Preparation and Concert/Contest Dress

- Come prepared everyday. Upon entering the room, grab music from the trays or your music binder. You will need your composition notebook for Wednesday Writing assignments.
- If we attend a contest as a group, choir robes will be worn for the performance. Black pants and black shoes will need to be worn under the robes. If we perform downtown for events and do not wear the robes, students will need to wear a pair of nice jeans without holes. I will provide a Hobart Choir polo shirt to be worn for the performance and will check it out that day.
- Nice, school appropriate dress clothes are required for the concerts. Follow the school dress code! <u>T-shirts, hoodies, spaghetti strap/halter top shirts/dresses are NOT ALLOWED!</u> Skirts and dress lengths must follow the dollar bill width rule in the school handbook. Pants or slacks are requested instead of jeans. If you don't have any pants or slacks, a nice pair of jeans without holes can be worn. Grades will be deducted for not dressing for the concerts and contests.
 - **Our first concert is 4 months away so now is plenty of time to find something appropriate to wear.

Rules and Discipline

I expect all students to follow my classroom rules.

Discipline:

- -A warning will be given first with points being taken off their daily point total.
- -Afterschool detention will be assigned for the next day or ISD
- -If the behavior hasn't changed after those have been given, the student will go straight to the office.

Classroom Rules:

- 1. Come in quietly, pick up materials for class, and be seated by the time warm-ups start.
- 2. Stay in your seat at all times unless otherwise given permission to be up.
- NO GUM!!
- 4. DO NOT bring food or drinks to class. If we have a reward day after a concert, I will tell you which day we will celebrate and then you can bring something.
- 5. No cellphones!! All cellphones will be placed in the basket on the piano at the start of class. If you have a cellphone out during class and don't turn it in, I will write a pink slip and take the phone to be turned into the office.
- 6. No toys, gadgets, or any item that will cause a distraction during class. These items will be taken and turned into the office.
- 7. No talking while I'm talking or while we are singing, you must raise your hand and get permission to speak. Grades will be affected for talking without permission.
- 8. Keep your hands to yourself and leave each other and their property or space around them alone.
- Be on time for class! If you are tardy, you will be marked in the computer and only the office staff can correct it after I mark it. Please let the office know you will be tardy before you come over to the music room.
- 10. Stay away from my desk, piano, and computer unless you have permission. (Do not touch the piano keys as you walk by!)
- 11. Students will be excused for restroom purposes only in case of illness or emergency. The custodian will lock the bathrooms in the music room building if there is a mess made in the bathrooms! It will then be off limits to students, so be responsible and use good actions so this doesn't happen.
- 12. Disrespectful students will not be tolerated. Afterschool detention will be assigned or the student will be sent straight to the office if you are disrespectful to myself or any other students.
- 13. Do not destroy school or my personal property. Be respectful of our school and other students property because you would not be happy if they destroyed something of yours.
- 14. Sing!! Students are expected to at least try their hardest everyday and participate.
