






## LET'S TALK ABOUT HOUSE BILL 5...



## TARDY POLICY



- ON THE 5<sup>TH</sup> TARDY THE STUDENT WILL RECEIVE ONE DAY OF PM DETENTION.
- ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup> TARDY THE STUDENT WILL RECEIVE ONE DAY OF PM DETENTION.
- ON THE 7<sup>th</sup> tardy the student will receive a Saturday school detention (4 HOURS FROM 8:30 A.M. TO 12:30 P.M.), A PARENT CONFERENCE, AND A DISCIPLINE REFERRAL.
- ON THE 8<sup>TH</sup> (+) TARDY THE STUDENT WILL BE ADDED TO THE "NO-ROAM LIST" AND THE FOLLOW DISCIPLINE ACTION WILL FOLLOW:
  - THE LOSS OF SCHOOL-SPONSORED/EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (ATTENDING SCHOOL DANCES, ATHLETIC EVENTS/GAMES/MEETS, ETC.)
  - THE STUDENT WILL RECEIVE 3 DAYS OF IN-SCHOOL SUSPENSION DAY (S) AND POSSIBLE OUT-OF-SCHOOL SUSPENSION DAY (S) WITH A BEHAVIOR CONTRACT AND PARENT CONFERENCE
- IF A STUDENT IS A NO-SHOW TO PM DETENTION, THEY WILL BE RESCHEDULED FOR THE NEXT PM DETENTION DAY. IF A STUDENT IS NO-SHOW FOR THE SECOND TIME, THEY WILL BE ASSIGNED ONE DAY OF ISS.



# EXEMPTION POLICY



#### GRADE 9-TWO CLASSES PER SEMESTER

- NO MORE THAN 3 ABSENCES PLUS AN ADDITIONAL 2 ABSENCES FOR MEDICAL REASONS IN THE CLASS PERIOD IN WHICH YOU ARE REQUESTING THE EXEMPTION.
- AN 80 OR BETTER SEMESTER AVERAGE OR ABOVE (1ST, 2ND, AND 3RD SIX WEEKS' AVERAGE).
- No more than 3 office referrals, with no more than 1 assignment to ISS. No assignments to ALC or out-of-school suspensions.
- NO OUTSTANDING FEES, FINES OR RESIDENCY HOLDS.
- ANY ABSENCES, REDUCTION IN GRADE BELOW 80, FINE, OR DISCIPLINE REFERRAL AFTER THE EXEMPTION DECLARATION MAY NEGATE FINAL EXAM EXEMPTIONS.

#### **CONSEQUENCES FOR POSSESSION OF DEVICES**

**1st Offense** – Parent Contact, Phone confiscated and returned at end of day.

**2ND OFFENSE** – PARENT CONTACT, PHONE CONFISCATED, AND PARENT MUST RETRIEVE PHONE WITH A \$15 FEE.

**3rd Offense** – Parent Contact, Phone confiscated, parent must retrieve phone with a \$15 fee, and student is assigned ISS.
