


New Course: Digital Art I/II

• 94% of Class of 2023 seniors taking AP Literature earned a score of 3, 4, or 5 on the AP exam (NYS average was 73.4%)



• 21% enrollment increase in AP Language & Comp (11th grade)



• 4% rise in Mastery Level on English Regents in the 2022-2023 school year






Mathematics

New Course: Coding

- Increased enrollment in AP Math Courses since 2021
- Possibility of adding two additional AP courses next year
- AP Calculus increased mean scores:
 - Calculus AB: from 3.15 to 3.54 (2023)
 - Calculus BC: from 3.9 to 4.17 (2023)



Technology

- Department received a Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Grant valued at approximately \$15,000
 - Free professional development for 4 teachers
 - Two years district membership
- PLTW: Nationally recognized science and engineering program that provides students with the ability to earn college credits through our engineering program






