

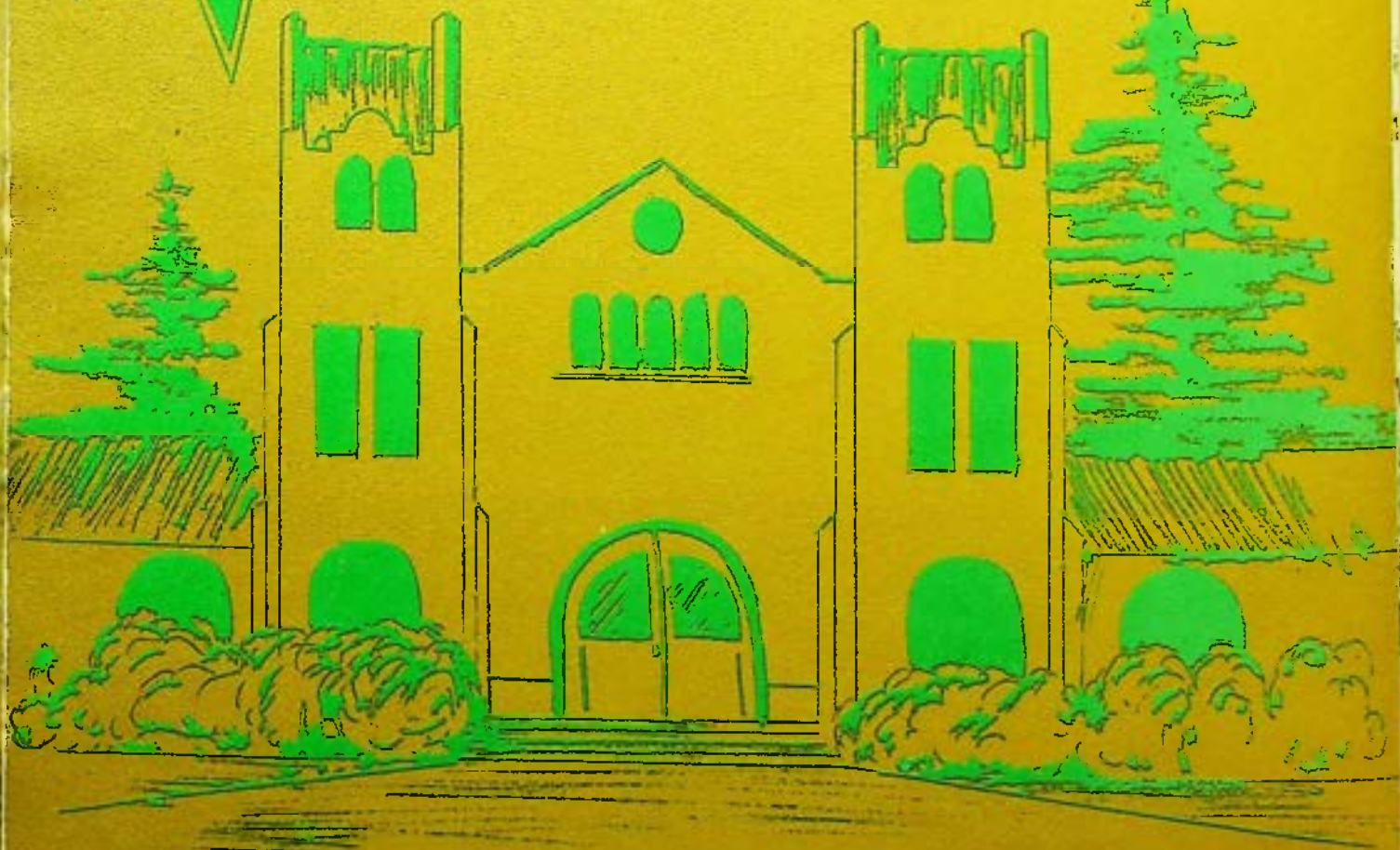

music for our football and basketball games.

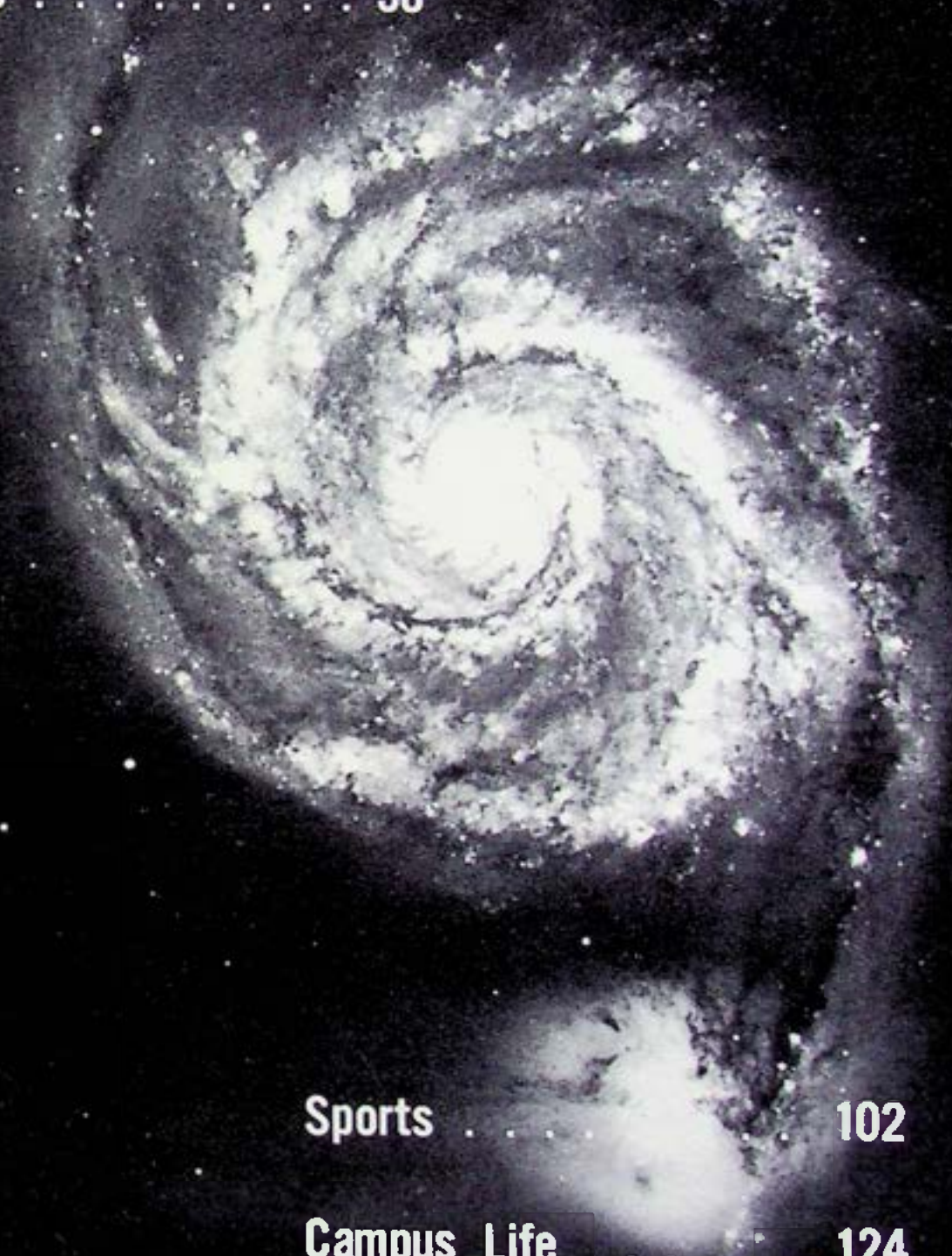

The Kingsburg Observatory and Astronomical Educational Center was designed to serve 110,000 young people in this area as well as the general public. This imaginative new educational facility should enrich the regular curriculum and provide a center for increasing the level of scientific understanding of Astronomy and Space Technology. In the area to be served by this project, no high school or college has an observatory for the study of Astronomy.

The major objectives of the Kingsburg Observatory are as follows:

1. To supplement the present programs of participating schools by the use of facilities not available in the classroom.
2. To provide the children of the area an opportunity to discover the wonders of Space Science.
3. To encourage interested students to pursue further study and prepare for scientific and technical careers.
4. To provide a center for increasing

the level of scientific understanding by the community.

The observatory project includes a building for an instructional lecture center and an observatory room with a dome and a permanently mounted 12 1/2-inch telescope. One ten-inch and two eight-inch portable telescopes will be used outside the building. The projection of slides from Mt. Palomar, Mt. Wilson, and Lick Observatories are included in the evening educational experience. Instructors with specialized skills will be on duty each night to serve both school children and adults.

Mr. Robert Taylor, principal of K.H.S., is the Director of the Observatory. Dr. Walter Lorenz, a graduate astronomer with experience at Yerkes and McDonald Observatories and lecturer at Adler Planetarium, is astronomer in charge of the instructional program. Dr. Lorenz is at the present time conducting a training class for the instructional staff.

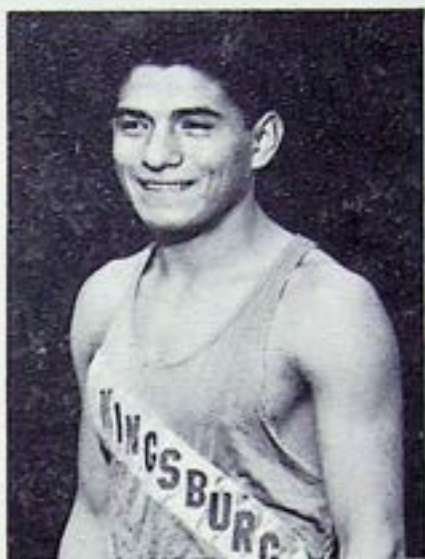

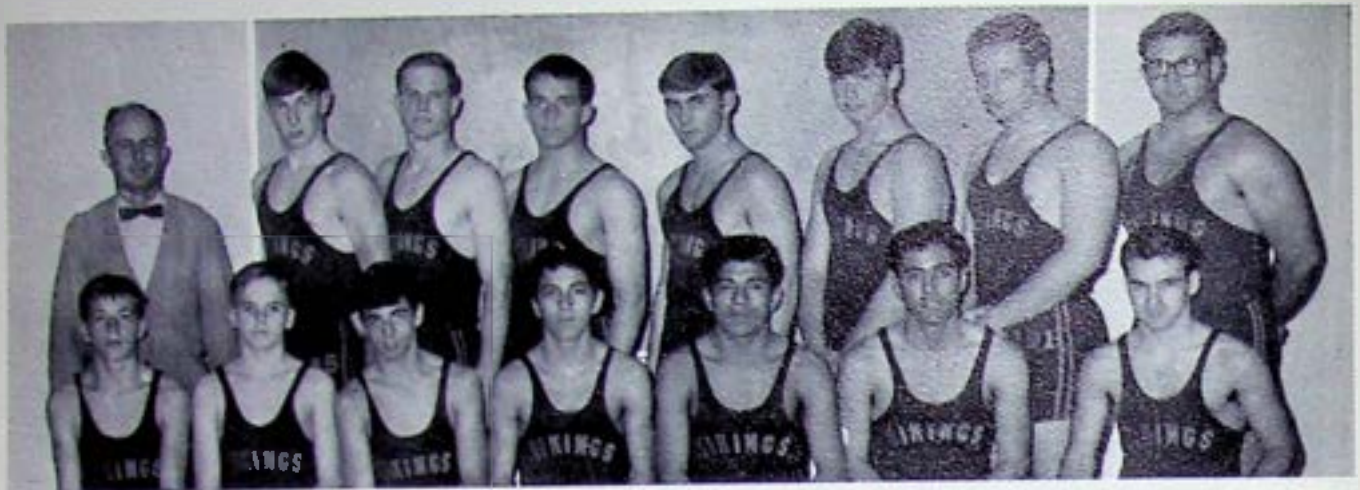

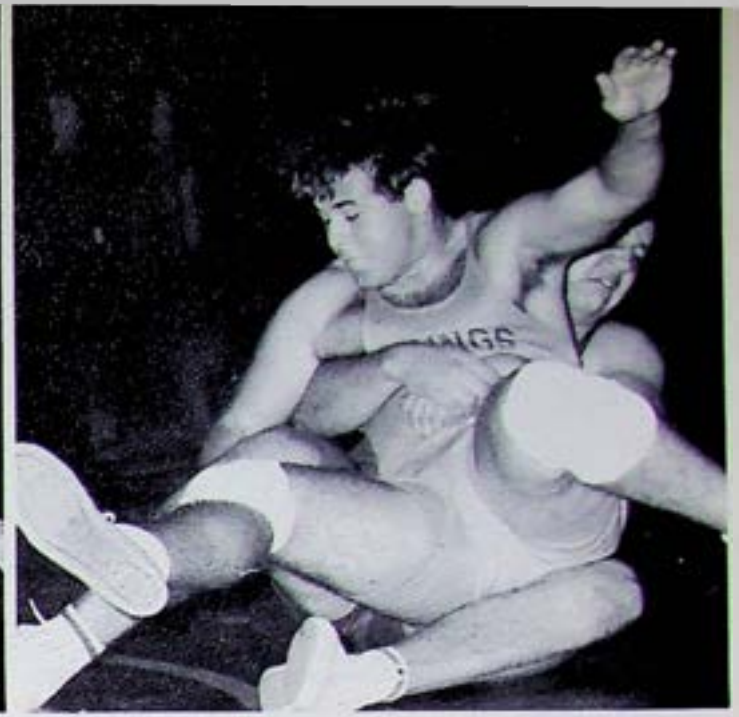

The matmen placed sixth at the Redwood Invitational and went on to capture fourth at the Fresno Invitational Tournament where 28 valley schools participated.

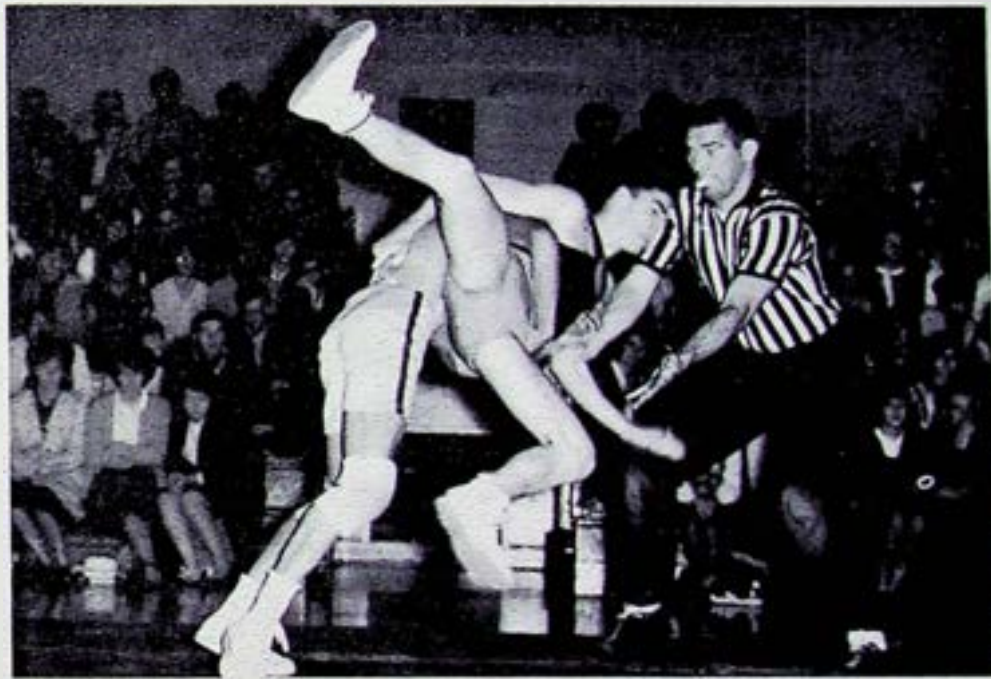
The outstanding Viking Wrestler was the returning Valley Champion, Reynaldo Contreras. Reynaldo again took first in the

Redwood and Fresno Invationals. He was voted the Outstanding Wrestler at the Fresno Tournament, and received a trophy with highest honors.

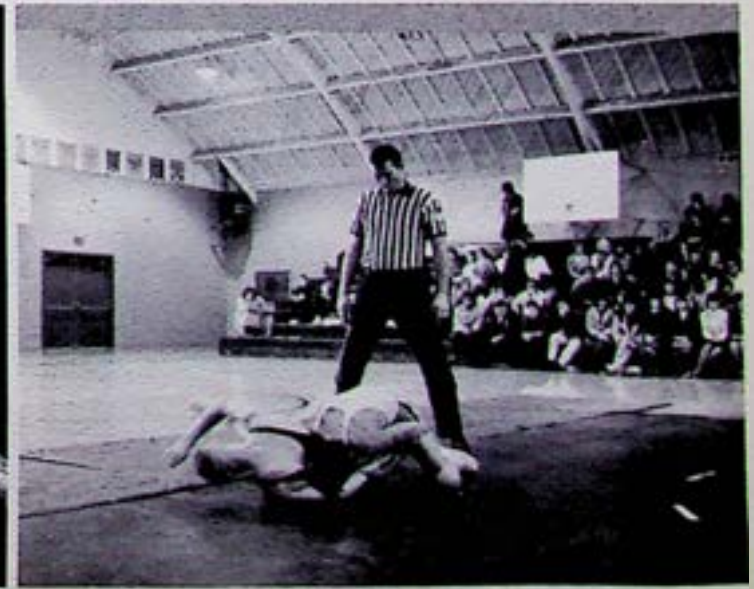
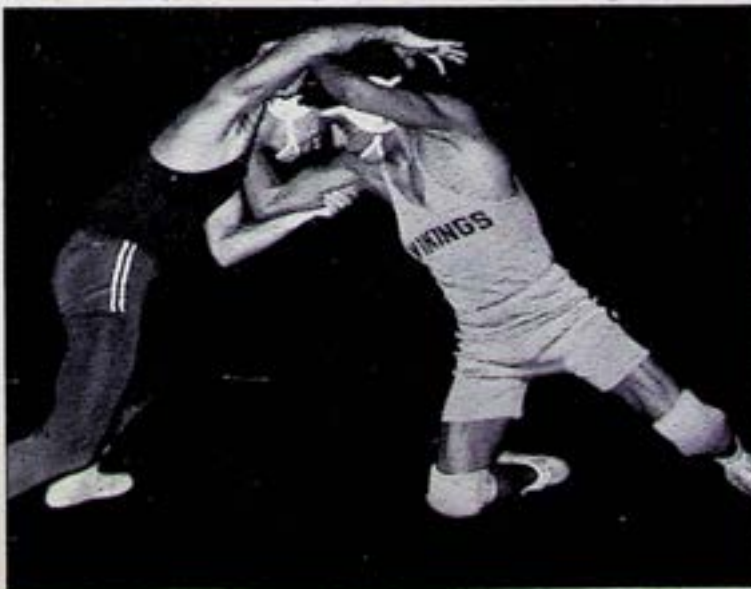

The League meet was held May 6 in Dinuba, the Divisional May 13 in Woodlake, and the Valley May 20 in Bakersfield.



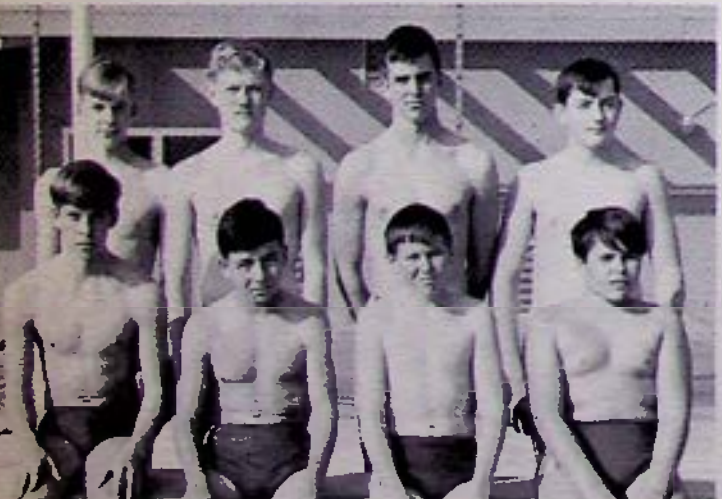
