Title I and LAP

Title I and the Learning Assistance Program (LAP) are designed to help students meet the state's high standards. Title I is federally funded and LAP is state funded. We serve students in grades K-I2 with these programs.

The effectiveness of these programs is judged by how well all of the students in our school perform on the Measure of Student Progress (MSP) and other State tests. There are standards set by the state which our schools have to meet each year in order to make adequate yearly progress.

Our Elementary School (grades k-5) is designated as a schoolwide school so that <u>all students</u> have access to this help in the early grades in various degrees.

At the elementary school our focus is on math and reading



Our three schools (Elementary, Middle, and High Schools) receive help from LAP to offer courses that help students prepare for the MSP.
