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SERVICES

The Kindergarten, First, and Second grades are served by whole group enrichment. The identification process begins at the end of 2nd grade. The Identification process was just completed in September. The GT program serves 3 students in Third grade, 5 students in Fourth grade, 5 students in Fifth grade, and 10 students in Sixth grade for a total of 23 students serviced by the Gifted and Talented program in Elementary.

Goals

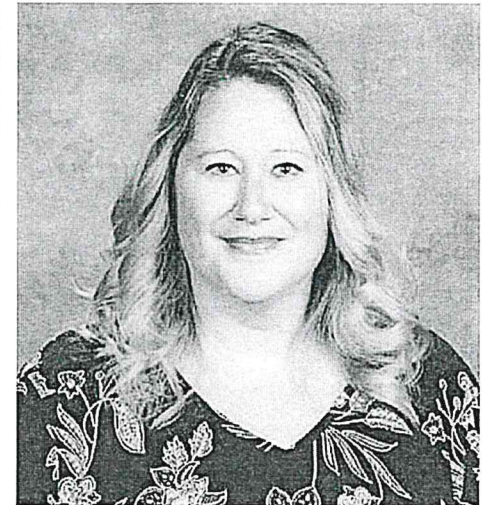
Continue to monitor all options by:

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(SERVICES cont.)

Fifth and Sixth grade students are serviced through Advanced Math, English, and Reading daily for 150 minutes and with pull out to the resource room for 50 minutes per week. They are also involved with Quiz Bowl and Chess as well as independent research. We also have competed in Quiz Bowl and Chess Tournaments. This year, due to the Covid-19, we may not be able to compete with other schools.

4 **(SERVICES cont.)**

The Glen Rose 7-12 GT program is served by Pre-AP classes, Advanced Placement classes, and college concurrent classes online and on campus. Students may also advance a year in math. AP students take the AP exams each spring to qualify for college credit and a weighted grade. Spring 2021, AP students took tests remotely via computer. Eleven students received qualifying scores in 2021.

5 **(SERVICES cont.)**

Glen Rose Jr and Sr High Quiz Bowl, led by high school teacher Wendy Abernathy, participates in invitational and AAA Quiz Bowl. Tournaments may be held virtually if conditions warrant. All invitational tournaments are subject to be virtual again this year. Students may also participate in Chess Club, led by high school teacher Julie Hathcock. They will also have the opportunity to participate in tournaments.
