
Because we Americans do not wish to change our theme, many have given their time and even their lives to defeat those who would cause such a change.

To the alumni of Kingsburg High who go to help the cause of democracy and peace and to restore the harmony in our lives, we dedicate this annual, the 1951 Viking.




Important in the administration of K. H. S. is the student government. The student council is composed of representatives from each of the four classes, the student body officers, and the vice-principal as a faculty adviser.

Publications are an important piece in the machinery of democracy. Through student journalism the citizens of tomorrow learn to understand and evaluate the power of the press.




This year the team was lucky because it was not handicapped by the serious injuries that riddled last year's team.






This was the first year out for track for a number of the athletes, but the team made a good showing in spite of the inexperience.








