

<u>The Ox-Cart Man</u>, by Donald Hall and illustrated by Barbara Cooney, is the story of a self-sufficient farm of years past that takes readers through the rhythms of traditional life on a family farm. <u>Farming</u>, by Gail Gibbons, explores farms, general farming practices, and the role the seasons and weather.





The Snowy Day Adventure Pack

<u>The Snowy Day</u>, written and illustrated by Ezra Jack Keats, tells the story of a young boy who wakes up to discover that a beautiful blanket of snow has fallen during the night. <u>Snow Is Falling</u>, written by Franklyn Branley and illustrated by Holly Keller, explores how snow can help plants, animals, and people to survive a harsh winter and thrive in the spring.

Where the Wild Things Are Adventure Pack

In <u>Where the Wild Things Are</u>, by Maurice Sendak, Max's imaginative adventure begins the night he wore his wolf suit, making mischief and being downright rude. When he was sent to his room to cool off, he travels to the land of the Wild Things where he is crowned king only returning when he's ready to be loved again. The list includes both nonfiction titles about night and fiction books that emphasize concepts such as dealing with feelings and using your imagination.




