## Focus on Equity

### Maximize Student Achievement

- Close the digital and equity gap.
- Offer robust in-person and independent study learning programs.
- Accelerate learning and improve attendance and engagement.

### Ensure the Health and Safety of Students and Employees

- Strengthen mental health support and programs.
- Ensure best practices for safe and healthy learning environments.
- Support physical, social, and emotional wellbeing.

### Foster a Positive Culture of Learning

- Ensure equitable teaching and learning opportunities led by excellence.
- Support culturally relevant curriculum that emphasizes inclusion.
- Increase school connectedness for students, parents, and families.

### Maintain District Financial Responsibility

- Ensure the fiscal health of the District.
- Implement a fiscal plan to preserve the District resources.
- Plan for the District's future educational and facility needs.

# Focus on Equity: Resource Redirection

- \$12 million discretionary funds to schools to meet site needs
- Closing the digital divide
- Increased mental health support
- 7-period day for middle and high school
- Expanded child care for families
- College Success Fund (college savings accounts)



# Focus on Equity

## Maximizing Student Achievement

- 7-period day provides more access to electives
- Increased intervention and support, including Super Tutors
- Universal, non-verbal screening for Gifted & Talented Education (GATE)
- Engaging, culturally relevant novels and reading materials at range of reading levels
- "Grading for Equity" training and support; adjustment of gradebook to allow for 4-point grading scale
- Targeted college counseling
- Expanded Career and Technical Education pathways and internships in high-demand fields
- Open enrollment and expanded opportunities for Advanced Placement courses
- District-funded Preliminary SAT for all 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders
- Differentiated math options to support student A-G course completion





# Focus on Equity

## Fostering a Positive Culture of Learning

- Wrap-around services – nutrition, health, counseling, child care, transportation, etc.
- Mental health support – psychological service providers, counselors
- Social emotional learning, mental health, mindfulness training and resources
- Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) and Restorative Practices
- Age-appropriate teacher resources for cultural/identity celebrations and recognitions
- "Where Everybody Belongs (WEB)" and "Link-Crew" programs to support transition to middle and high school
- Family engagement opportunities - Family Academies, Parent Chats, Parent Cafes, etc.



# Focus on Equity: Gifted & Talented Education

- GUSD began implementing NNAT3 exam – a universal, non-verbal screening for Gifted and Talented Education in the 2021-22 school year.
- Prior to 2021, students were referred for GATE screening based on CAASPP scores and administered the OLSAT, a literacy-based exam.

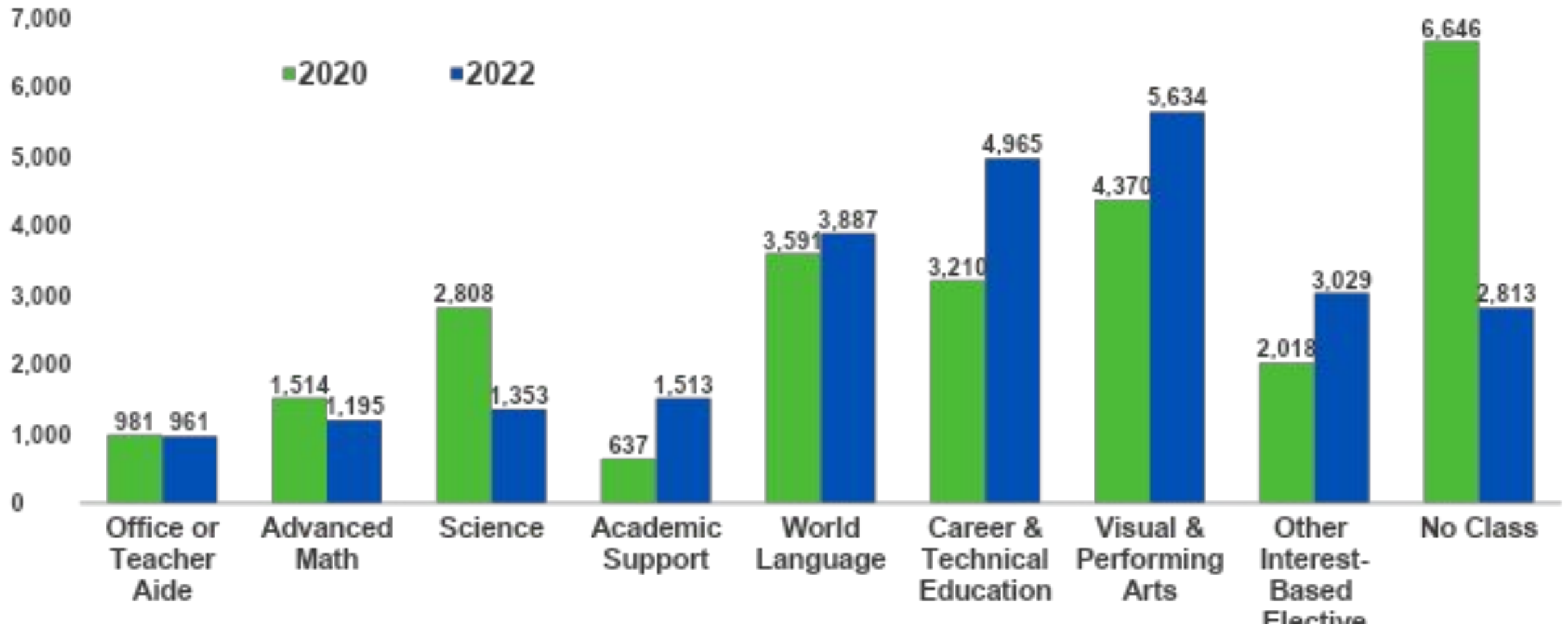

# 7-Period Day Increases Access to Electives

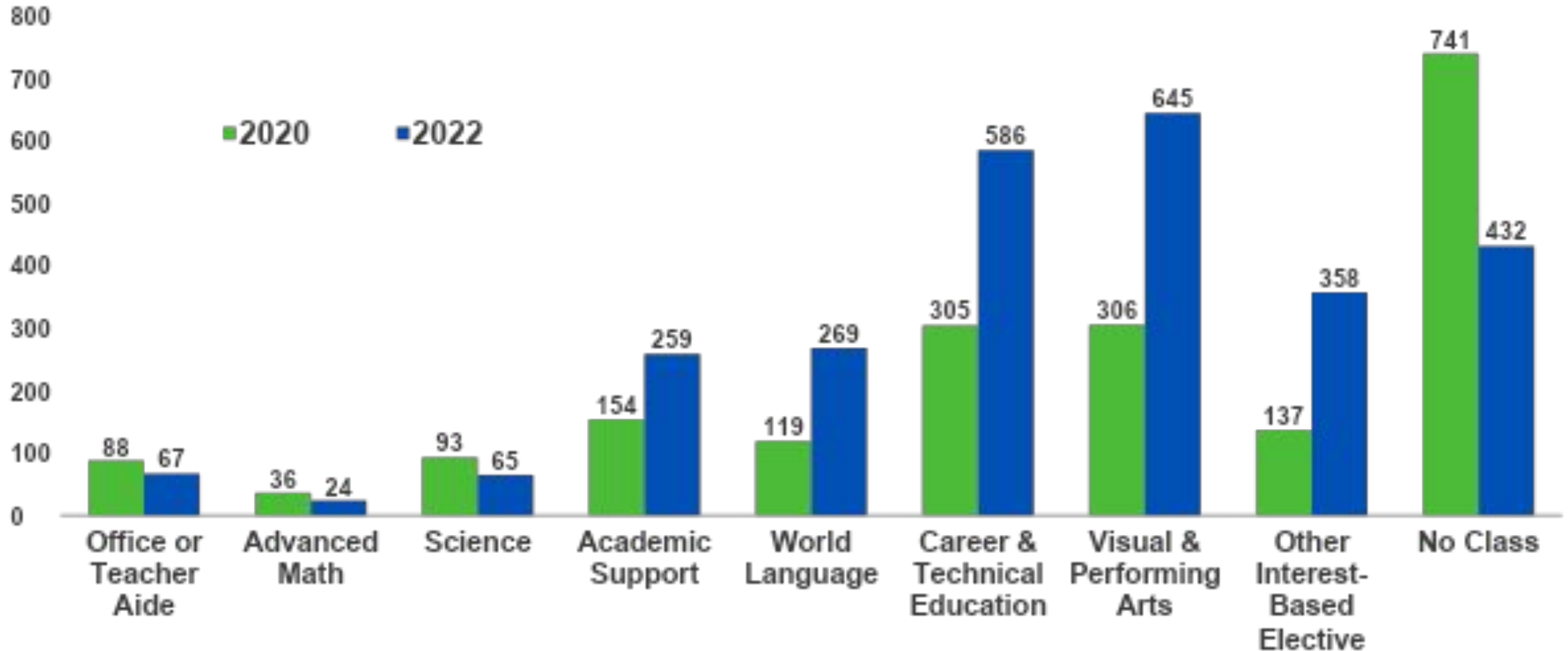
All Students: # Students Enrolled in Elective Categories

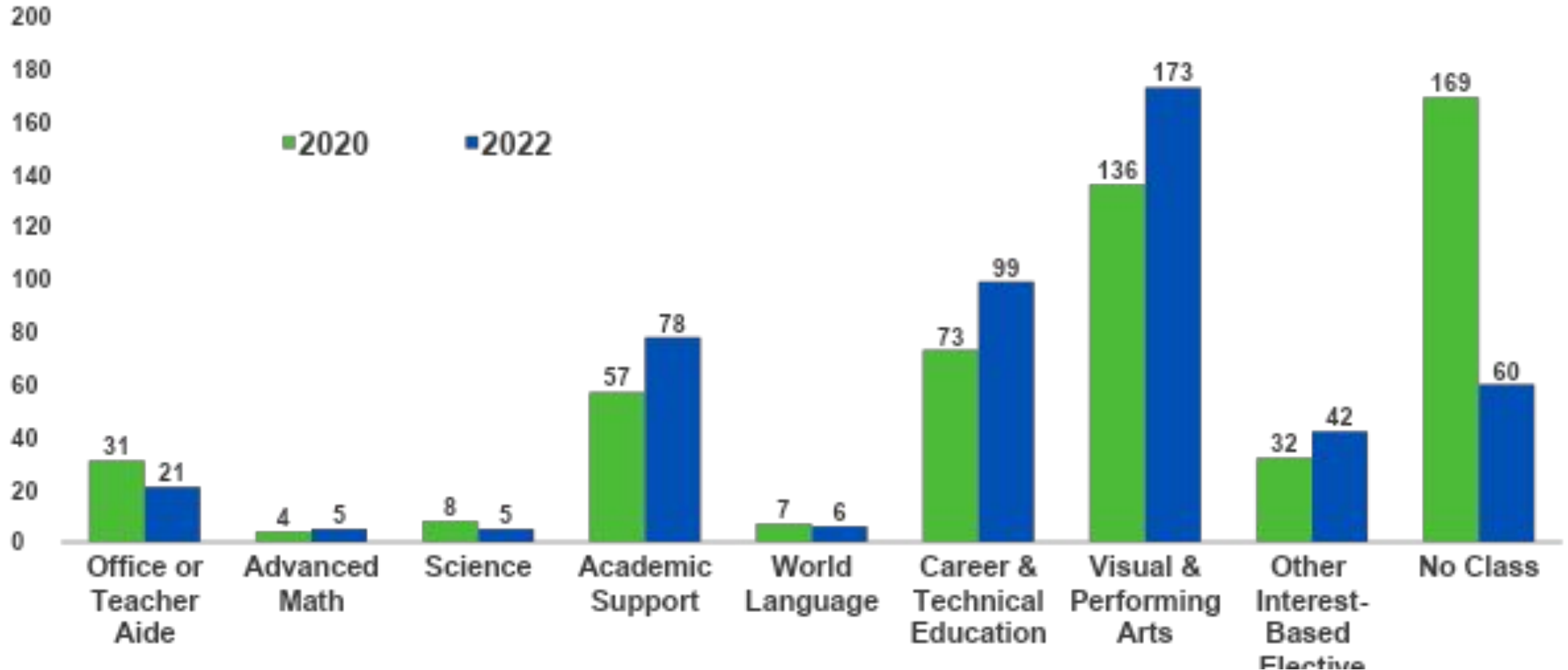
## English Learners: # Students Enrolled in Elective Categories
