

Public Health Updates

- LA County is in the Yellow "Minimal" Tier:
 - 0.7 Adjusted case rate for tier assignment
 - 0.4% Positivity rate (7-day average)
 - 0.4% Health equity quartile positivity rate
- On June 15, capacity and distancing restrictions will be lifted for most businesses and activities

Summer Expanded Learning

Administrators, support staff, 396 teachers, 107 substitute teachers, and 134 student Super Tutors will be supporting summer programs to serve 9,341 students (increase of 5,717 compared to last year):

- Preschool Summer Programs = 173 students
- Elementary Camp EXCEL = 1,806 students
- Elementary Campalooza = 1,757-1,931 students per week
- Middle School Summer School = 1,627 students
- High School Summer School = 2,897 students
- Extended School Year for Students with Special Needs = 907 students
