Healthy students attend school and are better able to learn!

Keeping students healthy is a priority of the Healthy Start program. It leads to better learning in school and more productive lives. If you don't have health insurance you may be eligible for a health insurance program. The Glendale Unified School District Healthy Start program has staff available to inform you about available health care programs and assist you with enrollment.

Why is Health Care Coverage Important?

Health care coverage allows children to have a medical home and receive consistent preventive vision care, dental care and health care. Mental health services and emergency room care are available at low cost. This means healthier children and lower medical bills.

Who is Eligible?

Most children are eligible depending on their age, family income and family size. There are programs available for children who were born outside the United States and do not have legal status.
