b. 2016 Los Angeles County Math Field Day – There were 20 Glendale fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students who represented the District on April 30 2016. Students from 33 schools or districts in Los Angeles County compete in this field day. Students worked in teams of four to solve problems in Problem Solving, Conceptual Understanding, and individually in Computational and Procedural Skills.

c. *Bob Hope Airport Authority Tower Banner* – The Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority once again offered students from Glendale, Burbank, and Pasadena Unified School Districts the opportunity to submit original artwork for the Tower Banner competition, with the winning entries from each school district being displayed on the building façade to offer airport visitors an added dimension to their experience of the airport and aviation. The competition winner this year from Glendale Unified School District is Austin White, from Crescenta Valley High School. Other District finalists are Kira Valera, Crescenta Valley High School (2nd place), and Lernik Khechadorian, Clark Magnet High School (3rd place). As an appreciation for GUSD's participation and for supporting and promoting education programs for the arts, Lucy Burghdorf, Public Relations Manager for the Airport Authority, is presenting the District with \$3,000.

d. *Austin White Wins* 28th *District Congressional Art Competition* – Congressman Adam Schiff honored student Austin White from Crescenta Valley High School with a First Place win in the Congressional Art Show.

e. *Poetry Out Loud* – Kristina Laue, student from Hoover High School came in first place at the district Poetry Out Loud competition with the poems "Dream Song" – by John Berryman and "The Obligation to be Happy" by Linda Pastan.

f. *Clark Lexus Eco Challenge* – The Board would like to recognize team "The Cricket Busters" from Clark Magnet High School for their first place win in the Final Challenge of the Lexus Eco Challenge.
