And see the joys and sorrows and fears


That made for them, their best four years.




















REFLECTIONS OF CLASSES . . . THEN AND NOW



West Sequoia League Champions for the first time in eleven years was the claim of the 1967-68 Viking basketball team. Not only did the team win the league championship, they also stopped Reedley's domination of the Kingsburg Lions Tournament by defeating Reedley and going on to win the tournament title. This year's team won 22 games while losing only 3 games and were rated as high as the number two team in the valley. 




The Team





This year the team was coached by Larry DeLong and John Seaman. Practice this year began the week after football was finished. The team started a weight-lifting program which they stayed on throughout the season.



The Junior Varsity team, which was also out to defend a 12-0 league championship record from last year, expected to have a fine season.








REFLECTIONS OF ACTIVITIES . . . THEN AND NOW

F.B.L.A.





To end a successful year F.H.A. had a fashion show in Kingsburg, a chapter trip to San Francisco, and a F.F.A.-F.H.A. gym party.




The top six future farmers in the chapter participated in a successful camping and trout fishing season this past summer. They even caught a few fish!
