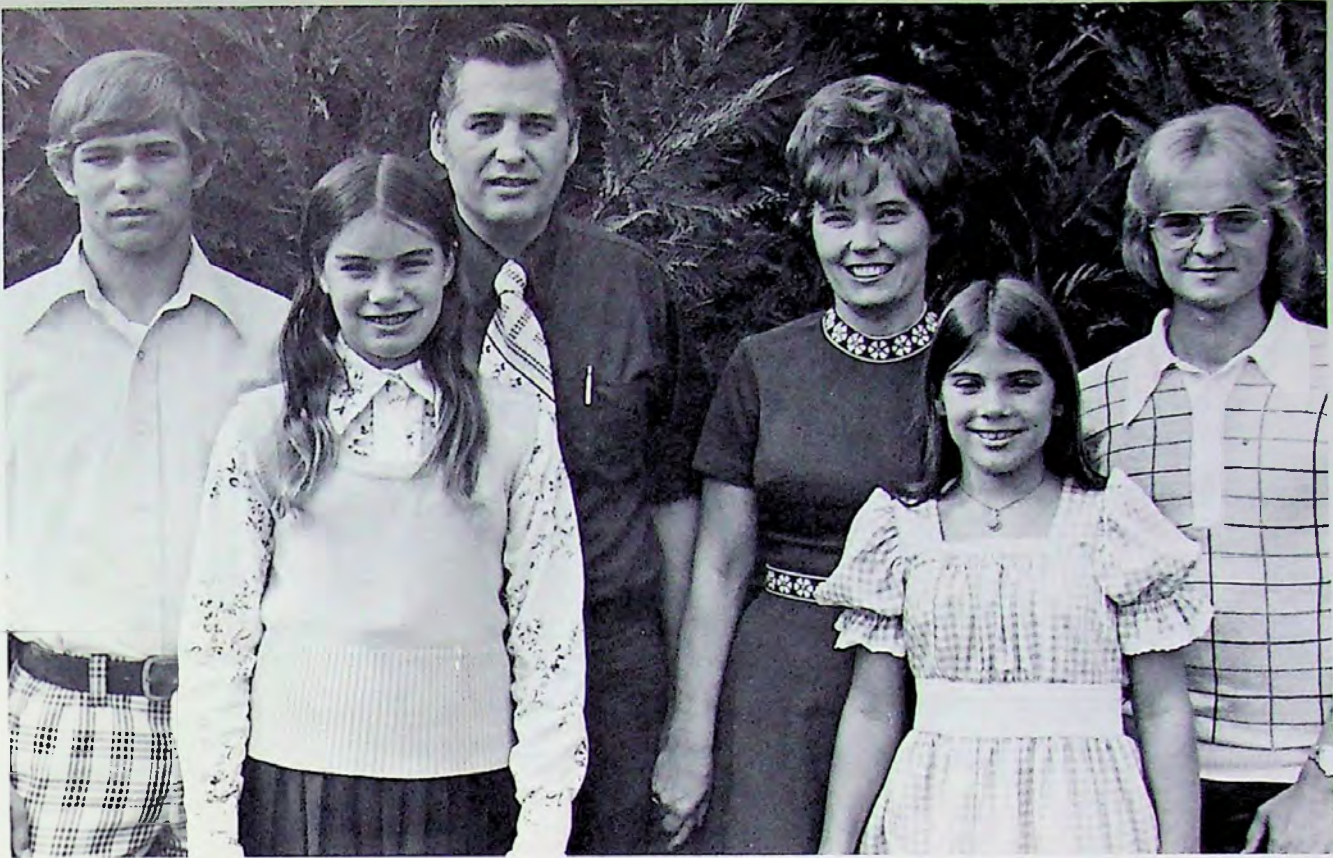
Towards the end of the year, he decided to spend some time in the Bay Area so he went to live with a family there.

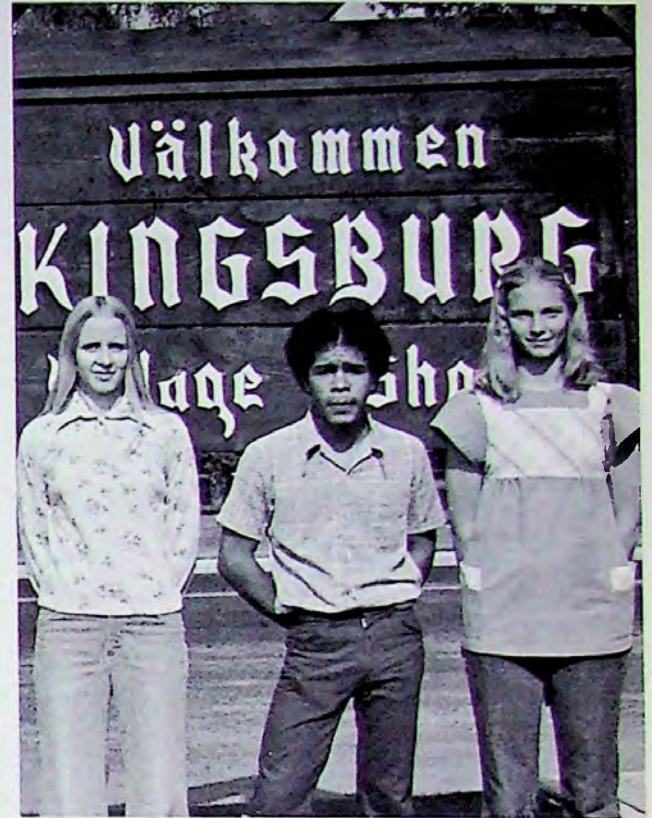
# Sophomores

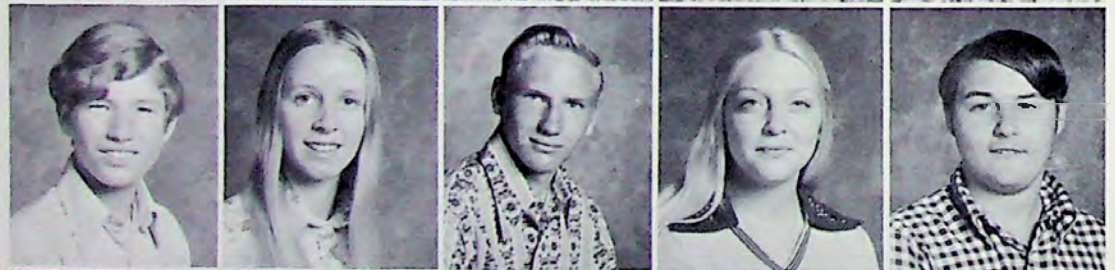

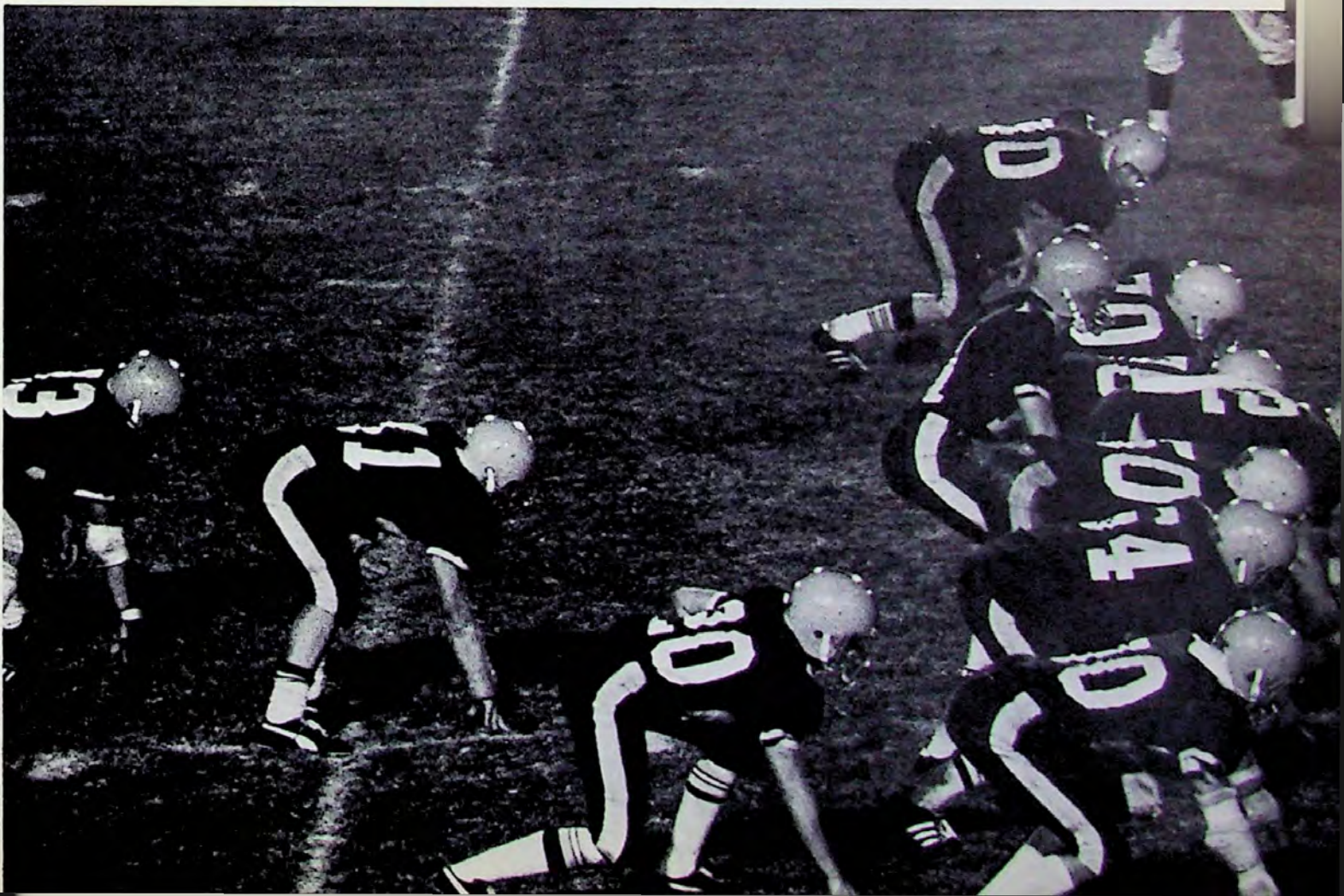

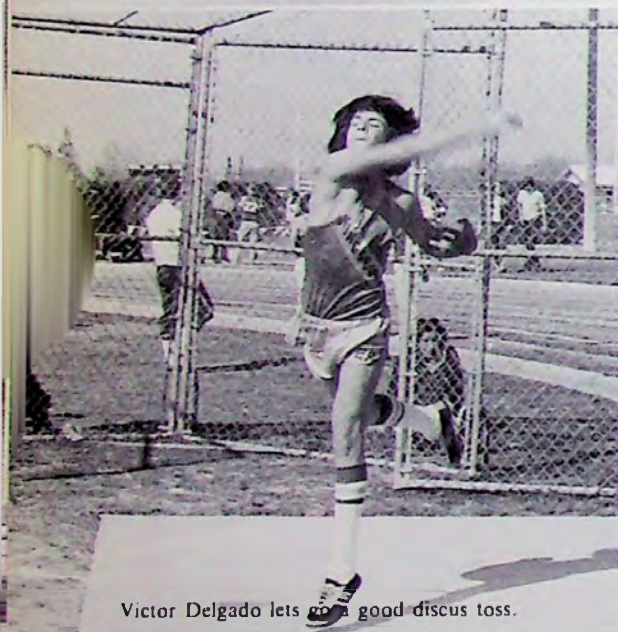

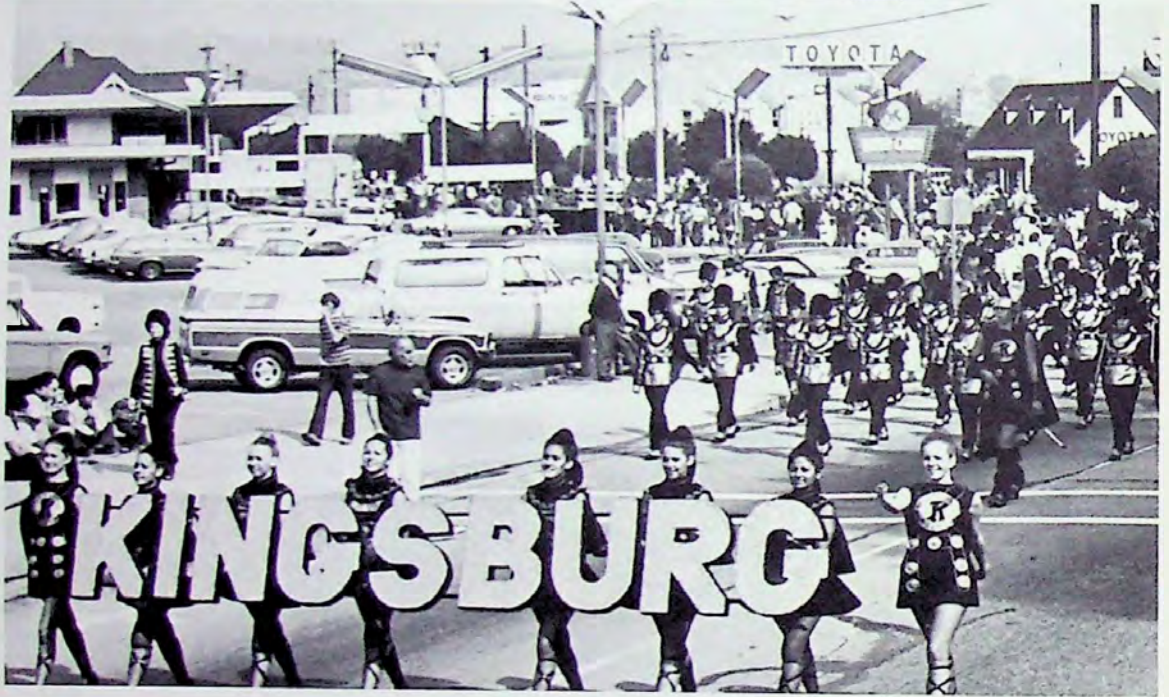

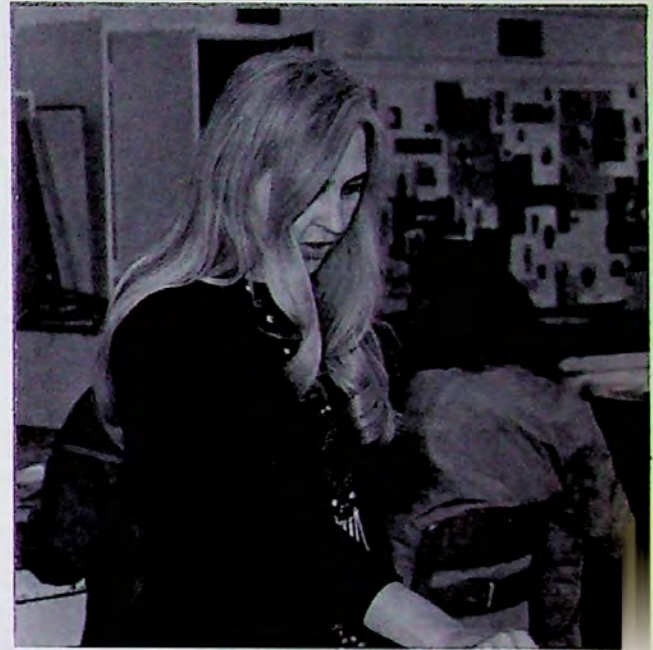

Student Council took part in the dedication of the new school facilities and headed the project for concrete benches to be placed around the school campus.

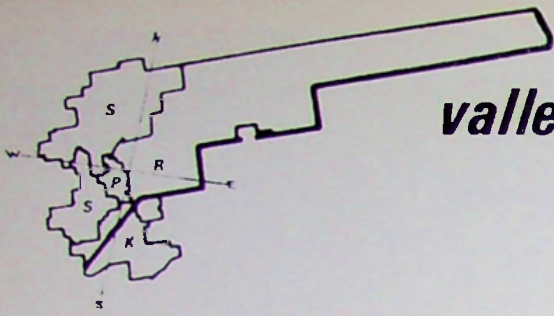

# Opportunities Available Through Occupational Programs

The purpose of the Valley Regional Occupational Program is to increase the vocational occupational opportunities for the youths of the five (5) cooperating school districts Reedley, Sanger, Selma, Kingsburg and Parlier.

Any Juniors or Seniors interested in a V.R.O.P. class may sign up, however, the class is particularly designed for those students who plan to go to work and get a job immediately following graduation.

The V.R.O.P. occupational preparation and opportunities can be extended to a wider variety of specialized courses and serves a larger number of students than which could be provided adequately, efficiently, and economically by a single school district.

It is further intended to provide high school students and graduates and out-of-school youths, regardless of the geographical location of their residence in the county or region with the opportunity to enroll in a vocational technical or training program.

The V.R.O.P. also makes available to you counseling and guidance for any questions that you may have regarding your future, in vocational skills, which you are training for, future courses that you may need to take.

V.R.O.P. also provides an upgrading of vocational skills for anyone that has had some previous knowledge or training and also maintains a pupil-teacher ratio which will enable the students to achieve ultimate benefits from the instructional programs.

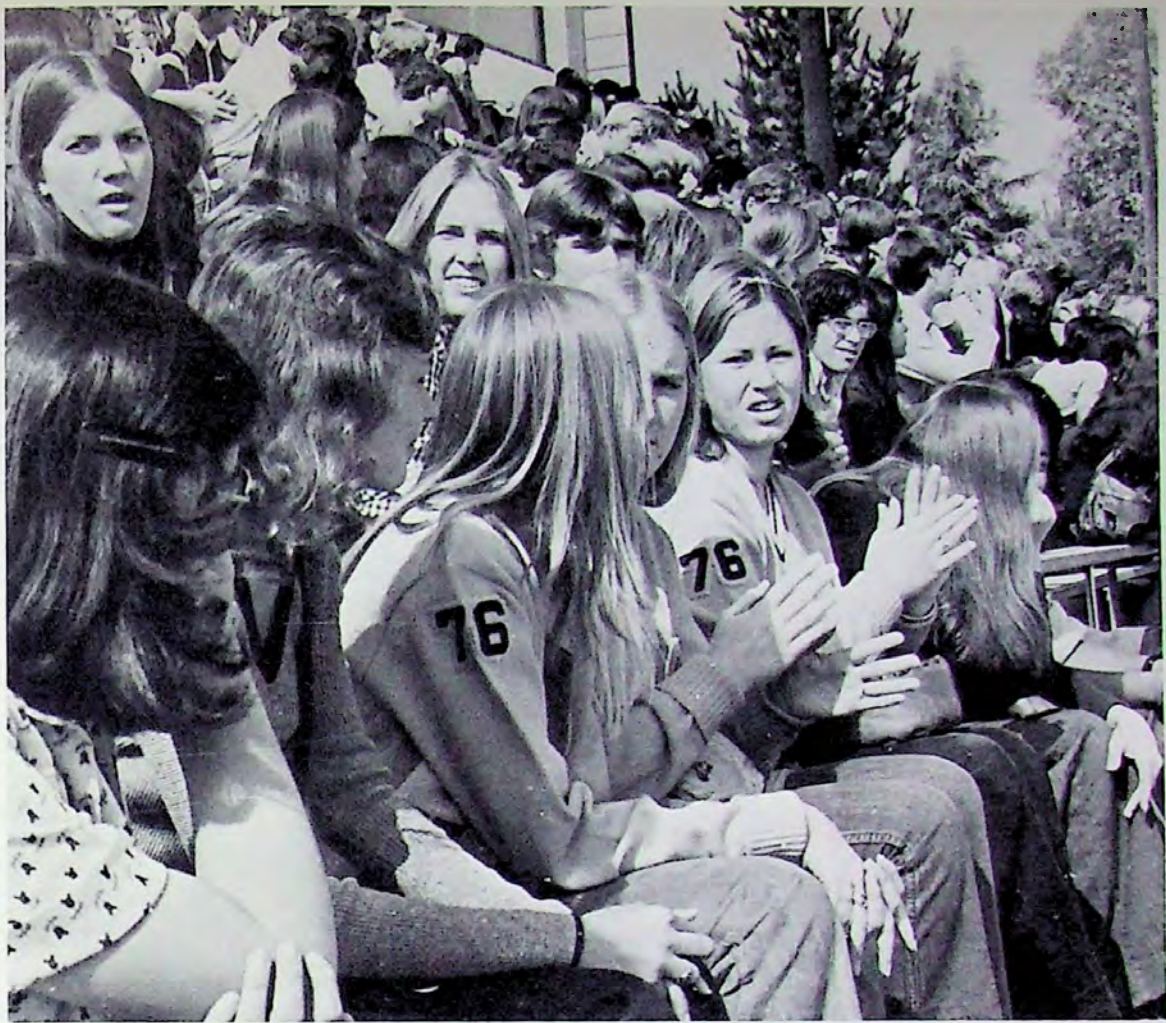
