



Public Health Update


- As of March 9, LA County is in week one of meeting the target to move into the Red Tier
- County has to stay within that band for two weeks to officially move into the Red Tier
- On March 4, the State announced upcoming changes to the Blueprint levels required for counties to move into the Red Tier based on vaccine equity
- Counties will move into Red Tier at 10/100,000 adjusted case rate (updated from 7/100,000)
 after adding a vaccine equity metric
- Anticipate this change will occur in 1-2 weeks

Elementary Commitment Survey Results

- 9,657 total responses (74% response rate)
- Families that did not respond were assigned to distance learning unless student is currently in a Tech Pod
- Students may be added to on-campus instruction as space allows
- Students may pivot to distance learning at any time

Proposed Elementary Return to School Timeline

- February 16: LA County districts eligible to pivot to in-person learning TK-6
- March 15-19: Spring Break
- March 23: Elementary teachers return to classrooms
- March 29: TK-2 students return for oncampus instruction
- April 5: Elementary students in grades 3-5 or 3-6 return for on-campus instruction

Pivot to Hybrid Learning Classroom Configurations

- Considerations:
 - Total number of students returning per classroom
 - Room capacity to maintain 6 feet of physical distancing



- Divide students into two stable groups
- Group A (Monday/Tuesday), Group B (Thursday/Friday)
- All students engage in distance learning Wednesday to allow for deep cleaning
- Option 2 Number of students returning </= room capacity:
 - All students may participate as one stable group
 - Group A (Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday/Friday)
 - No need for a designated cleaning day







Pivot to Hybrid Learning - Example

"School A" has a total enrollment of 839 students

403 students have expressed interest in returning for on-campus instruction (48% of total enrollment) 71 students are already in a Technology Learning Pod, 332 students have not yet been on campus







Pivot to Hybrid Learning Playtime and Child Care

- All students will have outdoor play time each day
- Student groups will be assigned an area on the playground
- Play equipment will be disinfected between each group
- Child care in Technology Learning Pods will continue to be available through the end of the school year



Vaccination Celebration

- As of March 5, all Glendale Unified teachers and staff have been offered a first round vaccination appointment
- Second round vaccinations will occur the week of March 22, before students return for on-campus instruction

- Safety signage throughout facilities



GUSD COVID Health Inspection Pre Visit Checklist

Purpose: This tool is intended to be used by the safety monitors assigned to ensure compliance of these measures at each facility.

2. Sign – Symptoms Check (Do not enter if you have COVID symptoms)
3. Sign – DO NOT ENTER if you have COVID 19 Symptoms
4. Sign – Social distancing
5. Sign – How to Wear a Mask
6. Sign – Wipe down after use manual paper towel dispensers
7. Temperature check station/sign in sheet
8. Verbally ask visitors if they have signs/symptoms of COVID
9. Separate entrances for staff? Students? Pods?

Ready to Return Safety Validation Visits

- Scheduling interested parents/community members to visit school sites in small groups
- Examine health and safety protocols using Glendale Unified and LA County Public Health checklists
- Effort to confirm what has been validated by LA County Public Health visits
- Connect with your school site principal to sign up



Public Health Parent Ambassador Program

- Partnership between LA County Public Health and LA County school districts
- Actively engages school communities in reducing the spread of COVID-19
- Empowers parents as essential partners in each school's prevention efforts
- Establishes active communication pathways between ambassadors, school administrators and Public Health to provide students and parents a voice
- LA County Public Health will provide support and training
- Participants will be expected to educate others in their communities
- Glendale Unified Equity, Access, and Family Engagement department will organize District ambassadors
- Training will begin the week following spring break
- Registration form coming soon!





COVID-19 Testing

- Voluntary testing for District employees beginning Wednesday, March 10
- Valencia Branch Lab self-administered PCR tests, observed by an LVN or trained staff
- Results are emailed and texted to employee within 24-48 hours





Athletics Update

- LA County Public Health updated their Youth Sports guidance on February 24 to allow practices, skill-building, training, and two-team competitions for outdoor moderate and high-contact sports
- Includes an informed consent process for student-athletes and parents/guardians
- Testing requirement for high-contact sports while county is in the Purple Tier
 - Weekly testing of athletes and coaches is required for high-contact sports (football and water polo)
 - o If competing, tests must be completed and results reviewed by the coaches within 24 hours of play
 - o If a student-athlete tests positive the team is considered to be a close contact and must be quarantined for 10 days
 - Cross-county teams are authorized for competitions without testing, but must wear masks
- Glendale Unified testing for athletes and coaches:
 - Weekly testing for high school football players using Valencia Branch Lab self-administered PCR tests, observed by trained staff
 - Rapid testing for water polo players participating in multiple competitive matches each week within 24 hours of each match using Vital Medical Services










COVID-19 Tracking

Employee or student's family notifies school or district about illness, testing, or test results





Individual is referred for COVID-19 testing if necessary



Individuals who have symptoms, are getting tested, or receive a positive test result are added to District database

- Contact tracing begins with every positive case
- LA County Public Health is notified of every positive case and results of contact tracing



COVID-19 Contact Tracing

- Not all positive cases result in exposure to a school or district facility
- District conducts contact tracing for all positive cases that result in an exposure to a school or district facility

GUSD COVID-19 Dashboard

- Glendale Unified tracks every positive case with confirmed exposure to a school or district facility
- Since August 11, 2020, 130 individuals who reported testing positive spent some time on a school campus or district facility (47 students, 83 employees)
- These potential exposures resulted in 1,040 students and employees being quarantined and tested
- Of the 1,040 individuals determined to have some exposure to a positive case, 13 subsequently tested positive for COVID-19
- This results in possible transmission rate of 1.44%
- In some cases the positive exposure was likely from outside the school or district facility, but is included on the Dashboard in the interest of full transparency

Glendale Unified School District COVID-19 Dashboard

Unified School District and its schools are committed to providing accurate and transparent information regarding COVID-19 cases on its campuses and work locations, while also maintaining privacy and confidentiality for its tail. The data below represents the number of confirmed active COVID-19 cases among District students and staff on its campuses (in-person only) both cumulatively from the first day of school (8/19/20) and within the past 10 journe. Pivot to Hybrid Learning Professional Development Support for Teachers

- Principals will provide on-site support for teachers
- District will provide recorded teacher trainings using Nearpod and scheduled office hours for additional support
- Teachers and staff can view videos, read content, and answer questions to check for understanding
- Teachers may "attend" trainings at their own pace
- Teachers will be compensated for training at their hourly rate



Pivot to Hybrid Learning Technology and Operational Support for Teachers

- Principals are working with teachers to determine their needs
- Sharing essential practices
- Classroom technology facilitation
- District will continue to provide tools for hybrid instruction, such as:
 - Omnidirectional microphones
 - Web cameras
 - Standing desks
