# Weapons and Dangerous Instruments

- A. The Glendale Unified School District maintains complete authority over the possession of weapons on school grounds or in buildings, or on school buses, or at any school-related or school-sponsored activity away from school facilities. No person, either school employee, student, or visitor other than a duly appointed police officer, shall possess a weapon, replicas of weapons, or a dangerous instrument, including pepper spray and tear gas weapons (even though Penal Code, Sections 12403.7 and 12403.8 authorize a person 16 years of age or older to possess and carry such weapons), unless written permission has been obtained from the principal or designee.
- B. Prohibited weapons and dangerous instruments include, but are not necessarily limited to: (Education Code 48915, 49330; Penal Code 626.10, 16100-17350, 30310)
  - 1. Firearms: Pistols, revolvers, shotguns, rifles, "zip guns," "stun guns," tasers, and any other device capable of propelling a projectile by the force of an explosion or other form of combustion.
  - 2. Ammunition or reloaded ammunition.
  - 3. Knives, razor blades, and box cutters: any dirks, daggers, ice picks, or other weapons with a fixed, sharpened blade fitted primarily for stabbing; weapons with a blade longer than two and one-half inches, folding knives with a blade that locks into place, and razors with an unguarded blade.
  - 4. Explosive and/or incendiary devices: Pipe bombs, time bombs, cap guns, containers of inflammable fluids, and other hazardous devices.
  - 5. Any instrument that expels a metallic projectile, such as a BB or a pellet, through the force of air pressure, carbon dioxide pressure or spring action, or any spot marker gun.
  - 6. Any other dangerous device, instrument, or weapon, including those defined in Penal Code 12020, including a blackjack, slingshot, billy, nunchaku, sandclub, sandbag, metal knuckles, or any metal plate with three or more radiating points with one or more sharp edges designed for use as a weapon.
  - 7. Any imitation firearm, defined as a replica of a firearm that is so substantially similar in physical properties to an existing firearm as to lead a reasonable person to conclude that the replica is a firearm.

- C. Possession of or bringing such weapons or devices on school grounds may also be a violation of the Penal Code and shall be reported immediately to the local law enforcement agency and the parents or guardian notified if possible. Students who violate this regulation will be subject to appropriate disciplinary action as well as possible court action.
- D. Any certificated or classified employee of the District may seize any weapon and/or dangerous instrument from the possession of any person upon the grounds, within a school, on a school bus, or at any school-related or school-sponsored activity. (Education Code 49331, 49332)
- E. In determining whether to take possession of the weapon or dangerous instrument, the employee shall use his/ her own judgment as to the dangerousness of the situation and, based upon this analysis, shall take one of the following actions:
  - 1. Confiscate the object and deliver it to the principal immediately.
  - 2. Immediately notify the principal, who shall take appropriate action.
  - 3. Immediately notify the local law enforcement agency and the principal.
- F. When informing the principal about the possession of a weapon or dangerous instrument, the employee shall report the name(s) of persons involved, witnesses, location, and circumstances of the possession.
- G. If it is known or suspected that a student has possession of such a device but the device has not been seized, the employee should report the matter to the principal immediately and the principal shall take such action as is appropriate.
- H. The principal shall report all violations of this regulation to the Superintendent or designee and to the local law enforcement agency on approval of the Superintendent or designee.
- I. The principal shall also take such disciplinary action as deemed necessary and shall report any possession of a weapon or dangerous instrument to the parents or guardian of the student by telephone or in person and follow this notification with a letter.

J. The employee shall retain possession of the instrument until the risk of its use as a weapon has dissipated, it has been taken into possession by a law enforcement officer, it is no longer needed as evidence for the investigation or disciplinary action, or upon the request of the student's parent/guardian, until the parent/guardian appears and personally takes possession. (Education Code 49331, 49332)
