CLASS SPECIFICATION

DISPATCHER/DRIVER TRAINER

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of the Supervisor of Transportation, train and re-train school bus drivers and oversee the general performance of the school bus driver staff.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES:

Organize the Transportation Office including routing, time scheduling, equipment and driver assignments. *El*

Maintain various records and files related to pupil transportation, maintenance, budget, driver training records and seniority balance. *El*

Attend conferences, workshops and transportation organization meets to maintain current knowledge of State pupil transportation regulations, and Department of Motor Vehicle (DMV) laws and policies. *E3*

Conduct training programs for new trainees; conduct renewal classes for regular *drivers. El*

Provide and maintain maximum efficiency for the safe transporting of students.

Assist the Supervisor with maintaining maximum safety and usage of equipment and personnel; participate in instruction of pupils in safe bus riding habits and bus evacuation procedures.

Assist the Supervisor with the organization of safety meetings and in-service programs to inform driving staff of updated State laws and regulations, DMV change and District policies.

Maintain appropriate licenses, special certificate and instructor's certificate. E3

Maintain and project good communication with the community and parents.

Serve as a relief driver as necessary.

Perform related duties as assigned.

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of:

- Methods, tools, material and equipment used in the maintenance and repair of mechanical equipment.
- Provisions of the California Motor Vehicle Codes applicable to the operation of vehicles in the transportation of school children.
- Proper operation of auxiliary equipment on motor vehicles.
- Modern office practices, procedures and equipment.
- Record-keeping techniques.
- Operation of a computer terminal and data entry techniques.
- Correct English usage, grammar; spelling, punctuation and vocabulary.
- Oral and written communication skills.
- Laws, rules and regulations related to assigned activities.
- Applicable sections of the State Education Code and other applicable laws.
- Interpersonal skills using tact, patience and courtesy.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Principles and practices of training and providing work direction.
- Technical aspects of field of specialty.

Ability To:

- Diagnose mechanical defects and perform necessary repairs.
- Understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- Utilize mechanical tools and equipment.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.
- Prepare and deliver oral presentations.
- Establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships with others.
- Maintain records and prepare reports.
- Compile and verify data and prepare reports.
- Operate a computer terminal to enter data, maintain records and generate reports.
- Assign and review the work of others.
- Train, supervise and evaluate personnel.
- Read, interpret, apply and explain rules, regulations, policies and procedures.
- Maintain current knowledge of program rules, regulations, requirements and restrictions.
- Maintain current knowledge of technological advances in the field.
- Analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action.
- Perform complex or varied tasks.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Any combination equivalent to: graduation from high school including coursework in office practices and procedures and five years of broad, varied and increasingly responsible experience in the field of transportation. Preference will be given: to candidates with two years of college or advanced certification in specialty fields including driver training and operation of vehicles in the transportation of school children; for experience in public education; for wide contact with the public; and for experience in a supervisory capacity.

LICENSES AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS:

- Valid California Motor Vehicle Operator's license, Class 2 license and must be insurable under the District's carrier.
- Valid California driver's license
- Valid Instructor's Certificate.

WORKING CONDITIONS:

Environment:

- School bus driving and training environment.
- Driving in various road and weather conditions.

Physical Abilities:

- Bending at the waist.
- Hearing and speaking to exchange information and provide training.

Hazards:

- Exposure to driving a school bus during adverse weather and traffic conditions.
- Exhaust fumes.
