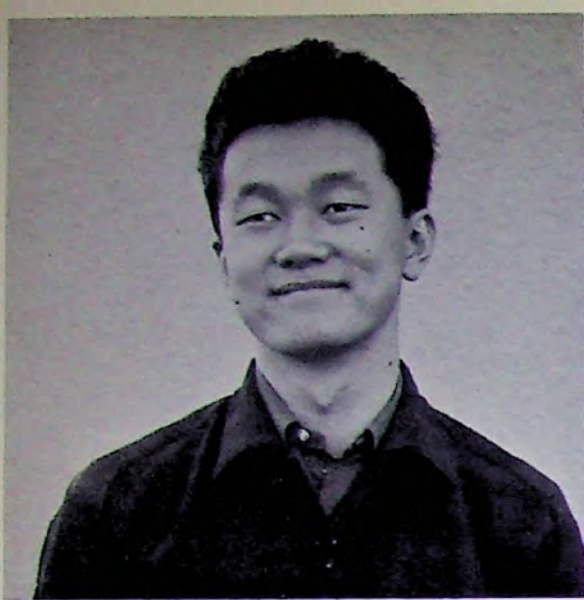
Class of '65

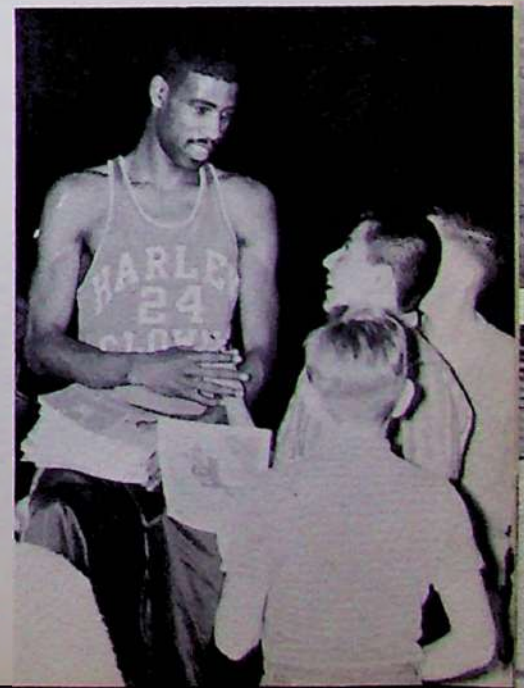

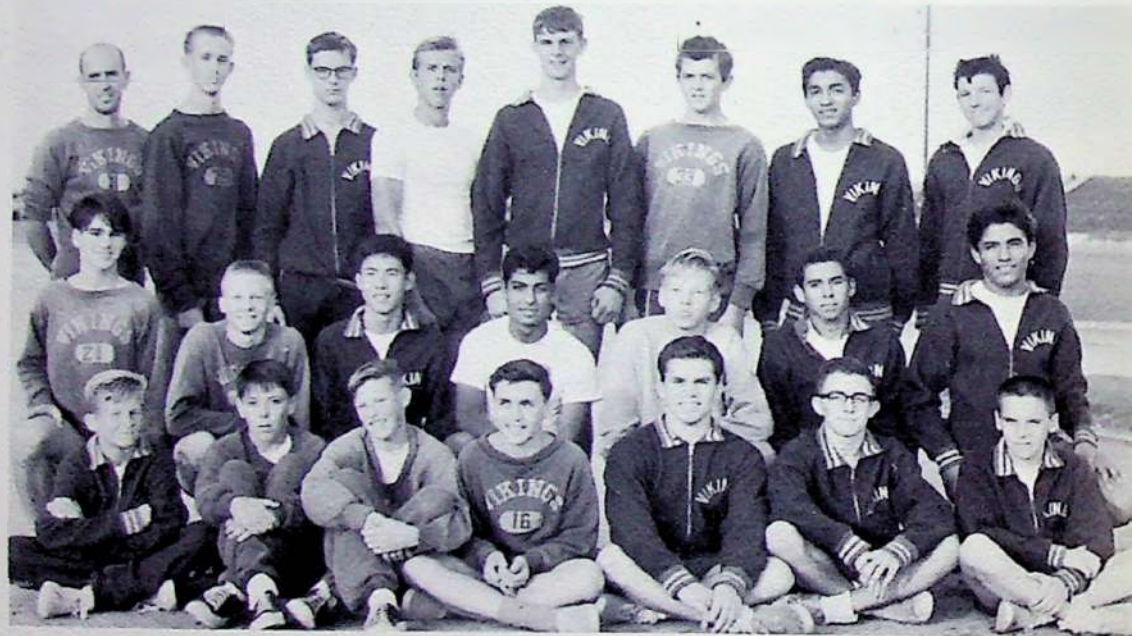
This year's young squad projected an even brighter look for next year. This year, the team had eight strong, enthusi-

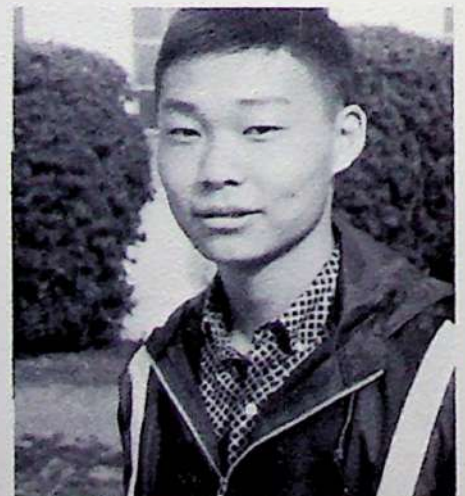

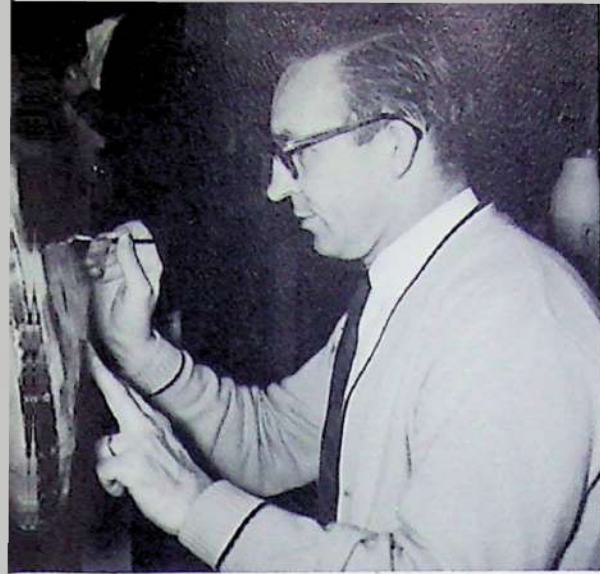
