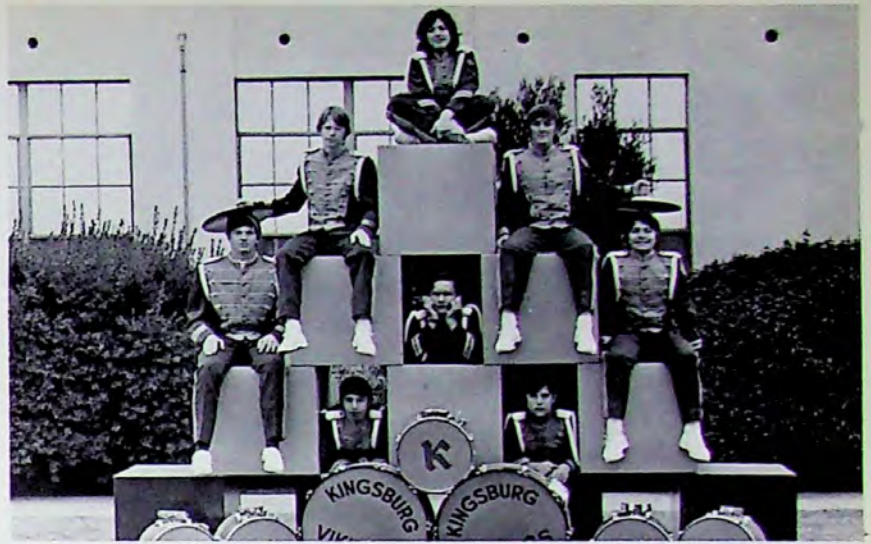

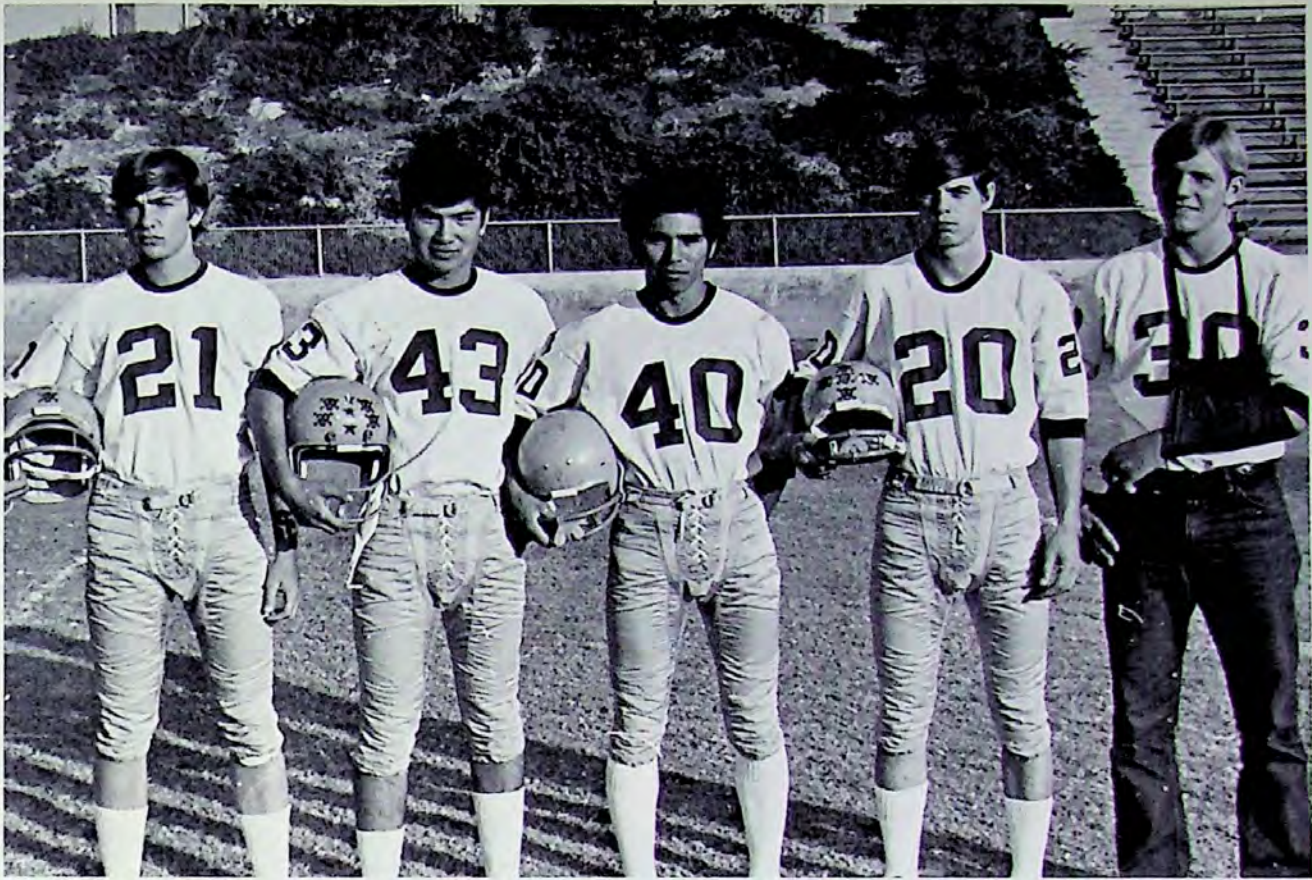

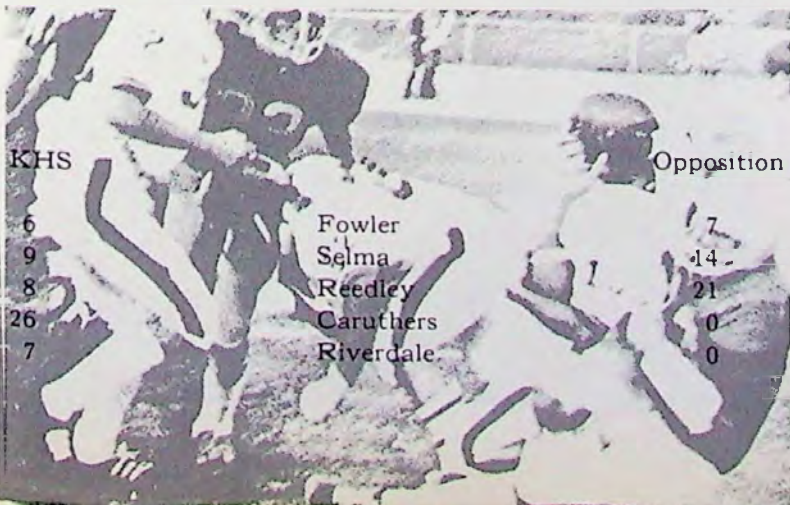

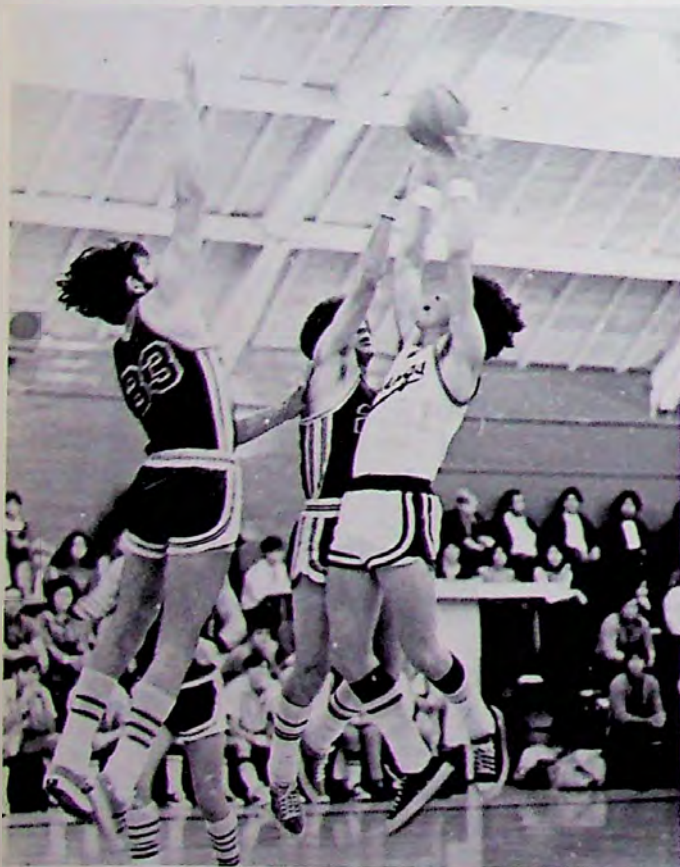

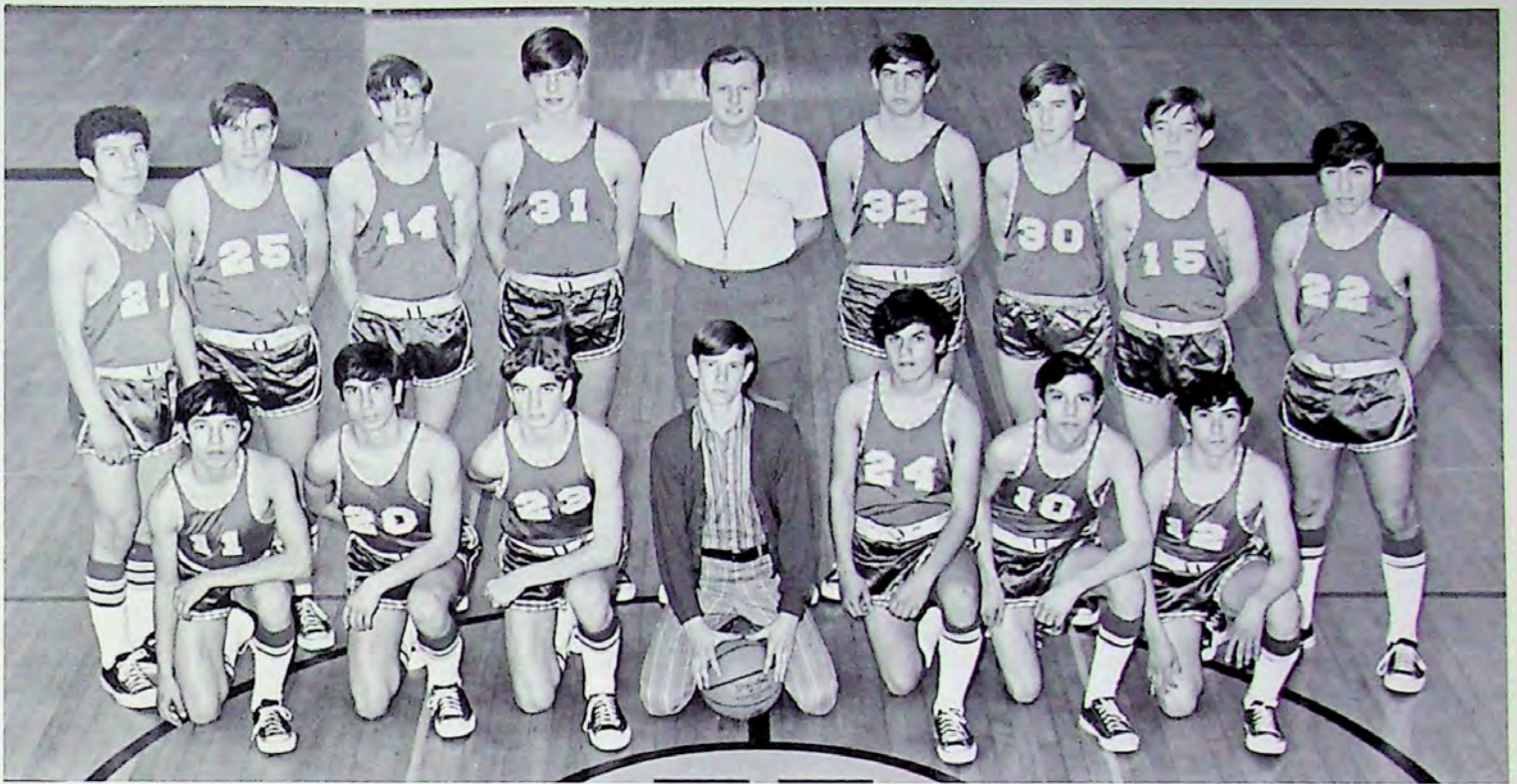

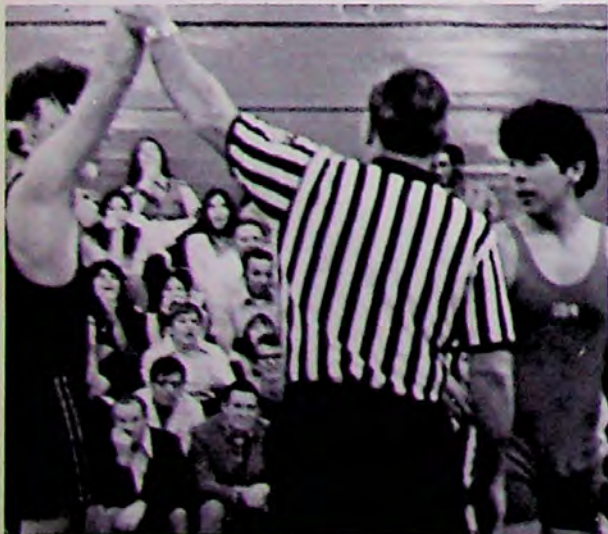

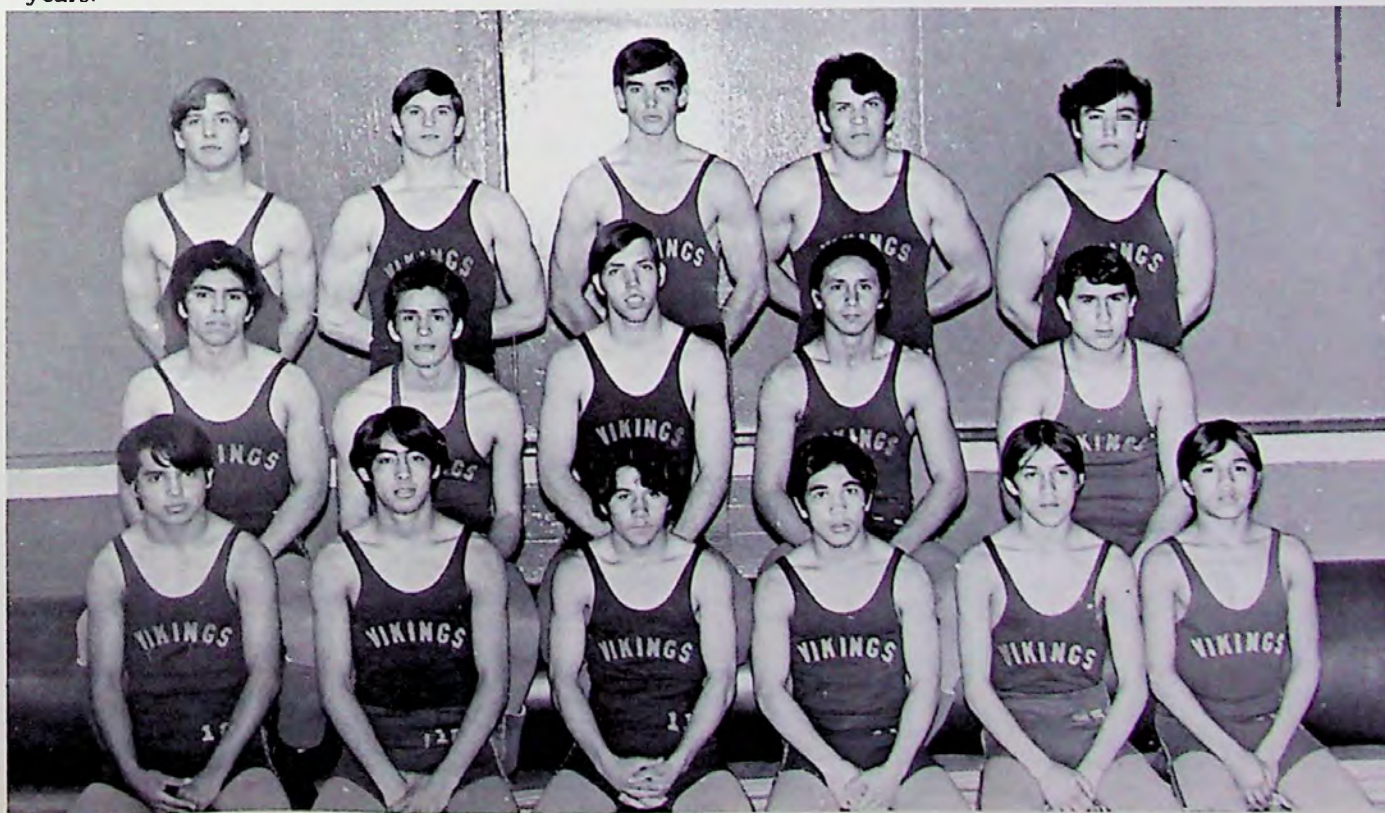

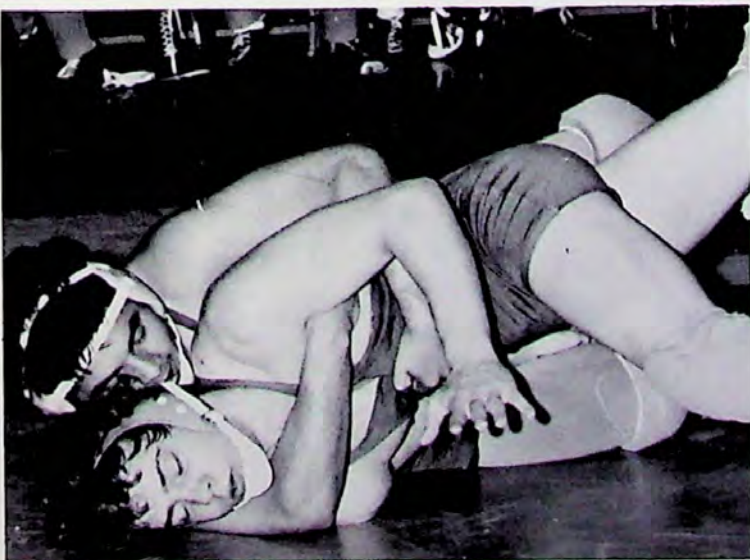

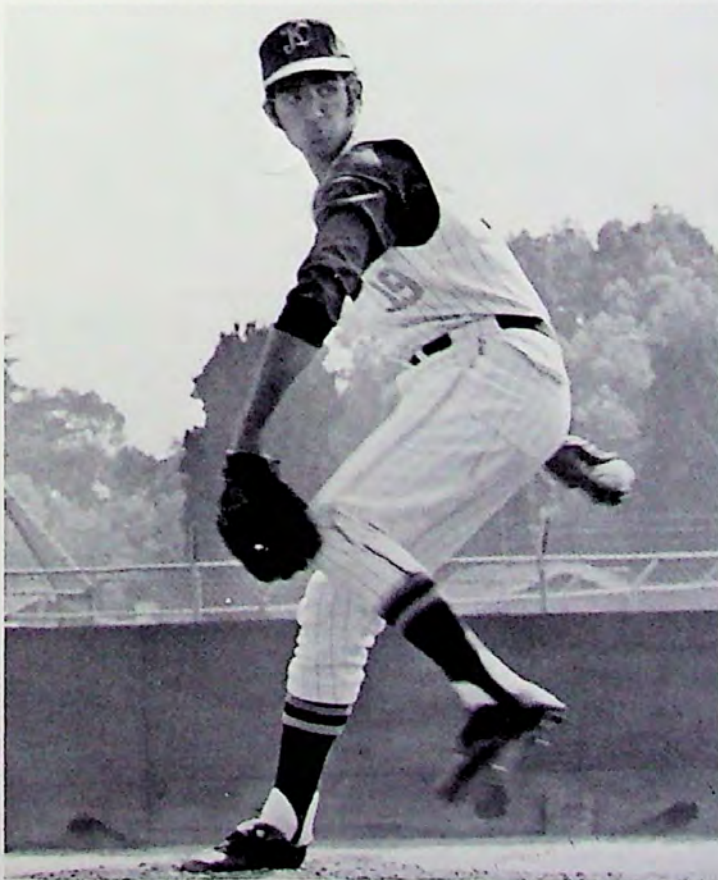

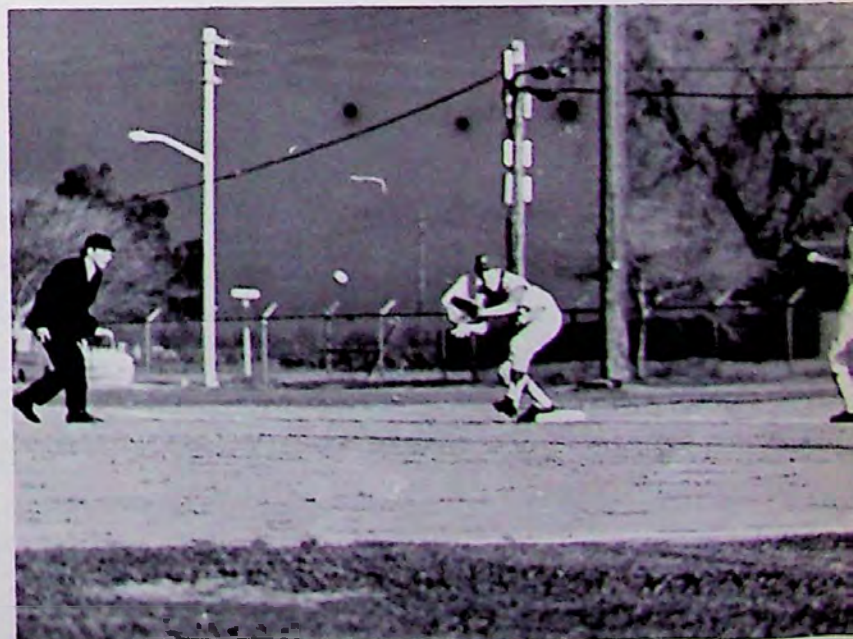

Some seniors were awarded scholarships and outstanding senior members were awarded life membership.

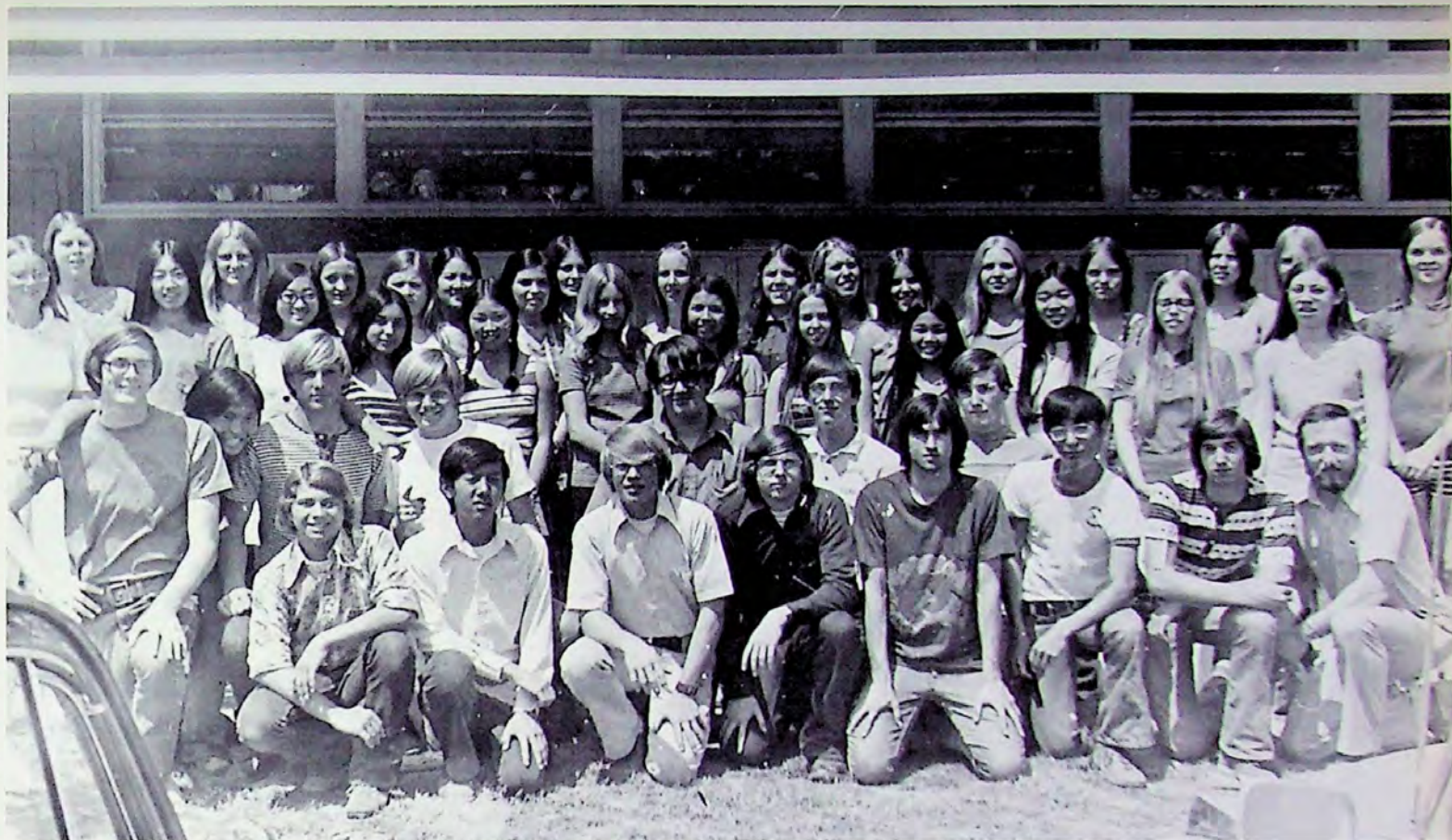

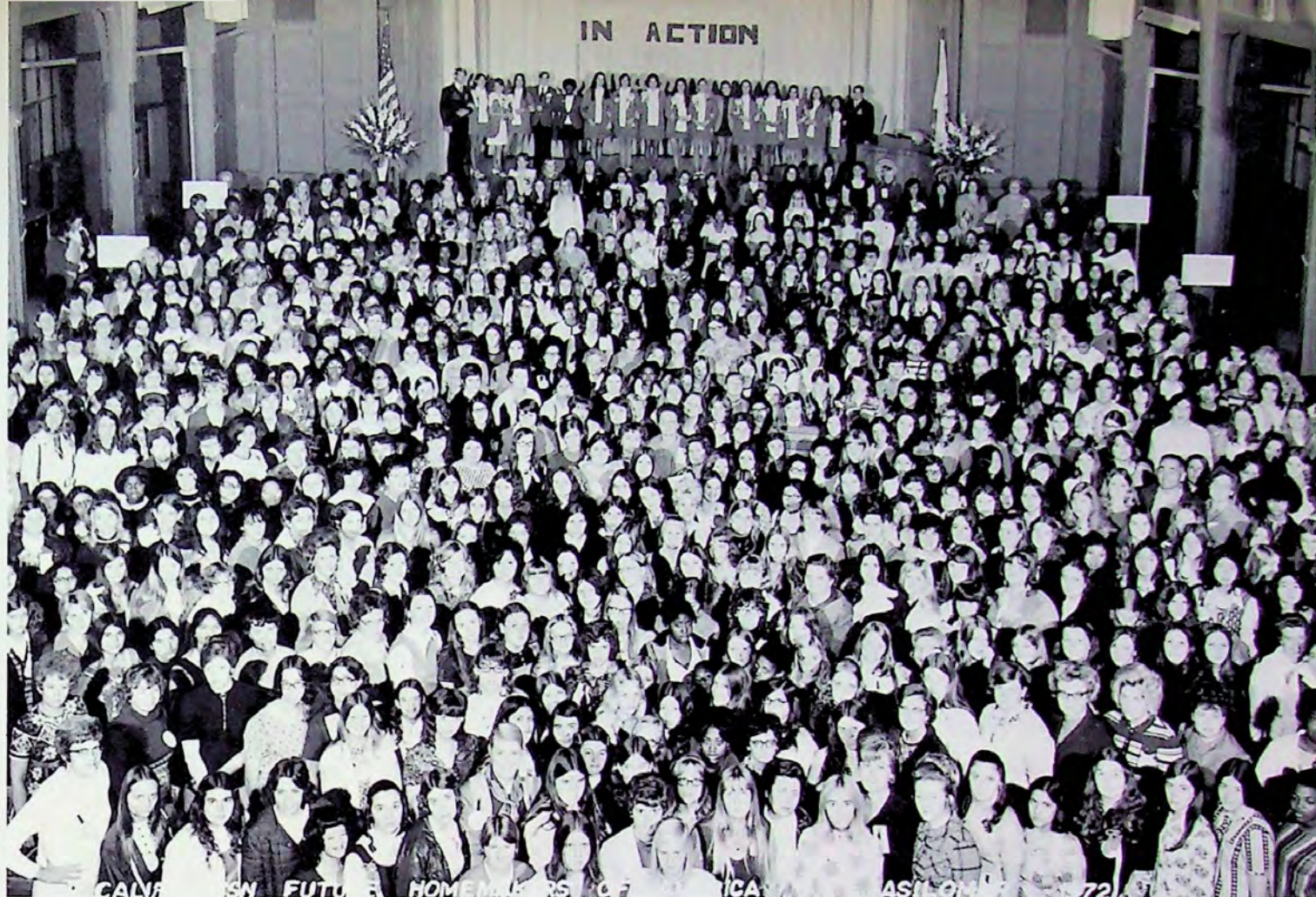
