Teacher Appreciation Week: During the first week in May, the Huntington Beach City School District (HBCSD) celebrated all certificated and classified staff members. More specifically, the Preschool Academy Leadership Team honored the hard work of our instructors daily with some goodies and playful puns. Our agency recognizes the tireless efforts of all staff members to provide unique and developmentally appropriate learning opportunities for the littles of our community. Reading is Fundamental (RIF): The Preschool Academy has partnered with Reading is Fundamental (RIF) for years. RIF is committed to supporting a literate America by giving children access to various literacy materials three times throughout the school year. During the Preschool Academy's last RIF book distribution of the 2022/23 school year, Director, Jason C. Reyes, went into each classroom to read with the students. He shared an interactive reading of There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed a Frog. During this reading, students could feed the old lady similar items identified in the book. They worked on various skills, including sequencing, answering open-ended questions, using language to express a want/need, and waiting for a turn. In addition, all students were sent home with a book and bookmark of their choosing.

Interactive Learning- Life Cycle of Butterflies & Chickens: Students on all three of our Preschool Academy campuses had the opportunity to receive interactive instruction when learning about the life cycle of both Butterflies and Chickens. More specifically, students on the Perry campus observed caterpillars transition twice into chrysalis and adult butterflies. In addition, our instructors paired this learning opportunity with the book titled *The Hungry Caterpillar*, which students referenced when providing delicious snacks for the butterflies— specifically oranges. On the Eader and Peterson campuses, students observed eggs hatch into chicks. During this process, students were introduced to incubators and their purpose. These were fun activities for students and instructors alike.

2023 ECE Employee of the Year: On Thursday, June 8, 2023, the Preschool Academy held its last program-wide staff meeting of the 2022/23 academic year. In this meeting, Director Jason C. Reyes recognized the program's first Employee of the Year voted to receive this acknowledgment from her colleagues.
