement, then each party shall bear its own litigation and collection expenses, witness fees, court costs and attorney's fees.
- 29. Captions and Interpretations. Paragraph headings in this Agreement are used solely for convenience, and shall be wholly disregarded in the construction of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement shall be interpreted for or against a party because that party or its legal

- representative drafted such provision, and this Agreement shall be construed as if jointly prepared by the Parties.
- 30. Calculation of Time. For the purposes of this Agreement, "days" refers to calendar days unless otherwise specified.
- 31. Signature Authority. Each party has the full power and authority to enter into and perform this Agreement, and the person signing this Agreement on behalf of each Party has been properly authorized and empowered to enter into this Agreement.
- 32. Counterparts. This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- 33. Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits. The Recitals and each exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 34. Force Majeure Clause. The parties to the Contract shall be excused from performance thereunder during the time and to the extent that they are prevented from obtaining, delivering, or performing by act of God, fire, strike, loss, or shortage of transportation facilities, lock-out, commandeering of materials, products, plants or facilities by the government, when satisfactory evidence thereof is presented to the other party(ies), provided that it is satisfactorily established that the non-performance is not due to the fault or neglect of the party not performing.
- 39. Amendments. No alteration or variation of the terms of this Contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties; no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the parties; and no exceptions, alternatives, substitutes or revisions are valid or binding on District unless authorized by District in writing.
- 40. **Delivery.** Time of delivery of goods or services is of the essence in this Contract. District reserves the right to refuse any goods or services and to cancel all or any part of the goods not conforming to applicable specifications, drawings, samples or descriptions or services that do not conform to the prescribed statement of work. Acceptance of any part of the order of goods shall not District to accept shipments nor deprive it of the right to return goods already accepted at Contractor's expense. Over shipments and under shipments of goods shall be only as agreed to in writing by District. Delivery shall not be deemed to be complete until all goods or services have actually been received and accepted in writing by District.
- 41. Conduct on District Premises. Contractor shall, at all times, comply with and abide by all reasonable policies and procedures of the District (or that may be established thereby, from time to time) that pertain to conduct on the District's premises, possession or distribution of contraband, or the access to, and security of, the Party's real property or facilities, to the extent that the Contractor has been provided with a copy of each such policy or procedure. Contractor shall exercise due care and diligence to prevent any injury to persons or damage to property while on the other Party's premises. The operation of vehicles by either Party's personnel on the other Party's property shall conform to posted and other applicable regulations and safe-driving practices. Vehicular accidents occurring on a Party's personnel. Each Party covenants that at all times during the term it, and its employees, agents, and Subcontractors shall comply with, and take no action that results in the

other Party being in violation of, any applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, and rules. Each Party's personnel shall clearly identify themselves as the appropriate Party's personnel and not as employees of the other Party. When on the other Party's premises, each Party's personnel shall wear and clearly display identification badges or tags, as approved by the other Party. Contractor's employees shall not smoke or use profanity or other inappropriate language while on site. Contractor's employees shall not enter the facility while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other intoxicants and shall not have such materials in their possession. Contractor's employees shall plan their activities to minimize the number of times they must enter and exit a facility. They should transport all tools, equipment and materials needed for the day at the start of the work period and restrict all breaks to the absolute minimum.

42. Employee Eligibility Verification: The Contractor warrants that it fully complies with all Federal and State statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and that all its employees performing work under this Contract meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in Federal statues and regulations. The Contractor shall obtain, from all employees performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by Federal or State statutes and regulations including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 U.S.C. §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. The Contractor shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees for the period prescribed by the law. The Contractor shall indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by District, and hold harmless, the District, its agents, officers, and employees from employer sanctions and any other liability which may be assessed against the Contractor or the District or both in connection with any alleged violation of any Federal or State statutes or regulations pertaining to the eligibility for employment of any persons performing work under this Contract.

- 5. Independent Contractor. Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partner, or joint venture of the District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor's employees. In the performance of the work herein contemplated, Contractor is an independent contractor or business entity, with the sole authority for controlling and directing the performance of the details of the work, District being interested only in the results obtained.
- 6. **Materials**. Contractor shall furnish, at its own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, except as follows:
- 7. Copyright/Trademark/Patent. Contractor understands and agrees that all matters produced under this Agreement shall become the property of District and cannot be used without District's express written permission. District shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the District. Contractor consents to use of Contractor's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.

#### 8. Termination.

- 8.1. Without Cause by District. District may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement and compensate Contractor only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by District shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by Contractor. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the Contractor or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.
- 8.2. Without Cause by Contractor. Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days notice, with or without reason, terminate this Agreement. Upon this termination, District shall only be obligated to compensate Contractor for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. Written notice by Contractor shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services to District. Contractor acknowledges that this sixty (60) day notice period is acceptable so that the District can attempt to procure the Services from another source.
- 8.3. With Cause by District. District may terminate this Agreement upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include:
  - 8.3.1. material violation of this Agreement by the Contractor; or
  - 8.3.2. any act by Contractor exposing the District to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or
  - 8.3.3. Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency.

Written notice by District shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within three (3) calendar days after that notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this Agreement shall upon the expiration of the three (3) calendar days cease and terminate. In the event of this termination, the District may secure the required services from another Contractor. If the expense, fees, and/or costs to the District exceed the cost of providing the service pursuant to this Agreement, the Contractor shall immediately pay the excess expense, fees, and/or costs to the District upon the receipt of the District's notice of these expense, fees, and/or costs. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or remedies available to District.

9. Indemnification. To the furthest extent permitted by California law, Contractor shall defend. indemnify, and hold free and harmless the District, its Board of Education, agents, representatives. officers, Contractors, employees, trustees, and volunteers ("the indemnified parties") from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits, actions, costs, expenses, judgments, liability, loss, damage or injury of any kind, nature and description, in law or equity ("Claim"), to property or persons including, but not limited to, personal injury, bodily injury, death, property damage, and Contractors' and/or attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with. or resulting from the negligence, recklessness, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct of Contractor, its officials, officers, employees, subcontractors, Contractors, or agents, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of the Services, the Project, or this Agreement, including without limitation the payment of all consequential damages: or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by the Contractor in conjunction with this Agreement, unless the claims are caused wholly by the sole negligence or willful The District shall have the right to accept or reject any legal misconduct of the District. representation that Contractor proposes to defend the indemnified parties.

- 10.1.2. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance. Workers' Compensation Insurance and Employers' Liability Insurance for all of its employees performing any portion of the Services. In accordance with provisions of section 3700 of the California Labor Code, the Contractor shall be required to secure workers' compensation coverage for its employees. If any class of employee or employees engaged in performing any portion of the Services under this Agreement are not protected under the Workers' Compensation Statute, adequate insurance coverage for the protection of any employee(s) not otherwise protected must be obtained before any of those employee(s) commence performing any portion of the Services.
- 10.1.3. **Professional Liability (Errors and Omissions)**. Professional Liability Insurance as appropriate to the Contractor's profession.
- 10.2. **Proof of Carriage of Insurance**. The Contractor shall not commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverage have been delivered in duplicate to the District and approved by the District. Certificates and insurance policies shall include the following:
  - 10.2.1. A clause stating: "SHOULD ANY OF THE ABOVE DESCRIBED POLICIES BE CANCELLED BEFORE THE EXPIRATION DATE THEREOF, NOTICE WILL BE DELIVERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE POLICY PROVISION."
  - 10.2.2. Language stating in particular those insured, extent of insurance, location and operation to which insurance applies, expiration date, to which cancellation and reduction notice will be sent, and length of notice period.
  - 10.2.3. An endorsement stating that the District and its Board of Education, agents, representatives, employees, trustees, officers, Contractors, and volunteers are named additional insured under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance, Professional Liability, and Employers' Liability Insurance. An endorsement shall also state that Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District. An endorsement shall also state that there shall be a waiver of any subrogation.
    - 10.2.4. All policies except the Professional Liability, Workers' Compensation Insurance, and Employers' Liability Insurance Policies shall be written on an occurrence form.
- 10.3. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A: VII, unless otherwise acceptable to the District.
- 11. **Assignment**. The obligations of the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall not be assigned by the Contractor.

- 12. Compliance with Laws. Debarment and Suspension. Contractor warrants and certifies that neither Contractor, nor any person working for or acting on behalf of Contractor as part of this Agreement, has been or is debarred, penalized by, convicted, sanctioned, suspended, excluded or otherwise ineligible to participate in any state or federal program, or by any federal department or agency, or by Los Angeles County
- 13. Certificates/Permits/Licenses. Contractor and all Contractor's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such certificates, permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of Services pursuant to this Agreement.
- 14. **Employment with Public Agency**. Contractor, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that Contractor will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this Agreement.
- 15. Anti-Discrimination. District programs, activities, practices shall be free from discrimination based on race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics and therefore the Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act beginning with Government Code Section 12900 and Labor Code Section 1735 and District policy. In addition, the Contractor agrees to require like compliance by all of its subcontractor(s).
- 16. **Fingerprinting of Employees**. The Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification must be completed and attached to this Agreement prior to Contractor's performing of any portion of the Services.
- 17. No Rights in Third Parties. This Agreement does not create any rights in, or inure to the benefit of, any third party except as expressly provided herein.
- 18. **District's Evaluation of Contractor and Contractor's Employees and/or Subcontractors.** The District may evaluate the Contractor in any way the District is entitled pursuant to applicable law. The District's evaluation may include, without limitation:
  - 18.1. Requesting that District employee(s) evaluate the Contractor and the Contractor's employees and subcontractors and each of their performance.
  - 18.2. Announced and unannounced observance of Contractor, Contractor's employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s).
- 19. Limitation of District Liability. Other than as provided in this Agreement, District's financial obligations under this Agreement shall be limited to the payment of the compensation provided in this Agreement. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, in no event, shall District be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue,

arising out of or in connection with this Agreement for the services performed in connection with this Agreement.

20. Confidentiality. The Contractor and all Contractor's agents, personnel, employee(s), and/or subcontractor(s) shall maintain the confidentiality of all information received in the course of performing the Services. Contractor understands that student records are confidential and agrees to comply with all state and federal laws concerning the maintenance and disclosure of student records. This requirement to maintain confidentiality shall extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

Both parties will maintain in confidence and safeguard all confidential information, as defined in this paragraph, of the other party, it affiliates, and its customers. "Confidential Information" means any information that is marked or otherwise identified as confidential or proprietary at the time of disclosure or by law, and includes but is not limited to, trade secrets, know-how, inventions, techniques, data, customers list, personal information, financial information, sales, and marketing plans of the other party, its affiliates, or its customers. Both parties recognize and acknowledge the confidential and proprietary nature of any Confidential Information and acknowledge the irreparable harm that could result if such confidential information is disclosed to a third party or used for unauthorized purposes. Each party agrees to use any Confidential Information only for the purpose of conduction business with each other and their clients in the manner contemplated by this Agreement. Both parties will restrict disclosure of any Confidential Information to only those personnel who have a need to know and will bind such personnel to obligations of confidentiality to the same extent that each party is bound by this Agreement. Upon request of the owner of the confidential information, the other party will promptly return or destroy all materials incorporating any Confidential Information and any copies. The obligation under this paragraph do not apply to information that: 1) is or becomes generally known or in the public domain through no act or omission of the other party; 2) was lawfully in Insight's or Client's possession without restriction as to use or disclosure before its receipt from the other party; 3) is received from, or was made available to, a third party without any obligation of confidentiality; 4) was independently developed; 5) is otherwise permitted to be disclosed under this Agreement; 6) is disclosed with the prior written consent of the disclosing party; or 7) is required to be disclosed in any civil or criminal legal proceeding, regulatory proceeding or any similar process, however, the party required to make the disclosure under the law shall give prompt notice of this to the other party prior to such disclosure so that the other party may seek an appropriate protective order or give its consent to such disclosure.

Any notice personally given or sent by facsimile transmission shall be effective upon receipt. Any notice sent by overnight delivery service shall be effective the business day next following delivery thereof to the overnight delivery service. Any notice given by mail shall be effective three (3) days after deposit in the United States mail.

- 22. Integration/Entire Agreement of Parties. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by both Parties. In the event an express conflict between the terms of this Agreement and the terms of the any attachments or exhibits, the terms of this Agreement will prevail.
- 23. California Law. - 30. Calculation of Time. For the purposes of this Agreement, "days" refers to calendar days unless otherwise specified.

- 34. Force Majeure Clause. The parties to the Contract shall be excused from performance thereunder during the time and to the extent that they are prevented from obtaining, delivering, or performing by act of God, fire, strike, loss, or shortage of transportation facilities, lock-out, commandeering of materials, products, plants or facilities by the government, when satisfactory evidence thereof is presented to the other party(ies), provided that it is satisfactorily established that the non-performance is not due to the fault or neglect of the party not performing.
- 39. Amendments. No alteration or variation of the terms of this Contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties; no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein shall be binding on either of the parties; and no exceptions, alternatives, substitutes or revisions are valid or binding on District unless authorized by District in writing.
- 40. **Delivery.** Time of delivery of goods or services is of the essence in this Contract. District reserves the right to refuse any goods or services and to cancel all or any part of the goods not conforming to applicable specifications, drawings, samples or descriptions or services that do not conform to the prescribed statement of work. Acceptance of any part of the order of goods shall not District to accept shipments nor deprive it of the right to return goods already accepted at Contractor's expense. Over shipments and under shipments of goods shall be only as agreed to in writing by District. Delivery shall not be deemed to be complete until all goods or services have actually been received and accepted in writing by District.
- 41. Conduct on District Premises. Contractor shall, at all times, comply with and abide by all reasonable policies and procedures of the District (or that may be established thereby, from time to time) that pertain to conduct on the District's premises, possession or distribution of contraband, or the access to, and security of, the Party's real property or facilities, to the extent that the Contractor has been provided with a copy of each such policy or procedure. Contractor shall exercise due care and diligence to prevent any injury to persons or damage to property while on the other Party's premises. The operation of vehicles by either Party's personnel on the other Party's property shall conform to posted and other applicable regulations and safe-driving practices. When on the other Party's premises, each Party's personnel shall wear and clearly display identification badges or tags, as approved by the other Party. Contractor's employees shall not smoke or use profanity or other inappropriate language while on site. Contractor's employees shall not enter the facility while under the influence of alcohol, drugs or other intoxicants and shall not have such materials in their possession. Contractor's employees shall plan their activities to minimize the number of times they must enter and exit a facility. They should transport all tools, equipment and materials needed for the day at the start of the work period and restrict all breaks to the absolute minimum.

42. Employee Eligibility Verification: The Contractor warrants that it fully complies with all Federal and State statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and that all its employees performing work under this Contract meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in Federal statues and regulations. The Contractor shall obtain, from all employees performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by Federal or State statutes and regulations including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 U.S.C. §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. The Contractor shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees for the period prescribed by the law. The Contractor shall indemnify, defend with counsel approved in writing by District, and hold harmless, the District, its agents, officers, and employees from employer sanctions and any other liability which may be assessed against the Contractor or the District or both in connection with any alleged violation of any Federal or State statutes or regulations pertaining to the eligibility for employment of any persons performing work under this Contract.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education (Administrative Unit for the Foothill SELPA) approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Foothill SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services Agency for the 2017-2018 school year in the amount of \$328,050 for educational services and an amount up to \$122,232 for therapeutic services.

The Foothill SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services Agency operates the Glendale West regionalized program at Glendale High School for students classified as emotionally disturbed (ED). The attached Memorandum and Understanding defines the roles and responsibilities of each party.

The Foothill SELPA Glendale West program is utilized by all three SELPA districts and the costs to utilize these services are to be paid for through district-level funds according to use of services.

# Between Foothill SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered into this 1st day of July, 2017 by and between the Foothill SELPA ("SELPA") and the Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services ("Hathaway-Sycamores") for the delivery of special education services and related services for students that are eligible as students with exceptional needs through an IEP.

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the SELPA is a multi-district special education local plan area, located in Los Angeles County, California, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, including the California Education Code; and

WHEREAS, Hathaway-Sycamores is a school and mental health provider located in Los Angeles, California; and

WHEREAS, the SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores desire to operate a SELPA regionalized special education program at Glendale High School for high school students that are eligible as students with exceptional needs under the category of Emotional Disturbance (ED), Specific Learning Disability (SLD), or Other Health Impairment (OHI).

NOW, THEREFORE, in the consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and obligations set forth herein, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

- A. Hathaway-Sycamores agrees to maintain and coordinate the operation of a SELPA regionalized program class at Glendale High School for high school students whose primary eligibility as students with exceptional needs under California and federal special education laws are ED, SLD, or OHI and who are entitled to special education and related services.
- B. Eligible Students: For the purpose of the MOU, an eligible student is one who meets the California eligibility criteria of laws under Emotional Disturbance ("ED") 5 CCR 3030 (i), SLD, or OHI, and for whom the appropriate and least restrictive educational environment for his or her unique educational needs is the specially designed program provided by Hathaway-Sycamores pursuant to the MOU.

- C. Services Provided by Hathaway-Sycamores for the ED Classroom at Glendale High School.
  - One (1) full-time fully California credentialed and trained teacher will be provided for serving up to twelve (12) students. Upon joint approval of the SELPA Director/designee and the Executive Vice President of Programs from Hathaway-Sycamores, class size may be increased by a ratio of 1 teacher to fourteen (14) students when necessary during the regular or extended school year to provide services to students with disabilities.
  - 2. One (1) full-time instructional aide trained and experienced in working with students will be provided.
  - 3. One (1) full-time trained behavioral specialist trained and experienced in behavior intervention strategies will be provided.
  - 4. One (1) full-time California therapist trained and experienced with Educationally Related Mental Health Services, and in accordance with the student's IEP goals and objectives, will be provided.
  - 5. Behavior data will be collected and analyzed by the teachers and/or aides assigned by Hathaway-Sycamores to the classroom.
  - 6. Instruction provided to students enrolled in the classroom will be based on California Standards.
  - 7. Staff will implement only Non Crisis Intervention (NCI) techniques, or other district approved intervention, and use those techniques to de-escalate students in the classroom. NCI training, or other district intervention, for Hathaway-Sycamores staff will be provided by School District.
  - 8. Case-management meetings will be held on an as –needed basis between the Hathaway-Sycamores' staff and Foothill SELPA staff.
  - 9. Provide support and collaborate with general education staff and administrators.

10. Pay for a substitute teacher and aide assigned to the classroom when they are absent from work.

- 11. Track and coordinate Individual Education Plan's (IEP's) for students enrolled in the classroom.
- 12. The Teachers/designees assigned to the classroom will administer academic achievement assessments to the students enrolled in the classroom as needed and in accordance with California and federal special education laws.
- 13. Staff, including the therapist assigned to the classroom, will be responsible for drafting proposed therapeutic goals and objectives for the students enrolled in the classroom for review and consideration at the student's annual IEP meetings.
- 14. Staff will deal with emergency behaviors exhibited by students enrolled in the classroom in accordance with the California law, and the policies and procedures of the SELPA member school district.
- 15. Ongoing communication will exist between the SELPA Director, Special Education Directors of the SELPA member school districts and designees of Hathaway-Sycamores.
- 16. Collaborative meetings on as needed basis will be attended by the teacher and aide assigned to the classroom and SELPA and/or Special Education designees.
- D. Responsibility of FOOTHILL SELPA
  - 1. Provide adequate space at District high school campus for a Classroom.
  - 2. Provide furniture, textbooks, supplies, internet, resources, and computers for students enrolled in classroom.
  - 3. Provide a substitute for the teacher when he/she is absent from work, as needed.
  - 4. Collaborate with the Hathaway-Sycamores' staff to place eligible students in the classroom.

# Between Foothill SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services

5. On site school counselors will assist with the transcripts for the students enrolled in

- the classroom.
- 6. Foothill SELPA will provide California credentialed school psychologists, speech and language pathologists, occupational therapists, and other service providers to conduct triennial assessments for student assigned to the classroom as required by the California and federal special education laws.
- 7. District of Residence will arrange transportation for students enrolled in the classroom whose IEP's include transportation as a related service.
- 8. District of Residence will coordinate dual enrollment of students enrolled in the classroom, when determined appropriate by an IEP team.
- 9. Site Administrator or designee will provide administrative and behavioral support in case of a behavioral emergency related to students enrolled in the classroom.
- 10. Glendale USD will provide staff for dispensing medication to students enrolled in the classroom.
- 11. Foothill SELPA will provide opportunities for training in NCI techniques or other identified intervention by certified NCI trainers, to be used in behavioral emergencies, as well as access to other district trainings.

#### E. SERVICE PROVIDERS AND ASSIGNMENT

Hathaway-Sycamores assures the SELPA that criminal background including fingerprint checks have been conducted and completed on any person, assigned to teach and provide services to any student enrolled in the classroom under this Agreement in accordance with applicable state and federal law before or any person is allowed to have contact with or assigned to work with any student enrolled in the classroom under this Agreement. Hathaway-Sycamores will submit a photocopy of the criminal background or fingerprint check reports for each such teacher, provider or person to the SELPA prior to allowing him or her to have contact with or assigning him or her to work with any student enrolled in the classroom. Staff must submit verification of tuberculosis (TB) test.

# Between Foothill SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services

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Any decision concerning the hiring and firing of teachers and aides assigned to the classroom will be a collaborative decision made by the SELPA and Hathaway-Sycamores with Hathaway-Sycamores retaining final authority. Teacher, aide, behavioral specialist and therapist assigned to the program will be supervised and evaluated by Hathaway-Sycamores.

#### F. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS STATUS

This Agreement is by and between two independent parties and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or association.

#### G. FUNDING

The term "district of residence" as used in this Agreement means the school district in which an eligible student lives for purposes of school attendance. Glendale Unified School District for an eligible student enrolled in the ED classroom will be allocated ADA and Revenue Limit for the ED classroom for that student.

The Foothill SELPA agrees to pay the sum of \$328,050 to Hathaway-Sycamores for the teacher, teacher aide, and behavioral specialist services provided for 180 school days and 24 extended school year days. Payment is not contingent on actual student attendance.

The Foothill SELPA agrees to pay the sum of \$926 per month per seat for the educational support services provided by the therapist. The therapist will bill Medi-Cal for any services provided to a Medi-Cal funded (who meets Specialty Mental criteria) student and will not bill the school district.

Glendale Unified School District will pay invoices within forty-five (45) business days of its receipt from Hathaway-Sycamores.

#### H. INDEMNIFICATION:

Hathaway-Sycamores shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the SELPA, and the SELPA's officers, agents, contractors, employees, and the SELPA member school districts and their officers, agents, contractors and employees, from any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees and other defense costs), or claims imposed for damages of any nature whatsoever. Including, but not limited to , bodily

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injury, death, personal injury, or property damage occurring by reason of any acts or omissions on the part of Hathaway-Sycamores' own officers, agents, contractors, or employees under or in connection with any obligation delegated to the Hathaway-Sycamores under this Agreement.

- I. Hathaway-Sycamores shall provide SELPA with an original Certificate(s) of Insurance evidencing insurance coverage for General Liability, Professional Liability, and Worker's Compensation. Evidence of insurance covering vehicles will also be required if Hathaway-Sycamores services include use of vehicle(s) on SELPA site(s) or providing transportation to SELPA students. Hathaway-Sycamores general liability and professional liability and vehicle coverage shall, at a minimum, provide for limits of \$1,000,000/\$3,000,000 per claim/occurrence. SELPA shall be named as an additional insured by endorsement, and maintain the coverage in effect at all times during the life of the MOU.
- J. For the purpose of the Agreement, "days" refer to school calendar days unless otherwise specified.
- K. Hathaway-Sycamores assures the SELPA that all teacher, aide, specialist, therapist or other provider, including volunteers and any other person assigned by Hathaway-Sycamores to work with students enrolled in the classroom under this Agreement, are familiar with child abuse reporting obligations and procedures as specified in the California Penal Code.
- L. Hathaway-Sycamores assures the SELPA that it does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics in employment or operation of the program.
- M. Hathaway-Sycamores and SELPA recognize that records maintained by them respectively related to pupils are confidential pursuant to related provision of federal and state law, including California Education Code Section 49062 et seq.
- N. Duration of this Agreement:

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered into this 1st day of July, 2017 by and between the Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) and the Hathaway-Sycamores Child and Family Services ("Hathaway-Sycamores") for the delivery of Educational Support Services (ESS).

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, Glendale Unified School District, is located in Los Angeles County, California, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, including the California Education Code; and

WHEREAS, Hathaway-Sycamores is an educationally related mental health services provider located in Los Angeles, California; and

WHEREAS, GUSD and Hathaway-Sycamores desire to create a partnership where the GUSD refers students who qualify for ESS to Hathaway-Sycamores and Hathaway-Sycamores will provide ESS to these referred students and families;

NOW, THEREFORE, in the consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and obligations set forth herein, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

- A. Hathaway-Sycamores agrees to provide ESS services to referred students.
- B. Eligible Students: For the purpose of the MOU, an eligible student is one who meets the California eligibility criteria as a student with special needs under 5 CCR 3030 and for whom the Individual Education Program (IEP) team has determined requires a specialized service to meet his/her social/emotional needs.
- C. Services Provided by Hathaway-Sycamores for ESS.
  - Educational Support Services Specialists trained and experienced in behavior intervention strategies will be provided.
  - 2. Educational Support Services Specialist staff that will provide Educational Support Services in accordance with the student's IEP goals and objectives.

- 3. Behavior data will be collected and analyzed by the Educational Support Services Specialists and shared with the GUSD Designee and other District staff as required.
- 4. Staff will implement only Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (NCI) techniques, or other district approved technique, and use those techniques to deescalate students. Training for Hathaway-Sycamores staff will be provided by School District, if required.
- 5. Case-coordination meetings will be held on a regular scheduled basis between the Hathaway-Sycamores' staff and Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) staff.
- 6. Provide support and collaborate with district education staff and administrators.
- 7. Staff, including the Educational Support Specialist staff assigned to the ESS case, will be responsible for drafting proposed goals and objectives for the students enrolled in the ESS for review and consideration at the student's annual IEP meetings.
- 8. Staff will deal with emergency behaviors exhibited by students enrolled in the ESS in accordance with the California law, and the policies and procedures of the GUSD.
- Ongoing communication will exist between the GUSD Director/Specialist, GUSD School Psychologist, other identified members of the school district and designees of Hathaway-Sycamores.
- 10. Collaborative meetings on as needed basis will be attended by the Educational Support Services staff and GUSD and/or School District designees.
- D. Responsibility of Glendale Unified School District (GUSD)
  - 1. Collaborate with the Hathaway-Sycamores' staff to refer eligible students to ESS.
  - 2. Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) will provide opportunities for training in Non-Violent Crisis Intervention techniques, or other identified technique, by certified trainers, to be used in behavioral emergencies, as the district requires.

Hathaway-Sycamores will submit a photocopy of the criminal background or fingerprint check reports for each such provider or person to the GUSD prior to allowing him or her to have contact with or assigning him or her to work with any student enrolled in ESS as the GUSD requires. Staff must submit verification of tuberculosis (TB) test.

Any decision concerning the hiring and firing of staff assigned to ESS will be a collaborative decision made by the GUSD and Hathaway-Sycamores, with Hathaway-Sycamores retaining final authority. Staff assigned to the ESS program will be supervised and evaluated by Hathaway-Sycamores.

#### F. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS STATUS

This Agreement is by and between two independent parties and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or association.

#### G. FUNDING

The term "district of residence" as used in this Agreement means the school district in which an eligible student lives for purposes of school attendance.

The Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) agrees to pay the sum of \$ 4,184 per month per case to Hathaway-Sycamores for the staff and services provided.

Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) will pay invoices within forty-five (45) business days of its receipt from Hathaway-Sycamores.

#### H. INDEMNIFICATION:

I. Hathaway-Sycamores shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the GUSD, and the GUSD 's officers, agents, contractors, employees, and the GUSD member schools, and

their officers, agents, contractors and employees, from any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorneys' fees and other defense costs), or claims imposed for damages of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to , bodily injury, death, personal injury, or property damage occurring by reason of any acts or omissions on the part of Hathaway-Sycamores' own officers, agents, contractors, or employees under or in connection with any obligation delegated to the Hathaway-Sycamores under this Agreement. Hathaway-Sycamores shall provide GUSD with an original Certificate(s) of Insurance evidencing insurance coverage for General Liability, Professional Liability, and Worker's Compensation. Evidence of insurance covering vehicles will also be required if Hathaway-Sycamores services include use of vehicle(s) on GUSD site(s) or providing transportation to GUSD students. Hathaway-Sycamores general liability and professional liability and vehicle coverage shall, at a minimum, provide for limits of \$1,000,000/\$3,000,000 per claim/occurrence. GUSD shall be named as an additional insured by endorsement, and maintain the coverage in effect at all times during the life of the MOU.

- **J.** For the purpose of the Agreement, "days" refer to school calendar days unless otherwise specified.
- K. Hathaway-Sycamores assures the GUSD that the staff, including volunteers and any other person assigned by Hathaway-Sycamores to work with students enrolled in ESS under this Agreement, are familiar with child abuse reporting obligations and procedures as specified in the California Penal Code.
- L. Hathaway-Sycamores assures the GUSD that it does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, ancestry, national origin, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, or genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics in employment or operation of the program.
- M. Hathaway-Sycamores and SELPA recognize that records maintained by them respectively related to pupils are confidential pursuant to related provision of federal and state law, including California Education Code Section 49062 et seq.

**District and Beach Cities Learning** 

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve an agreement with Beach Cities Learning for the 2017-2018 school year in the amount of \$150,000 and \$75 per hour for additional therapy.

The agreement provides support to one elementary and one middle school special day class designed to meet the needs of students who exhibit behavioral and emotional challenges. The middle school program is an addition this year. It is necessary for the matriculation of students from the elementary program to middle school.

The provision of special education services implemented by Beach Cities Learning is funded by state special education appropriations.

This Agreement is entered into this 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2017 by and between the Glendale Unified School District ("GUSD") and the Beach Cities Learning ("BCL" and with GUSD, the "Parties") for the delivery of special education services and classroom support to the GUSD Elementary & Middle School Special Day Classes for students with behavioral and emotional challenges (each one, a "Class" and collectively, "Classes").

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Glendale Unified School District is a Local Educational Agency located in Los Angeles County, California, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the law of the State of California, including the California Education Code; and

WHEREAS, Beach Cities Learning is a special education program and therapeutic service provider located in Los Angeles, California; and

WHEREAS, GUSD seeks support for Elementary and Middle School Special Day Classes for students with behavioral and emotional challenges.

NOW, THEREFORE, in the consideration of the mutual covenants, conditions and obligations set forth herein, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:

- A. Beach Cities Learning agrees to: expand existing special education services in GUSD by supporting Elementary & Middle School Special Day Classes and providing related therapeutic support and services for students with behavioral and emotional challenges.
- B. Services Provided by Beach Cities Consultants:
  - 1500 hours of classroom support and services for the twelve months July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 – to be utilized for Program Development (50 hours) and Program Management/Direct Student Services (1450 hours per classroom).
  - Program development includes: Classroom / Program Development and Curriculum Modification; Behavioral Modification Program Set-Up; and Professional Development for GUSD staff (Curriculum Modification and Behavior modules).
  - 3. Program Management/Student Services includes: 250 hours consultation to the GUSD teacher (22.7 hours per month for eleven months); and 1200 hours of therapeutic support per classroom (109 hours per month for eleven months per classroom).
  - 4. Any additional hours of Related Services (RS) Counseling authorized by GUSD will be billed to GUSD at \$75.00 per hour.
  - 5. Behavior data will be collected and analyzed by the Program
  - 6. Curriculum developed for the program will be based on GUSD and California State Standards.

- 7. BCC staff will implement only Non Crisis Intervention (NCI) techniques and use those techniques to de-escalate students in the classroom.
- 8. BCL will collaborate with general education staff and administrator.
- Therapeutic staff assigned to the special day classroom will be responsible for drafting proposed clinical goals and objectives for the students enrolled in the class for review and consideration at the student's annual IEP meetings.
- Staff will deal with emergency behaviors exhibited by students enrolled in the special day class in accordance with the California law, and the policies and procedures of GUSD.

#### C. Responsibility of Glendale Unified School District

- Designate a GUSD teacher for the Classes. Facilitate teacher participation in BCL professional development.
- 2. GUSD staff will collaborate with BCL on the GUSD curriculum requirements and provide GUSD curriculum materials.
- 3. GUSD will provide furniture, textbooks, supplies, internet, instructional resources, and computers for students enrolled in the classroom.
- Should BCL staff require current NCI certification, GUSD will provide opportunities for training in NCI techniques by certified NCI trainers to be used in behavioral emergencies.
- 5. GUSD site Administrator will provide administrative and behavioral support in cases of a behavioral emergency related to students enrolled in the special day class.

#### D. SERVICE PROVIDERS AND ASSIGNMENT

BCL assures the GUSD that criminal background including fingerprint checks have been conducted and completed on any person, assigned to provide services to any student enrolled in the special day classroom under this Agreement in accordance with applicable state and federal law before any person is allowed to have contact with or assigned to work with any student enrolled in the special day classroom under this Agreement. BCL will submit a photocopy of the criminal background or fingerprint check reports for each such provider or person to GUSD prior to allowing him or her to have contact with or assigning him or her to work with any student enrolled in the special day classroom. Staff must submit verification of tuberculosis (TB) test.

Any decision concerning the assignment of BCL staff to the special day classroom will be a collaborative decision made by GUSD and BCL. Staff assigned to the special day classroom will be supervised and evaluated by BCL.

#### E. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

This Agreement is by and between two independent parties and is not intended to and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture, or association.

BCL agrees, during the term of this agreement, to maintain at BCL's expense, all necessary insurance for its employees, including but not limited to workers compensation, employer's liability, disability, and unemployment insurance.

BCL shall provide GUSD with an original Certificate(s) of Insurance evidencing insurance coverage for General Liability, Professional Liability, and Worker's Compensation. Evidence of insurance covering vehicles will also be required if BCL services include use of vehicle(s) on GUSD site(s) or providing transportation to GUSD students. BCL general liability and professional liability and vehicle coverage shall, at a minimum provide for limits of \$1,000,000/\$3,000,000 per claim/occurrence. GUSD shall be named as an additional insured by endorsement, and maintain the coverage in effect at all times during the life of the Agreement.

#### F. FUNDING

 Glendale Unified School District agrees to pay the sum of \$150,000 to Beach Cities Learning for the staff and services provided from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 to be utilized for Program Development (50 hours) and Program Management/Student Services (1450 hours).

Payment for Program Development hours will be made upon execution of this agreement and receipt of invoice from BCL. GUSD will pay ongoing invoices within forty-five (45) business days of receipt from Beach Cities Consultants.

GUSD will fund additional RS counseling as appropriate for any student during the student's enrollment in the classroom in accordance with the student's IEP. The rate for RS counseling will be \$75 per hour.

#### G. INDEMNIFICATION:

BCL shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless GUSD and GUSD's officers, agents, contractors, employees from any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable attorney's fees and other defense costs), or claims imposed for damages of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to, bodily injury, death, personal injury, or property damage occurring by reason of any acts or omissions on the part of GUSD's own officers, agents, contractors, or employees under or in connection with any obligation delegated to BCL under this Agreement.

GUSD shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless BCL and BCL's officers, agents, contractors, employees from any and all liability, loss, expense (including reasonable

attorney's fees and other defense costs), or claims imposed for damages of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to, bodily injury, death, personal injury, or property damage occurring by reason of any acts or omissions on the part of BCL's own officers, agents, contractors, or employees under or in connection with any obligation delegated to GUSD under this Agreement.

- H. BCL assures the Glendale Unified School District that all of their service providers, including volunteers and any other person assigned by BCL to work with students enrolled in the special day classroom under this Agreement are familiar with child abuse reporting obligations and procedures as specified in the California Penal Code.
- I. BCL assures the GUSD that it does not discriminate on the basis of race, religion, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, or disability in employment or operation of the program.
- J. Duration of this Agreement:

This agreement is effective and shall remain in full force and effect from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

SUBJECT: Approve 2017-2018 School Lunch Price Increase

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve a lunch price increase for all schools, from \$2.60 to \$2.75, effective January 1, 2018.

School districts are required to review their paid lunch revenue annually. When the average paid lunch price is less than the difference between the free and paid Federal reimbursement rates, the districts must either increase their average paid lunch price or provide funds from non-Federal sources. Attachment 1 compares meal prices from several districts. To comply with the USDA's paid lunch equity requirement, the District will need to increase school lunch prices from \$2.60 to \$2.75 effective January 2018.

#### Rationale

On December 13, 2010, the President signed reauthorization legislation that governs all Child Nutrition Programs (CNPs). The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010, Public Law 111-296, made many important improvements such as requiring school districts to increase servings of fruits, vegetables, whole grain, offer only fat-free or low-fat milk, free potable water where meals are served, and setting standards for sodium, calories, saturated, and trans fats.

School districts participating in the National School Lunch Program must ensure sufficient funds are provided to the nonprofit school food service account to cover the costs of meals provided to students who do not qualify for free or reduced priced meals. Using federal reimbursements gives the appearance that districts are subsidizing meals for middle and upper income children. To ensure the program is operating appropriately, our district must implement pricing that is supported by the federal formula.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve the agreement with Coachella Valley Unified School District for the sale of Three (3) portable buildings at R. D. White Elementary School with a total value of \$3.00.

In April and May 2017, the Board of Education authorized the disposal of surplus portable buildings at various schools in the most efficient and environmentally responsible manner. These schools included Crescenta Valley High School, Muir, Lincoln, Fremont, and R.D. White Elementary Schools.

Following these authorizations, Facilities staff has been in discussions with Coachella Valley Unified School District for the sale of three (3) portable buildings at R. D. White Elementary School at the cost of \$1.00 per building.

Attached is the sales agreement reflecting the total value of \$3.00 for the three (3) buildings. All costs associated with disconnection, removal, and transportation of these buildings will be borne by Coachella Valley Unified School District. The revenue associated with this sale will be placed into the Restricted Maintenance Account to be used for general maintenance of all GUSD facilities.

The Superintendent's Facility Advisory Committee voted to support this recommendation.

## AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE AND SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY

THIS AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE AND SALE OF PORTABLE BUILDINGS ("Agreement") is made and entered into this 7th day of November, 2017, by and between GLENDALE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, a California public school district ("Seller") and Coachella Valley Unified School District, a California public school district ("Buyer") (referred to individually as "Party" and together as "Parties").

WHEREAS, Seller is the owner of certain Three (3) PORTABLE BUILDINGS currently located at R. D. White Elementary School and further described as:

• Three (3) PORTABLE BUILDINGS, including all items/attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and incorporated herein by this reference.

WHEREAS, Buyer desires to acquire the three (3) Portables for its use and Seller desires to sell the three (3) Portables; and

**WHEREAS**, Seller, pursuant to section 17540 of the California Education Code and by action of its governing board, is authorized to sell personal property to the Buyer without advertisement for or receipt of bids; and

**WHEREAS**, Buyer, pursuant to section 17540 of the California Education Code and by action of its governing board is authorized to buy personal property from the Seller without advertisement for or receipt of bids; and

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, Seller and Buyer agree as follows:

- 1. **Assets Purchased**. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, Seller hereby agrees to sell and convey to Buyer the three (3) Portables. Subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, Buyer agrees to purchase from Seller the three (3) Portables.
- 2. Purchase Price. The purchase price for the three (3) Portables shall be Three Dollars (\$3.00).
- 3. **Possession and Risk of Loss.** Possession of the three (3) Portables and the risk of loss with regard to the three (3) Portables shall pass to Buyer at the time Buyer accepts the delivery and installation of the three (3) Portables.
- 4. **Approval of Sale.** This Agreement shall be effective only upon the approval of each Party's governing boards ("Effective Date").
- 5. **DSA Approval of Buildings.** Seller agrees to provide DSA approved plans for the 22 buildings at their current locations, Three (3) at R. D. White Elementary School.
- 6. **Condition of the three (3) Portables.** Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, Buyer acknowledges that Buyer is purchasing the three (3) Portables solely in reliance on Buyer's own investigation, and that no additional representations or warranties of any kind whatsoever, express or implied, have been made by Seller, or by Seller's agents, concerning the three (3) Portables, with the exception of the terms and conditions set forth herein. Buyer further acknowledges and agrees that it is purchasing the three (3) Portables in an "As Is" condition. Any needed repairs shall be the responsibility of Buyer.
- 7. **Delivery and Installation of Property.** Buyer shall remove the three (3) Portables Buildings in accordance with the following schedule. Seller shall provide access to the Portables as mutually agreed to by the Parties. Seller shall maintain the three (3) Portables and shall perform all normal repair and maintenance, reasonable wear and tear excepted, until Buyer's removal of the three (3) Portables.

#### 8. Mutual Indemnification.

- 8.1 To the fullest extent permitted by California law, Buyer shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Seller, its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers (the "indemnified parties") from any and all losses, liabilities, claims, suits, and actions of any kind, nature, and description, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, any claim directly or indirectly caused by any condition of the three (3) Portables, or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by Buyer in conjunction with the performance of this Agreement; and in case any action or proceeding be brought against Seller, Buyer shall defend the same at Buyer's expense.
- 8.2 To the fullest extent permitted by California law, Seller shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Buyer, its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, trustees, and volunteers (the "indemnified parties") from any and all losses, liabilities, claims, suits, and actions of any kind, nature, and description, including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and costs, directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from the performance of this Agreement, including, without limitation, any claim directly or indirectly caused by any condition of the three (3) Portables, or from any activity, work, or thing done, permitted, or suffered by Seller in conjunction with the performance of this Agreement; and in case any action or proceeding be brought against Buyer, Seller shall defend the same at Seller's expense.
- 9. Insurance. Buyer shall require insurance certificates from all of the Buyer's third-party contractors delivering or installing the three (3) Portables that are in compliance with the Buyer's standard insurance requirements. At a minimum, Buyer's third-party contractors shall have in force, and during the term of this Agreement shall maintain in force with the minimum indicated limits, the following insurance: Commercial General Liability insurance for \$1,000,000 for each occurrence and general aggregate with Products and Completed Operations Coverage; Automobile Liability Any Auto for combined single limit of \$1,000,000; Workers Compensation for Statutory limits; and Employers' Liability: \$1,000,000. The Buyer shall provide to the Seller certificate(s) of insurance and endorsements satisfactory to the Seller. The policy(ies) shall not be amended or modified and the coverage amounts shall not be reduced without thirty (30) days written notice to the Buyer prior to cancellation. All endorsements, certificates and insurance policies shall state that Buyer, its Board members, employees and agents, and the State of California, are named additional insureds under all policies except Workers' Compensation Insurance. The policy(ies) shall be primary; any insurance carried by the Buyer shall only be secondary and supplemental. The Buyer's third- party contractors shall not allow any subcontractor, employee, or agent to commence work on this Agreement or any subcontract until the insurance required of the Buyer's third-party contractor, its subcontractors and agents have been obtained.
- 10. **Entire Agreement of Parties.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations and agreements, whether oral or written. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by a written instrument executed by the Parties.
- 11. **California Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and the rights, duties and obligations of the Parties shall be determined and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 12. **Disputes.** Any actions or proceedings arising under, growing out of, or in any way related to this Agreement shall be instituted and prosecuted only in courts located in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and each party hereto expressly waives its right, under part II, title IV of the California Code of Civil Procedure, to cause any such actions or proceedings to be instituted or prosecuted elsewhere.

- 13. **Attorneys' Fees.** If either Party files any action or brings any proceedings against the other arising out of this Agreement, or is made a party to any action or proceeding brought by a third party, then, as between Buyer and Seller, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover, in addition to its costs of suit and damages, reasonable attorneys' fees to be fixed by the court. The "Prevailing Party" shall be the Party who is entitled to recover its costs of suit, whether or not suit proceeds to final judgment. No sum for attorneys' fees shall be counted in calculating the amount of a judgment for purposes of determining whether a Party is entitled to its costs or attorneys' fees.
- 14. **Waiver.** No waiver by any Party of any provision of this Agreement shall be considered a waiver of any other provision or of any subsequent breach of the same or any other provision, including the time for performance of any such provision. The exercise by a Party of any remedy provided in this Agreement or at law shall not prevent the exercise by that Party of any other remedy provided in this Agreement or at law or in equity.
- 15. **Binding Agreement.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns.
- 16. **Counterparts.** This Agreement and all amendments and supplements to it may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts together shall be construed as one document.
- 17. **Captions.** The captions contained in this Agreement are for convenience only and shall not in any way affect the meaning or interpretation hereof nor serve as evidence of the interpretation hereof, or of the intention of the Parties hereto.
- 18. **Severability.** The unenforceability, invalidity, or illegality of any provision of this Agreement shall not render the other provisions hereof unenforceable, invalid or illegal.
- 19. **Review of Form of Agreement.** Submission of this instrument for examination or signature by Seller does not constitute an agreement to purchase all, or any portion of, the three (3) Portables, and it is not effective as an Agreement, or otherwise, until execution and delivery by both Buyer and Seller.
- 20. **Incorporation of Recitals and Exhibits.** The recitals and any exhibit attached hereto are hereby incorporated herein by reference.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve Felix Melendez, Executive Director, Secondary Education, as the official designated representative for Glendale Unified School District for the Adult Education Block Grant Program.

Work from the Assembly Bill 86 Adult Education Consortium Planning Grant commenced in 2013. Based on recommendations developed from the planning process, the California Legislature has passed Assembly Bill 104, which includes the legislation for the Adult Education Block Grant.

The Adult Education Block Grant will fund adult education providers and the adult education regional consortia. Glendale Community College District (GCCD) Regional Consortium includes Glendale Community College and Glendale Unified School District as members. Partners in the GCCD Regional Consortium include the Armenian Relief Society, Burbank Unified School District, Catholic Charities of Los Angeles, the Employment Development Department, Glendale City Library Arts and Culture, the International Rescue Committee, and the Verdugo Workforce Investment Board.

The regional allocation for the Glendale Community College District Regional Consortium for 2017-2018 is \$985,475 and, in accordance with Section 39, Article 9 of the Adult Education Block Grant Program, and specifically listed in 84905(c), "a member of the consortium shall be represented only by an official designated by the governing board of the member." The designated officials from the region will work towards implementing the regional plan for adult education.

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve revisions to Board Policy (BP) 6112 (School Day) as recommended by the California School Boards Association and to comply with Education Code and federal and state laws.

# BP 6112 School Day CSBA Update April 2013 Last GUSD Update October 2002

Board Policy 6112 "School Day" is being revised to reflect current CSBA language and legal references. This policy will bring the school district into compliance with EC 37202, which states,

"(a) Except if a school has been closed by order of a city or a county board of health, or of the State Board of Health, on account of contagious disease, or if the school has been closed on account of fire, flood, or other public disaster, the governing board of a school district shall maintain all of the elementary day schools established by it for an equal length of time during the school year and all of the day high schools established by it for an equal length of time during the school year."

In addition, EC 46100 states,

"The governing board of each school district shall, subject to the provisions of this chapter, fix the length of the schoolday for the several grades and classes of the schools maintained by the district."

Upon approval of the policy, updates to the accompanying Administrative Regulation will be made as needed following current District procedures.

#### Instruction

#### School Day

The Board of Education shall fix the length of the school day subject to the provisions of law. (Education Code 46100)

The length of the school day shall apply equally to students with disabilities unless otherwise specified in the student's individualized education program or Section 504 plan.

The schedule for elementary schools shall include at least one daily period of recess of at least 20 minutes in length in order to provide students with unstructured but supervised opportunities for physical activity.

In establishing the daily instructional schedule for each secondary school, the Superintendent or designee shall give consideration to course requirements and curricular demands, availability of school facilities, and applicable legal requirements.

The Board of Education encourages flexibility in scheduling so as to provide longer time blocks or class periods when appropriate and desirable to support student learning, provide more intensive study of core academic subjects or extended exploration of complex topics, and reduce transition time between classes.

Prior to implementing a block schedule program in which secondary students attend class for fewer school days, the Board shall consult with the certificated and classified employees of the school in a good faith effort to reach agreement and shall also consult with parents/guardians of the students who would be affected by the change and the community at large. Such consultation shall include at least one public hearing for which the Board has given adequate notice to the employees and to the parents/guardians of affected students. (Education Code 46162)

### **MEMORANDUM of UNDERSTANDING (MOU)**

Between the **Glendale Unified School District (GUSD)** and **California Association for Bilingual Education (CABE)** for 2017-2018

This agreement is for the California Association for Bilingual Education Professional Development Services (CABE PDS) to provide expert consultants to deliver up to four (4) days of professional development and consulting to support the enhancement of the Foreign Language Academies of Glendale (FLAG) program in Glendale Unified School District (GUSD) for a **total of \$10,000**. The professional development presentations will be customized to meet the needs of GUSD, its administrators, teachers, and community as outlined in Appendix A, the GUSD-approved proposal.

#### **Responsibilities of GUSD**

- To secure an appropriate location and absorb any cost of the location for the presentations or consulting.
- To schedule the presentations and consulting in collaboration with CABE PDS.
- To notify CABE PDS of date/time changes for the presentation(s) or consulting in a timely manner:
  - Once GUSD and CABE PDS have mutually agreed upon the date/time for the presentations, CABE PDS must be notified of any change in date/time at least ten (10) business days prior to the originally scheduled day and time of the presentation(s).
  - ♦ If notice is received less than ten (10) business days prior to the originally scheduled day and time of the presentation(s), GUSD will be liable for any additional travel and consultant costs related to the date/time change(s), if applicable.
- To provide the audiovisual equipment needed for the presentation(s) at no cost to CABE PDS.
- To make copies of all handouts and provide all materials requested by CABE PDS consultants for the presentations or consultation meetings.

#### **Responsibility of CABE**

 To provide expert consultants to provide professional development or consulting on topics as agreed on dates mutually agreed upon by GUSD and CABE PDS.

#### **Intellectual Property**

Consultant retains all intellectual property rights to the content of the presentations/consultations.

#### Budgeting

CABE PDS will invoice GUSD for the professional development presentations the day after each presentation or consulting day is completed.

#### Insurance

CABE shall provide to GUSD a current certificate of policy evidencing its comprehensive and general liability insurance coverage in a sum not less than \$3,000,000 aggregate and \$1,000,000 per occurrence. CABE will provide evidence of Workers' Compensation insurance coverage for all CABE PDS consultants upon request.

#### Indemnification

- A. Insofar as permitted by law, GUSD shall assume the defense and hold harmless CABE and/or any of its officers, agents or employees from any liability, damages, costs, or expenses of any kind whatsoever, including attorneys' fees, which may arise by reason of the sole fault or negligence of GUSD, its officers, agents or employees.
- B. Insofar as permitted by law, CABE shall assume the defense and hold harmless GUSD and/or any of its officers, agents or employees from any liability, damages, costs, or expenses of any kind whatsoever, including attorneys' fees, which may arise by reason of any harm to person(s) or property received or suffered by reason of the sole fault or negligence of CABE its officers, agents or employees.
- C. It is the intent of GUSD and CABE that where negligence or responsibility for any harm to person(s) or property is determined to have been shared, the principles of comparative negligence shall be followed and each party shall bear the proportionate cost of any liability, damages, costs, or expenses attributable to that party.
- D. GUSD and CABE agree to notify the other party of any claims, administrative actions, or civil actions determined to be within the scope of this Agreement within ten (10) calendar days of such determination. GUSD and CABE further agree to cooperate in the defense of any such actions. Nothing in this Agreement shall establish a standard of care for or create any legal right for any person not a party to this Agreement.

## **Termination/Suspension**

This MOU may be terminated without cause by either party upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. When required by law, this MOU may be immediately suspended by either party upon notice to the other party; any such suspension shall not extend the term of this MOU.

Any notice required to be given by the terms of this MOU shall be deemed to have been given when the same is personally delivered or sent by first class mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective parties as follows:

Institute

The Superintendent recommends that the Board of Education approve an agreement with Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute to provide facilities, supplies, equipment and services to Edison Elementary School students during their annual sixth grade field trip.

Edison Elementary School is planning their annual field trip for sixth grade students to Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute (ECOS) in February 2018. ECOS is located in Running Springs, California. Through a focus on earth sciences, the ECOS Institute provides curriculum that grows the knowledge, skills, character and relationships of 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade students through three-, four-, or five-day standards-based outdoor science programs. The curriculum, aligned with California State Standards, focuses on 21<sup>st</sup> century life skills and provides learning in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) and also "whole child" development.

The Edison Elementary School annual sixth-grade camping trip will be three days/two nights from February 14, 2018 to February 16, 2018. The costs associated with the trip, estimated at \$15,120, will be funded by student fundraising and parent donations.

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# AGREEMENT FOR USE OF EMERALD COVE OUTDOOR SCIENCE INSTITUTE FACILITIES, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, AND SERVICES PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS SCHOOL YEAR 2017-2018

This AGREEMENT is entered into this 1st day of July, 2017 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute, hereinafter referred to as ECOS, and Glendale Unified School District, hereinafter referred to as DISTRICT.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

- 1.0 Under the authority of Section 8760, et seq. of the California Education Code, DISTRICT wishes to contract with ECOS to provide a program and classes in Outdoor Science and Environmental Education for students of DISTRICT.
  - 1.1 ECOS shall make available to DISTRICT one (1) or more of its Outdoor Science Institute sites (hereinafter referred to as the "OUTDOOR PROGRAM"), to be determined in the discretion of ECOS based upon the number of DISTRICT students participating in the program.
  - 1.2 DISTRICT agrees to cooperate with ECOS in every reasonable way to enable ECOS as Lessee to carry out its obligations to the Lessor(s) of the OUTDOOR PROGRAM site.
- 2.0 This AGREEMENT shall be in full force and effect for the period commencing July 1, 2017 and ending June 30, 2018. This AGREEMENT must be fully executed by the Parties and be on file with ECOS prior to DISTRICT participating in the OUTDOOR PROGRAM.
- 3.0 The authority and responsibility with respect to the conduct of the OUTDOOR SCHOOL and its program shall rest with ECOS, acting through its authorized representative, the OUTDOOR PROGRAM Administrator or his/her designee.
- 4.0 DISTRICT shall leave the OUTDOOR PROGRAM site in the same condition as when DISTRICT arrived, reasonable wear and tear excepted. DISTRICT agrees to bear the expense of repair or replacement of Lessor's or ECOS's property or equipment due to damage and/or unreasonable wear to such property or equipment by DISTRICT'S students and/or staff.
- 5.0 Hold Harmless/Insurance coverage shall be as follows:
  - A. To the extent that ECOS and its, officers, agents, and employees (collectively, "ECOS Parties") are responsible, liable or at fault for such Claims, ECOS shall hold harmless, defend, and indemnify DISTRICT, and its Governing Board

officers, agents, employees, and students (collectively, "DISTRICT Parties"), against any and all claims, demands, liability, judgments, awards, fines, liens, losses, damages, expenses, charges or costs of any kind or character, including attorneys' fees and court costs ("Claims"), which arise out of or are in any way connected to the services covered by this AGREEMENT, either directly or indirectly from any act, error, omission, active or passive negligence of ECOS Parties.

- B. To the extent the DISTRICT Parties are responsible, liable, or at fault for any such Claims, DISTRICT shall likewise hold harmless, defend, and indemnify the ECOS Parties for all Claims which arise out of or are in any way connected to the services covered by this AGREEMENT, either directly or indirectly from any act, error, omission, active or passive negligence of DISTRICT Parties.
- C. In the event of a Claim caused by the concurrent negligent act, error or omission of either party, each party, and/or any third party, a determination of the percentage of fault and or liability will be made by agreement between the parties hereto or by a court of competent jurisdiction, and, to the fullest extent permitted by law, a party's total liability to the other party and anyone claiming by, through, or under the other party for any Claim caused in part by the act, omission, or negligence of such party and in part by the act, omission, or negligence of any other party, entity, or individual, shall not exceed the percentage share that such party's responsibility, fault or liability bears to the total responsibility, fault or liability of all parties, entities and individuals determined to be responsible, liable, or at fault.
- D. DISTRICT must furnish to ECOS a certificate of insurance evidencing all coverages and additional insured endorsements required no less than fourteen (14) business days, excluding holidays, prior to DISTRICT'S first day of participation. DISTRICT shall not participate in the OUTDOOR PROGRAM session until ECOS has received a valid certificate of insurance evidencing the insurance coverage required.
- E. DISTRICT'S insurance must be with an insurance company admitted and licensed by the Insurance Commissioner of the State of California or a program of self-insurance approved by ECOS.
- F. If the DISTRICT is either partially or fully self-insured for its liability exposures, DISTRICT must notify ECOS in writing and provide ECOS with a statement signed by an authorized representative of DISTRICT'S governing board which states that DISTRICT agrees to protect ECOS and its officers, employees, and agents to no less than the protection that would be in place if the insurance requirements in this Section 5.0 were in full effect.

- G. DISTRICT agrees to maintain Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, including bodily injury, property damage, premises-operations, products-completed operations and personal injury in the amount of not less than One million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence or a program of self-insurance approved by ECOS. DISTRICT shall, at its sole cost and expense, take out and/or maintain such insurance policy(ies) or program of self-insurance approved by ECOS prior to participation in the OUTDOOR PROGRAM, and maintain in full force and effect such policy(ies) or program from the first day of participation through the last day of participation in the OUTDOOR PROGRAM.
- H. The following two (2) policy endorsements must be included and written as follows:
  - (a) "The Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute and its officers, agents and employees shall be added as an additional insured to the policy."
  - (b) "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy for the Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute and its officers, agents, and employees shall be primary, and any insurance carried by the Emerald Cove Outdoor Science Institute and its officers, agents, and employees shall be excess and non-contributory."
- Insurance certificate description should read as "Participation in the Emeraid Cove Outdoor Science Institute Program."
