#### SAT

- Sections
  - Reading
  - Math
  - Writing (may be optional)
- Scoring
  - Each section is worth 800 point
  - Reading + Math = Composite score
- If you like...
  - Vocabulary
  - Logical reasoning and puzzles
  - More time and complex questions

## New vs. Old

#### **ACT**

- Sections
  - Reading
  - Math
  - Social Studies
  - Science
  - Writing (may be optional)
- Scoring
  - Each section is worth 36 points
  - Composite score Average of first 4 sections
- If you like...
  - Slightly more complex math
  - Straightforward information
  - Less time and direct questions

| September 12   | August 7                 |
| October 24     | September 18             |
| December 12    | November 6               |
| February 6     | January 8                |
| April 9        | March 4                  |

- What they do
  - Helps low income students pay for SAT/ACT testing
  - Potentially help pay for college application fees
- Where you get them
  - Your high school counselor

# Re-Testing & Super Scores

- Why re-test?
  - Improve your scores for admissions
    - And possibly placement testing exemptions
  - Improve your scores for scholarships
- Super-scoring (for participating institutions)
  - Taking the best scores from different sections of the SAT or ACT from different test dates to determine the score they will use for admissions and/or scholarships

## Texas Success Initiative (TSI)

- Placement testing for all Texas public institutions
  - Community college
  - AND 4 year institution
- Does not affect your admission decision
  - Cannot take the place of an SAT or ACT
  - Determines the need for remediation/placement courses

# TSI Exemptions

- Exemption eligibility based on
  - SAT
  - ACT
  - TAKS
  - And STARRS scores
- It IS possible to be partially exempt
- The state of Texas sets the minimum that must be achieved to take college level courses, but the school may expect higher
- Look to your school to determine exemptions

### How To Take The TSI?

- When
  - During your senior year
  - In the summer between high school and college
  - Prior to orientation/registration for most schools
- Where
  - Locally
    - At a community college
    - Area university
    - At your school district (if they administer the test)
    - At the institution you will be attending
  - Just be sure your scores will be released to you/your college
- **Note:** If you're taking dual credit, you many have already tested (double check before registering)

#### FAQ

- Does it matter which test I take?
- Should I test early?
- If I'm top 10%...
  - Do I have to take the test?
  - Does it matter what I score?
- What if I get a lower score after retesting?
