Oldfield Middle School National Junior Honor Society Leadership, Community Service, and School Activities Form

The National Junior Honor Society at Oldfield Middle School is seeking students who have demonstrated a commitment to both their community and their school.

School Service:

Students applying for induction must have significant participation in at least one school activity (clubs, sports, student government — please see attached Student Activities sheet). Please list the organization you were involved with, activities, any special leadership position held, frequency of meetings or hours, and the supervisor of the organization/team. If a student tries out for a team but does not make it, we highly recommend that they ask for a managerial position with that team. Any students whose after school schedule is too busy to include school teams or organizations (dancers, gymnasts etc.) are encouraged to pursue activities that happen within the school day (school store, multi-cultural club, student government — see attached).

Community Service: (15 hours – documented)

Community Service must meet all of the following criteria:

- 1. Students must volunteer time and effort (participate in something you are not otherwise required to attend).
- 2. Students applying for induction must demonstrate that they have been involved in community service through *an established organization*.
- 3. Students may not receive financial or material compensation, including tips.
- 4. The community service must be signed off by the event supervisor (not a parent).

To fulfill the community service requirement, students need to have spent a minimum of fifteen hours working in their community. This may have taken place through one organization over a period of time, or through several different events/groups where the accumulated time equals fifteen hours. Please do not try to fill up your hours in the weeks before induction. We are looking for a history of service in the past year. Students must list the organization(s), thoroughly describe their involvement and any leadership positions held, hours, dates, and provide contact information as well as the supervisor's signature. You may also attach a document that you feel might be worthy of our notice (i.e. attending a leadership conference, an essay on things you have learned through service...). Failure to provide all of the requested information will adversely impact the application process.

- All school and community activities must have occurred within the last 12 months.

 Activities and Service before that will not be counted.
- Please fill out the form as neatly as possible, remembering that this form is a reflection of you.

Examples of some acceptable community service:

- Walkathons
- Organization and distribution of clothes or food drives
- Specific service within a religious community
- Volunteering at a pet shelter
- Soup kitchens
- Specific events in Boy or Girl Scouts
- Environmental groups
- Active fundraising for a specific organization or cause

Some Activities that will not be counted as acceptable for community service requirements:

- Babysitting (private/family): this is not through an established organization
- Family or friend business work: this is not through an established organization
- Counselor In Training (CIT) Programs: may receive tips
- Simple donations of money or goods: this is not volunteering your time
- Home chores: this is not through an established organization
- Caring for a neighborhood pet, shoveling neighborhood driveways: this is not through an established organization
- Any events where the student received payment, including tips
- Any activity that is not done through or for a specific organization
- All submitted activities are subject to the NJHS Faculty Council's discretion.*
- If you have any questions regarding acceptable community service activities, please contact the NJHS advisors for pre-approval.

Character: (Leadership and Discipline)

"All decisions concerning selection have a certain subjective element, but problems can be avoided if the Faculty Council develops and follow some objective criteria."

The Faculty Council will evaluate a student's character in two parts: *Leadership and Discipline*. Weaknesses in either of these areas may disqualify a student from induction into the NJHS. All candidates will be thoroughly examined by the Faculty Council.

Discipline Record:

Any student considering joining the NJHS must maintain a clean discipline record. For 7th grade candidates, the Council will review records from September to May of that student's seventh grade year. The Council will review 8th grade candidates in an identical manner, counting only the candidate's current year. The Council will review any disciplinary infractions in regards to severity, subsequent personal growth, and the *Character Counts Coalition* standards.

The form used by our chapter is directly aligned with the National Junior Honor Society's sample, but includes more detail and examples. The form is based on the Character Counts Coalition's 6 Pillars of character format (charactercounts.org). The 6 Pillars are: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship.

Opt-Out:

If at any time a student realizes that they are unable to fulfill any of the requirements for induction, or that they are unable to fulfill requirements of the chapter once they are inducted, they can approach the adviser and obtain an Opt-Out form that declares the student is a viable candidate for this round of selection, but that the student respectfully declines the invitation to join at this time. It is requested that students who decide to withdraw from the induction process at any point to make their intentions known to the adviser in some manner. Opting out or withdrawing from the process will not disqualify a student from accepting another invitation at a later date in the student's academic career.

A Note to Parents:

It is requested that all communication be initiated by students, and that parents encourage students to advocate for themselves and their questions directly with the advisor. We also ask that parents NOT fill out the form for the student as this is contradictory to the independence the NJHS seeks to encourage within its members. It is highly recommended that parents proof-read their child's paperwork, guiding them through this process.
