THE CLASS OF '47

As an artist takes his brush and blends his colors upon his palette before he begins his painting, so have we, the Class of '47, carefully and cautiously added colors to our palettes of knowledge and character before we begin our murals of life. And we are proud that, in spite of four years of mixing and blending, adding and detracting, our colors have remained pure and bright.

At the beginning of our freshman year, the only color on our palettes was green—and that we were. But soon other colors began to appear—blue—for the studies we were sure we would flunk—but somehow, not many of us ever did. And then with Freshman-Sophomore Brawl, a little yellow appeared—not for cowardice this time but for courage—for we won. Red was added for the many good times we had at the Senior-Freshman Reception, the Freshman parties and programs. By the end of our freshman year our palettes contained all of the primary paints; but we soon realized that primary colors alone are not enough with which to paint, so for three more years we blended and worked with our colors.

Our sophomore year was ideal for obtaining secondary colors for our palettes—orange, for the gay times we had in working on scrap and paper drives; purple, royally awarded for winning the War Bond drives sponsored by the Kiwanis Club and Student Body, and for winning the Freshman-Sophomore Brawl for the second time.

The hues and shades of our paints began to take on depth for our increased activities in their junior year. Aqua was added for our successful presentation of "Junior Miss." Many colors—lavender, gold, rose, and a little black, grey, navy and brown — were blended on our palettes, during the weeks of work on our Junior-Senior Banquet. "Fairyland" was the theme of this festivity, in which we acted as hosts to the class of '46. A variety of pastel shades were added for our work in the Hi-Y and Tri-Hi-Y organizations.

And in the final year of preparation of our paints, we have added the richest tones—vermillion, for our Student Body activities; magenta, for the various sports activities; fuchsia, for our colorful and entertaining presentation, "Seven Sisters"; chartreuse, for the Viking Annual; and cerise, for our various farewell parties, Baccalaureate and Graduation exercises. Of course, a great many shades and hues which we have not mentioned were added for the offices we held, the programs in which we participated, the courses we studied, the extra-curricular activities in which we took part, school functions which we attended.

For those of you who have so kindly and generously guided our hands in mixing our paints—the administration, our sponsors, our teachers, our friends, our parents—we, the Class of 1947—Thank you.

But now it is time for us to lift with trembling hands our brushes, dip into the paints we have blended these past four years, and start our murals of life.

We wish to express our thanks to our sponsors, Mr. Ewan, Miss Dasura, and Mr. Rohrer, and our many teachers.



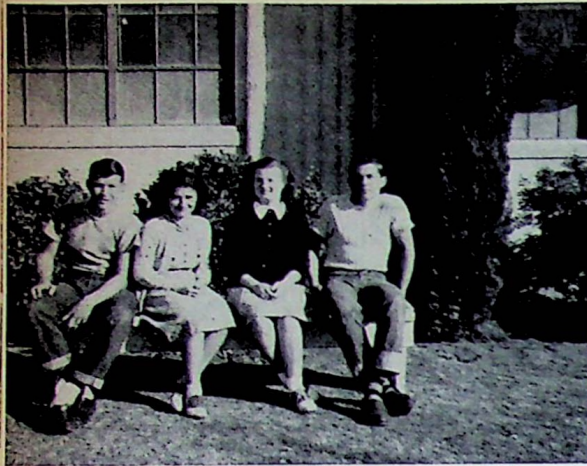

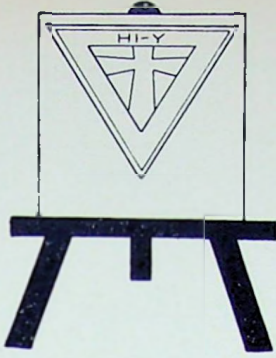
There were several parties; among these were two exchange parties with the Hi-Y, a wiener roast, and a swimming party.

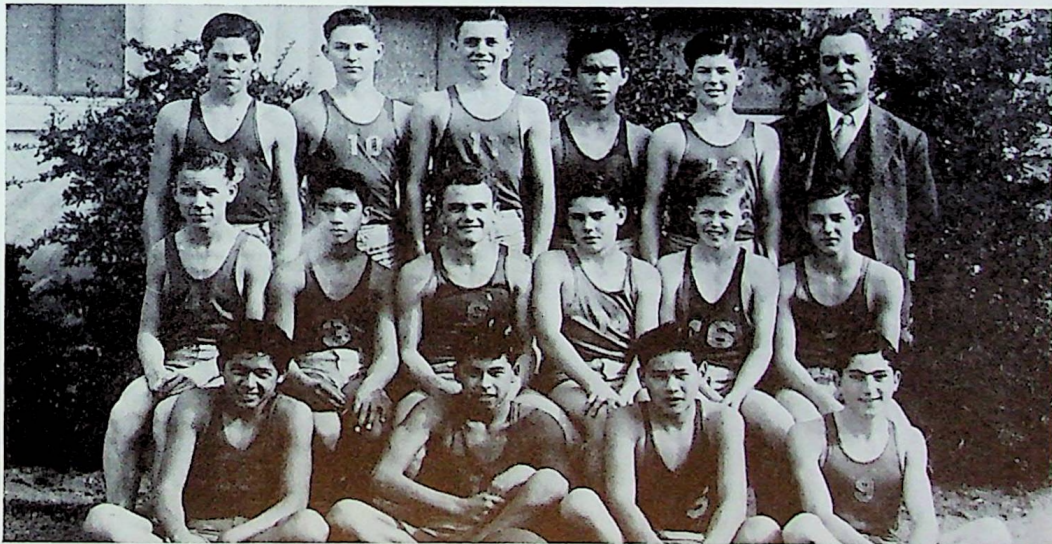
THE B CLASS basketball squad proved to be one of the strongest teams in the history of the school this year by winning the Fresno County Championship.

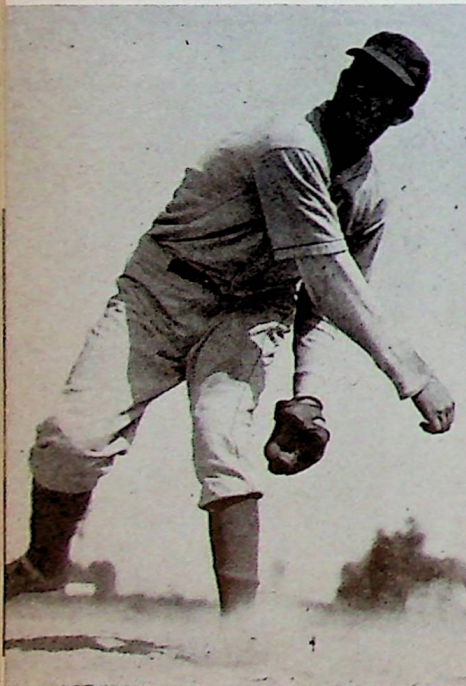
