The Student Body consists of all the students in school. Its governing body is the Board of Managers which is comprised of the student body officers and the president and secretary of each class. The student body officers are

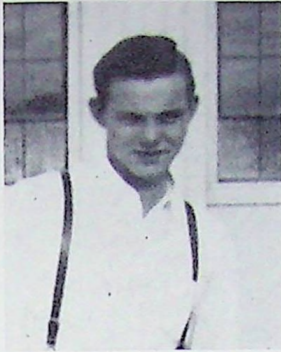

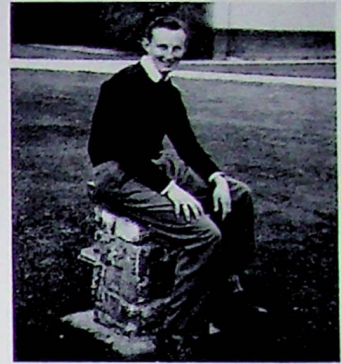

As in music, one must always be a beginner. So were we when we began our progress as Freshmen.

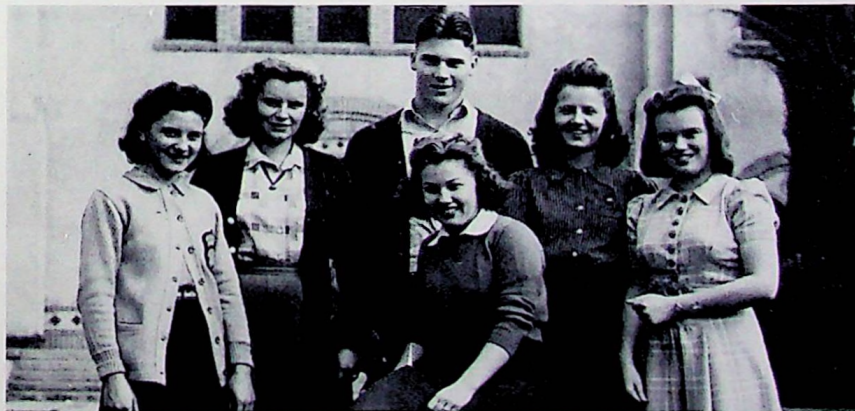
At our reception, we looked up to the Seniors in the same manner as a beginner looks up to an accomplished musician.

Our spirits as Sophomores were bolstered considerably when we won the quiz.

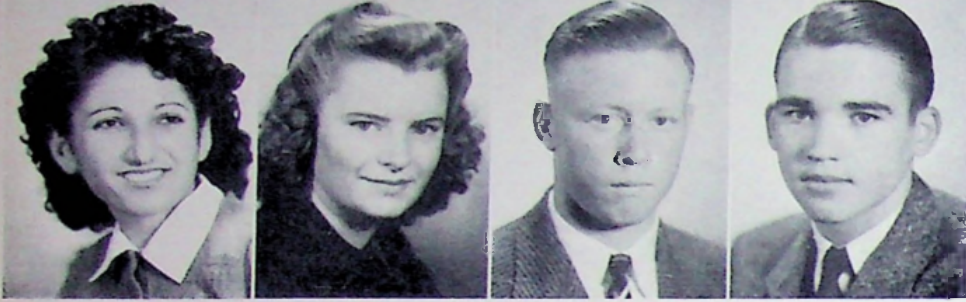

The social event of the year was a progressive dinner March 21.

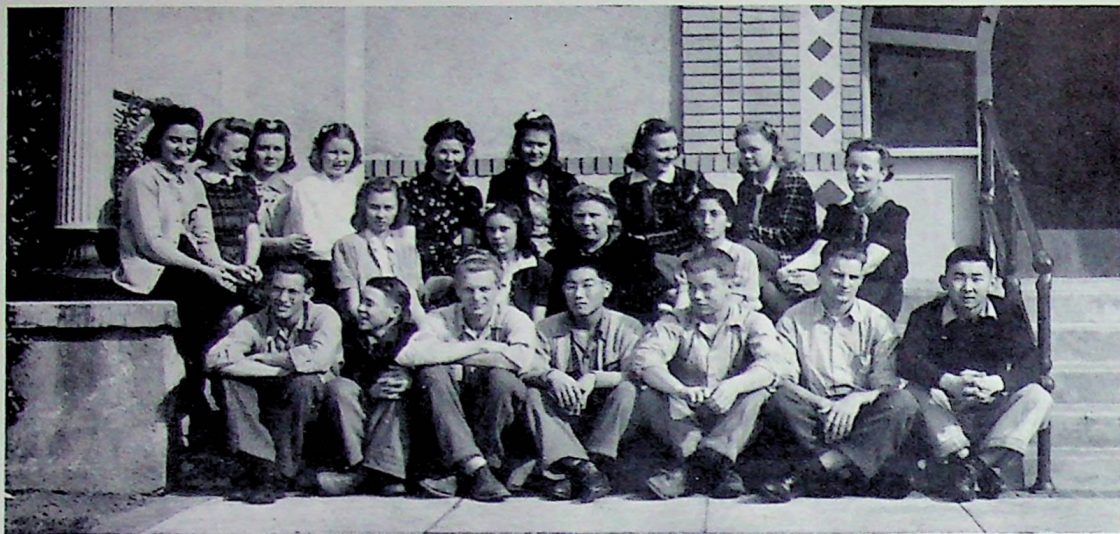
Several of the students attended the Spring Press Conference April 26, in Fresno. The "Viking News" received an "A" rating.

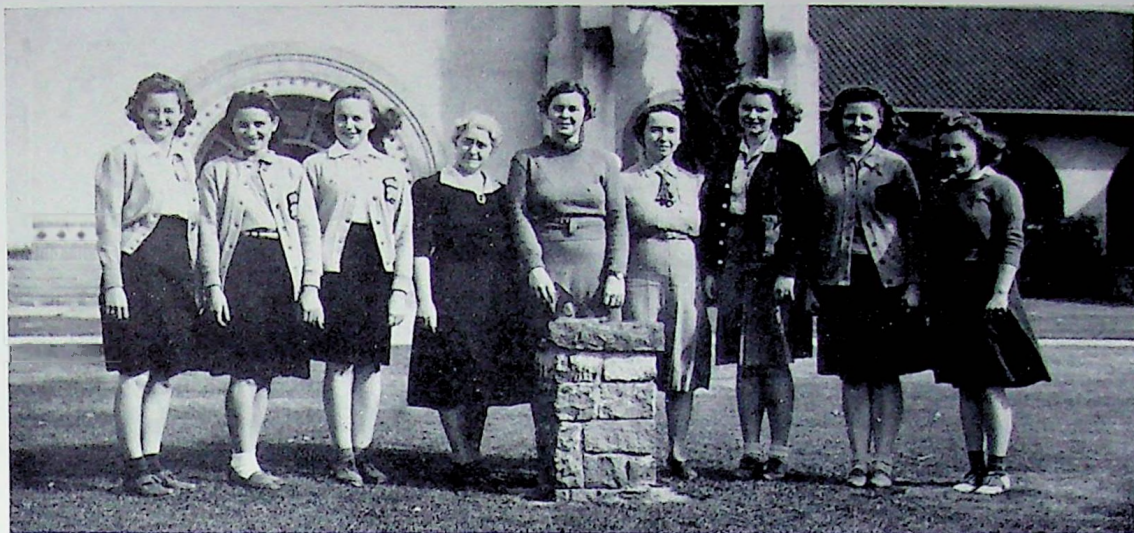

At the annual Armistice Day parade the band was awarded first prize for street and field marching.

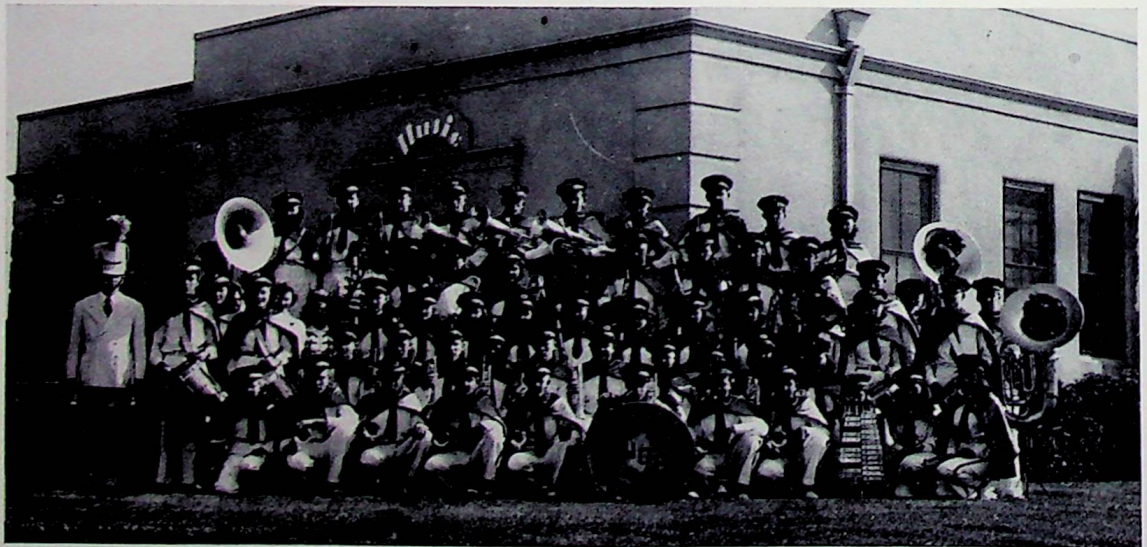
The band presented the Student Body with a snappy pep concert, and later in the season it displayed real musicianship at the Annual Spring Concert.

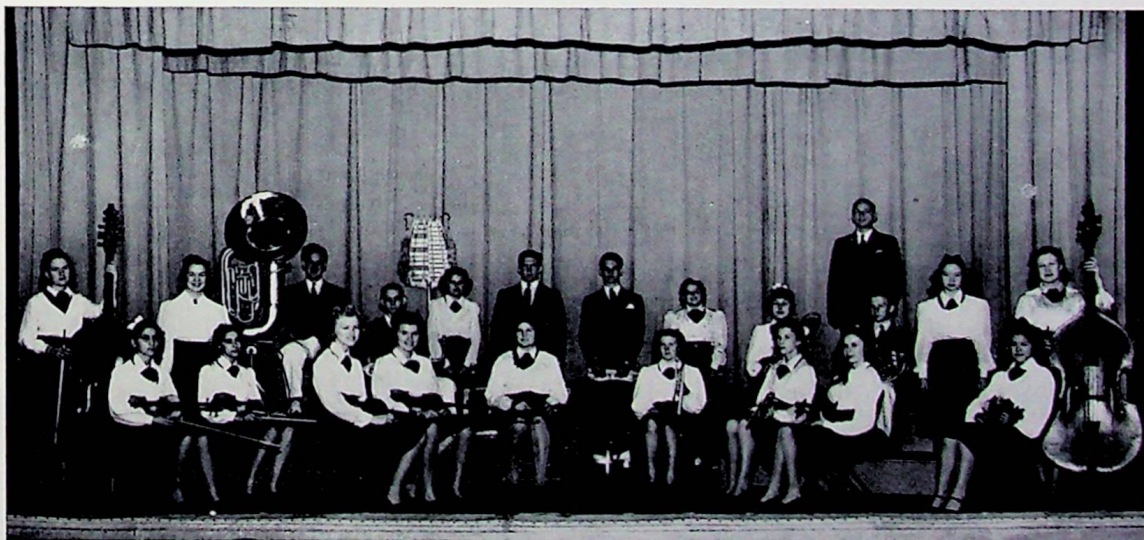
ORCHESTRA

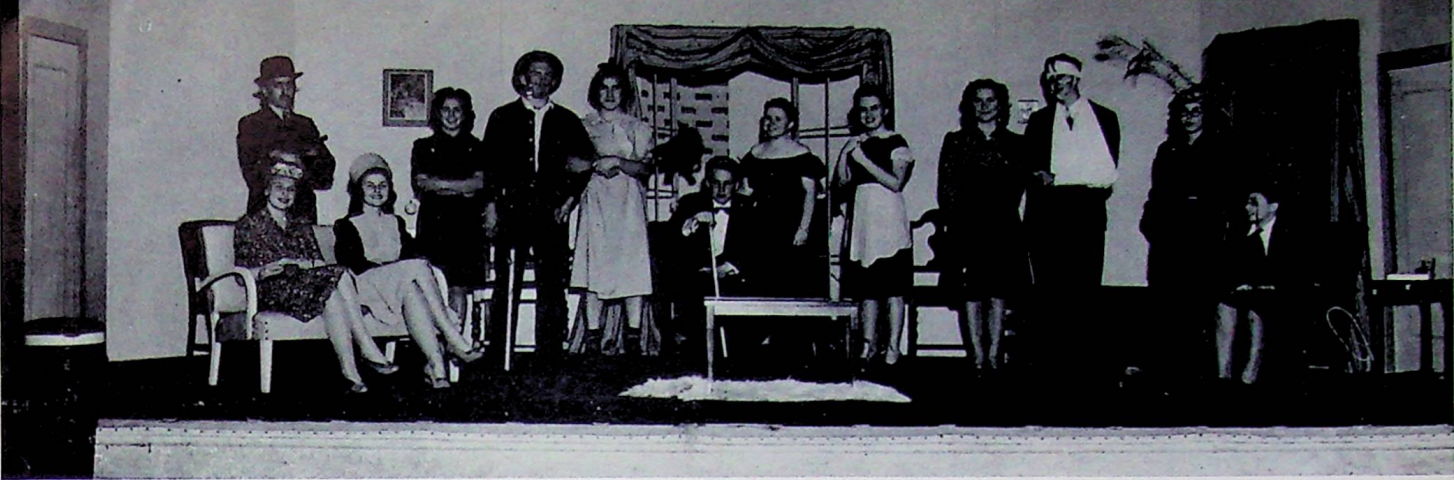

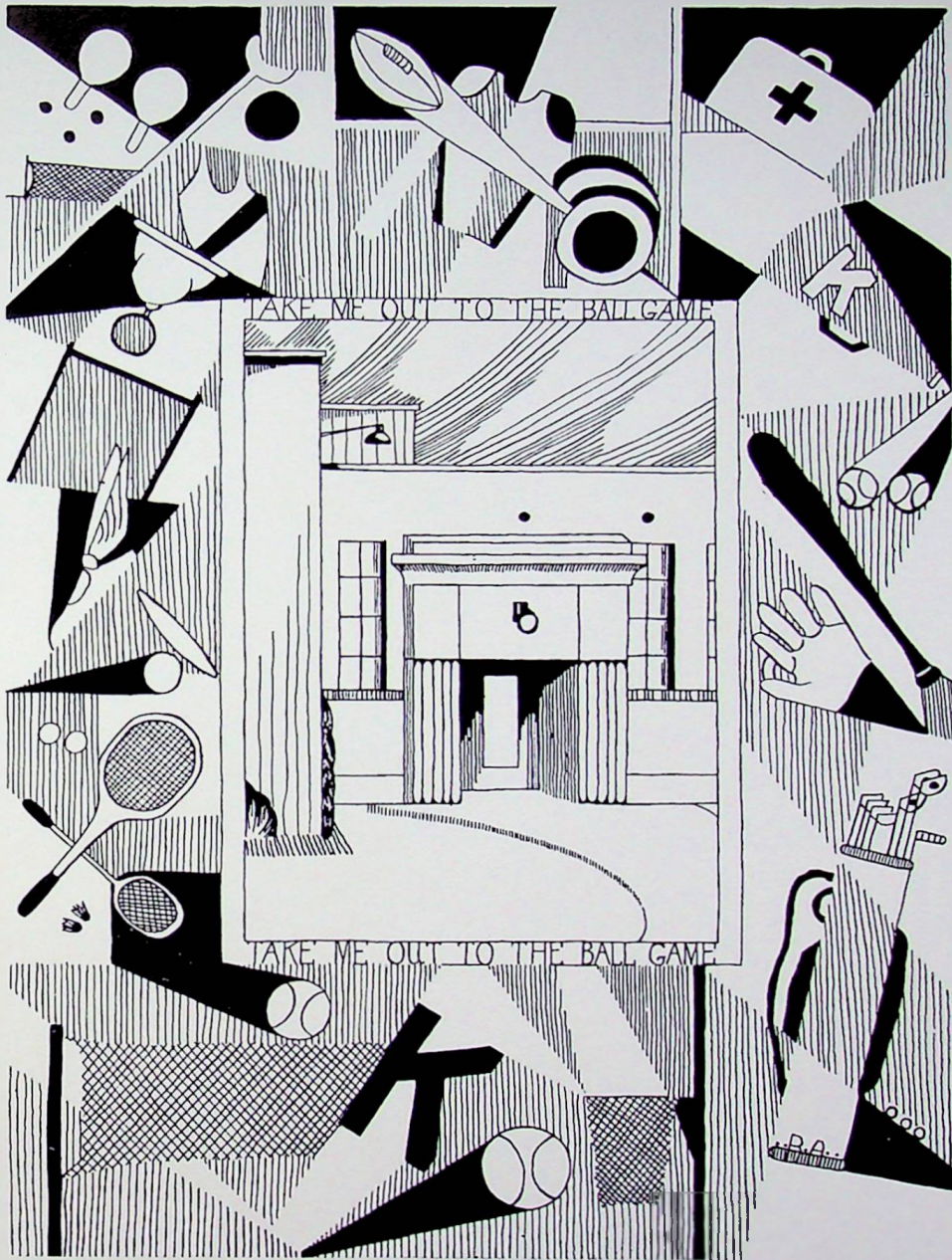

The basketball games drew large crowds and we had a fine season. The Gym has been a great boon to the sport of basketball.

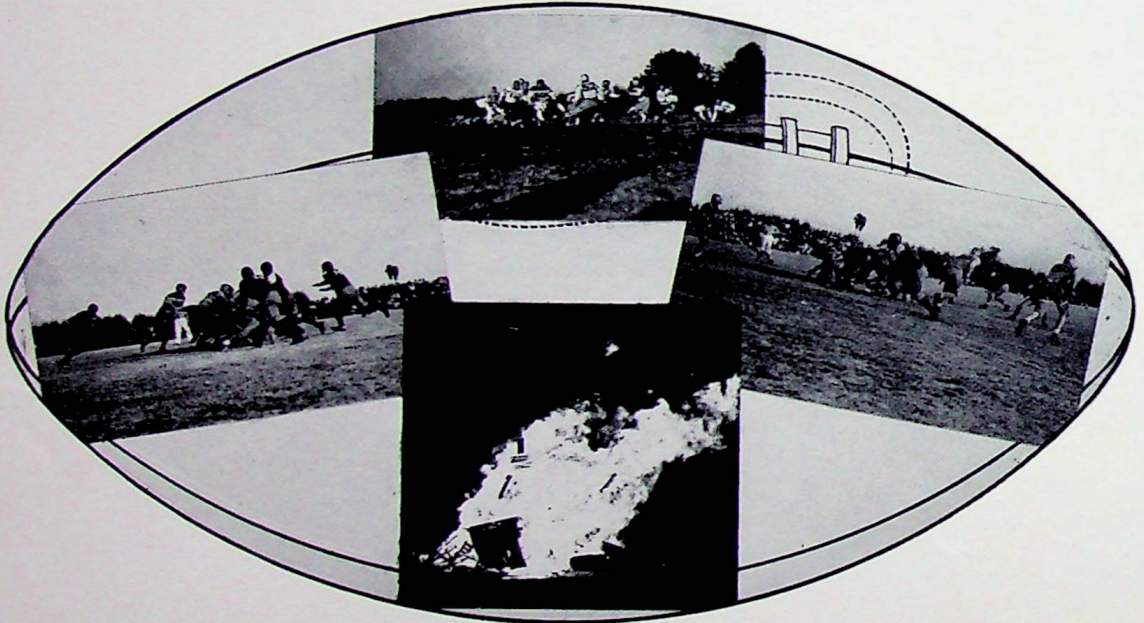

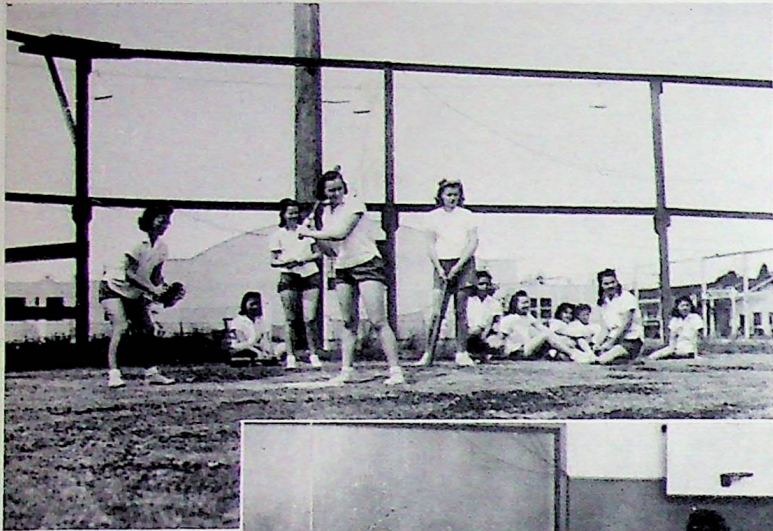
TENNIS

The tennis team did very well this year even though they were handicapped by a rainy season. Under the capable coaching of Mrs. Smith the team has developed in many respects. It was

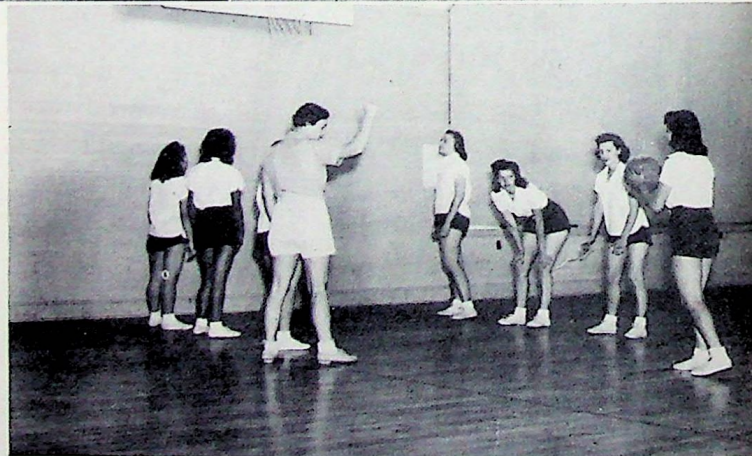

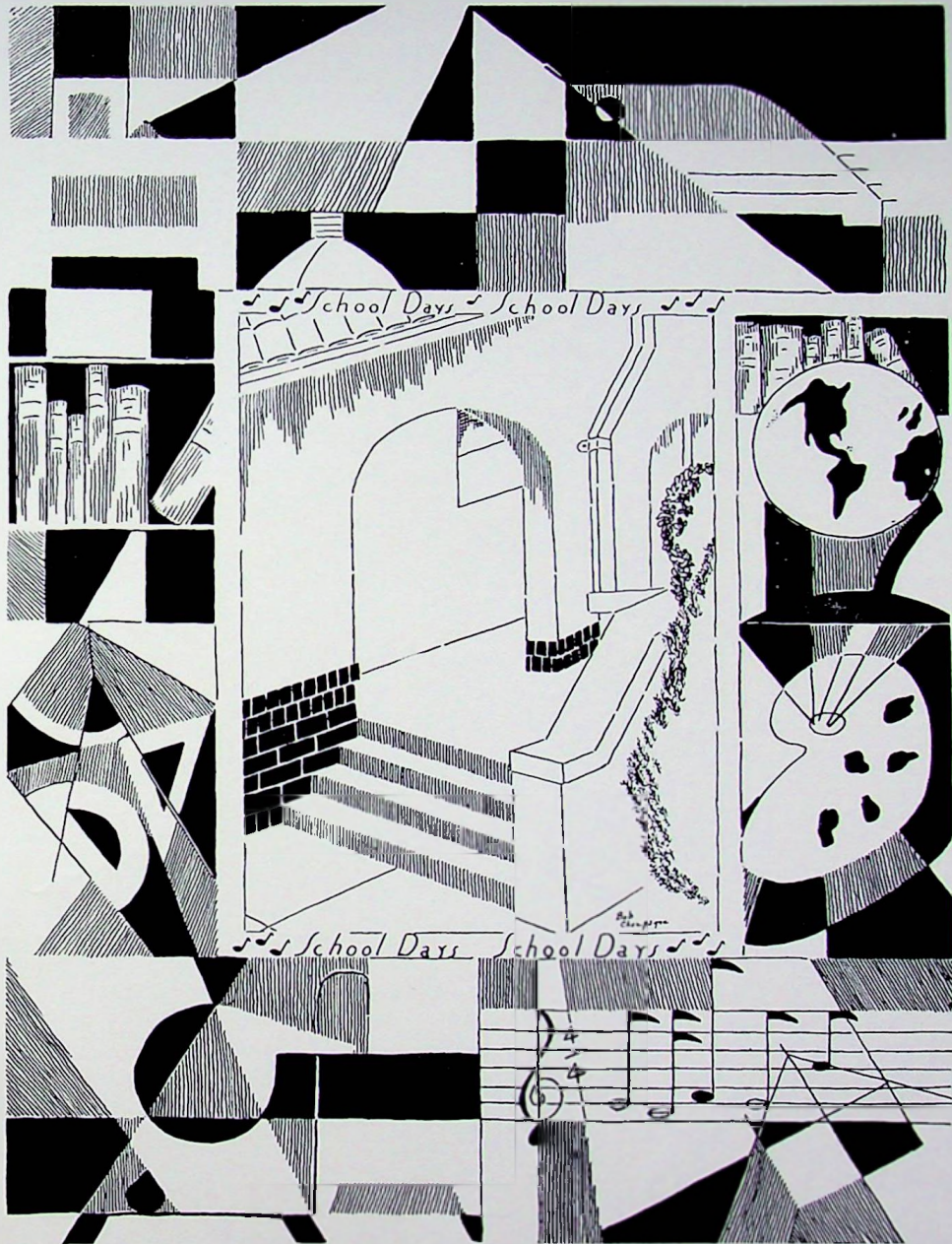

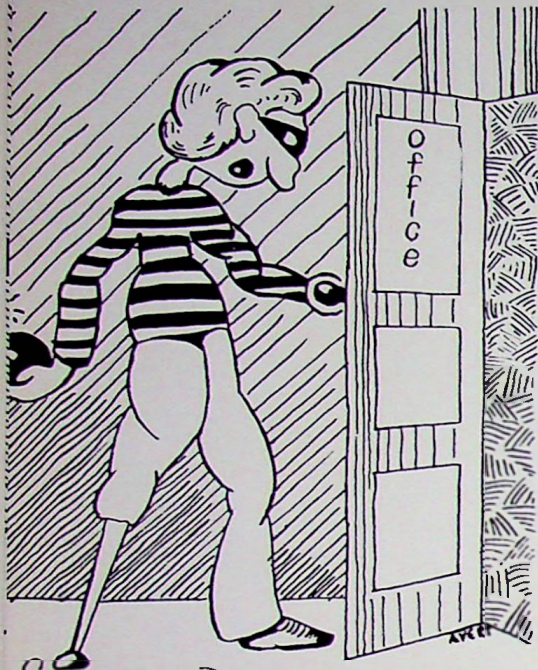
