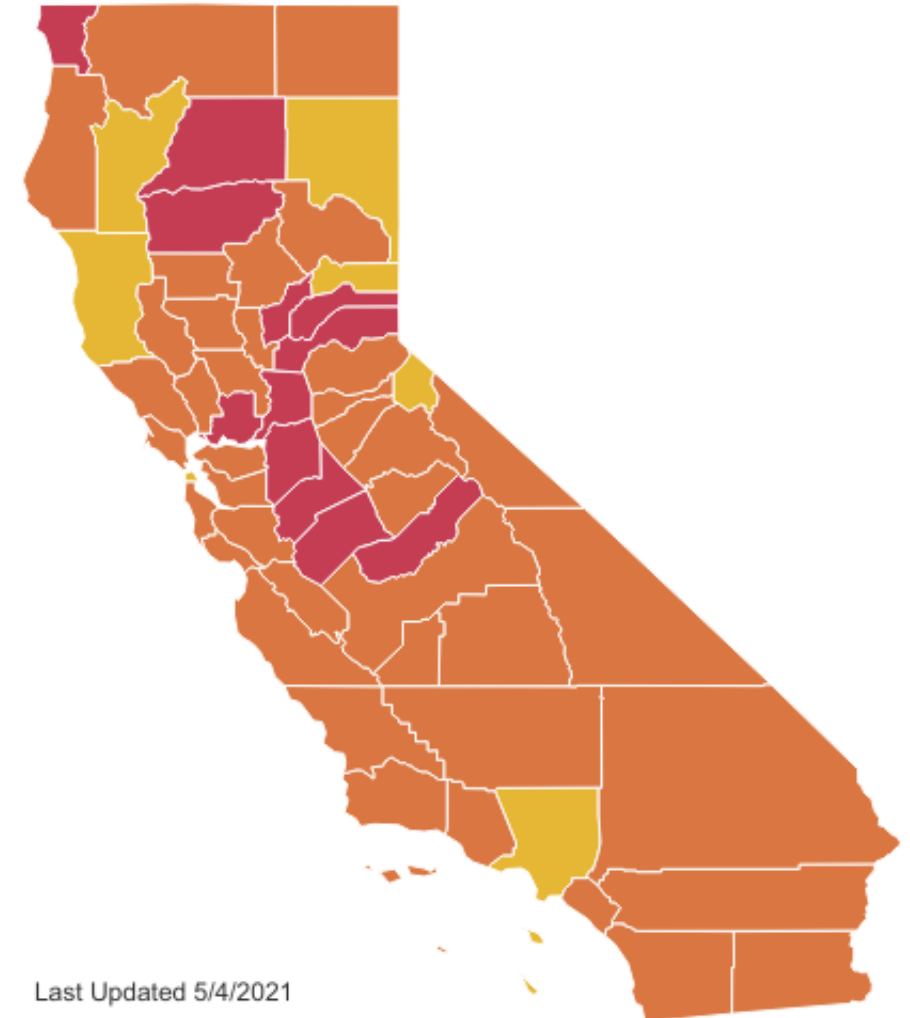

Public Health Updates

- LA County is in the Yellow “Minimal” Tier:
 - 1.6 Adjusted case rate for tier assignment
 - 0.7% Positivity rate (7-day average)
 - 0.8% Health equity quartile positivity rate
- LA County Department of Public Health will update all guidance for new allowances in the Yellow Tier
- Pfizer vaccine expected to be available for 12+ by early next week

Public Health Updates

- Staff may pull out as many students as necessary for 1-on-1 special education services and may go into multiple rooms if less than 15 minutes in each room
- Instrumental music with wind instruments may be held outdoors with at least 8 feet of distancing and use of bell covers is suggested
- Choir may be held outdoors with masks
- Drama classes may be held indoors with masks, physical distancing, and limited sharing of props
- Dance may be held indoors with masks and physical distancing, outdoors is preferred
- All performances must follow guidance for *County Health Protocols for Live Events and Performances* (Outdoor Seated or Indoor Seated)



Update on Return to In-Person Instruction

- 52.1% of elementary students have returned to in-person learning (2% increase from March 29)
- 28.6% of middle school students and 17.9% of high school students returned for on-campus instruction April 26



Looking Ahead to the 2021-22 School Year

- Governor Newsom stated that schools should conduct full-time in-person instruction in compliance with public health guidelines for the 2021-22 academic year
- Glendale Unified intends for all students to attend in-person learning full time, 5 days a week, beginning with the first day of school on August 18
- An online learning option will be available for students who cannot return to in-person learning due to medical or social emotional concerns
- District will pivot to hybrid or distance learning instruction as needed based on public health guidelines
