OMS CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES: 2023-2024

ART CLUB

Art Club is designed for students who want to challenge themselves with interesting and creative projects. Drawing, coloring, CGI and sculpture will be attempted this year. No worries, we will make it work and it will be a fun year in the Art Club!

CHESS CLUB

The Chess Club is designed to promote brain growth, spark creativity, increase problem-solving skills, teach planning and foresight, help concentration, improve reading skills and raise I.Q.s all while having fun!

CREATIVE COMPUTING CLUB

Are you someone who can't get enough KidOyo? Do you consider yourself a code-breaker? Do you not have a clue how to code, but want to learn? Then this is a club just for you! OMS Creative Computing Club (aka the Coding Club) provides the opportunity to create coding games and activities throughout the year and we even have the opportunity to take part in the KidOyo Hackathon! This club is open to all grades.

CREATIVE LEARNING CLUB

The Creative Learning Club is designed to allow students to discover their interests by trying out a variety of hands-on skills! Students will have the opportunity to learn about five modules: Acts of Kindness, Cooking, STEM/Upcycle, Media, and Movement, while meeting new peers from all grades. Each module will have three sessions (meeting once or twice monthly). They may sign up for one or all modules. Come discover a new hobby!

DRAMA CLUB

Members of the Drama Club perform a full-scale musical each year. Students must audition to be part of the on-stage cast and must be available for every rehearsal (students involved in Winter I and II sports will not be eligible for membership in the Drama Club). For students who prefer to work behind the scenes there is set and costume design, backstage crew and publicity work.

LGBTQ+ ALLY PRIDE CLUB

The mission of the LGBTQ+ Ally Pride Club is to work toward an accepting environment for all people, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity, through education, support, social action and advocacy. Club is open to anyone who wishes to participate and meetings are held once or twice monthly.

OMS KICKERS - DANCE CLUB

A new dance club for those who want to use performance to increase and spread school spirit. This club is for all students and will meet every Thursday through the end of January. Students will work together to learn the foundation of a kickline/drill team routine. With the help of their advisor, they will choreograph a routine to perform at an event during the winter sports season. Eighth-grade participants will also take part in 'Kickline for a Day' at the high school in October. Students should wear comfortable clothes and sneakers to each meeting.

MAGIC CLUB

"Magic: The Gathering" is a strategy card game. Players build decks of cards and compete in magical duels where they attempt to defeat their opponent. Cards act as spells that summon creatures, produce enchantments, and provide offensive and defensive benefits. "Magic" has been

an established card game worldwide for nearly 30 years. Participants in the club would meet weekly to compete with one another in friendly games. New and experienced players are welcome. All participants must supply their own deck of Magic cards, available online or in local game stores.

MULTICULTURAL CLUB

Multicultural Club is a way for students to celebrate the ethnic diversity in our community. The club's main objective is to promote awareness and acceptance of diverse cultures. Throughout the year, the club will be involved in several projects that target multiculturalism. The projects and activities will provide assistance and relief to cultures in need using readily accessible resources. The club will educate the student body of domestic and international cultures. The Multicultural Club is a place to meet up with different types of people and build new friendships. The club is open to all students who wish to participate.

PHOTOJOURNALISM CLUB

The aim of this club is to create the 8th Grade End of Year video from the events that 8th graders participate in throughout the year. Interested club members need to be willing to attend 8th grade events. Students will meet when it's necessary to plan on attending an event or to create the video. This club is open to 8th grade students.

ROBOTICS CLUB

Do you enjoy building things? Do you find yourself always wondering how something works? The Robotics club will show you how to build your own robot and program using block style coding. Inhouse competitions will also be a major part of the club. The Robotics team will build and program robots to compete with other teams in an in person competition. Students will also work together to solve real-world problems and present what they have learned. There are limited spots available!

SCHOOL STORE

Through an application process, which will include teacher recommendations, students will be selected to work at the School Store. The School Store is open for business during Homeroom. As a member of the School Store, you will be getting hands-on business experience! If you are accepted as a member of the School Store Club you will be responsible for: working the school store, marketing/promoting/advertisements, store research and design, and financial planning/budgeting. This club is open to all grades.

STUDENT RECOGNITION CLUB

This club is designed to recognize and honor students who have exhibited positive character traits. Each month of the year is assigned a specific trait. Teams of teachers nominate students who exhibit the current month's character trait. A group of student committee members then meet each month to generate 'goodie' bags for the nominated students and decorate the hallways with quotes that promote the new month's character trait. In addition, the students will be involved in activities that help promote a positive school environment.

S.T.E.A.M CLUB (Science, Technology, Engineering, Aesthetics, Math)

Club members will explore and experiment with creating projects that support the principles of STEAM. Students will be empowered to think creatively for themselves, collaborate with others and demonstrate their understanding of these concepts through original ideas. Most projects include the use of the 3D printer technology as well as an exploration of digital design and coding. No worries, we will make it work and it will be a fun year in the STEAM club!
