The Council enjoyed a trip this year to San Francisco and showed a movie prior to Christmas.

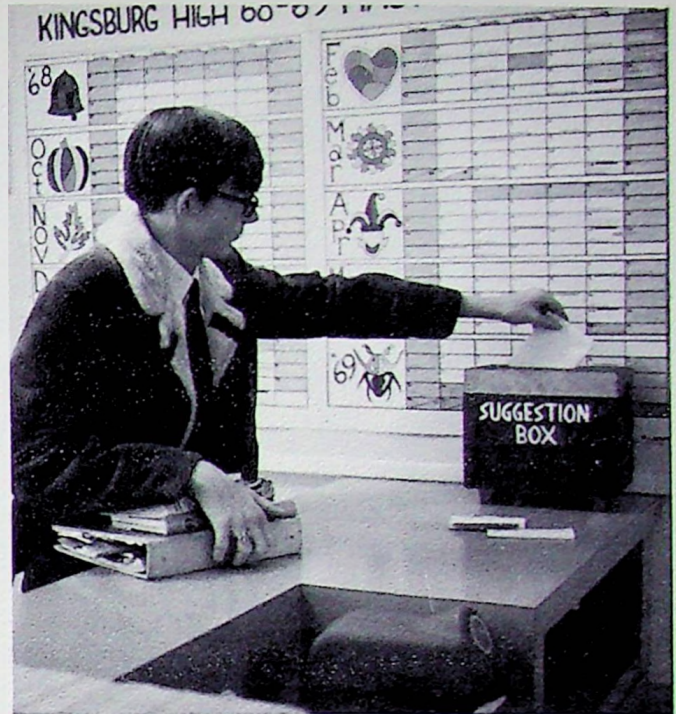

The year closed with the installation of new officers and a farewell party in May.

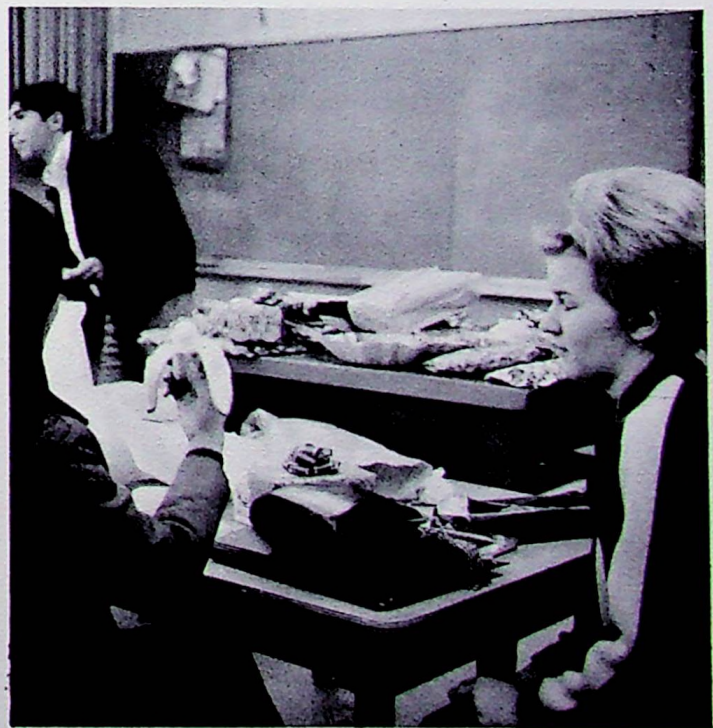

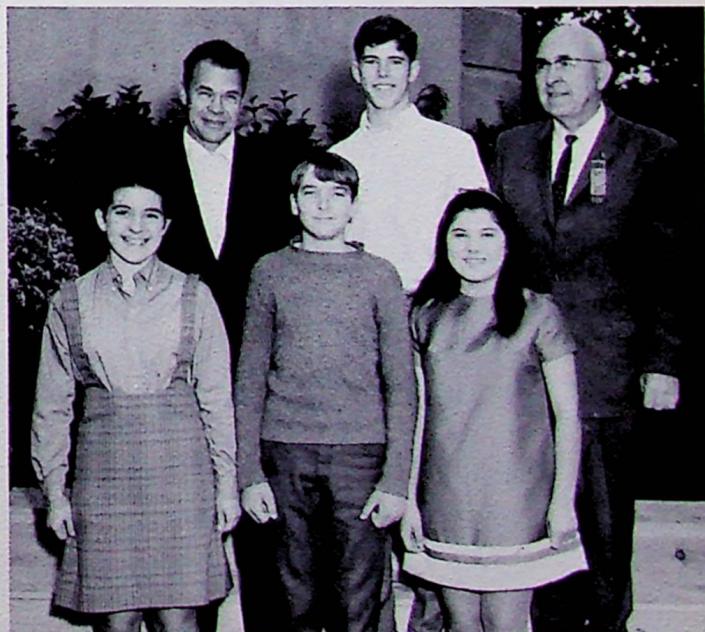

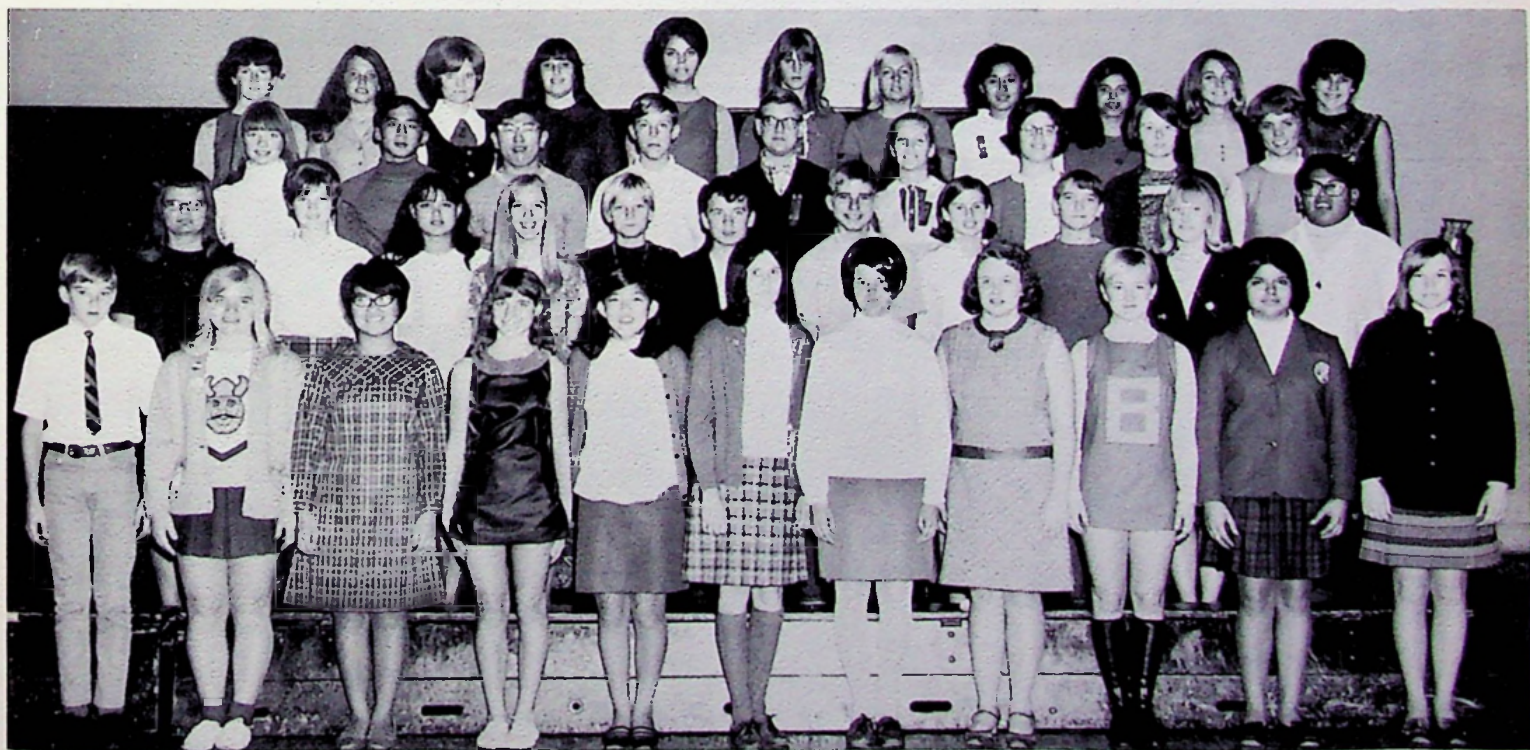

The Block K has as its aim the promotion of all high school sports. Its task is not only to represent the high school on the field of competition, but also to maintain a high standard of sportsmanship.

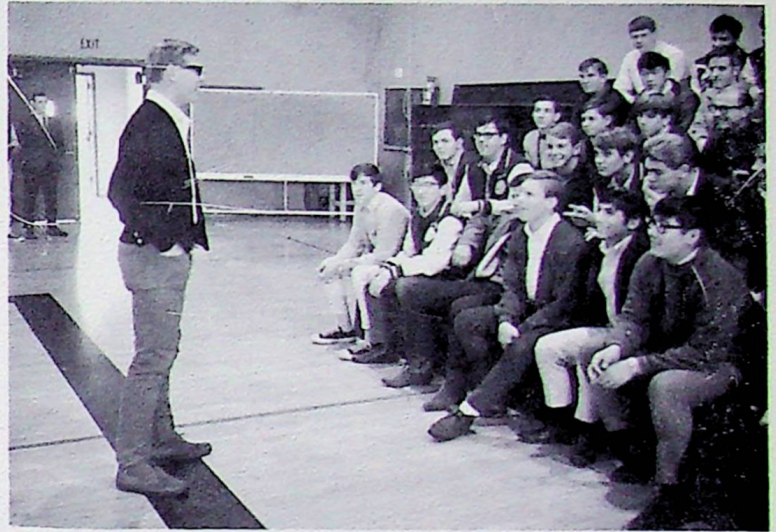

Bob Togioka was one of the top defensive men, and also led the team with 42 assists. Mike Jensen shot 73% at the foul line to lead the team in that department.

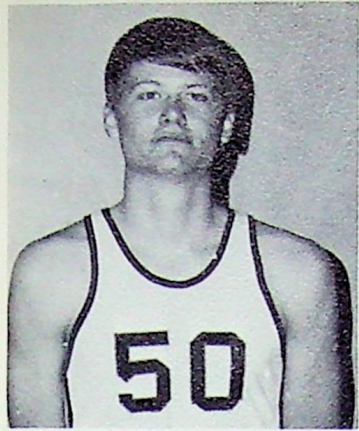

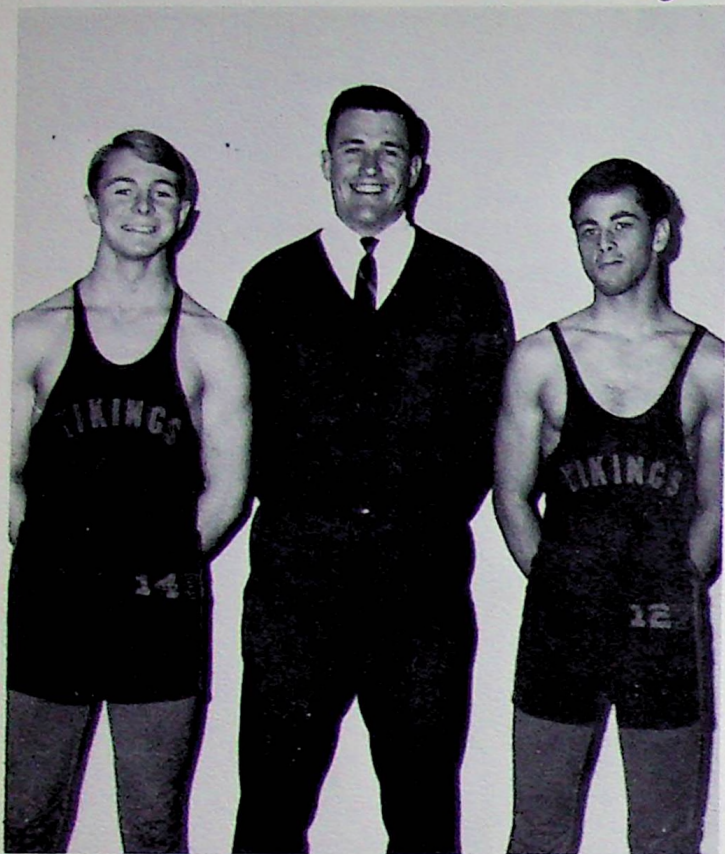


Co-Captain Hamada reaches for a rebound as Yano looks on.
