- Based on eligibility

- At 4 sites w/o Subsidy
- 3 days- \$285-\$518
- 4 days- \$380-691
- 5 days- \$475-864
- Rates varied depending on number of hours and grade level

- Separate programs based on funding (staff, supplies, students)
- Program differences at the child level
- Site differences

- 9 sites: 1-6 grade
- After school only
- Attendance required 5 days per week until 6:00 p.m.
- Lottery & prior attendance

- Varied Sites: 1-6 grade
- After school only, "drop in" until 5:30 p.m.
- Limited structure/activities
- \$55 per week



What has changed?

- AB 130- Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P)
 - 9 hours inclusive of school day, every school day, plus 30 additional days, access to all UPP, TK-6 grade, ASES equivalent
- Needs of families in our community (possibly related to pandemic)
- Site changes related to space
- Shifts in staffing (who is available to work)
- Shifts in thinking (equity & access)



CDCC Priorities for Care

- Access to all families who need care
- Affordability of programs to private pay families
- Quality programs that engage all kids
 - Sameness of programs at student level
- Sustainability and financial solvency
 - Maintaining contracts
 - Meeting requirements for apportionment

GUSD CARES

Care, Academic support, Recreation & Enrichment before and after School



AM Child Care

Supervision from 6:30 am until the school gates open
\$90 per month (flat fee)
Free to eligible families



TK/Kinder Bridge

Supervision until school dismissal. Students receive homework assistance and enrichment
\$180 per month (flat fee)
Free to eligible families



Dismissal +60

Supervision only for children whose parents need a little extra time to pick up.
Begins at primary dismissal and closes promptly 60 minutes after the last school dismissal.
\$90 per month (flat fee)



After School Care

Our full after-school expanded learning program includes homework assistance, snack, physical education, and enrichment activities from school dismissal until 6:00 p.m.
\$270 per month (flat fee)
Free to eligible families



GUSD CARES

Care, Academic support, Recreation & Enrichment before and after School

- 1 multi-funded program
- Homework, snack, physical activity & enrichment
- All students in same program after school
- Drop in option (Dismissal +60)
- Affordability of programs to private pay families
- Site staff team works together
- Community partnerships (One Glendale) in development

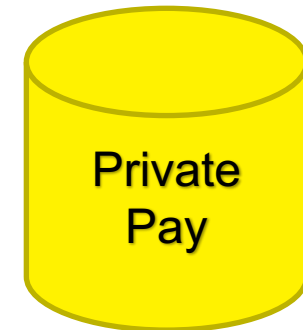
- 15 schools: TK-6 grade
- Based on financial eligibility & determination of need
- Schedules determined at certification
- Includes vacation time care
- Family fees (waived 2020-2022)
- Ratio 28:1



- 9 schools: TK-6 grade
- Priority to FRPM
- Site Administrator 10%
- Attendance requirement
- 5 days/ until 6:00 p.m.
- Registration fee \$75/family
- Ratio TK/K 10:1, 1-6 20:1



- All Schools: TK-6 grade
- Eligibility = UPP
- ELL, FRPM, Homeless/Foster Youth
- Target 50%
- ASES equivalent programming
- Based on family need
- Registration fee \$75/family
- Ratio TK/K 10:1, 1-6 20:1



- All Schools: TK-6 grade
- Based on site capacity
- Priority to families who need most amount of care
- Fees based on care options
- \$90-270 per month
- Registration fee \$75/family



GUSD CARES

Care, Academic support, Recreation & Enrichment before and after School

- Sign up opened February 22 (by March 18)
 - Information in TK/K registration packet
 - Invitation to all ELO-P eligible students
 - Notification to currently enrolled and waitlisted families
 - District-wide: site communication, GUSD news, website
- Enrollment confirmation April 15-30
- Enrollment requests accepted continuously-space dependent on staffing
- Maintain enrollment for incoming students
- Audit attendance regularly to ensure participation and maintain waitlist

Summer 2022

Child Care Camp: June 15-August 14 for subsidy-eligible families. Participation in Child Care Camp for fee is available for \$50 per day.

Typically located at 5 sites – To be determined

Additional ELO-P summer program is in planning at this time.
