## D BASKETBALL

The Viking D Basketball team, coached by Richard Gibbs, finished their season in second place in the league by winning seven and losing seven.

Short of stature as compared to most of the other teams in the league, they made up for that with speed and good defensive play. In the hands of Earl Wright, captain, and Tim Furman, the Vikings ball control proved fatal to enemy teams.

Although the Vikings had only two practice games, they won both of them.

The Vikings suffered from injuries late in the season, but came through in fine style, winning their last game. The scoring was as follows: Earl Wright, 83; Tim Furman, 46; James Furman, 35; Tom Ward, 30; John Lindsey, 12; Tom Horn, 10; Jim Lindsey, 6.

## CROSS-COUNTRY

Cross-country is a fairly young sport at Kingsburg High School, having been in existence a little over ten years.

The cross-country team at KHS has been relatively small in these few years with just enough competitors to make a varsity team. This year there were five harriers coached by Mr. Lowell Draper of the English department.

This sport is considered by Coach Draper to be the most gruelling of all sports at KHS.

To compete, one must be able to run one and a half to one and nine-tenths miles. This running isn't around the track; it is around the practice fields, over the "hills" in the bowl, and around the student parking lot. Furthermore, a harrier must be able to run on dirt, grass, or asphalt.

For practice, the boys run three to five miles each day around the track in the bowl.

Coach Draper had four returning lettermen this year—Lopez, Bruland, Ramirez, and Olson. Lopez and Bruland were usually the 1-2 punch, placing close together in most meets.

Coffman, for a rookie, did extremely well this year, placing high in several meets.

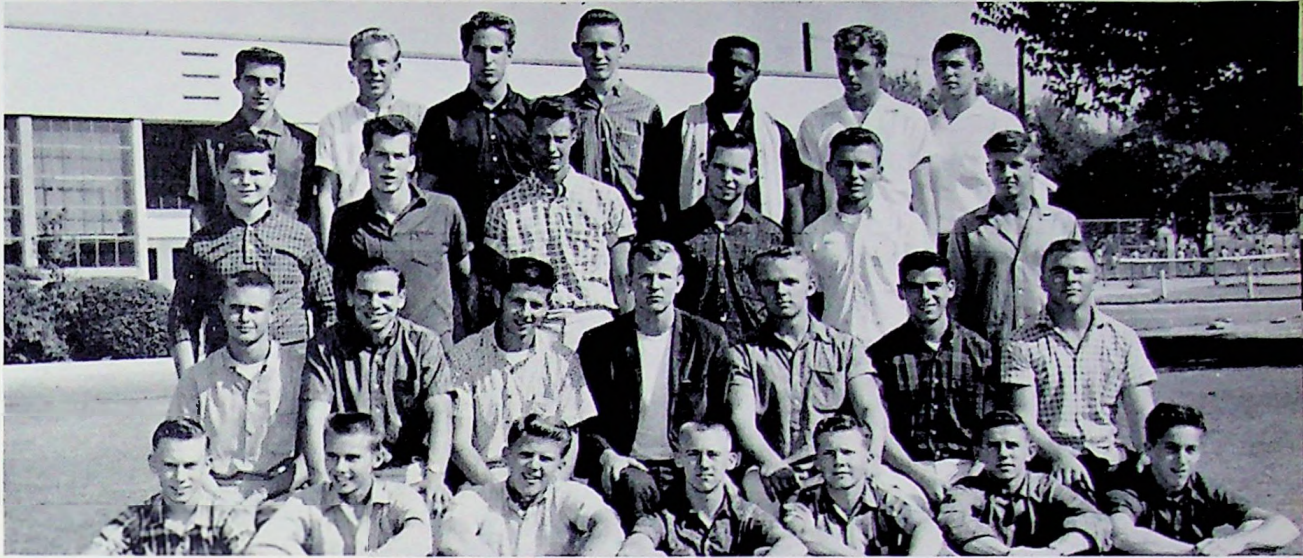

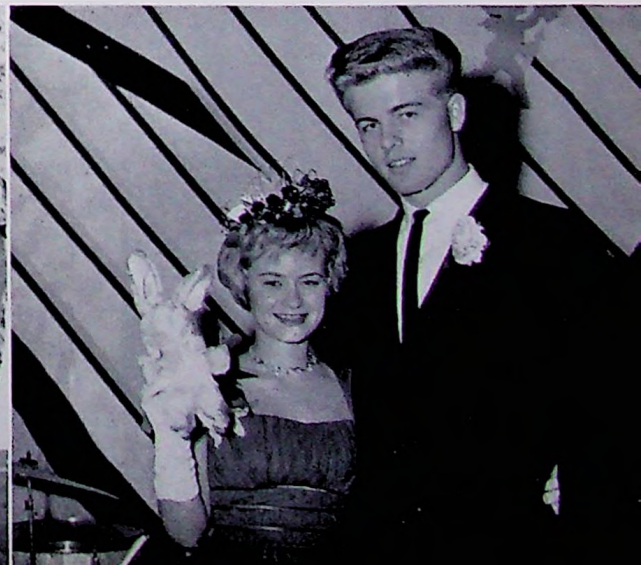
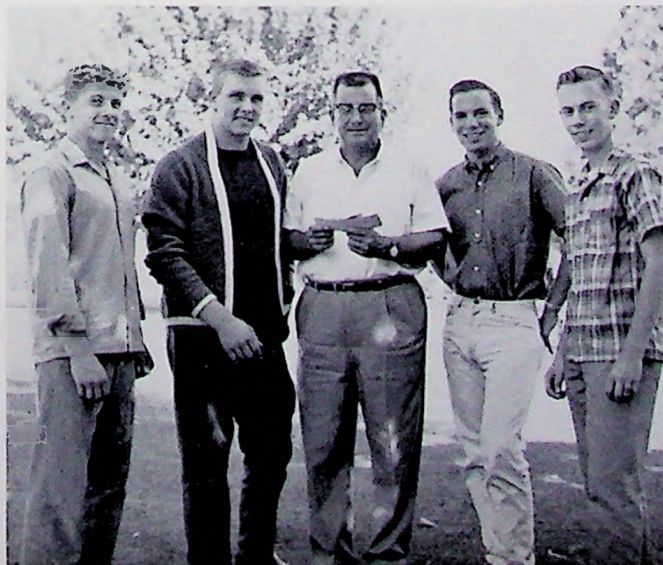
ten on it and was given the honor of reigning as queen of the Block K for one year.

Improvement became evident in the varsity and beginners' skills with constant daily drilling in the fundamentals of tennis, such as the serve and the backhand stroke.

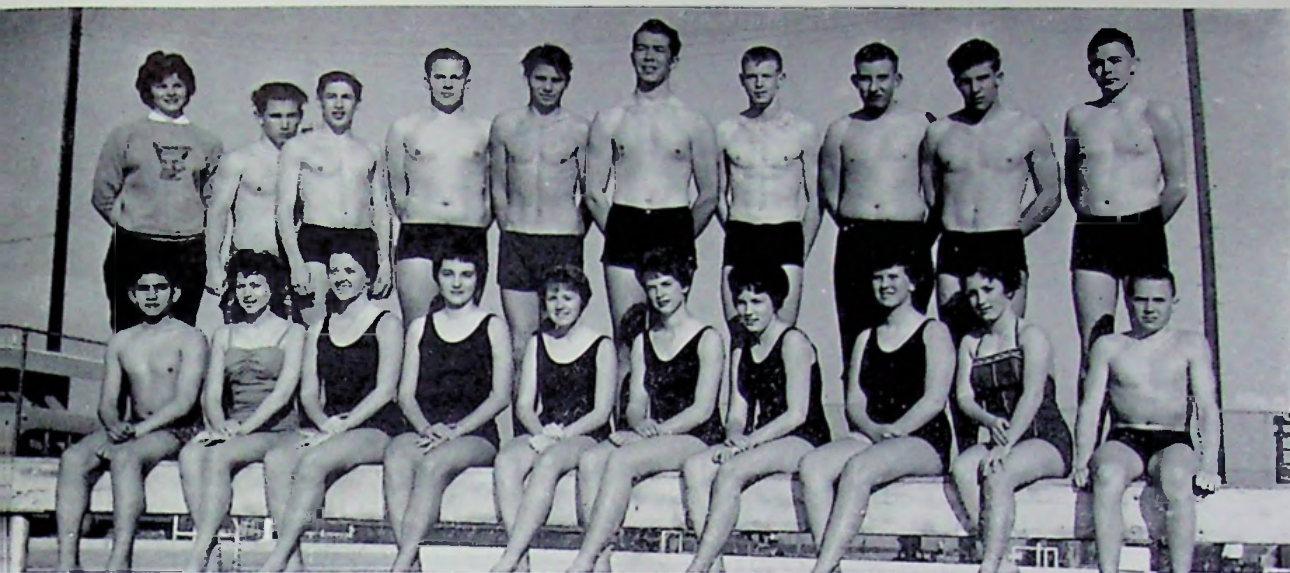

The team was composed mainly of young swimmers, the majority being freshmen and sophomores; nevertheless, some very good individual performers appeared toward the end of the season.

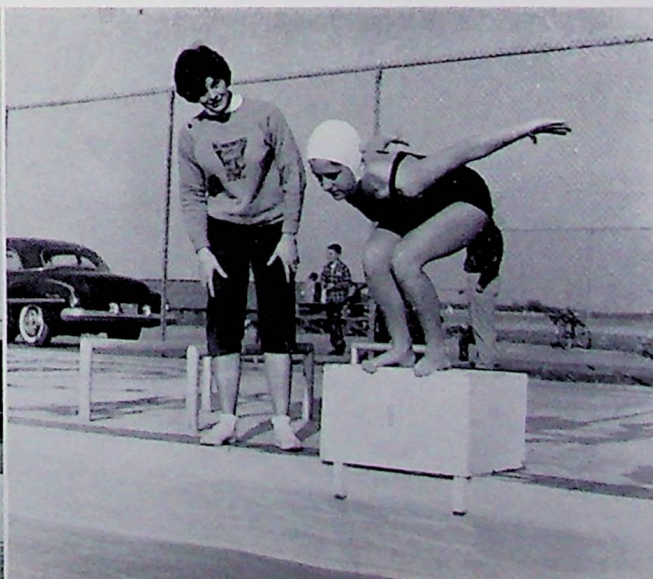
Competing in our league were Dinuba, Reedley, Selma, Exeter, Sanger and Fowler high schools, all of whom participated in the six meets that were held this year.

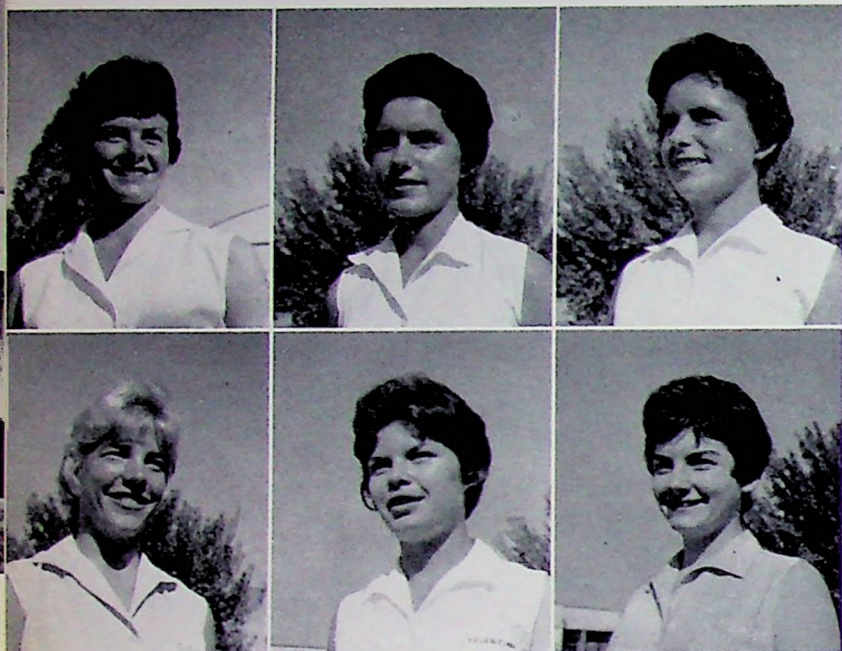

The local Cooperation Quiz contest was won by Wayne Adams, with Bill Bennett placing second. Both members competed in the Fresno-Madera section finals.

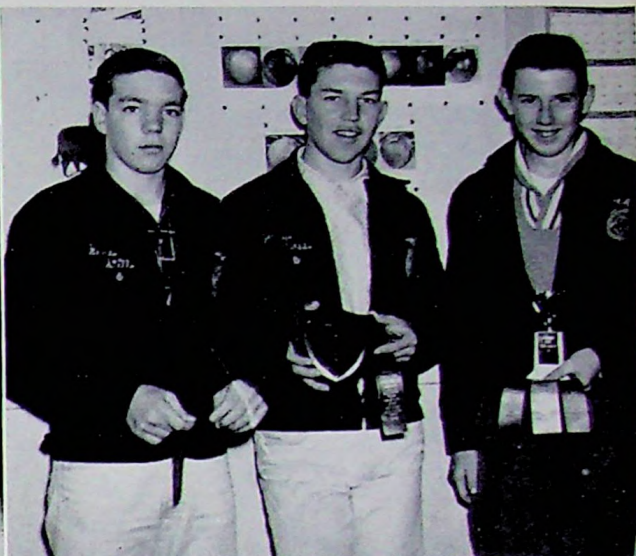

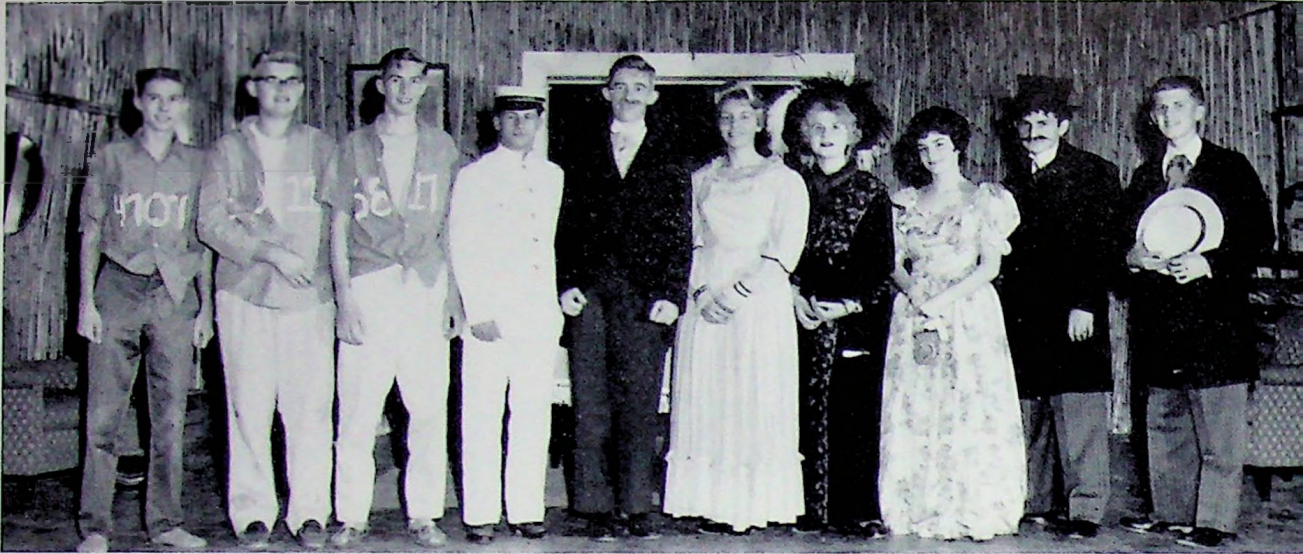

It is the story of an eccentric lady who runs a boarding house, and finds she is hosting a group of outlaws.

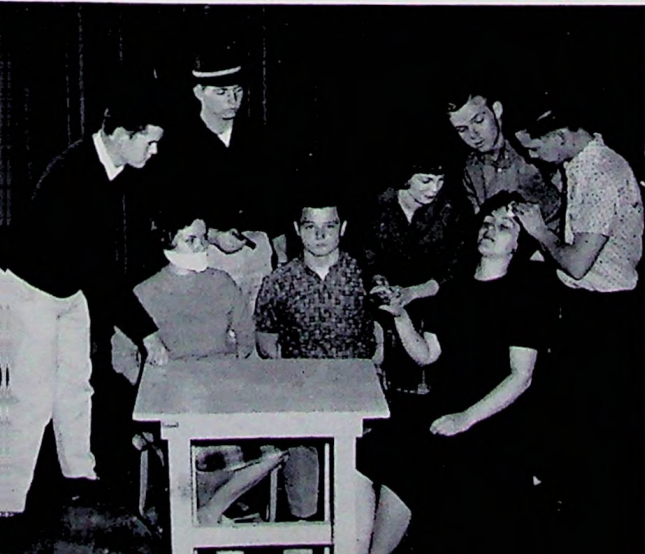

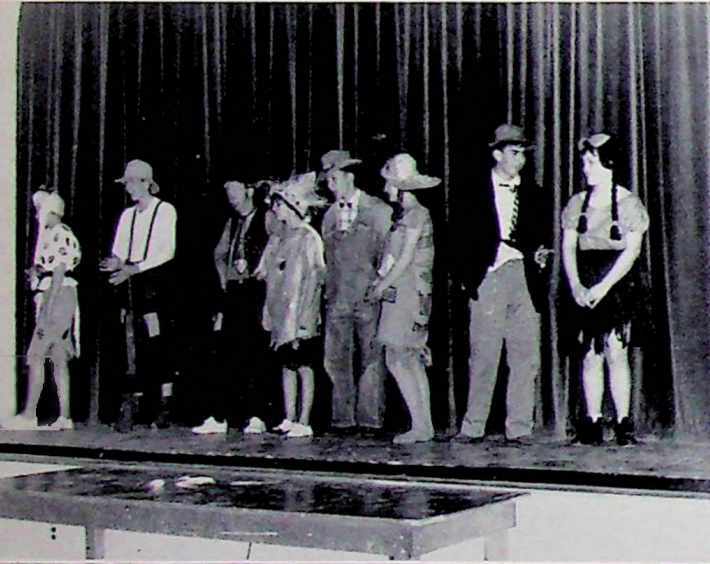

So many people helped that it is difficult to recognize here all of those who deserve recognition. The student body as a whole was very cooperative.

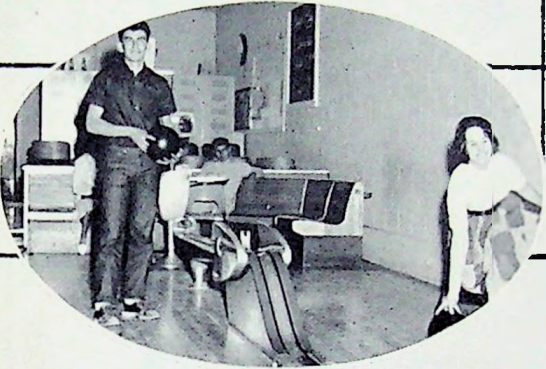
