The State Allocation Board (SAB), at its meeting on January 22, 2014, authorized a bi-annual inflationary increase in the statutory fee (Developer Fees) that may be assessed by school districts for residential and commercial development. The new statutory rates (developer fees) are \$3.36 per square foot for residential development (currently \$3.20), and \$.54 for commercial/industrial construction (currently \$.51 per square foot).
