Campus Safety Measures

- ✓ Mental health support – GUSD invested \$2.3 MM in COVID funds to add more counselors
- ✓ Tip line (app and phone)
- ✓ See something, say something campaign
- ✓ School safety plans
- ✓ Campus safety maps (located in principal's office, superintendent's office, student support services office + law enforcement and fire)
- ✓ Schedules/rosters of who is on campus
- ✓ Secured entrances and sign in/out procedures at every school site
- ✓ Raptor emergency management system (pilot)
- ✓ Security cameras on every campus
- ✓ Security screens on fences
- ✓ Lock-blocks on doors
- ✓ Panic buttons in front offices
- ✓ Emergency bins on every campus
- ✓ Increased communication (walkie-talkies)
- ✓ Shatter-proof film on exterior windows
- ✓ Security guards at every middle and high school



Coordination with Safety Partners

- School safety plans are developed in consultation with law enforcement.
- GUSD leadership conducts regular safety walk-thrus of every campus with law enforcement, fire departments, and public health department.
 - Coordinating again for summer 2022
- Glendale Police and Fire Departments, and LA County Sheriff's and Fire Departments have updated maps of every GUSD campus.
- MOUs with GPD and LA County Sheriff's for use of GUSD cameras.
- School resource officers at CV, Glendale, Hoover High Schools.
- Security guards at Clark Magnet HS, Daily HS, and all middle schools.

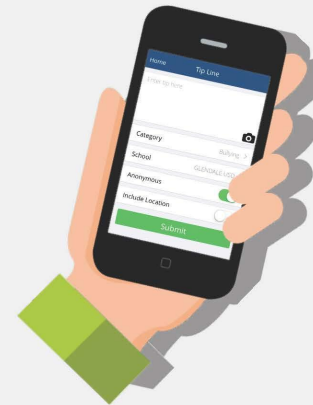
Family & Community Support
