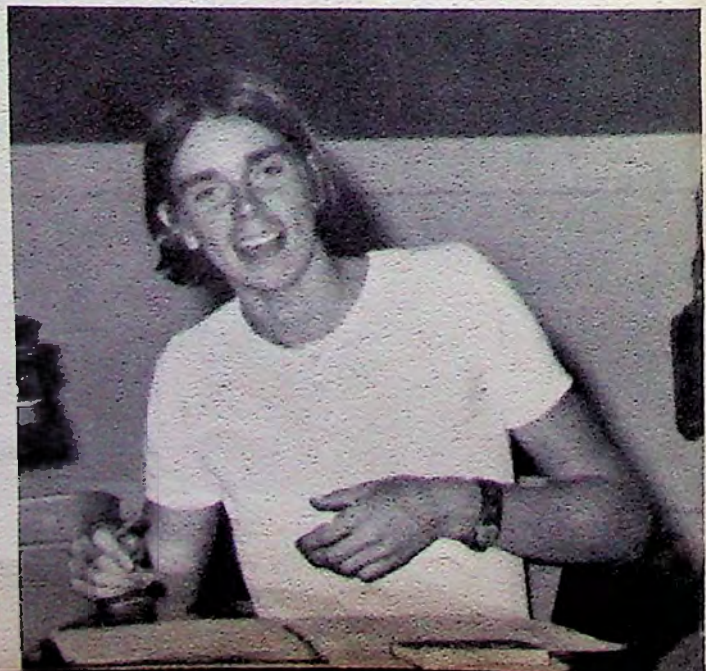
Jukka Rosie Anders

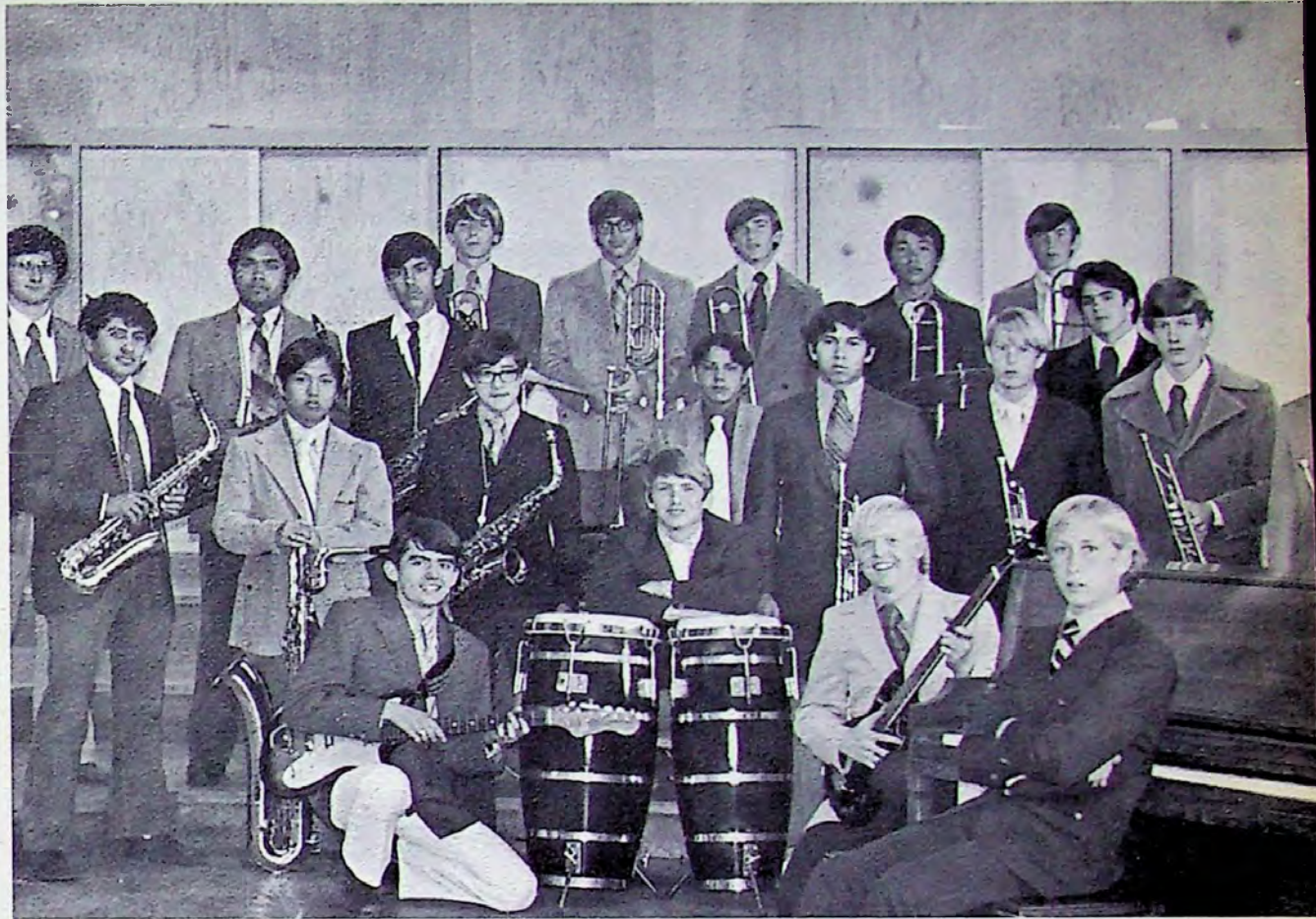

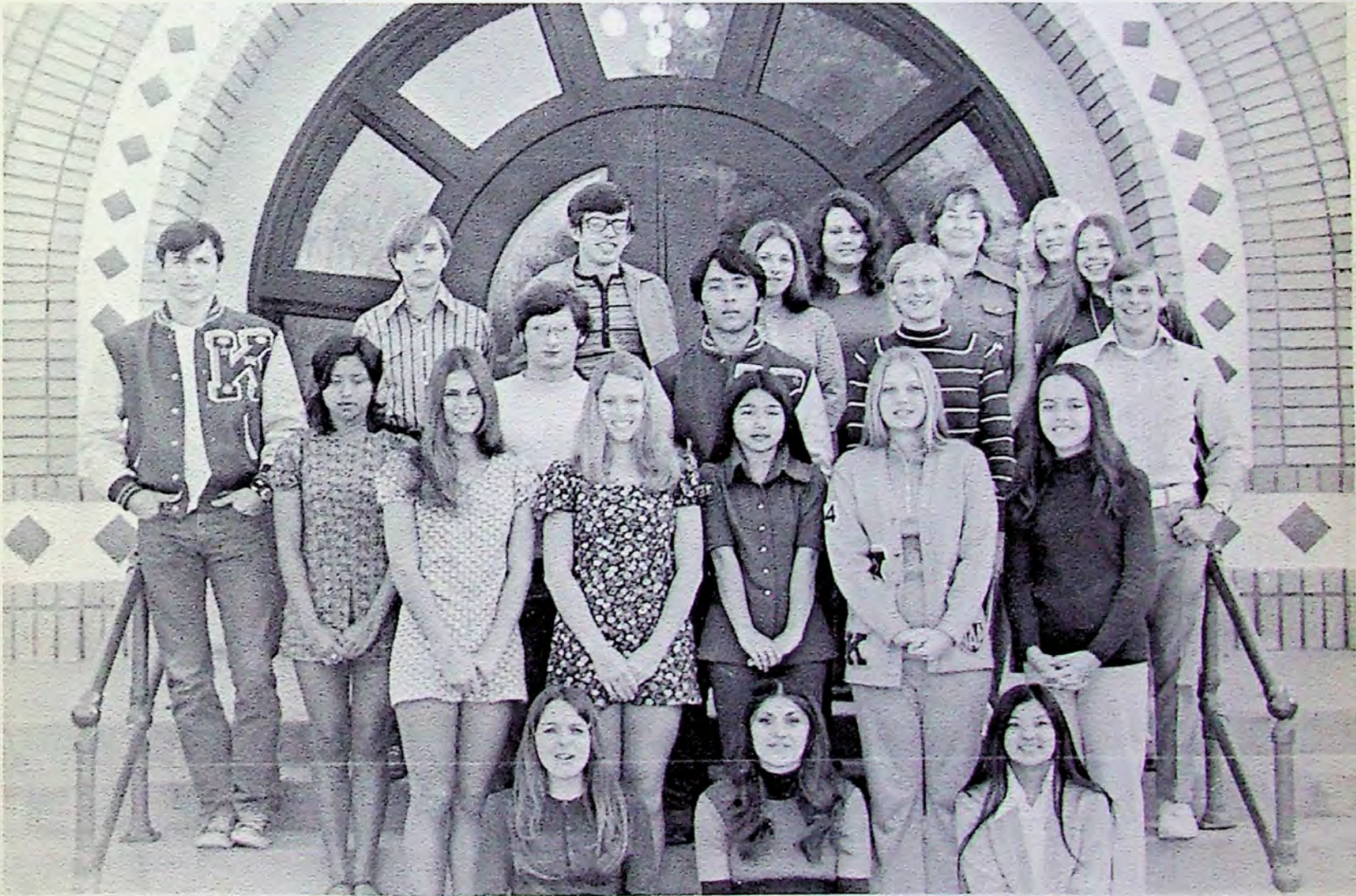

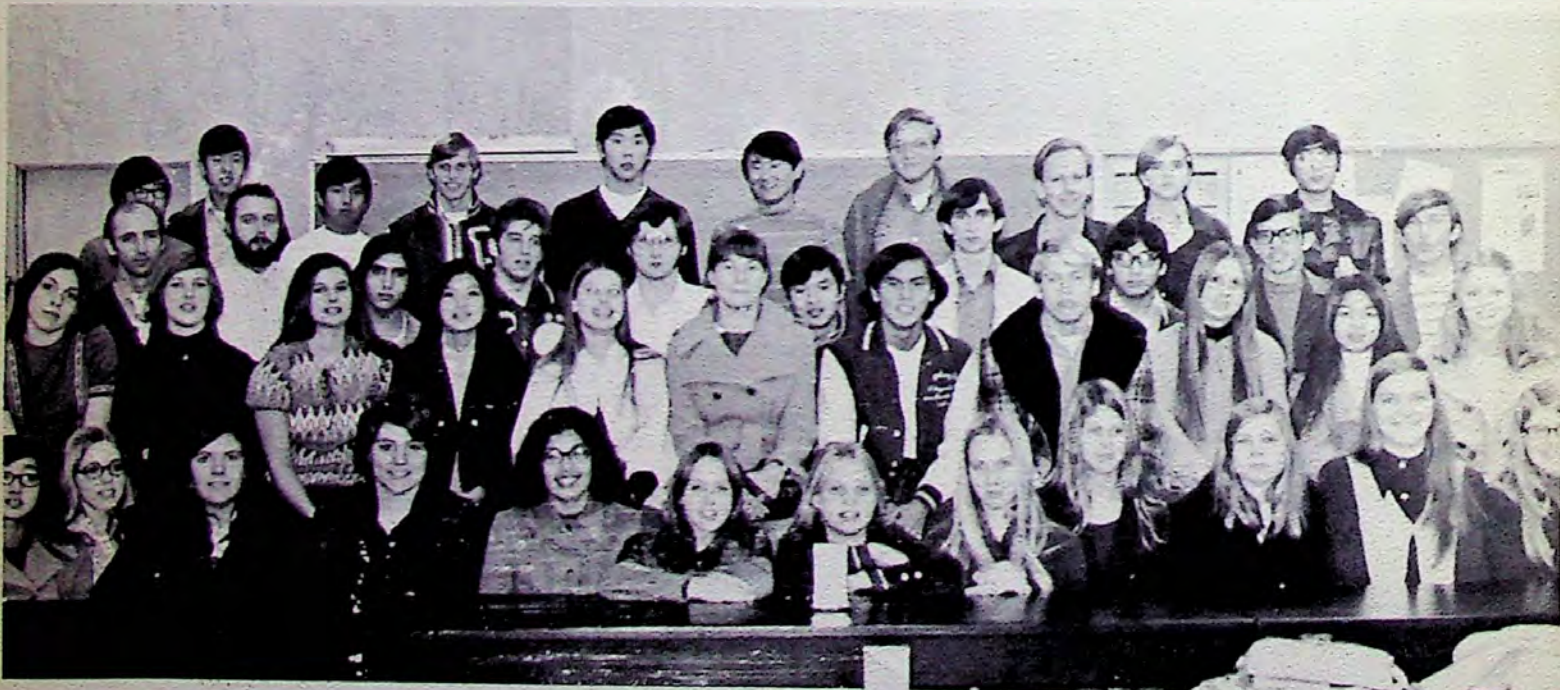
CSF and Honor Roll

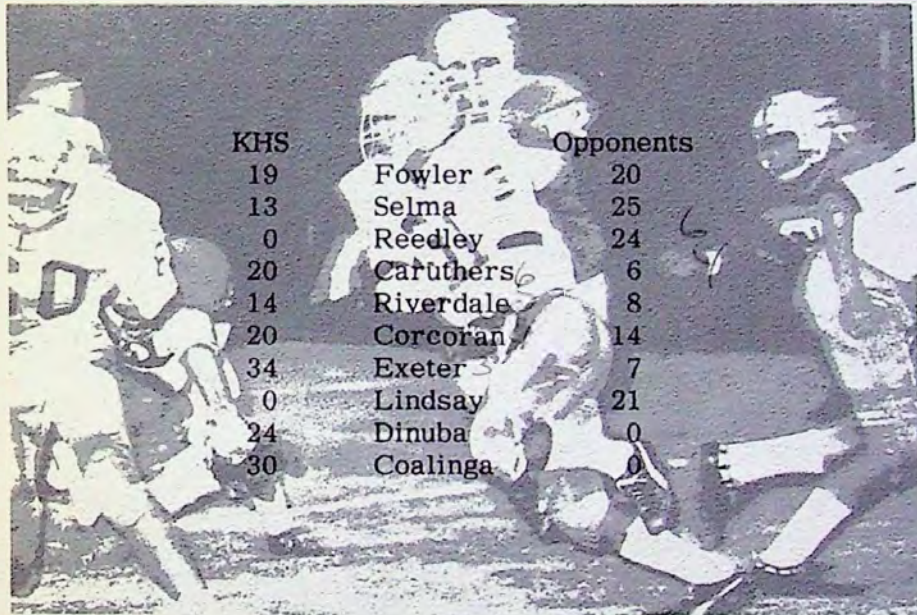

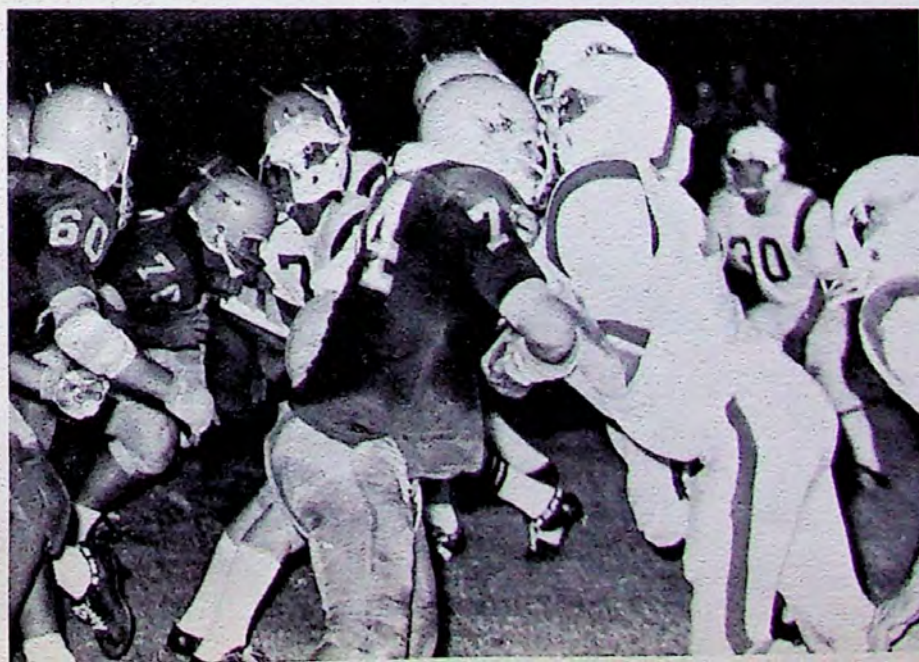

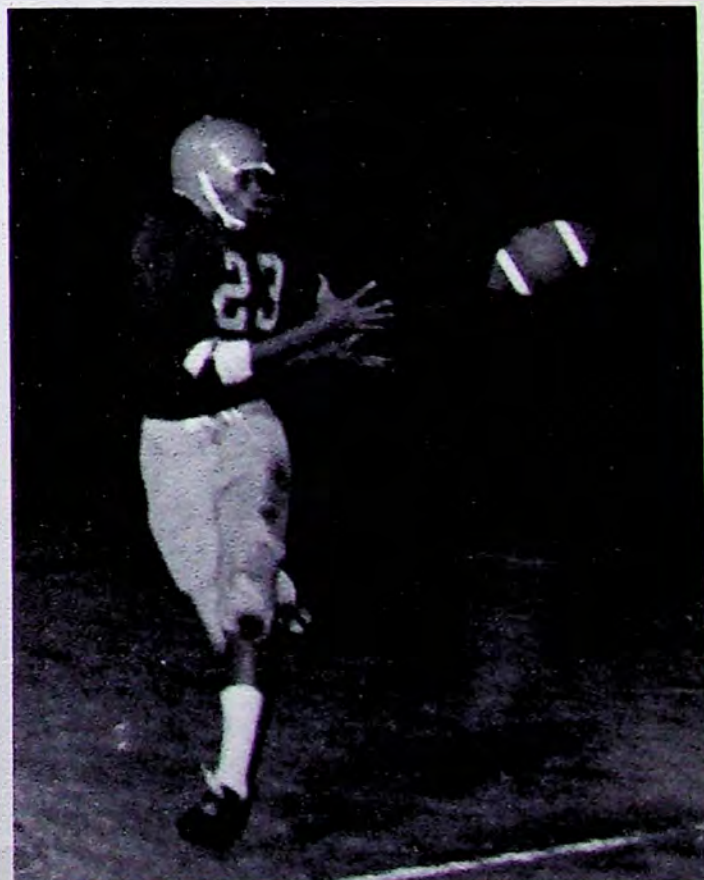

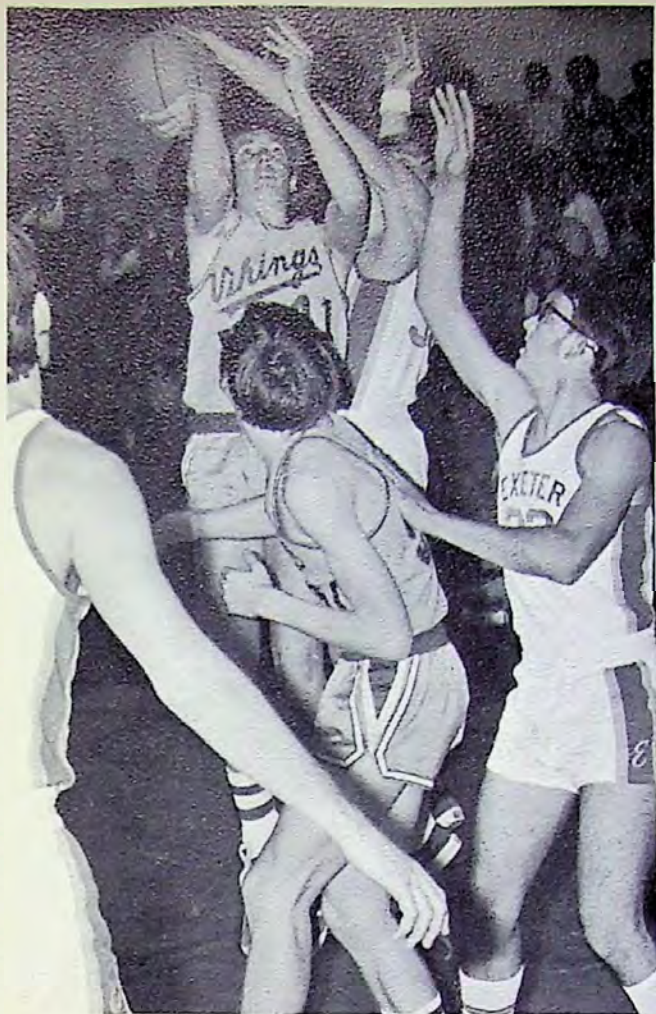

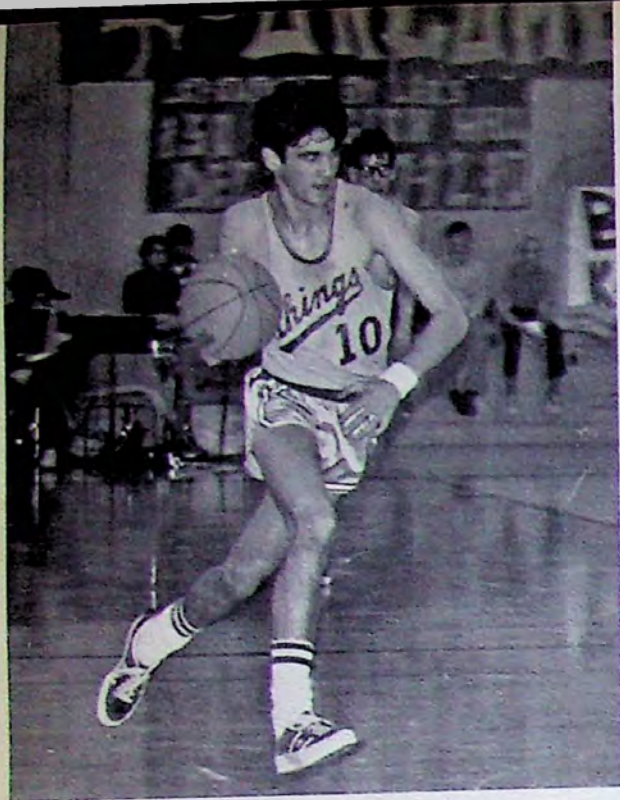

Varsity Wrestling

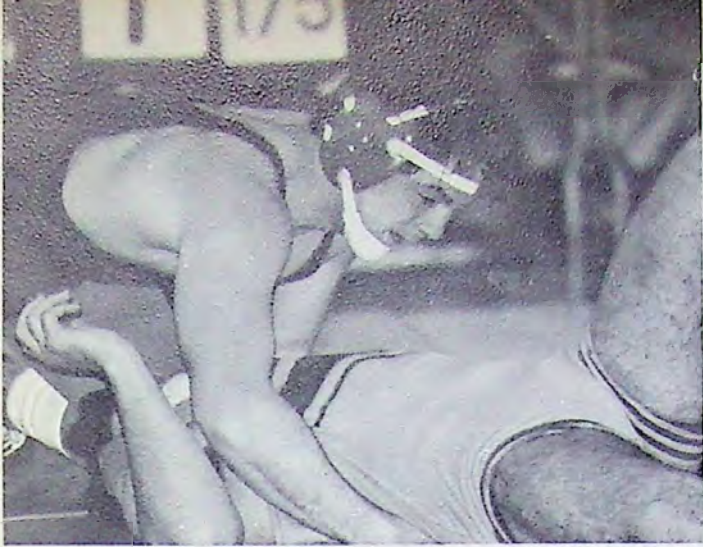

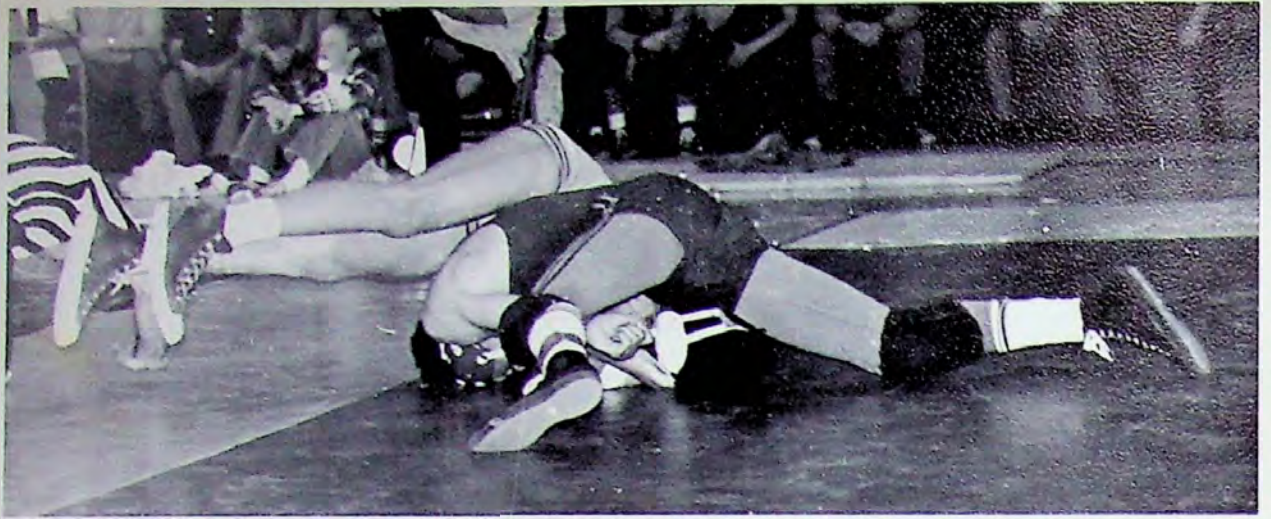

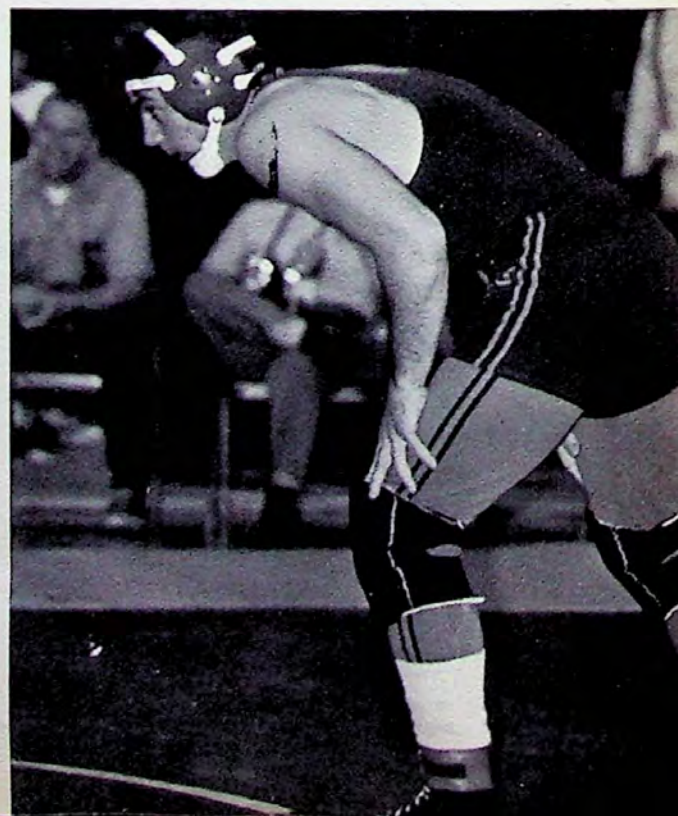

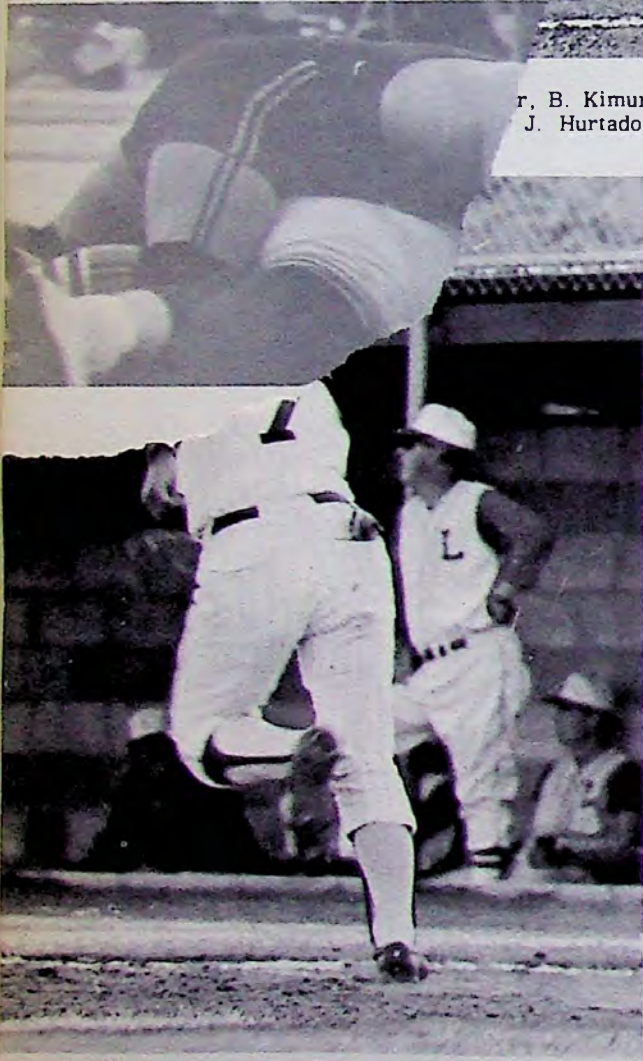

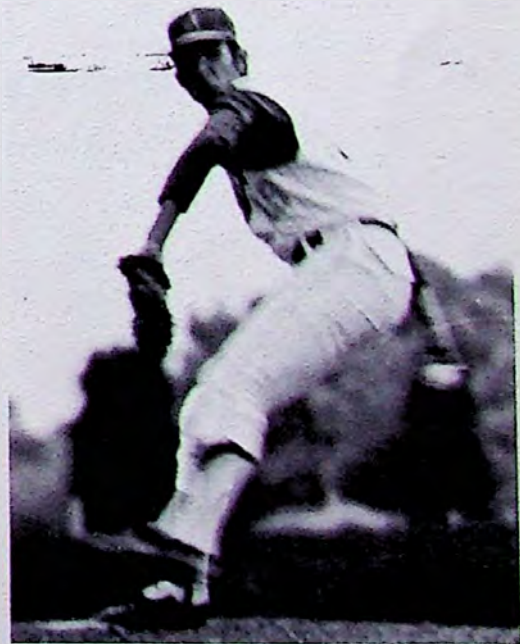

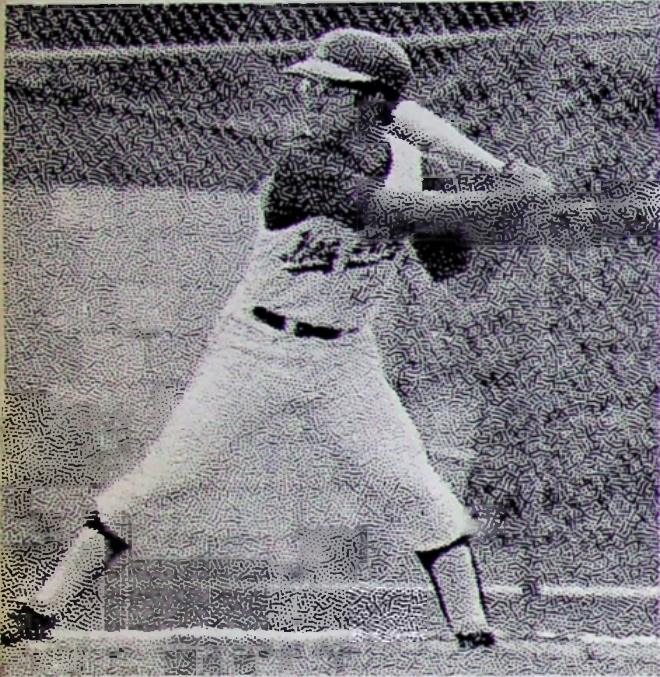

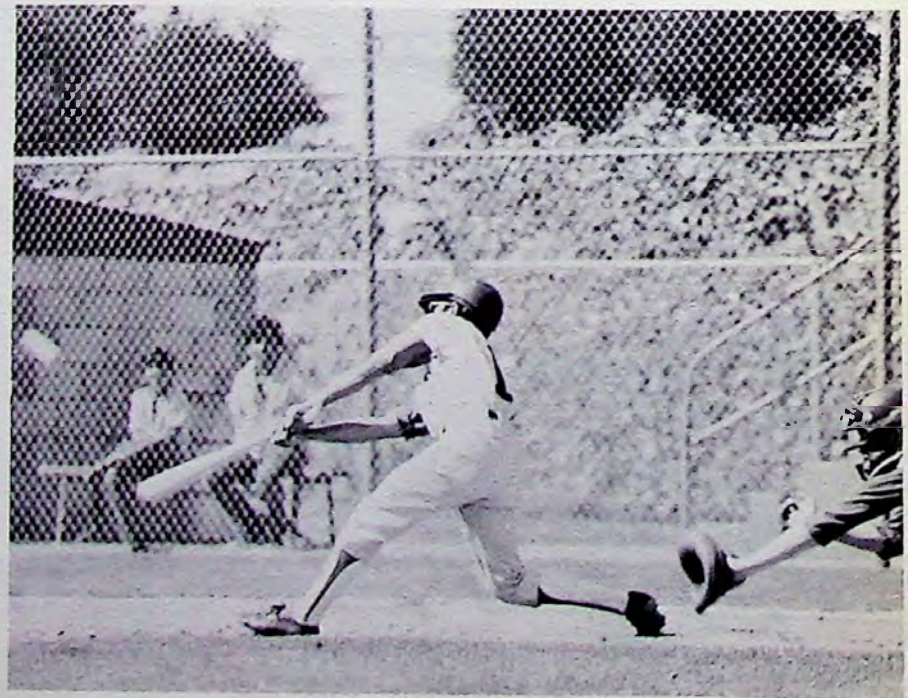

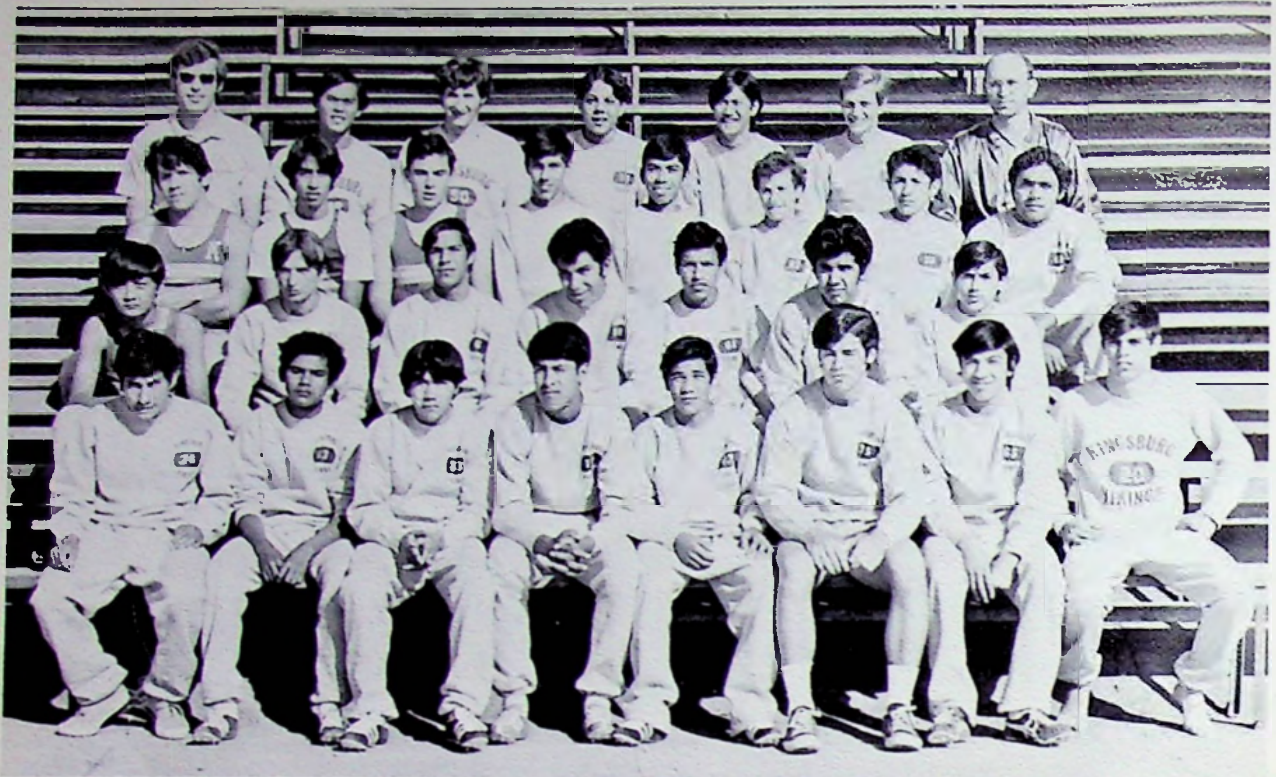

The Kingsburg High School Viking Swim Team of 1972 has a terrific challenge in upholding and surpassing the

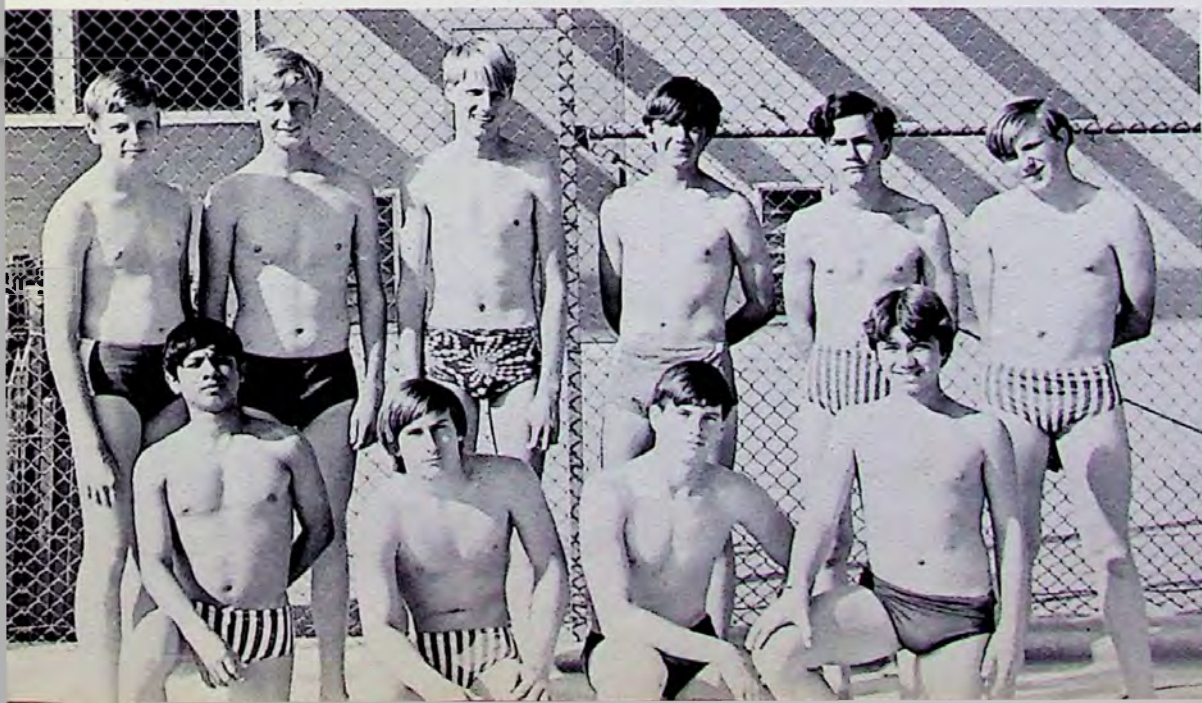
