This annual, then, is presented as a logbook for the Viking Voyage of 1966.



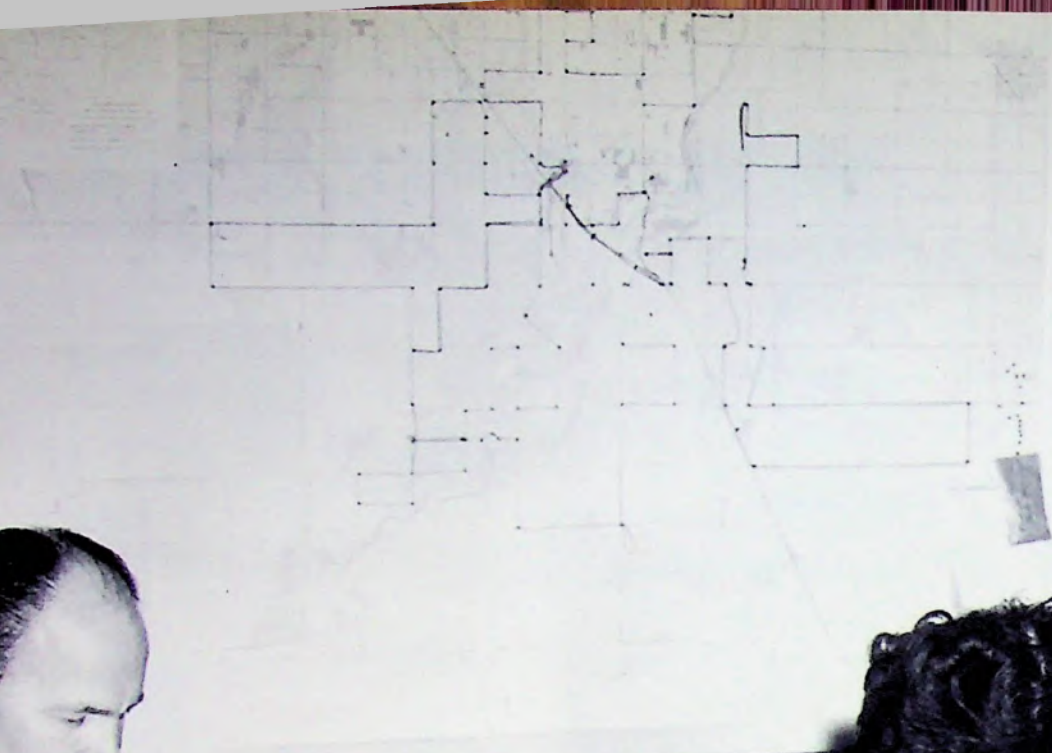
DEDICATION

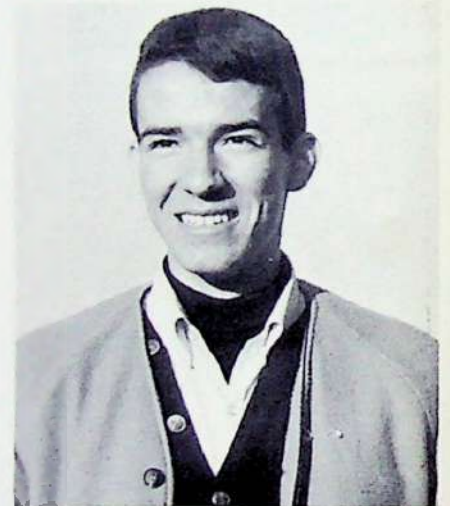

Senior week, the climax to a tremendous year, included Baccalaureate services, a senior breakfast, a steak bake, and a trip to Disneyland.



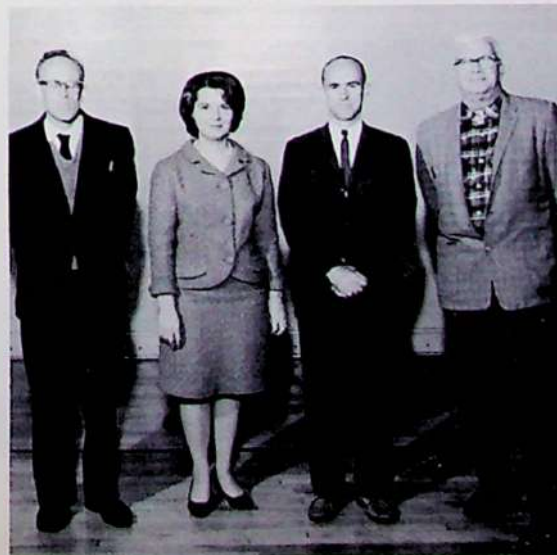

The three-act comedy was concerned with the confusion that goes on in a household preceding a wedding.



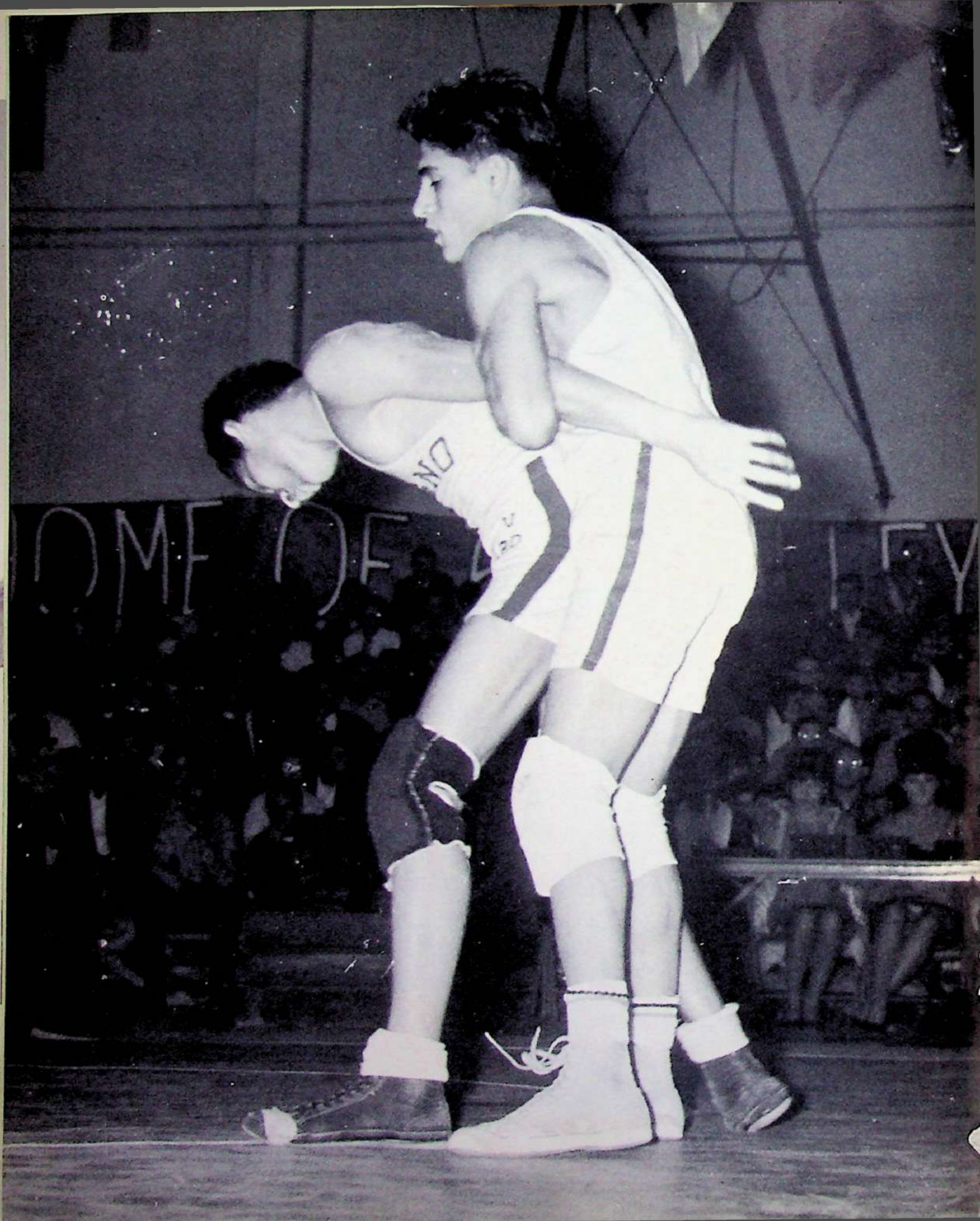

Kingsburg, although sporting a 3-6 season record, had the ability to fight back when down and gave the spectators a good game.

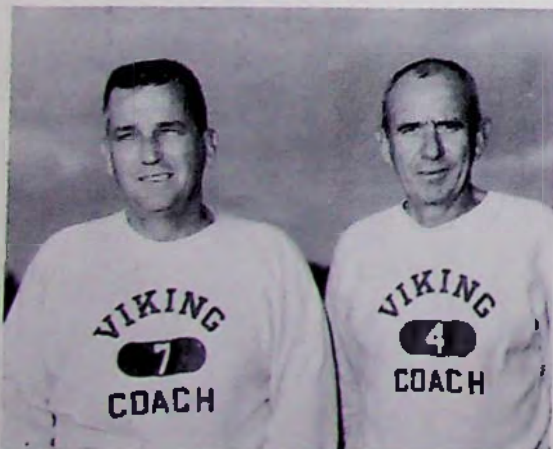

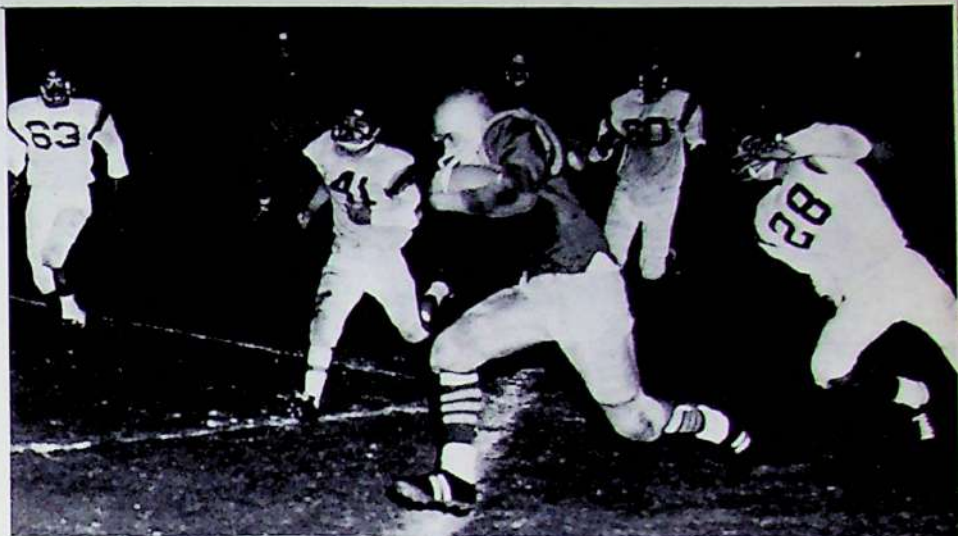

The juniors, together with the freshmen, won a trophy for presenting the best pep rally in competition against the sophomores and seniors.

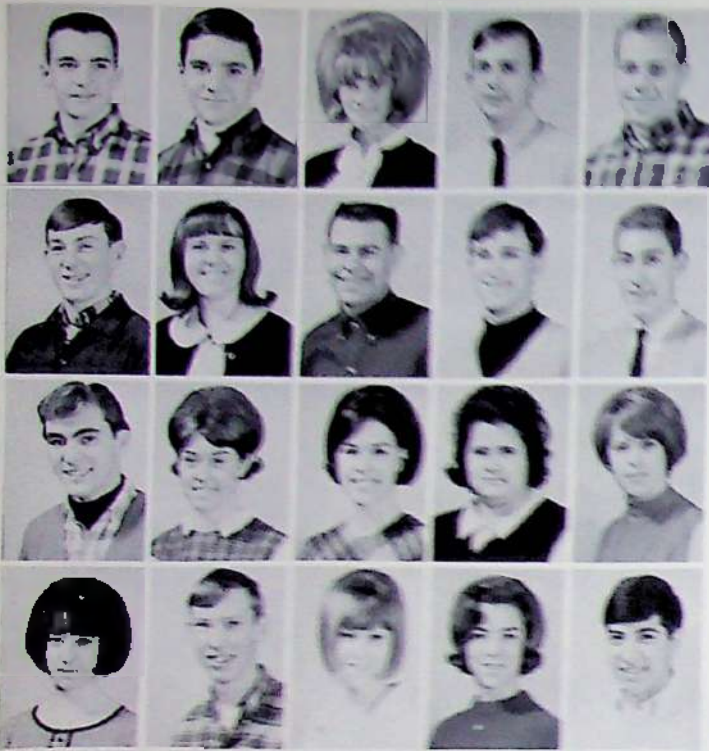
