TECHNOLOGY:

Student technology offers a new element to the classroom. Students will use their school-provided Google Chromebook to participate in class and outside of class using Google Classroom, Google Tools, Desmos, Quizizz, and other applications. Students are responsible for bringing their device ready for class and using it responsibly during class. Students will only be allowed to use their Chromebooks and the appropriate apps when instructed by the teacher. *There should be no texting or internet use during school hours (no Instagram, Snapchat, TikTok, etc.)* Your Chromebook is an excellent resource, our goal is to learn to use it appropriately and to help move learning forward. *If a Chromebook distracts learning, I will use a three-strikes rule resulting in the loss of the device and/or the privilege to use the device in class. Cell phones will be confiscated immediately, if seen, and taken to the front office (this is a* <u>school policy</u>).

Chromebooks should be brought to class every day and must be charged. Failure to comply could result in a loss of points for an assignment

GRADING POLICY:

1. <u>Minor Assignments</u>: Classwork, Homework, Weekly Deltas or Math IXL assignments, and Unit Study Guides. Each homework assignment is given to practice skills learned in class. All daily assignments including notes and activities should be kept neatly in a notebook so that it may be used for reference and studying. 2. <u>Major Assessments:</u> Quizzes, Tests, and Projects. At the end of each unit, <u>TWO TESTS</u> are given. If a student scores 85+ on the first test, the student may take two class days "off" or retest for an even higher score. If a student scores below an 85 on the first test, the student will test again after a built-in review day where we go over the first test together reviewing misconceptions. The second test will occur the day after the review day during class. <u>The higher of the two scores prevails.</u>

***If a student is absent for Test 1 and returns the next day, he/she may either make up Test 1 or participate in the review for Test 2. If a student is absent for both Test 1 and the Review Day, then he/she will only take Test 2. ***

3. <u>Semester Exam</u>: A comprehensive final exam will be given to every student regardless of averages or absences at the conclusion of each semester. The final exam is 20% of your semester grade.

MAKEUP and ABSENCES:

It is the student's responsibility to see the teacher about makeup assignments/tests. Assignments not made up receive zero points. All missed notes should be copied from a classmate's notebook or Google Classroom. Google Classroom is the primary resource for collecting and completing makeup work. <u>Please note:</u> A single absence the day before the test does not excuse the student from the test. If a test is missed, it is the student's responsibility to schedule a make-up time preferably before school, beginning at 7:20. It is recommended that the test be made up as quickly as possible. <u>The</u> <u>Hartselle City Schools policy on excused and unexcused absences will be</u> followed.
