

A Rodent Pest Contest was held between first and third periods. Many pests were killed and brought in by both classes with first period as the winner.


The Victory gardens which were planted early in the spring were very productive.


The year ended with work on orations and further practice in the minimum requirements of speech which are essential in both public and private discussion.




