The secret of success is continuous effort. It is always more difficult to climb up the hill than it is to slide down.



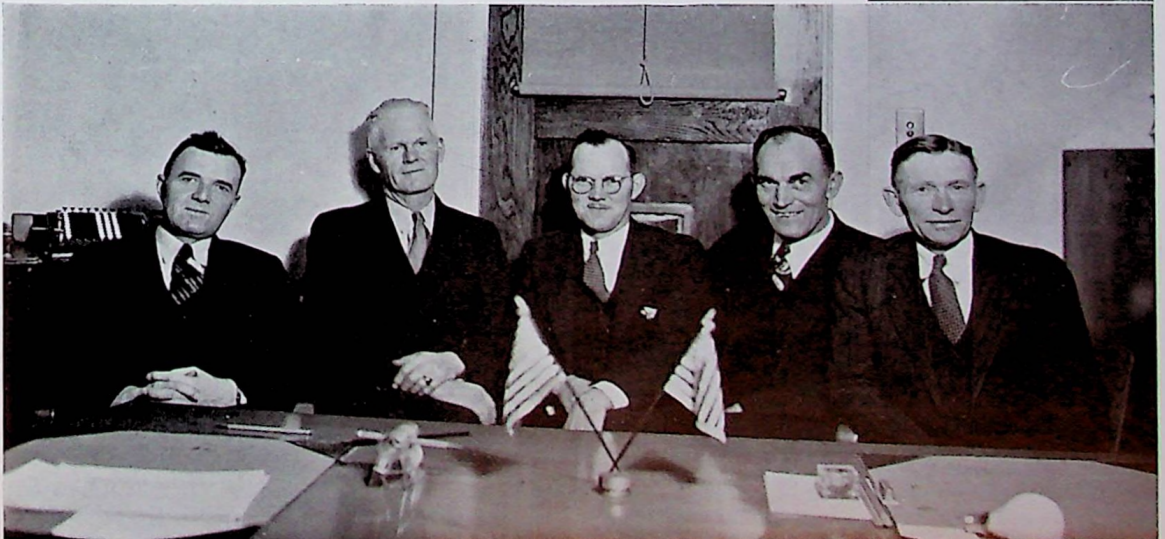

## STUDENT BODY

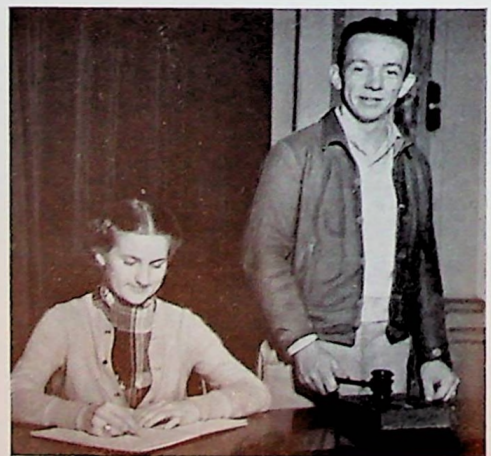

The Masquers is an organization for the purpose of promoting interest in and for the development and appreciation of Drama and the finer Arts.

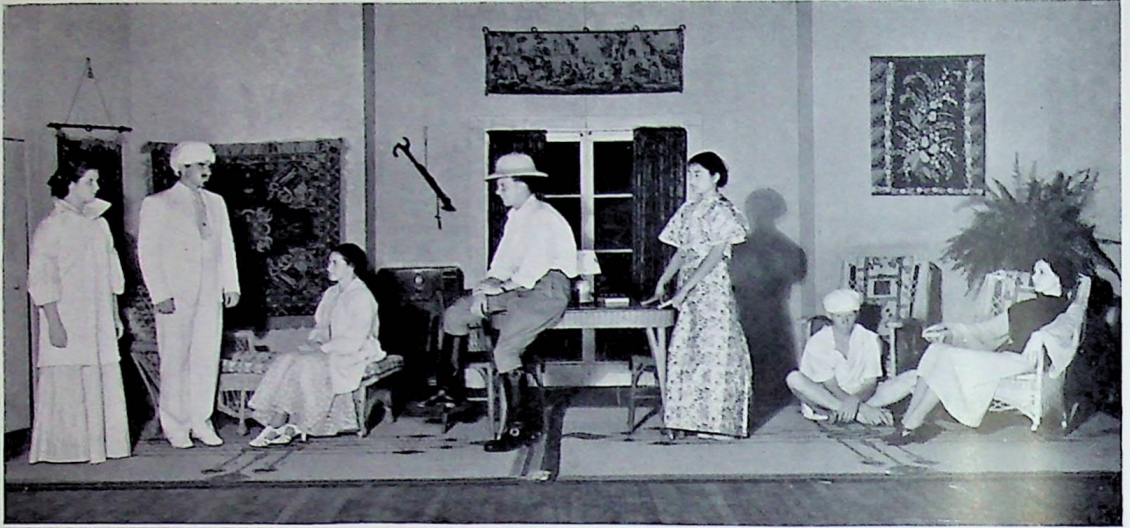
The club has a small though enthusiastic membership and the group has done preliminary work on marionettes, tableaux, choral reading, and one act plays.

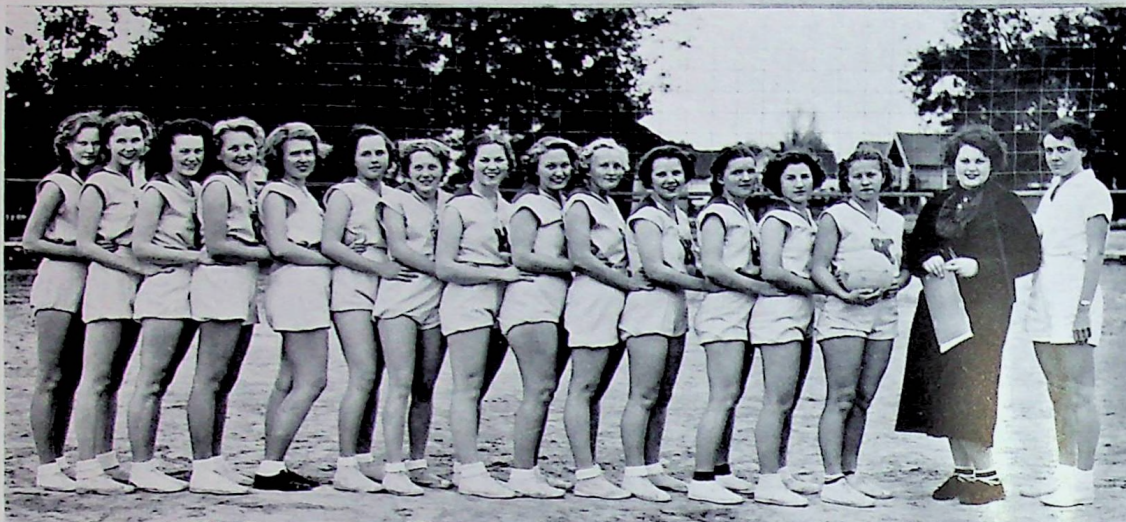
## TENNIS
