- 2012 Graduation Requirements
- Leads to lower drop-out rates (If a student does not graduate in 4 years, he/she is considered a drop-out)
- Gates Foundation survey found that 81% of drop-out students say that "more real-world learning" may have influenced them to stay in school.
- U. S. Bureau of Labor statistics show that 18 of the 20 fastest growing occupations within the next decade WILL REQUIRE CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION.
- Resurgence of CTE growth across the nation.


