# Public Health Updates

- LA County is in the Yellow "Minimal" Tier:
  - 1.2 Adjusted case rate for tier assignment
  - 0.6% Positivity rate (7-day average)
  - 0.6% Health equity quartile positivity rate
- State will move beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy and the Tier System On June 15
  - All industries will be allowed to return to "usual operations with common-sense risk reduction measures"

# 2021-22 Secondary School Schedules

- In consultation with principals and GTA, and after listening to students and families, three actions are recommended for secondary schools:
  - Implementation of 8:30 a.m. late start (SB 328)
  - Block scheduling
  - 7-period day





# Later Start Time for Middle and High School

- American Academy of Pediatrics (2014) recommended that middle and high schools start at 8:30 a.m. to support adolescent health and wellness
- In 2019, Governor Newsom signed SB 328, leading the nation on school start time policy
- The bill was co-sponsored by the California State PTA
- Late start was endorsed by Glendale Unified students during 2019 and 2020 student voice panels
- GUSD implemented a later start time with the 2020-21 distance learning schedule

- Middle schools offer snack, lunch, and a consistent Period 1 schedule to help students transition from elementary to secondary and provide a consistent teacher to check in with every morning.
- High School has a longer period in the morning for homeroom advisory activities, lunch, and a consistent period 7 schedule to facilitate sports.



# Advantages of Block Scheduling

- Extended class time facilitates more rigorous exploration, discussion, experiments, practice, collaboration, and differentiation
- Additional time built into the first period of each day for announcements and enrichment/expanded learning activities
- Reduced number of transitions between class periods
- Students and teachers can focus attention on four periods a day
- Additional time for teachers to collaborate; common preparation time is possible for departments



# Advantages of 7-Period Day

- Intervention classes built into the master schedule
- English learners can take ELD and an elective course
- More opportunities for mainstreaming for students with special needs
- Students can take more than one elective and pursue multiple interests
- Opportunity for students to participate in internships
- Top three California high schools ranked by U.S. News & World Report provide students a 7-8 period, blocked schedule



# **Elementary Expanded Learning Opportunities**

- Camp EXCEL invitations have been sent to students
- Sign Up for Campalooza will be sent out this week
  - 120 spaces at every elementary school, 2,400 total
  - Priority participation for students who qualify for subsidy child care and families who completed the interest survey
  - Programs provided by GUSD Child Development and Child Care, City of Glendale, YMCA, Sports for Learning, and other community partners
