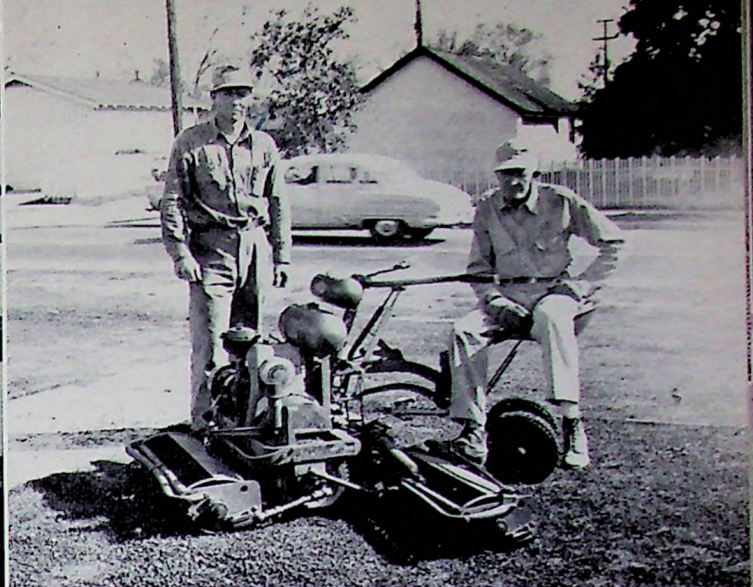

If it weren't for the gardeners being constantly on their toes, the neat green shrubbery and grass would soon be a shambles.

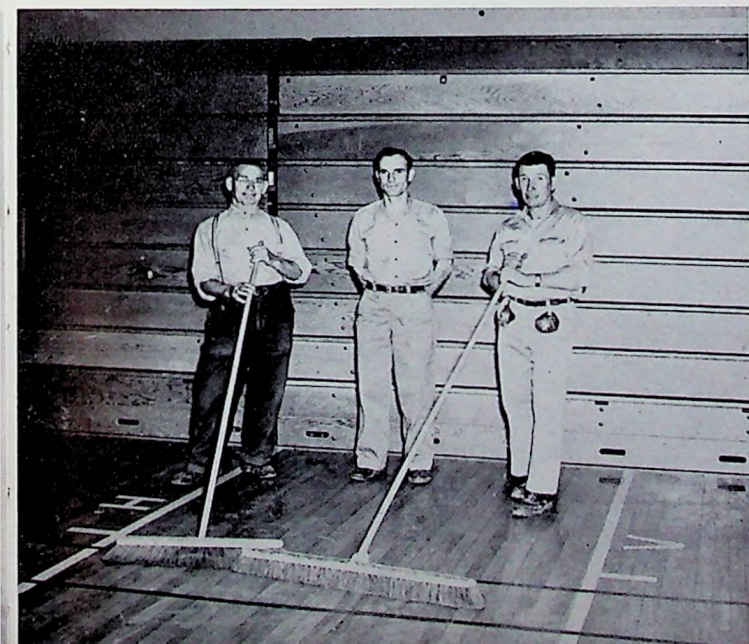

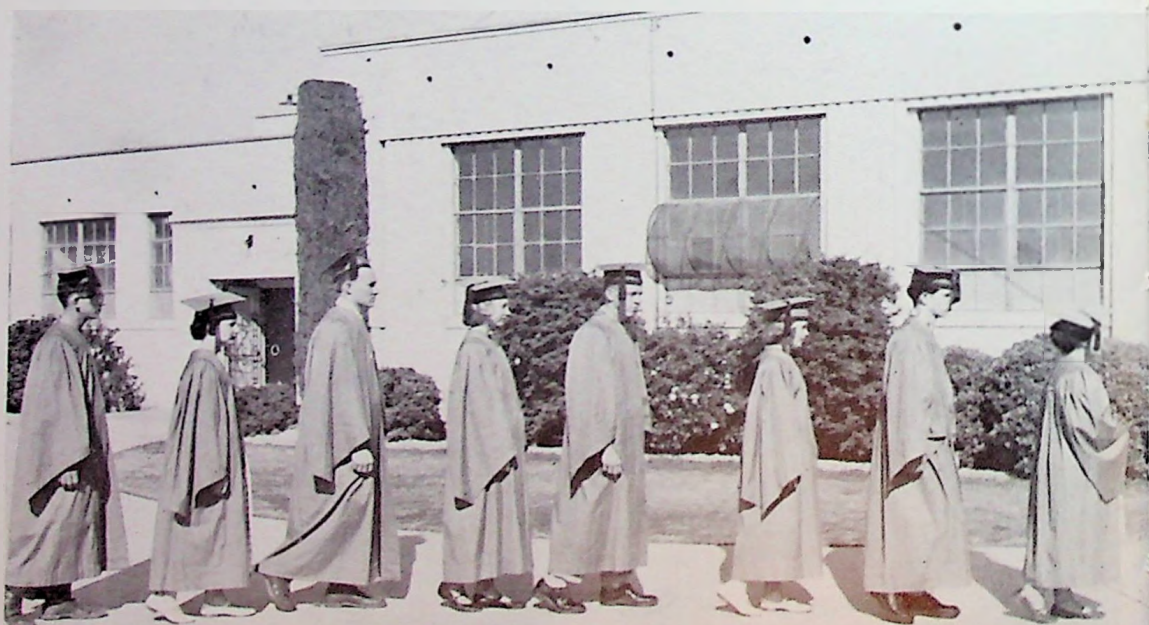
SENIORS

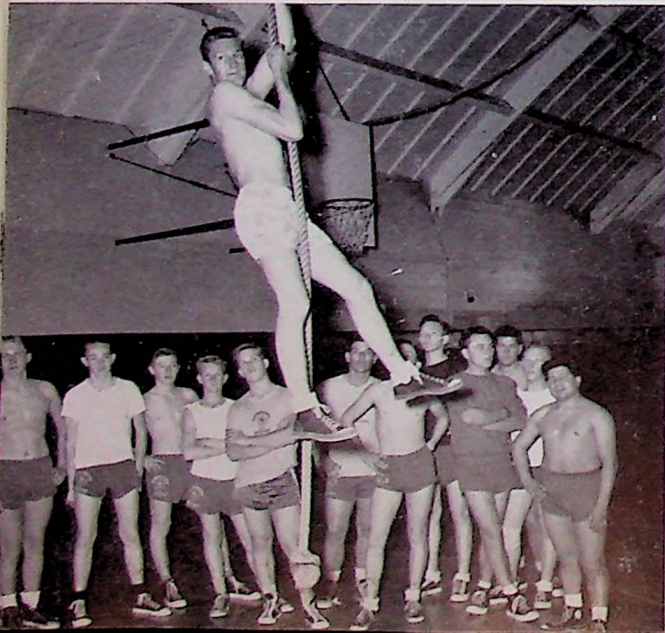

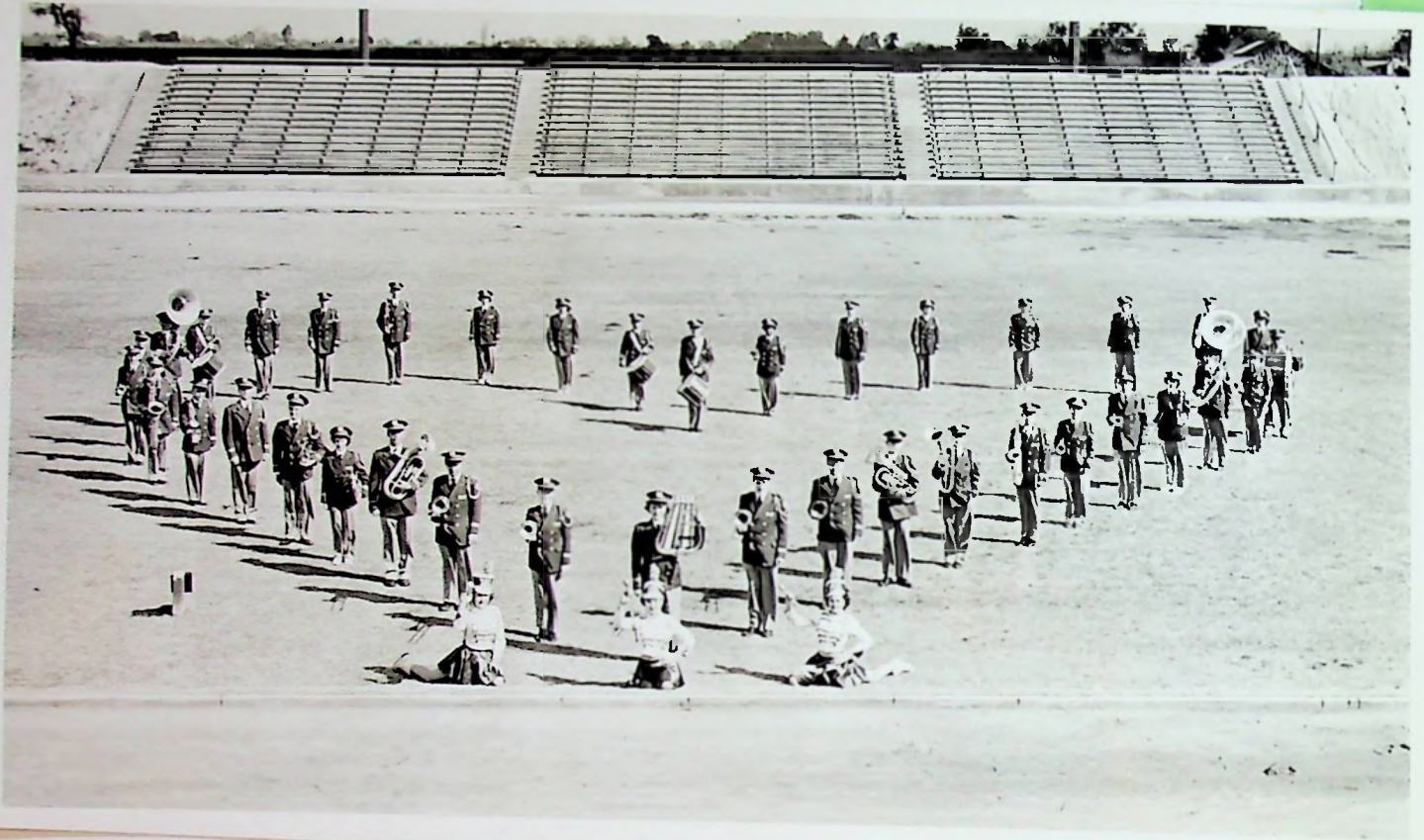

Presenting the annual Tri-Hi-Y Easter program for the student body was the main event undertaken by the girls.

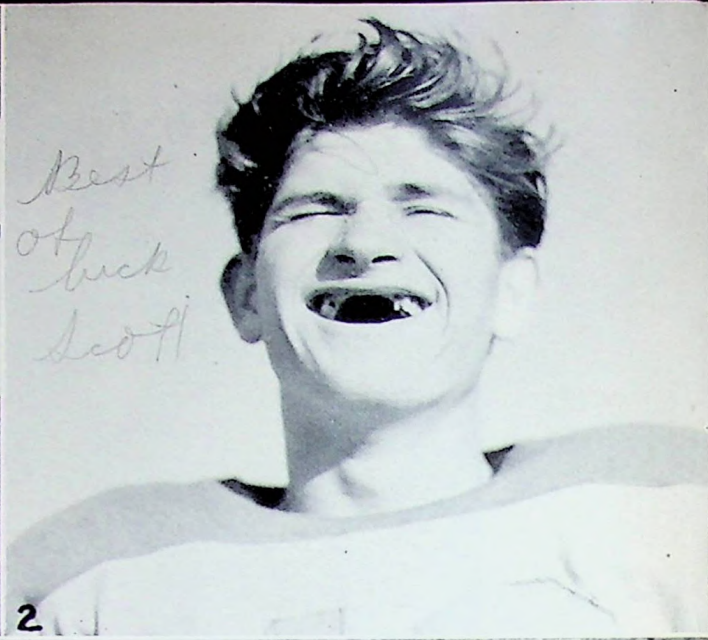

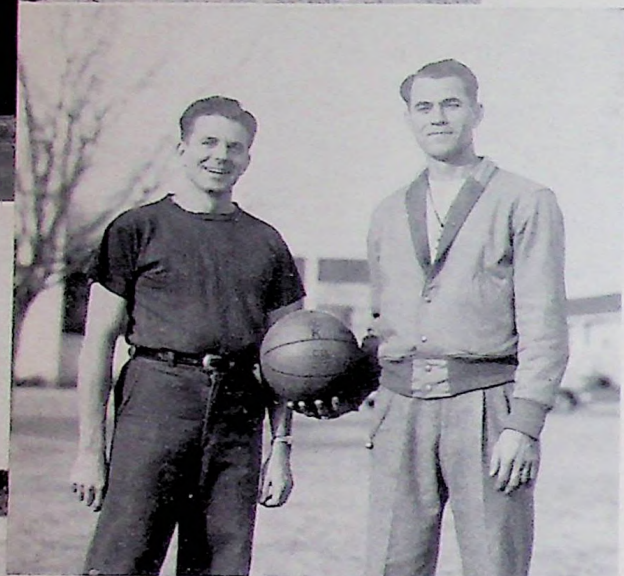
The Viking B-Class emerged from league competition with a negative record of no wins and 10 defeats for the 1951-52 basketball season.

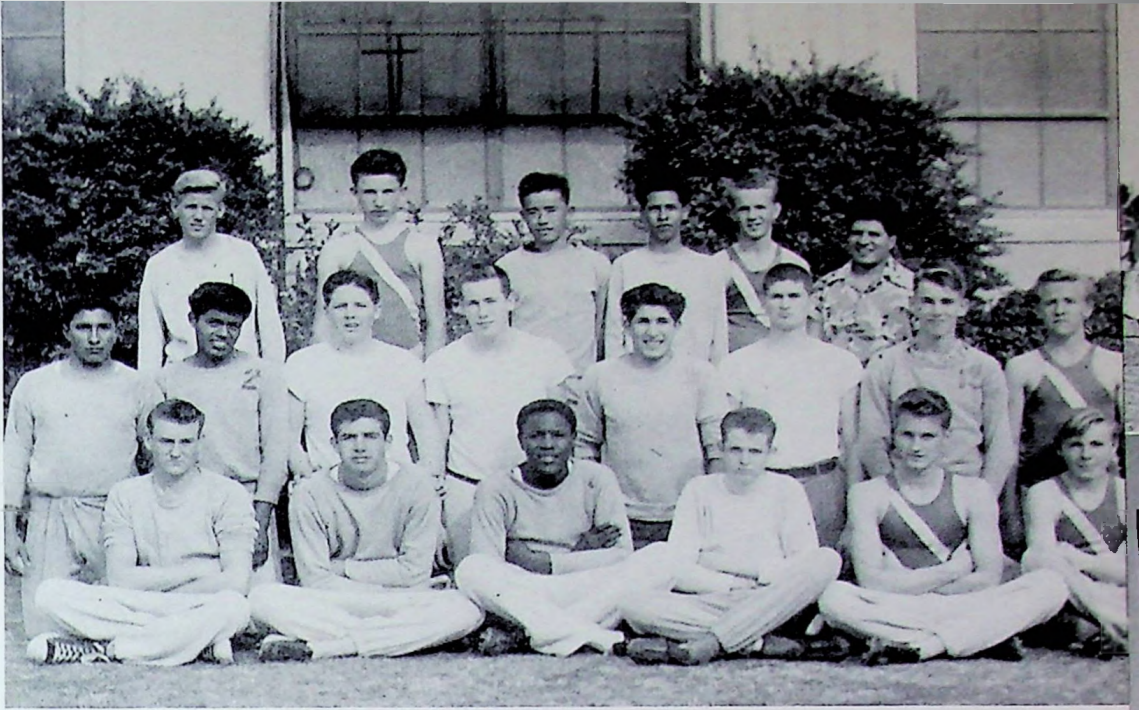

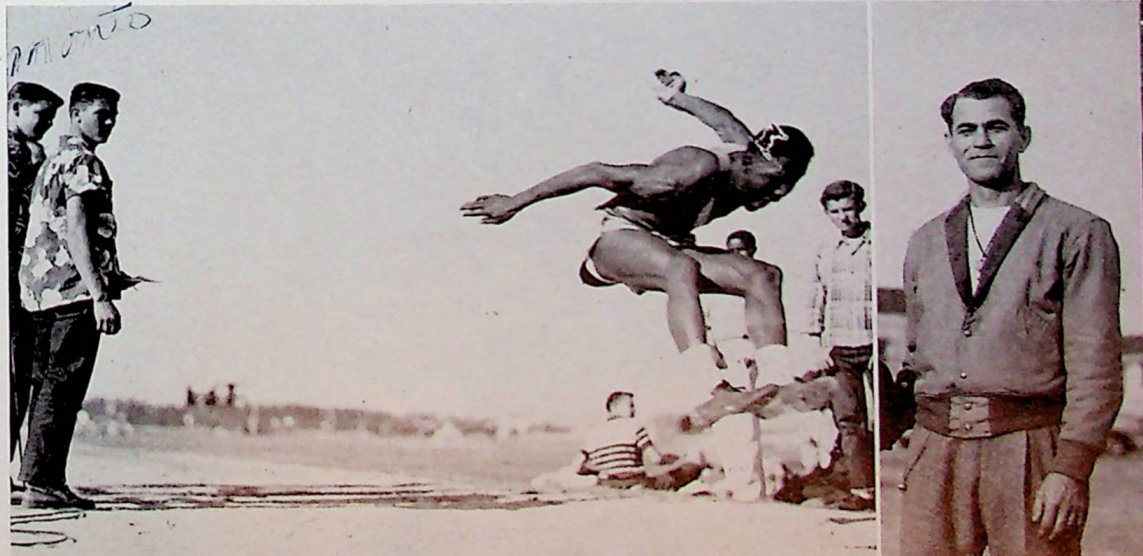

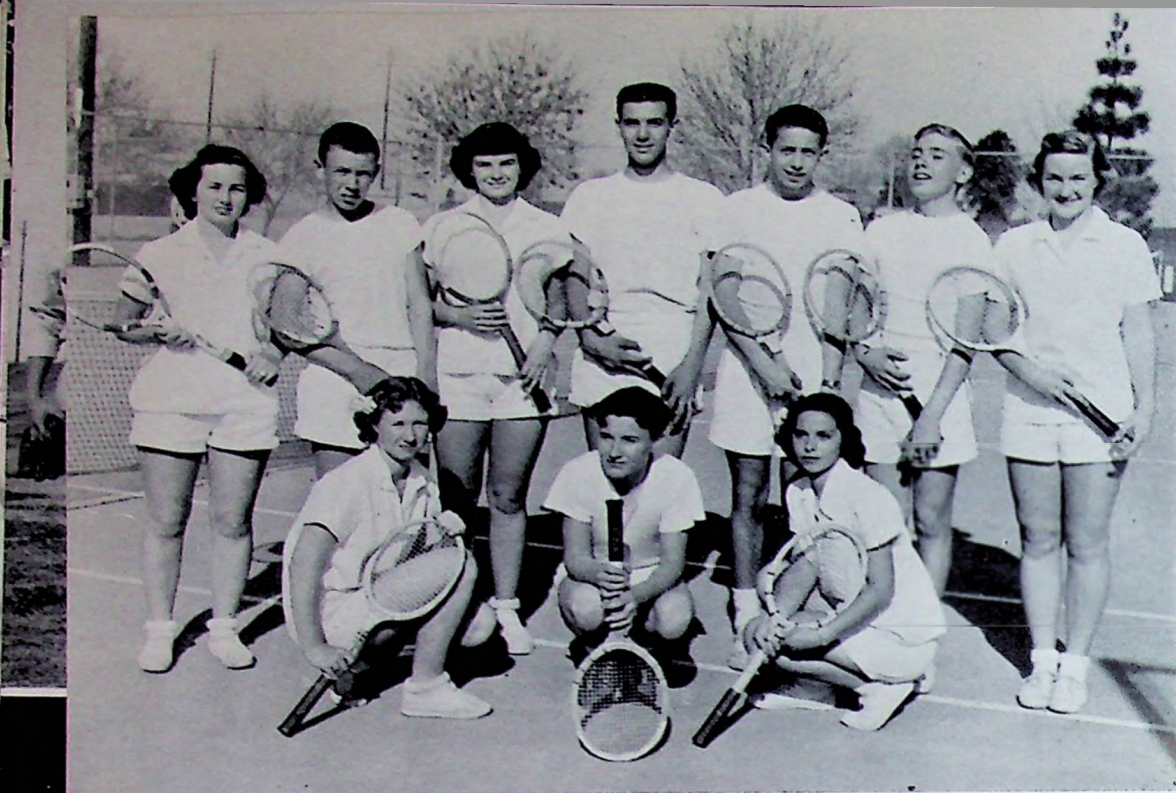


L. C. Scott clears the pole vault bar at 9' 6" at a home practice meet.

May 13 the division finals were held at Lindsay, and May 10 saw the valley finals at Fresno.

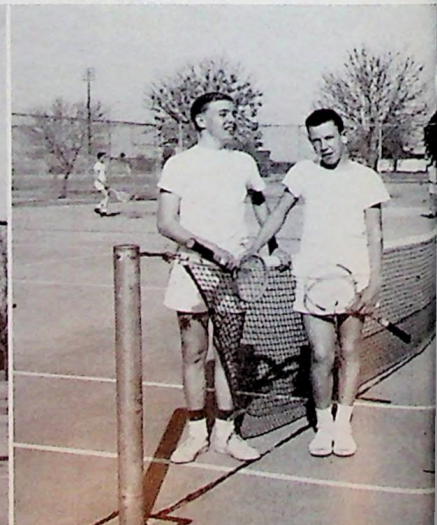
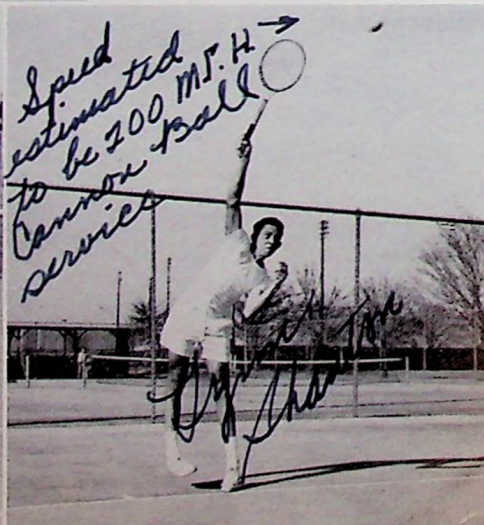
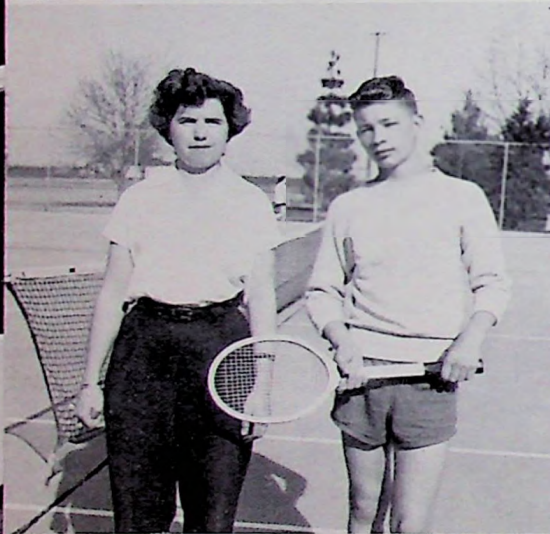

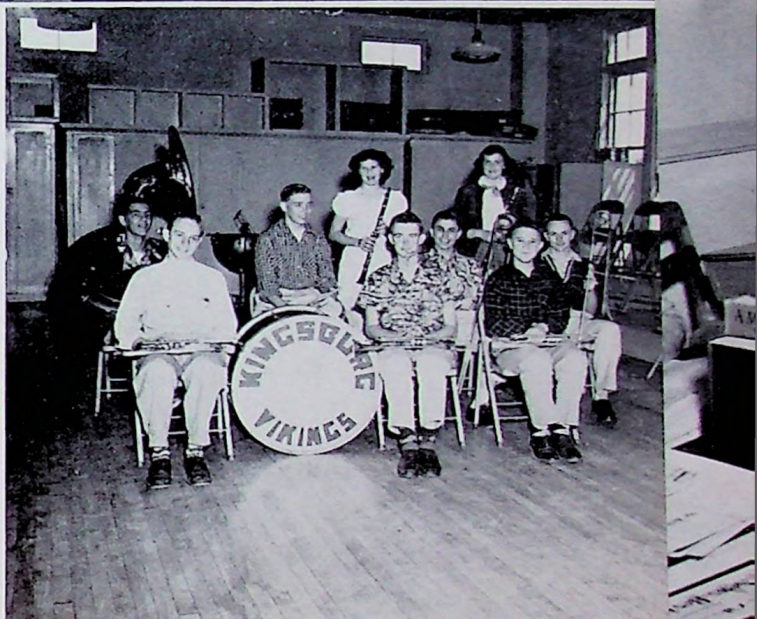
