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#### Welcome to the BAND!

I am a graduate of Hartselle High School, class of 2000, and am an alumnus of the Hartselle Band Program. I earned my Bachelors degree and teaching certification at UNA and a Master's of Educational Leadership from the University of West Florida. My teaching career as a band director began in fall of 2006 and in the past 16 years as an educator, I've taught public school bands from grade levels 6 thru 12. My wife and I live here in Hartselle with our two children. Finally, and most importantly, I love teaching young people!

The Hartselle Band **will be a fun and rewarding** experience for parents and students. We will work hard together and have fun! I encourage all parents to connect with the Hartselle Band Boosters to help support our organization. The boosters stay active in fundraising, organizing, and supporting our program. The booster communication platform is through an app called "BAND". See the end of this document for instructions to join the "BAND" app.

#### Rehearsal, Classroom & Practice Expectations

All band students are expected to be in the Bandroom, with their **shoes on the carpet** when the tardy bell rings. 90 seconds after the bell the downbeat of warm ups and/or instruction will begin. All musicians should **have all supplies necessary at the ready and begin playing at this defined moment.** School policy will be followed in regards to tardies. Students should always be ready to learn, ready to work together, and ready to make music.

Safety, Clear Communication, and Compliance with teacher expectations are very important. Every student must take responsibility for their own behavior and be aware of how their actions affect others. When all band members work together for our common good, we can become an impressive group of musicians. In 3 words, Band Students will be Respectful, Responsible, and Resourceful.

On a regular basis, all students will be expected to prepare some musical content on their instrument, outside of class. This means that your child will need to make arrangements to practice their instrument at home and regularly complete a recording assignment on Google Classroom. As a general rule, students need to have their instrument available at home to practice and develop some essential skills. Some students practice everyday, and others practice every other day.

## **Grading Policy**

<u>Daily Participation - 5 points</u>: All students will receive a daily participation credit of up to **5 points per day**. The students can earn full credit by having all needed supplies in rehearsal AND engaging in all musical activities.

<u>Quizzes/Written Assignments - 25 up to 50 points</u>: Periodically throughout the semester, the students will complete written work to learn music theory, ear training, music history, and rehearsal/concert etiquette. These will range in value from **25 to 50 points** per assignment.





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<u>Performance Assessments - 100 points</u>: This type of assignment is CRUCIAL to our success as a band. Using the google classroom platform, students will perform and record an excerpt of music and submit it to Mr. Nix for assessment. *If your child needs access or resources to complete these assignments; time and resources WILL BE PROVIDED to your child to complete these assignments during their class period.* Once completed and returned, the students may resubmit work up to three times to improve their grade, if needed. I will accept past due assignments, but credit will be deducted for late submissions. These important assignments are worth 100 points per assignment.

<u>Concert Attendance - 100 points</u>: We prepare for these moments daily in class, and we need everyone to be there. Criteria for this includes being punctual, dressed appropriately, bringing needed materials, and staying through completion of the event. If your child misses a concert, I will need a written/typed, signed, and dated document from a parent or guardian providing a reason to excuse the students absence. Once excused, an alternative assignment will be assigned to the student. These are **worth 100 points per concert**.

\*\*\*Students scoring 85% or higher in Daily Participation AND Quizzes/Written Assignments will be eligible to drop their lowest Performance Assessment grade from the 9 weeks average.\*\*\*

In my years of experience teaching band, I've seen instrument vendors on the internet target a low price niche in the market. This market has grown within the past 10 years, but the quality of the instrument has remained low. I've witnessed the frustration a band student experiences when trying to make these low quality instruments function in a band setting. If you are buying used, please discuss with me the type and age of the instrument. I will be glad to inspect an instrument that you may be interested in purchasing. Below is a list of band instruments that come from brands that are known for great quality construction and performance.

<u>Clarinet:</u> Normandy 4, Noblet, Yamaha, Selmer, Buffet <u>Trumpet</u>: King 601, Yamaha, Conn, Holton, Bach, Getzen

<u>Trombone</u>: King, Yamaha, Conn, Holton, Bach, Getzen

Percussion: Mapex, Pearl
