It is to you, Mr. Moore, our teacher and our friend, that we the students of Kingsburg High School dedicate the 1963 VIKING.

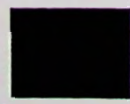
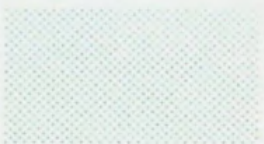
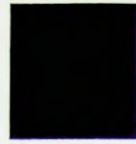
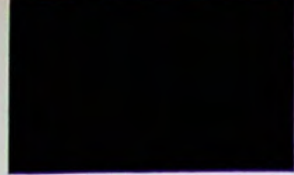

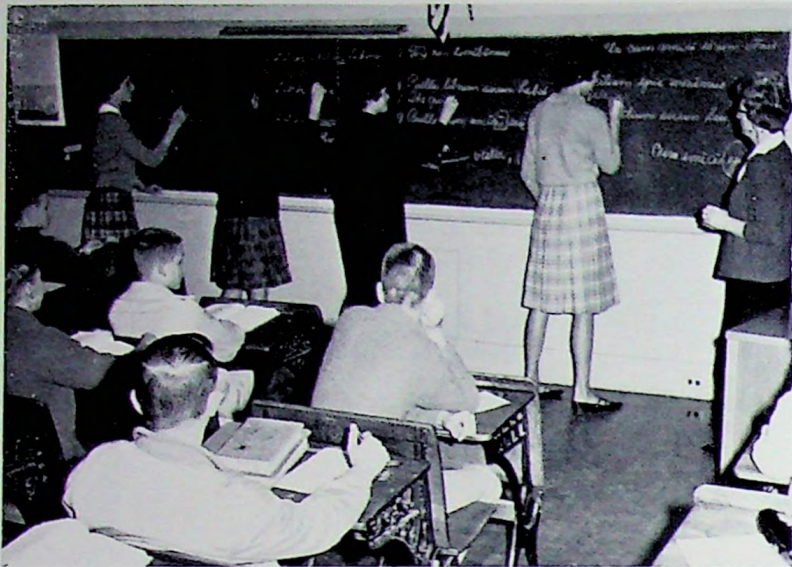

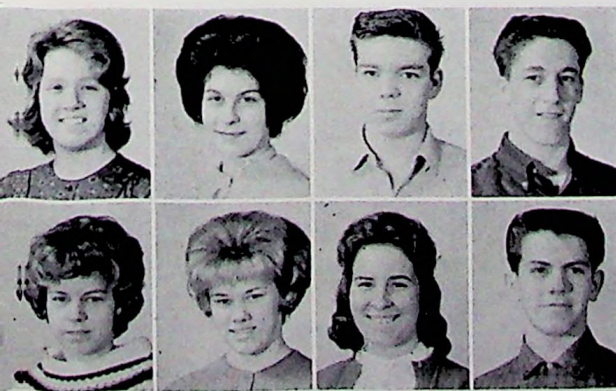

For the sophomores, 1963 started with a class party held in the gym. At the party, members participated in basketball and volleyball. Later there were also dancing and refreshments.

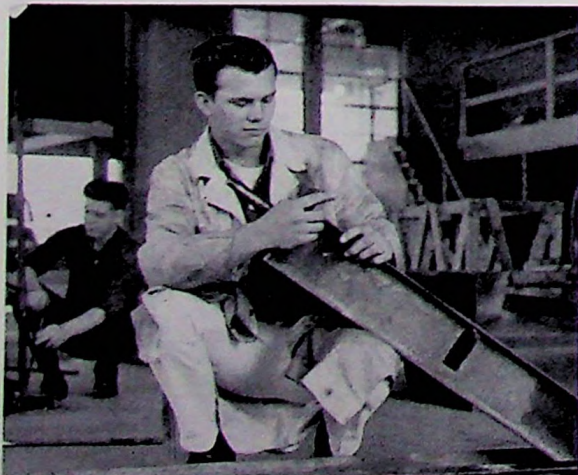

To celebrate the closing of school, the class had a swim party. After the swimming, a barbecue was held on the high school grounds.

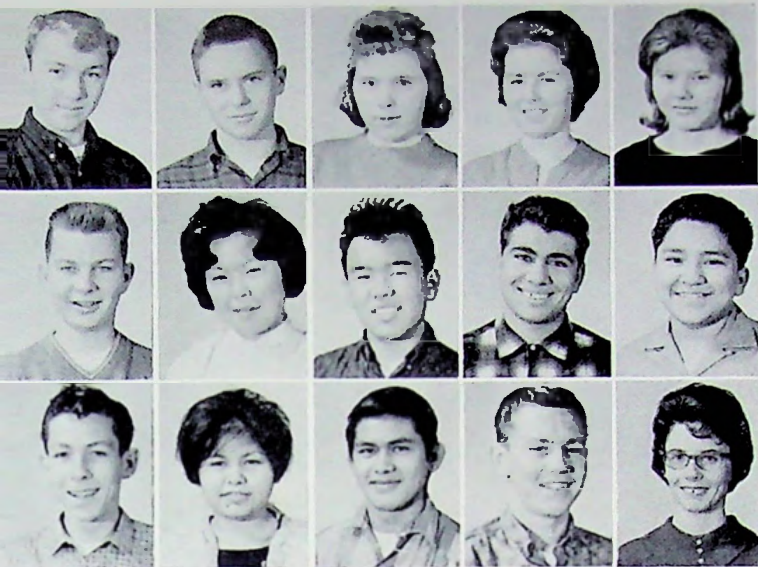

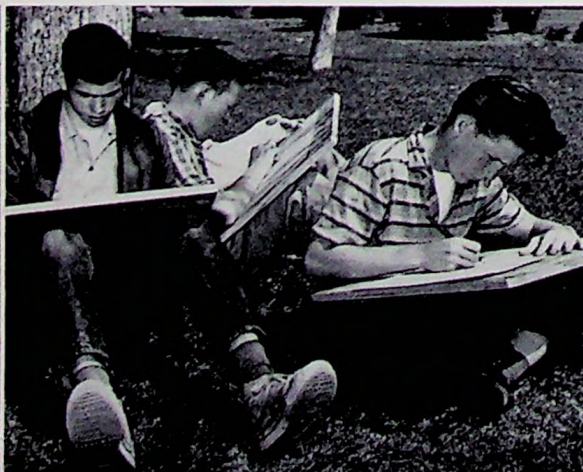

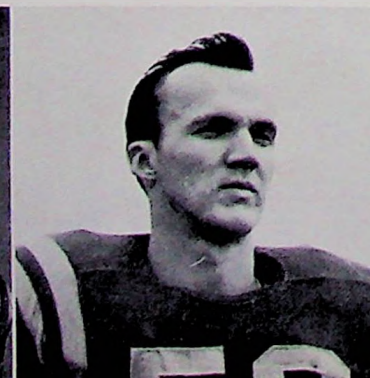

The Vikings retaliated by downing Exeter and Sanger, another old rival, and Corcoran, a member of the South Sequoia League, thus extending a winning streak into next year.

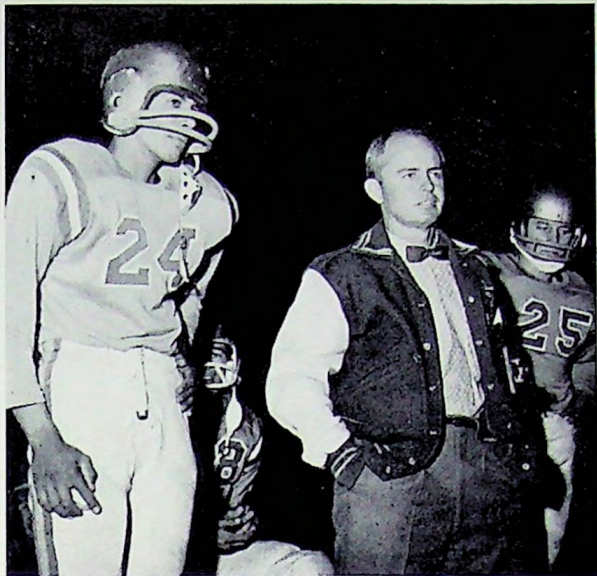
At the annual football banquet on December 13, David Jackson was honored as the most valuable player. Rodger Chambers received the honor of most improved player.

In league play, the Norsemen defeated Dinuba, a victory unprecedented for the last three years.

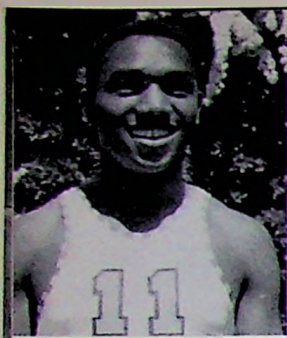

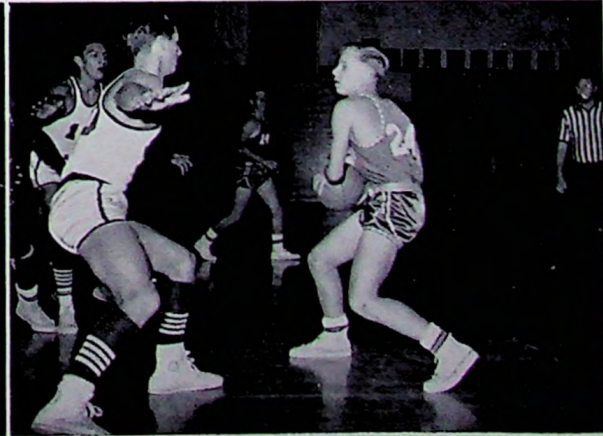

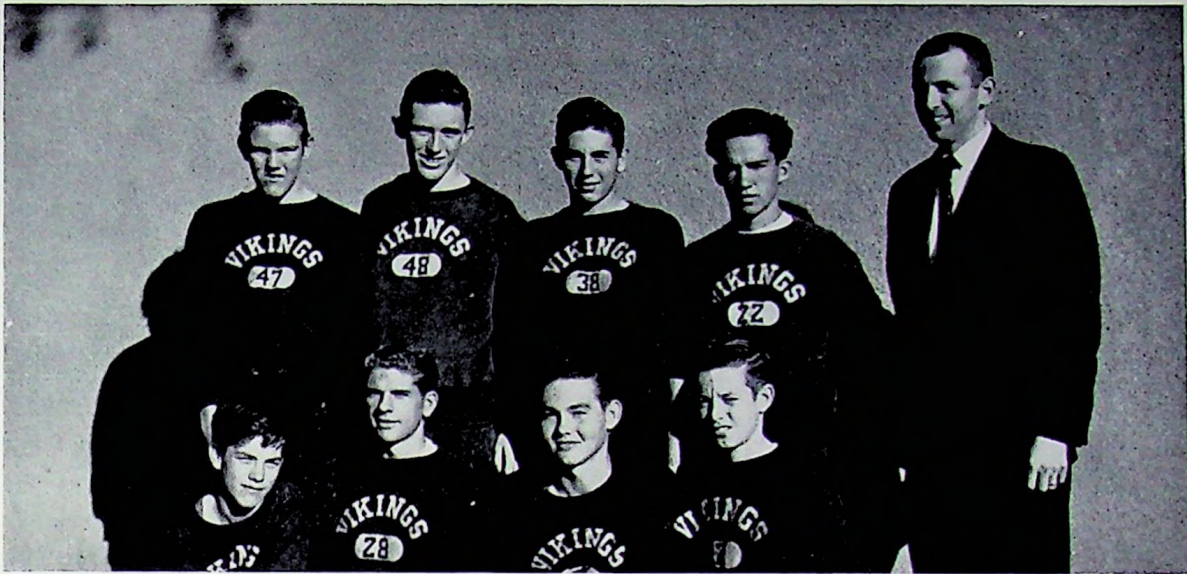

## CROSS-COUNTRY

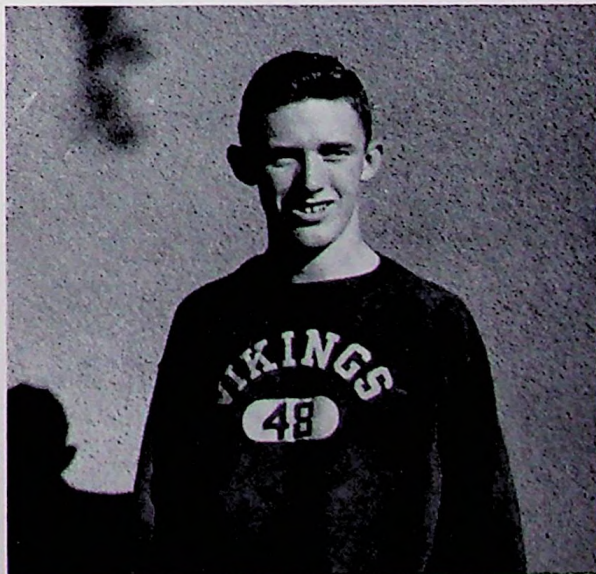
The cross-country team, under the coaching of Lowell Draper, matched last year's harriers by placing fourth in league competition and fourth in the league meet.

The outfield consisted of Rodger Chambers, Bob Peckfelder, James Randleman, and Robert Yeramian.

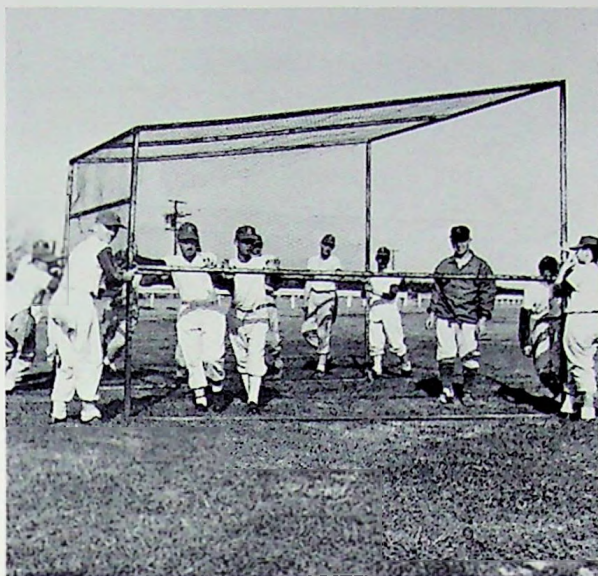

Jerry Bogard and Leodis Jones were co-captains. Mike Hankins was manager for the team. All three boys were on the A team.

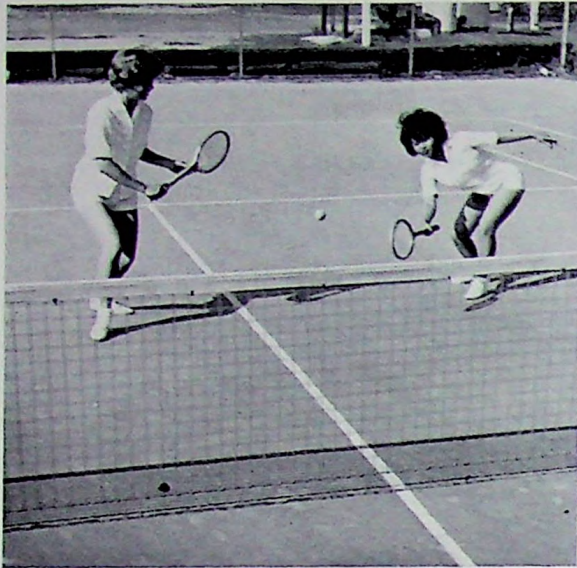

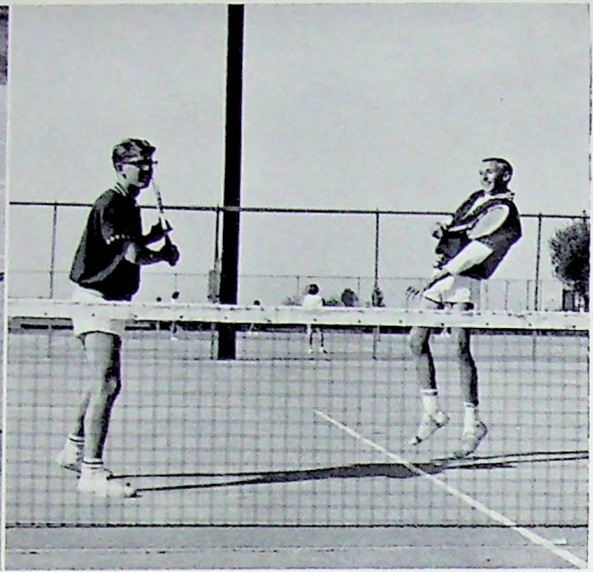

## TENNIS

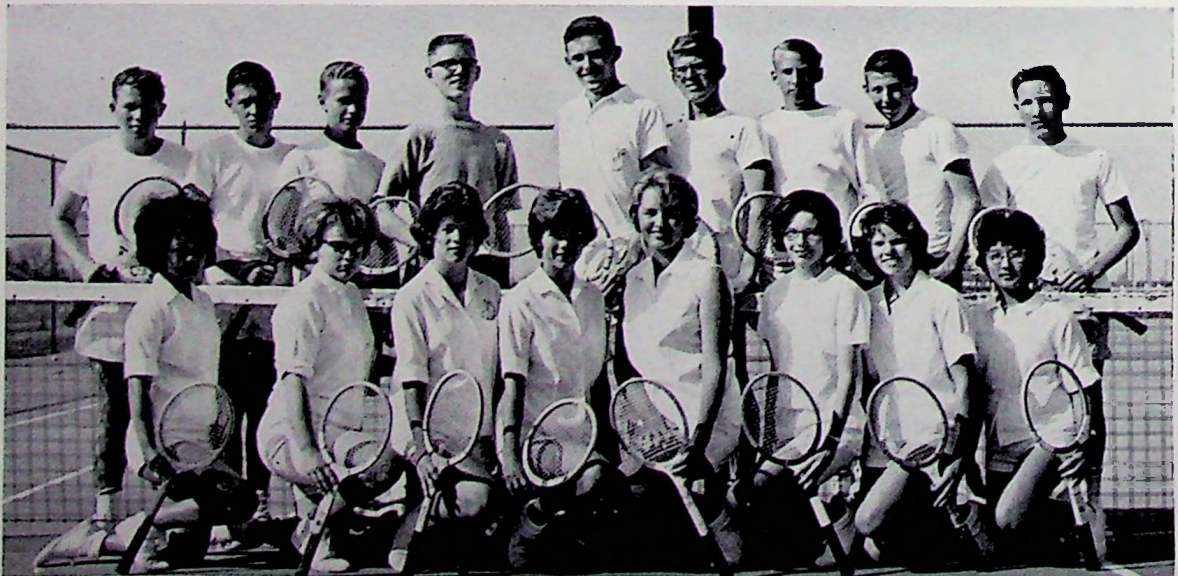

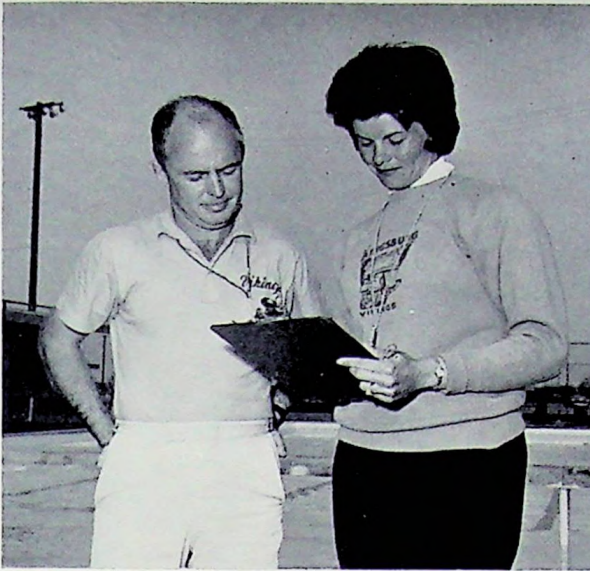

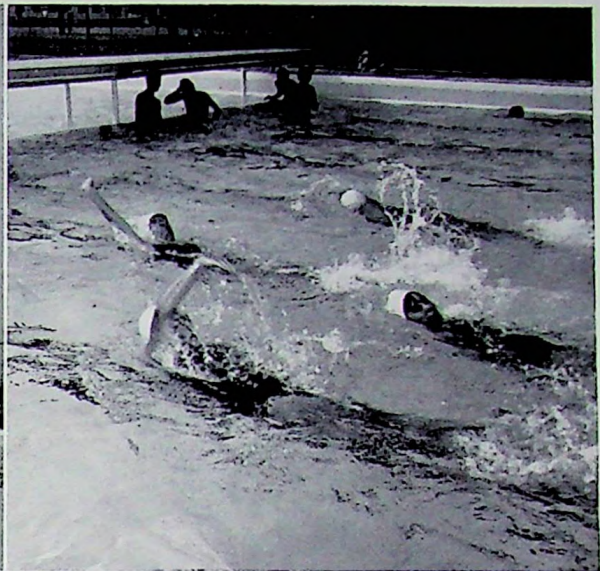

This year the league meet was held in Sanger, the divisional meet in Selma, and the Valley meet at Redwood High in Visalia.

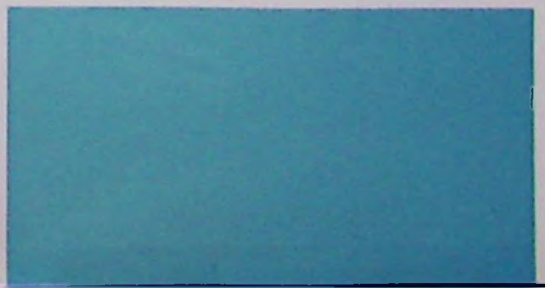
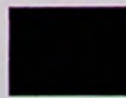
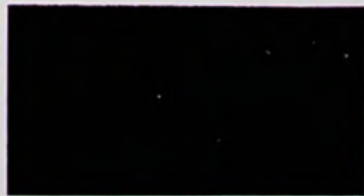
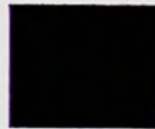
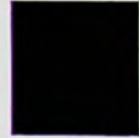
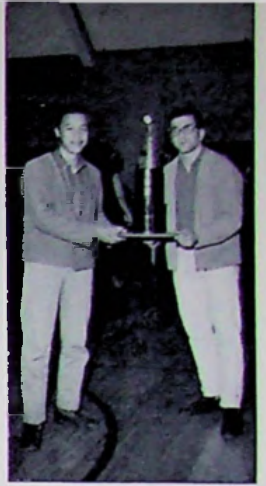

On October 28, 1962, they attended the 49'er football game at Kezar Stadium in San Francisco and competed against pompon girls from other schools throughout California.

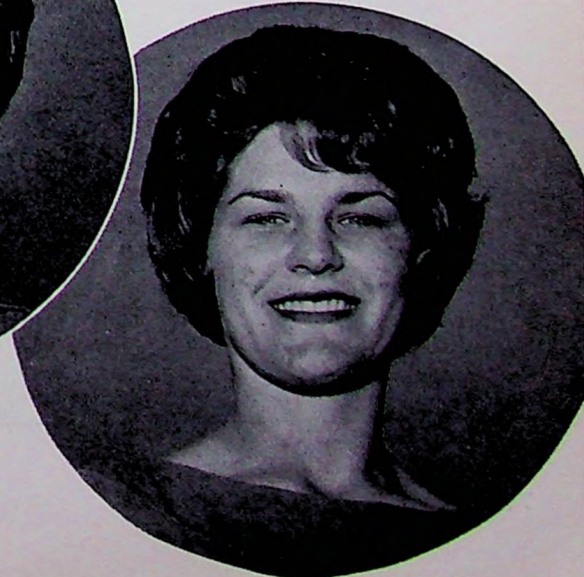

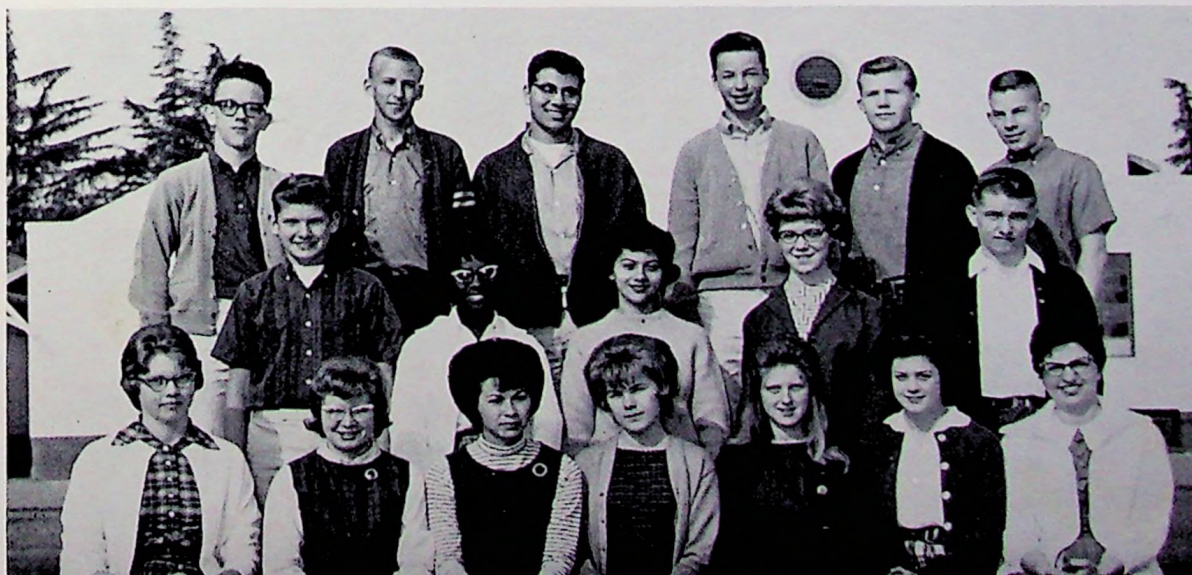
# HONOR ROLL

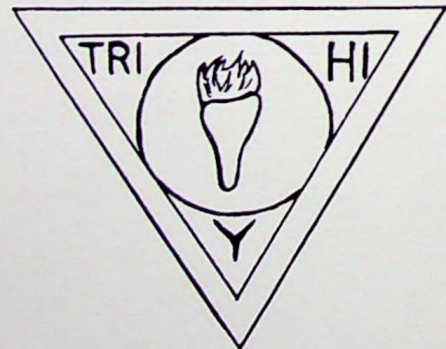

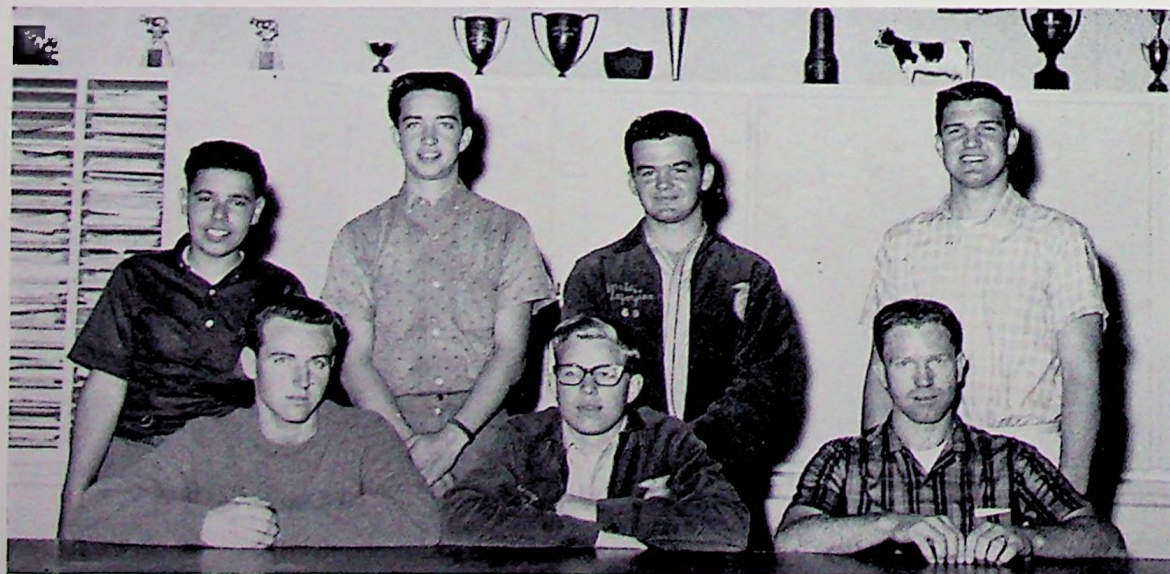
To begin the year, fifteen members entered blue ribbon animals at the Fresno District Fair in October. Jerry Crass, junior, came home with a Grand Champion steer.

## MARCHING BAND

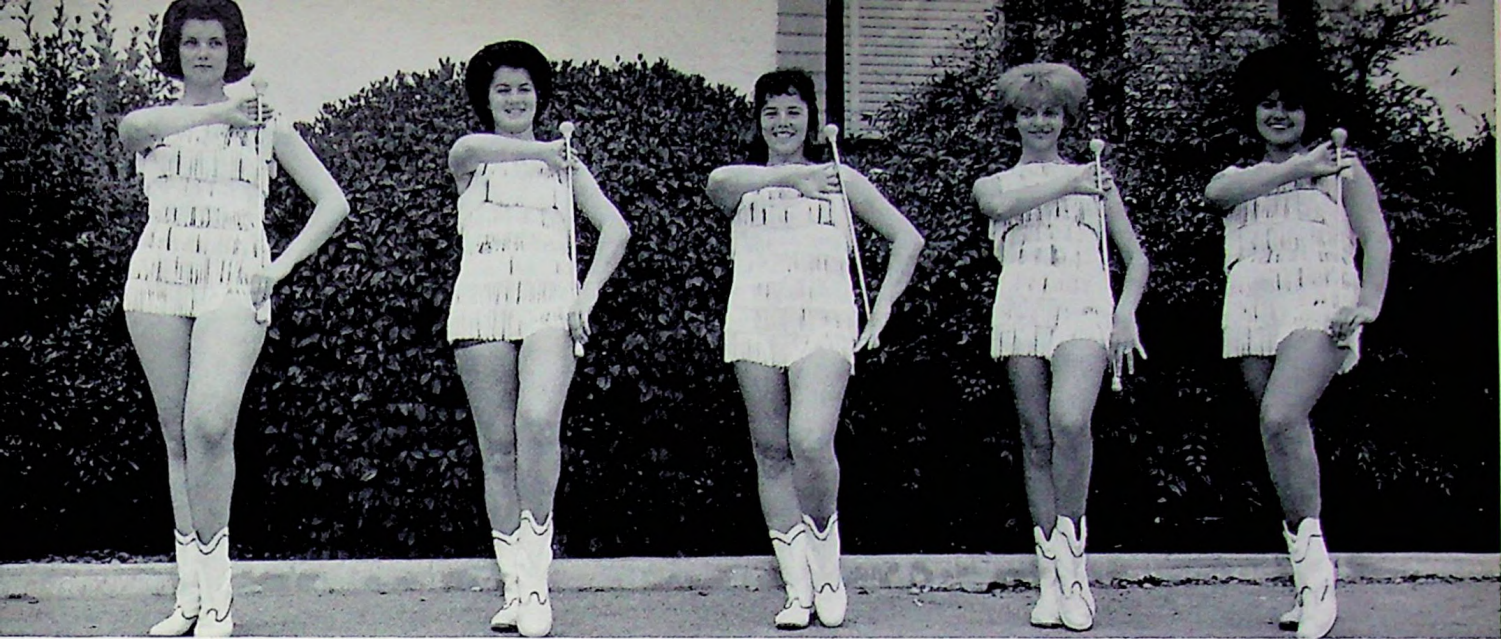

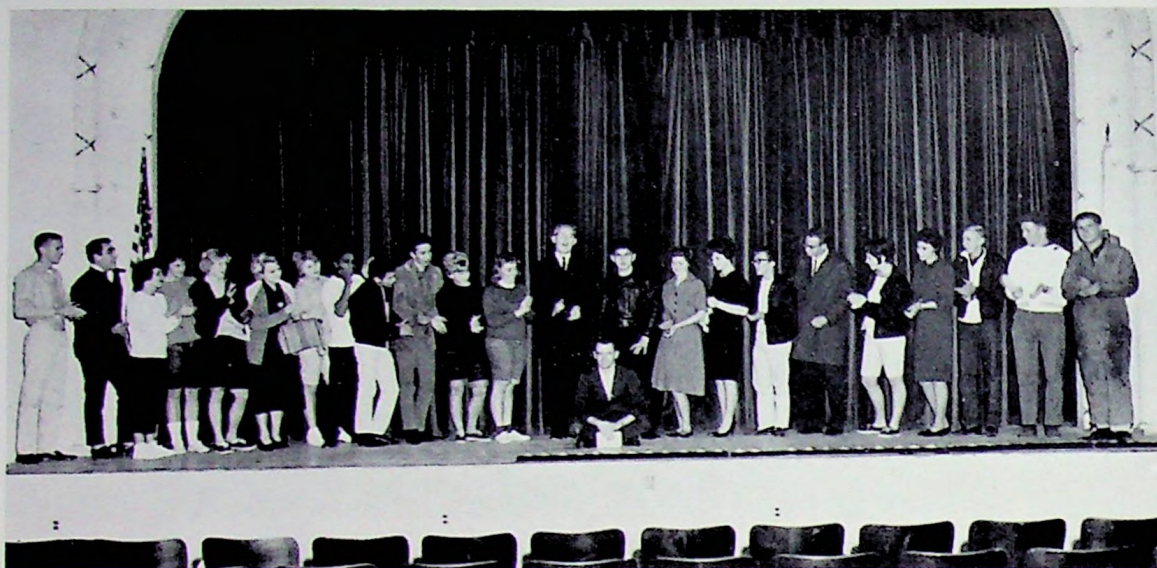
