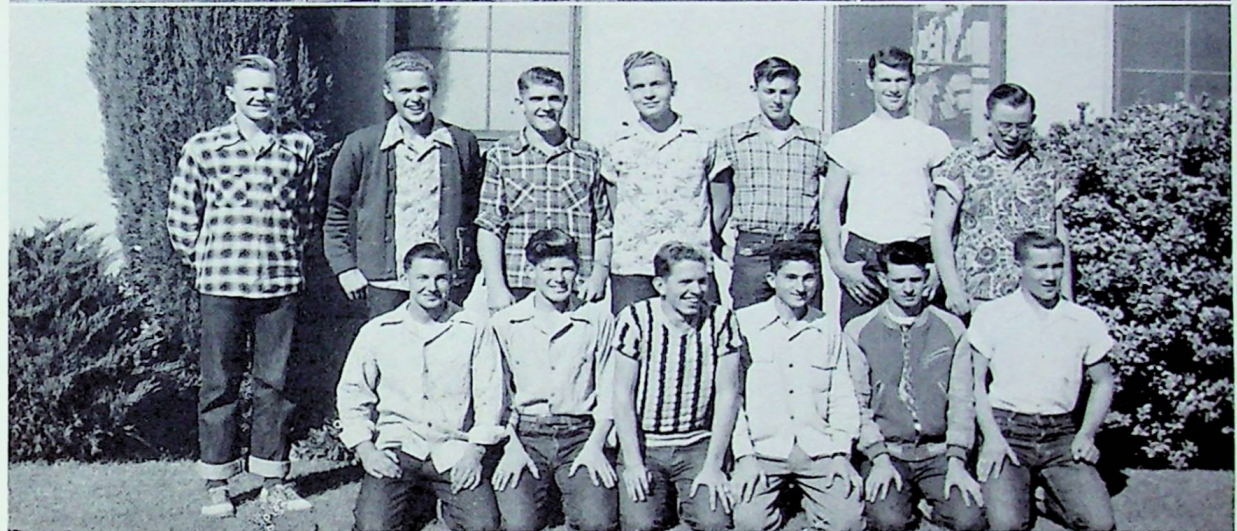
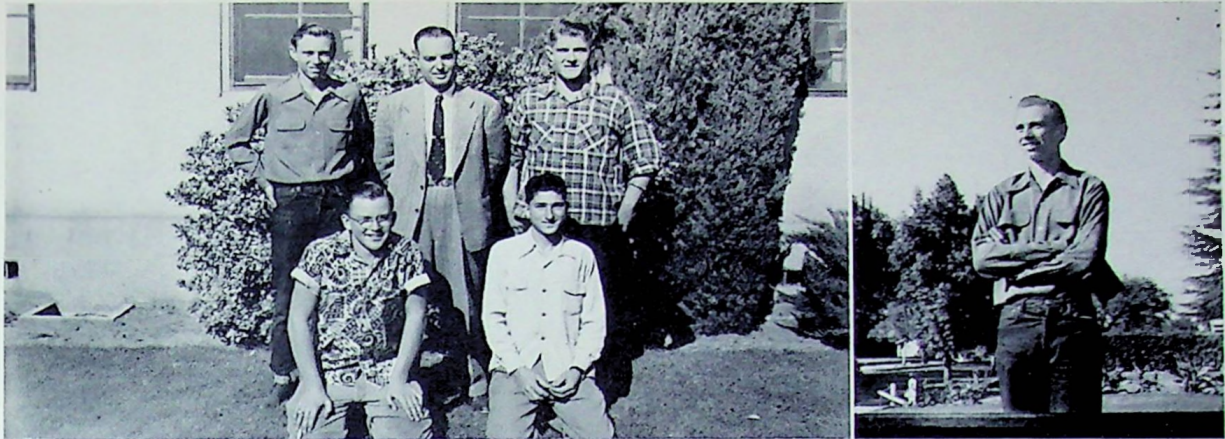
In April the C.S.F. presented a play entitled "Father Goes on a Diet." Several musical numbers were also given.

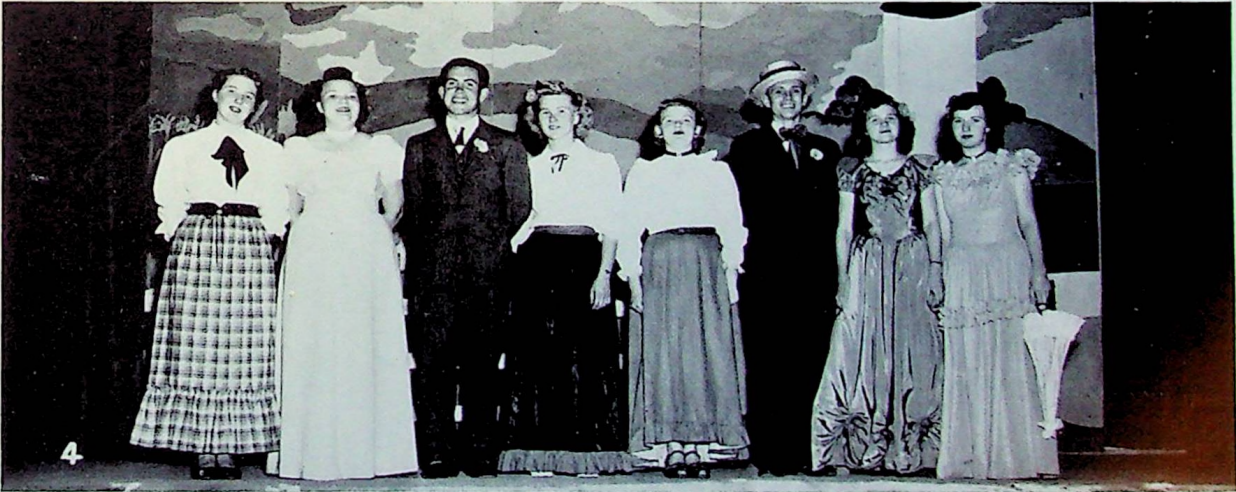

The return of several lettermen made the prospects of a winning team very good.

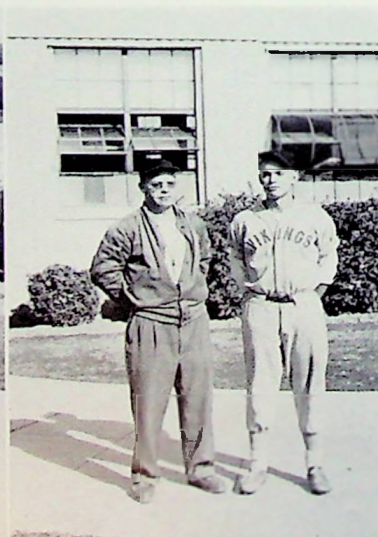
