He went all out on them, averaging 35 points per game. They won the NBA championship again that year. And in 1993, the Bulls, led by Michael Jordan, finally completed the 3-peat. Woodson got his high school diploma in less than two years. He graduated high school, then became a teacher, then a principal, and he kept on studying hard. He never stopped. In 1921, he became the second African American to get a PhD at Harvard University!

Woodson believed in many things, while the rest of the people didn't. For example, people didn't believe in the importance of education and history, but Woodson did. The people didn't recognize Black people in American politics, but he did. So he wanted to change that. Since it is a hard job, he worked with a lot of his friends. They created the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. Now the organization is known as the Association for Study and History. The organization has been researching and speaking about Black life, history, and the culture to the rest of the world. Carter Woodson also created The Journal of Negro History, a resource where Black scholars can publish their research.
